OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-32) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (28-30)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games but have lost seven of the last 10...are 25-32 (.439), which is the third worst record in the American League...are seven games under .500, which is one short of the season high of eight (twice, last: 24-32 on June 4)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 16½ games for the second consecutive day...the only other time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games this early in the season was in 2001 when they were 17½ games out after 56 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 15 days in fifth...are 2-3 in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE LONG BALL....: The A's have hit 10 home runs in four games on the homestand and the home runs have accounted for 22 of the A's 28 runs...now have 86 home runs for the season, which ranks third in the American League and is the most in Athletics history after 57 games...had 83 in 2000 (85 after 58 games)...53 of the A's 86 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's lead the majors in home runs at home...134 of the A's 238 runs have come on home runs (56.3%)...are 24-22 when homering, 1-10 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the majors (DET, 1-14)...A's pitchers have allowed 62 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are 20-9 when out-homer the opponent, 5-23 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out 24 times in four games on the homestand after fanning 59 times in the four-game series at Cleveland to close out the last road trip...that included 19 strikeouts a week ago today, tying the franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game...have 517 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League but 90 fewer than Tampa Bay (607).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone back-to-back games without an error for the first time since May 13-14...have committed 58 errors, which is 38.1% more than the next closest team (LAD, 42)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 40 unearned runs (ATL, 35)...have allowed a ML leading 51 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 44)...are tied for second in the American League in passed balls (7).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217 (71-for-327) over the last 10 games, including .132 (9-for-68) with runners in scoring position...have scored 45 in the 10 games, 20 of which came on Saturday and Sunday...for the season, rank second to last in the American League in runs scored (238), batting average (.235) and on-base percentage (.304) to Kansas City (197/.235/.292)...have the third most extra base hits (188)...rank last in the majors in batting with runners in scoring position (.208) and batting with the based loaded (.179)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.161) and second to last in on-base percentage (.248).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 55 runs over the last seven home games (8.7 per game) and opponents are batting .313 (84-for-268) over that stretch...have compiled a 5.95 ERA (80 er in 121.0 ip) over the last 14 games overall and now have a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and fifth highest in the majors...lead the majors in wild pitches (33) and top the AL in hit batters (24).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-19 with a 4.74 ERA (112 er in 212.2 ip) over the last 39 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 18-24 with a 4.45 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.391) and have the second lowest opponents batting average (.243)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this six-game homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (1-0)...the series loss to Washington was the A's first home series loss since dropping a rain-shortened two-game series with Houston, April 14-15...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 15 of the last 22 home games...

are 17-12 (.586) at home compared to 8-20 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 8-21)...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (four games) and Miami (two games) that begins on Friday...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 5-2-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's improved to 8-7 in games started by left-handed pitchers with the win last night, including 8-2 at home...are 17-25 against right-handers...are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher twice in this three-game series against the Blue Jays...faced a right-hander in each of the previous eight games.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 13-11 (.542) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 12-21 (.364) in games decided by three runs or more...have the worst record in American League and second worst in the majors in games decided by three runs or more (PHI, 7-18)...are 5-7 (.417) in one-run games, including 4-2 at home...the 12 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL (MIN, 10) and the record is tied for third worst...have a run differential of -60, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, -94).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-9 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 10-6...through games of last Thursday, the A's had a replay success ratio of 20.0%, which was second worst in the majors (MIL, 1-6)...rank third in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (32) and tied for second in runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11)...after 50 consecutive games with a different lineup, the A's lineup Sunday was the same as game 54...have used 54 different lineups in 57 games...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the American League...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's won the first meeting of 2017 last night after the two clubs split the six-game season series last year...the A's won two of three in Oakland and lost two of three at Toronto...have won eight of the last 11 games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre...the A's have lost the season series just once over the previous six seasons (1-5 in 2015)...are 23-23 against the Blue Jays dating back to the start of the 2011 season...are 216-190 all-time, including 108-96 in Oakland, 108-92 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is tied for third in the American League with a career-high 16 home runs...leads AL first baseman in on-base percentage (.397) and slugging percentage (.682), is tied for the lead in home runs (16), ranks second in batting (.305) and third in RBI (34)...**Khris Davis** hit his 17th home run of the season Sunday, which is second in the majors to the Yankees Judge (18)...has 59 home runs over the last two years, which are the most in the majors (Cruz, 57)...**Ryon Healy** is 7-for-11 (.636) with five runs, two doubles, four home runs and nine RBI over his last three games...has two two-homer games over that stretch, the first of his career...has 13 home runs for the season, which matches his career high from last year...**Trevor Plouffe** is 0 for his last 25, which is the longest hitless streak of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson's collects his 1000th hit in Oakland uniform...he finished his career with the A's with an Oakland record 1640 hits...in **2003** the A's return to Philadelphia for the first time in 49 years as Oakland defeats the Philadelphia Phillies in interleague play, 7-4...Miguel Tejada collects four hits, including an Oakland record tying three doubles.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-4, 3.81 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today and is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and ninth start of the season... was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton last Wednesday against Lancaster and had a no decision in the Ports 3-2 win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 75 pitches)...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his last eight appearances.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 5.70 ERA (15 er in 23.2 ip) and .306 (30-for-98) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak matches his career high (fourth time, last: June 3, 2016-April 13, 2017)...went 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .174 opponents batting average over his first four games (three starts).

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run over his last six starts and has a 32.2-inning, 146-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just one home run in 49.2 innings, an average of 0.18 per nine innings...the lone home run came on April 19 against Texas, a solo shot by Gallo to lead off the fifth inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 6.94 ERA (9 er in 11.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) in five games on the road... has not allowed a home run in 38.0 innings on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-5 with a 3.49 ERA (41 er in 105.2 ip) in 18 starts in Oakland, 3-9 with a 4.86 ERA (47 er in 87.0 ip) in 16 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 0-3 with a 4.06 ERA (17 er in 37.2 ip) in seven games at night compared to 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts during the day...now has a seven-game losing streak in night games and has a 5.70 ERA (38 er in 60.0 ip) over that 12-game (11-start) stretch...has not won a night game since June 15, 2015 at San Diego...is 0-4 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) in nine career starts at night in the Coliseum...his career splits are 9-4 with a 2.39 ERA (28 er in 105.1 ip) in 17 day games, 7-14 with a 4.76 ERA (85 er in 160.2 ip) in 30 night games.

SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his eight starts, including no runs four times, and has a season run support average of 2.54 (14 rs in 49.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 18 of his 33 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his six starts this year (April 25 and May 12).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed his only home run and issued 12 of his 18 walks to left-handed hitters...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed over the last two years have been hit by lefties...opponents are 13-for-41 (.317) with runners in scoring position but they are 3-for-16 (.188) with RISP and two outs...allowed a .324 batting average with RISP last year...has a .277 (39-for-141) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .143 (7-for-49) after that...has yielded a .169 (15-for-89) batting average with two strikes after allowing a .300 mark with two strikes last year.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 0-2 with a 6.11 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May after going 1-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in five games in April...his May ERA was his highest in a month (min 5.0 ip).

THIS AND THAT: Has committed two errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers...also ranks tied for seventh in assists (9) and total chances (14)...has tossed more than six innings in just two of his eight starts this year and 13 of 45 in his career...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen bases attempts off him...are 11-for-12 (91.6%) over the last two years after going 5-for-10 (50.0%) over his first two.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Is his first appearance, he relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas **April 7**...entered the game trailing 8-3 and allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 3-1 A's loss at Kansas City **April 13**...left trailing 3-0 and Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on **April 19** in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on **April 25**...tossed 8.0 shutout innings

and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Houston **April 30**...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0...Keuchel shut out the A's on two hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored single runs in the eighth and ninth... had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win over Detroit **May 6** in Oakland...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run triple by Romine and a RBI single by Castellanos...loaded the bases with two outs in the fourth and was relieved by Coulombe after tossing 101 pitches...Coulombe allowed one of the inherited runners to score...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas **May 12**...shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when Gomez doubled to start the fifth, moved to third on a Hahn error on a pickoff attempt and scored on a DeShields sacrifice bunt/fielders choice...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings and he left with a 2-1 lead...Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle **May 17**...allowed a run in the first inning on a Cruz sacrifice fly and then blanked the Mariners on one hit over the next three innings...yielded three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run single by Segura and a Cruz RBI ground out...the A's were shutout on two hits by Bergman and Pazos.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-9 loss to Miami on May 23 in Oakland...tossed just 2.0 innings as he left the game early with a strained right triceps...allowed a RBI single to Stanton in the first and three more runs in the second on a two-run single by Suzuki and a RBI triple by Gordon...was relieved by Wahl after walking Yelich to start the third inning...Wahl allowed the run to score.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in a rehab start for Single-A Stockton last Wednesday in a 3-2 win over Lancaster...allowed a RBI single to Brian Mundell in the first inning and a solo home run to Brendan Rodgers in the sixth...left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0 but the Ports scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...his opponents batting average included a mark of .273 against right-handed hitters compared to .361 against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jharel Cotton (3-6, 5.11 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA and .162 opponents batting average in two starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (49.1), strikeouts (44) and games started (9) and tied for second in wins (3)...is 3-2 with a 2.37 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in five starts during the day compared to 0-4 with an 9.47 ERA and .369 opponents average in four starts at night...ranks eighth in the American League in day ERA...was charged with his sixth loss of the season in his last start, an 8-0 A's loss at Cleveland last Thursday (5.2 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is tied for fourth in the AL in losses...has never faced the Blue Jays in his career.
