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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-32) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (28-39)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and seven of the last nine and are a season-high tying eight games under .500 (also 23-31 on June 2)...are 24-32 (.429), which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 16½ games...the only other time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games this early in the season was in 2001 when they were 17½ games out after 56 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 14 days in fifth...are 1-3 in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE NINTH INNING: The A's scored six runs in the ninth inning yesterday, marking the first time they scored six runs in the bottom of the ninth since July 15, 1952 in the first game of a doubleheader against St. Louis...have scored 32 runs in the ninth inning for the season, which is third most in the majors (BOS and LAA, 35)...have allowed 31 runs, which is second most (MIN, 38)...Matt Joyce hit the A's first grand slam of the season in the ninth yesterday...it was the A's 11th home run in the ninth this year, which is two more than any other team...lead the majors in ninth inning slugging (.526), rank fourth in on-base percentage (.352) and fifth in batting (.269).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 10 runs in each of the last two games after scoring nine runs or fewer in each of the first 54 contests...it marks the first time the A's have reached double figures in runs scored in back-to-back games since April 24-25, 2014...are hitting .301 (22-for-73) with 20 runs scored over the last two games after batting .196 with 20 runs over the previous seven contests...for the season, rank second to last in the American League in runs scored (233), batting average (.236) and on-base percentage (.304) to Kansas City (194/234/292)...have the fourth most extra base hits in the AL (184)...are 8-for-60 (.133) with runners in scoring position over the last nine games and are batting .207 with RISP for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also rank last in batting with the bases loaded (.179)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.163) and second to last in on-base percentage (.248)...designated hitters rank last in the AL in RBI (20) and slugging (.341) and tied for second in fewest home runs (7).

THE LONG BALL...: The A's hit eight home runs in the three-game series against Washington and now have 84 home runs for the season...that is tied for third in the American League and is the most in Athletics history after 56 games...had 82 in 2000 (83 after 57 games)...51 of the A's 84 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's lead the majors in home runs at home...19 of the A's last 26 runs and 129 of their 233 runs for the season (55.4%) have come on home runs...are 23-22 when homering, 1-10 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the majors (DET, 1-14)...A's pitchers have allowed 61 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL...are 19-9 when out-homer the opponent, 5-23 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's struck out four times yesterday, which matches the season low (May 14 at Texas)...fanned 19 times in the three-game series against Washington after striking out 59 times in the four-game series at Cleveland...that includes 19 strikeouts last Tuesday, tying the franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game...have 512 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League but nearly 100 fewer than Tampa Bay (607).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors Saturday (sixth time)...last year, the A's had five games with three or more errors the entire season...have 58 errors this year, which is 41.5% more than the next closest team (LAD, 41)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 40 unearned runs (ATL, 35)...have allowed a ML leading 51 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 44)...are tied for second in the American League in passed balls (7).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 52 runs over the last six home games (8.7 per game) and opponents are batting .329 (77-for-234) over that stretch...have compiled a 6.19 ERA (77 er in 112.0 ip) over the last 13 games overall and now have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors...lead the majors in wild pitches (33) and top the AL in hit batters (24).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-6 with a 5.85 ERA (31 er in 47.2 ip) over the last nine games...are 8-19 with a 4.79 ERA (110 er in 206.2 ip) over the last 38 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 17-24 with a 4.48 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.393) and have the second lowest opponents batting average (.244)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (three games)...the series loss to Washington was the A's first home series loss since dropping a rain-shortened two-game series with Houston, April 14-15...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 14 of the last 21 home games...are 16-12 (.571) at home compared to 8-20 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-21)...leave following the game Wednesday for a six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (four games) and Miami (two games) that begins on Friday...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 5-2-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher twice in this three-game series against the Blue Jays...have faced a right-hander in each of the last eight games after facing a lefty in four of the previous seven contests...are 7-7 in games started by left-handers, including 7-2 at home...are 17-25 against right-handers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-9 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 10-6...through games of last Thursday, the A's had a success ratio of 20.0%, which was second worst in the majors (MIL, 1-6)...after 50 consecutive games with a different lineup, the A's lineup yesterday was the same as game 54...have used 53 different lineups in 56 games...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the American League...are 12-11 (.522) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 12-21 (.364) in games decided by three runs or more...have the worst record in AL and third worst in the majors in games decided by three runs or more.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hahn, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The two clubs split the six-game season series last year with the A's winning two of three in Oakland and losing two of three at Toronto...have won seven of the last 10 games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre...the A's have lost the season series just once over the previous six seasons (1-5 in 2015)...are 22-23 against the Blue Jays dating back to the start of the 2011 season...are 215-190 all-time, including 107-96 in Oakland, 108-92 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

A scoring change has been made in Saturday's game...in the third inning, credit Stephen Vogt with a hit and take away the error from Stephen Drew...the change is reflected in today's notes but not in the stat packets...**Yonder Alonso** is tied for third in the American League with a career-high 16 home runs...leads AL first baseman in on-base percentage (.394) and slugging percentage (.680), is tied for the lead in home runs (16), ranks second in batting (.299) and third in RBI (34)...**Khris Davis** hit his 17th home run of the season yesterday, which is second in the majors to the Yankees Judge (18)...has 59 home runs over the last two years, which are the most in the majors (Cruz, 57).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2004** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

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TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-3, 3.91 ERA)

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has won each of his last three starts for the first three-game winning streak of his career...has a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) and .179 (12-for-67) opponents batting average during the winning streak and has issued just two walks in 19.0 innings (0.95 walks per nine innings...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts and issued 17 walks in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings).

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his nine starts this year...also surrendered five hits or fewer in each of his final six starts last year...has a streak of 15 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more...that matches the longest such streak by an American League pitcher since at least 1913 (Tom Gordon, June 24-Sept. 2, 1992)...the longest by a Major Leaguer is 18 by Al Downing (June 10, 1975-May 24, 1976).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter over his last five starts (0-for-19)...for the season, left-handers are hit .054 (2-for-37) compared to .213 (26-for-136) by right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings...his career splits are .146 (20-for-137) against lefties. .51 (146-for-581) against righties...held lefties to a .180 batting average last year, which was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .526 OPS against lefties last year, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts at home compared to 2-3 with a 4.44 ERA (13 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts on the road...last year, he was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 7-3 with a 3.08 ERA (36 er in 105.1 ip) in 18 career games in the Coliseum compared to 4-9 with a 4.83 ERA (47 er in 87.2 ip) in 16 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .176 (6-for-34) with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .192 with RISP, which was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...opponents are 7-for-98 (.071) with two strikes...they are 3-for-42 (.071) when leading of an inning but he has walked five and hit three for a .220 on-base percentage...has held the opponents three and four hitters to a .093 (4-for-43) batting average...has a .239 (17-for-71) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup. .137 (14-for-102) after that...has a .118 (13-for-110) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .286 (18-for-63) average with 15 of his 19 opponents RBI with two outs.

THE SECOND INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 24 runs in the second inning for a 13.00 ERA (13 er in 9.0 ip)...has a 1.83 ERA (8 er in 39.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .381 (16-for-42) with a .422 on-base percentage (3 bb) in the second inning. .115 (15-for-131) with a .232 on-base percentage (16 bb, 4 hbp, 0 sf) in all other innings.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...his three wins in the month of May are his most ever in a month...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed seven innings in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career...has hit four batters, which is tied for fifth most in the American League and matches his season total from last year (144.2 innings)...is 2-2 with a 5.12 ERA (11 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts on four days rests compared to 2-1 with a 3.10 ERA (10 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

2017 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) **April 4** in Oakland...left trailing 4-2 after six innings but the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas **April 9**...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston in Oakland on **April 15**...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Seattle **April 21**

in Oakland...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...the longest is a five-game streak by Mike Norris in 1980...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth and then scored twice in the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 26**...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...was relieved by Montas to start the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle on **May 15**...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings...issued bases loaded walks to Valencia and Gamel in the first inning and allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the second...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced following the Cruz home run...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 8-3 victory over Boston **May 20** in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Ramirez home run and a Rutledge RBI ground out, but Oakland came back to tie the game in the bottom of the second...allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Pedroia RBI single but the A's scored five times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win at New York (AL) **May 26**...tossed a career-high tying 106 pitches...pitched 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just four hits and a walk...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...Tanaka blanked the A's over the first seven innings but Oakland scored twice in the eighth and ninth innings for the win.

LAST START: He won his third straight start in the A's 3-1 win at Cleveland last Wednesday...retired each of the first 10 batters and had a 1-0 lead when Lindor homered with one out in the fourth to tie the game...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings and the A's scored twice in the fifth for the win.

MANAEA vs. TORONTO: Is making his second career appearance and his first start...made his first career relief appearance in the A's 5-3 loss on July 17, 2016 in Oakland and had a no decision (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...set down the first six batters he faced but then allowed a two-run home run to Tulowitzki in the fourth...retired eight of the final nine batters he faced.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-4, 3.81 ERA): Is scheduled to be reinstated from the 10-day disabled list tomorrow to make his 10th appearance and ninth start of the season...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton last Wednesday against Lancaster and had a no decision in the Ports 3-2 win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 75 pitches)...is 0-3 with a 5.70 ERA and .306 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak matches his career high...went 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .174 opponents batting average over his first four games (three starts)...has allowed just one home run in 49.2 innings...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start on May 23, an 11-9 A's loss to Miami (2.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 so)...has never faced the Blue Jays in his career.

- The bullpen has a 5.65 ERA (78 er in 124.1 ip) over its last 38 games after posting a 3.73 ERA (25 er in 60.1 ip) over its first 18 games.
- Has recorded just two saves in its last six chances dating back to May 12, a span of 21 games...overall, are 10-for-17 (58.8%) in save chances and has the sixth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Liam Hendriks earned the win on Saturday, the first win by an A's reliever since May 19 (Dull)...seven total wins by relievers are tied for fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen sported a 4-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (16 er in 48.0 ip) in 10 games...road ERA in May was 6.35 (28 er in 39.2 ip).
- Relievers rank first in the AL in stolen bases allowed (22).
- Bullpen is first in the AL in runs allowed (115).
- Tied for second in the AL in unearned runs (12) and tied for fourth in wild pitches (12).

- Is 13-for-48 (.271) over his last 14 games...went 8-for-28 (.286) over his first seven games but was 9-for-58 (.155) in 21 games in between.
- Has made 35 of his 36 starts in games started by a right-handed pitcher...is batting .238 (29-for-122) against right-handers but is just 1-for-12 (.083) against lefties.
- The Nationals stole three bases with him behind the plate yesterday and opponents have been successful in each of their last 18 stolen base attempts off him...has tossed out just 2-of-33 (6.1%) for the season...the stolen base percentage is the worst mark in the majors and the 31 stolen bases are the most.
- Has committed six errors, which is tied for the lead among AL catchers and is one short of his career high of seven from last year.

Last Year: Played in a career-high 137 games and hit .251 with 14 home runs and 56 RBI...also had career bests in hits (123), doubles (30) and extra base hits (46)...was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team.
