THE LATEST:

- Last night, TOR dropped the opener of its 3-game series, 5-3, in OAK...Fall to 10-10 in series openers and 12-12 in games when scoring first...The Jays are now 6.0 games back in the AL East and are looking to narrow that margin to less than 5.5 games for the first time since April 12 (4.5 GB), a span of 50 games...With a win and a Tampa Bay loss today, could leap-frog the Rays (29-30) into 4th place and out of 5th in the division, where TOR has resided since April 8, 53 games ago.
- With last night's loss, Toronto falls to 3-10 vs. left-handed starters...Last season, the Jays posted a 24-20 record in such contests...Went 64-54 vs. LH starters over the previous 3 seasons.

GOOD JUNES:

- The Blue Jays may have lowered their record to 2-3 this month, but since the start of 2013, Toronto ranks tied for the 2nd best June record in all of baseball...The Jays went 15-12 during the month last season, after posting an 18-9 record in 2015.

THIS & THAT:

- Last night, the Blue Jays scored 3 runs on 7 hits for the second straight game...Have scored 3 or less in 3 straight games and 4 of the last 5...Have more than 7 hits only twice in the last 10 games.
- Toronto lost while out-hitting Oakland, 7-5, last night...That ended a 7G win streak when out-hitting opponents...Before last night, had won 15 of the last 17 such contests, following a 2-6 start...Are now 17-8 overall when out-hitting the opposition.
- The Jays hit another home run last night, and have done so in 7 of the last 8G (17HR)...Have hit 57 homers since the start of May, which is tied for the 2nd most in the Majors over that time (HOU-62, TB-57).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT:

- J.A. Happ fell to 0-4 on the season, allowing 5ER in 5.1 innings...Allowed 2HR and has surrendered a pair of homers in 4 of his 5 starts...Issued 3 walks and has surrendered 6 in 2 starts since returning from the DL, after not allowing a walk in his first 3 starts prior to his left-elbow injury.
- Justin Smoak extended his team lead with his 15th home run...Has HR in back-to-back games for the second time this year and the 14th time in his career...Did not hit HR in consecutive games last season and did so once in 2015...Has 3 more homers than any other MLB switch-hitter...Also leads all switch-hitters with 40 RBI, and ranks 2nd in both SLG (.574) and OPS (.924).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

- Tonight, TOR resumes its six-game road trip with the second match of a 3G series against the Athletics...After an off-day on Thursday, will play another 3G set in Seattle (28-30)...Will then enjoy another off-day on Monday before starting a 5G homestand on June 13.
- Are 11-16 on the road but have gone 10-11 since a 1-5 start...Are averaging 4.48 R/G on the road, which ranks 14th in the Majors and 7th in the AL...Have allowed 4.70 R/G on the road this season (14th in MLB and 7th in the AL)...Have scored 3 or more runs in 8 consecutive road games and in 15 of the last 17, after reaching the 3-run plateau just 5 times in the first 10 road contests.

BLUE JAYS vs. ATHLETICS:

- All-Time:** 190-216...**All-Time, On The Road:** 98-108...**2017:** 0-1
- The Jays split the season series with the A's, 3-3, in 2016 after taking 2015 with a 5-1 record...Have outscored Oakland 44-69 over the last two seasons...Prior to that, lost 3 consecutive season series all by one game (3-4 in 2014, 3-4 in 2013, 4-5 in 2012).
- Kendrys Morales has 19 HR and 57 RBI against the A's to lead all Toronto batters...Since the start of 2015, is batting .308 (16-for-52) in 14 games, with 3-XBH and 7-RBI.
- Kevin Pillar is a career .321 (18-for-56) hitter vs. Oakland and has a hit in 14 of 16 games...Went 8-for-24 (.333) in 6G last season with a pair of doubles and 4-RBI...Has 6-RBI in his last 8 contests.

NO RISP, NO REWARD:

- Blue Jay batters went 0-for-8 with runners in scoring position last night...By doing so, Toronto extended it's current skid to 0-for-32 with RISP, setting a new franchise record...The streak is the second longest by any MLB team this season (KC: 0-for-35, May 19-26)...courtesy STATS.
- The Jays rebounded from a .198 RISP average in April (29th in MLB, 14th in AL) by hitting .274 in May (9th in MLB, 5th in AL)...The team does not yet have a hit with RISP in the month of June (4G)...In fact, since hitting 12-for-21 (.571) with RISP in a 17-2 victory over the Reds on May 29, the Jays have gone a combined 1-for-26 over the last 7 games.

SMOAKING SECTION:

- With a 2-for-4 night, Justin Smoak bumped his average to .287 on the year...His previous career-best season was with Seattle in 2013, when he posted a .238 average with .334 OBP and a .746 OPS...With last night's home run (15th in 57G), he surpassed his total of 14 from all of last season (126G)...His 40 RBI are also 6 more than he had in 2016...In fact, on this day last year, he had 5 HR and 16 RBI in 55 games, while batting 12 points lower with 10 more strikeouts.
- Since May 10, Smoak has hit .329 (27-for-82) with 10-HR (T-1st in AL), 23-RBI (2nd in AL), with 14-BB and 13-K, leading to a 1.154 OPS (3rd in AL)...His 60 total bases in the last 24 games are also the 3rd most in the AL.

- While the Blue Jays may be 3-10 vs. south-paw starters this year, they've countered with a 25-20 record against righties...The team ranks 1st in the Majors on refraining from chasing curve balls and sliders delivered by RHPs out of the strike zone.

TODAY'S START & HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✦ Scheduled to make his 13th start of the season...His 82 strike outs this season is ranked 3rd in the AL (Sale-119, Archer-95) and his eight quality starts is ranked 7th in the AL... Has pitched 6 innings or more in 10 of his 12 starts this season.
- ✦ Has improved his strikeout rate by more than two full strikeouts per nine...Came into 2017 with an 8.06 K/9 total, however in 2017 is currently at 10.20 K/9.
- ✦ In his last start vs. NYY, gave up 4 runs in the 1st inning for the first time in his career...Now holds a 7.50 ERA (10ER/12IP) in the opening frame this season with an opp. avg. of .320 and a WHIP of 1.92...His 3.2IP outing was his shortest start since 9/9/16 vs. BOS (2.1IP)...Allowed a season-high 7ER, the most in a start since 6/20/14 at COL (7ER)... Matched season-lows with 4 K's and 89 pitches (both from his Opening Day start on 4/3 at BAL).
- ✦ Won his 3rd straight decision after a 3-1 win vs. TEX on May 27...Struck out 8 and has 8+ in five of his 12 starts...In the contest gave up his 8th career leadoff homerun and his 2nd career vs. Texas...Was also the first time he had given up a leadoff homerun on the first pitch...The last time a Blue Jays pitcher gave up a home run on the first pitch of the ball games was Brandon Morrow, Aug 28/2011 vs. TB (Desmond Jennings).
- ✦ Estrada's 78 strikeouts were the 3rd most in franchise history entering the month of June behind Roger Clemens in 1997 (80) and Ricky Romero in 2010 (79).
- ✦ Estrada has allowed at least one HR in each of his last 6 games dating back to May 6, 2017 (Jesse Chavez has the longest active streak with 9)..
- ✦ Has thrown his changeup 37.1% of time, the most in the Majors.
- ✦ HITTERS COUNT?: Estrada has allowed an OPS of just .637 (36 PAs) when he's behind in the count this season (Rank: 5th among qualified SPs in MLB; League Avg: 1.116).
- ✦ Since 2015 he has limited opponents to a .210 average, the best mark in the AL (Verlander 2nd at .221).
- ✦ DID YOU KNOW? That Estrada (2015-16) joined Pedro Martinez (1999-2000-Bos) & Nolan Ryan (1989-91, 3 seasons-Tex) as the only AL pitchers with consecutive seasons allowing .205 BA (or Lower)

- ◆ Has recorded 24 of his 28 strike outs this season with his fastball.
- ◆ Has allowed an OPS of .238 with RISP this season. Ranked 7th among qualified relievers in the MLB.
- ◆ Had pitched 1 IP plus in 9 of his 19 games this season.
- ◆ 6/2 vs. NYY surrendered his 4th career HR after not allowing one in his first 26.2 innings (111 batters faced). Also to note, he has now given up 3 HR in his last 5 appearances (6.1IP, 7H, 9K, 5ER, 3HR).

- ◆ His 9-HR allowed this season rank T-1st most in the ML among relievers & his 4 losses rank T-4th most.
- ◆ 6/4 vs. NYY pitched 0.2 IP & gave up a career high 4-HR, all coming in the 8th inning (most by a TOR reliever)...The last ML pitcher to allow 4HR in an inning was Masahiro Tanaka (9/21/16 at TB -3rd inning, 4HR)...The last ML reliever to surrender 4HR in an outing was Yusmeiro Petit for SF on 6/21/15 at LAD...The last time any pitcher (starter or reliever) allowed 4+HR & pitched less than an inning was Travis Harper (TB) on 6/21/05 at NYY (4 HR, 0.2 IP in relief)...No Blue Jay (starter or reliever) had ever done so before that contest.

- ◆ Signed by the Toronto Blue Jays on Dec 19, 2016.

- ◆ Has limited AAA hitters to a .147 average with 11 hits allowed in 32 innings. (LHH-143/RHH-149).

- ◆ Has recorded a SV in each of his last 8 appearances (7.1 IP, ER, BB/11K, opp. 4-for-26 with 1-XBH)...Became the 3rd Blue Jay (4th time) to save at least 6G in any 9G span (May 21-31) of a season (Duane Ward, 2x, 1991/1993 & Kelvim Escobar in 2002)...Went 8-for-8 in SV situations in May (14 total games, 0.71 WHIP & .159 opp. AVG)
- ◆ Opponents have a swing rate of 69.3% on curves and sliders. Ranked 1st among qualified relievers.
- ◆ His 13 saves are ranked 6th in the AL.
- ◆ Has walked 2 of 86 batters (2.3%) this season (Rank: 7th of 228 qualified RPs in MLB; League Avg: 9.4%).

- ◆ Hasn't issued a walk to a RHH this year (61 batters)...Also to note; he hasn't allowed a walk in his last 76 PA vs. RHH since Sept 13, 2016.
- ◆ Hitters have chased 63 of his 138 fastballs out of the zone (chase rate of 45.7%), Rank: 1st among qualified RPs in MLB.

- ◆ 5/30 had his scoreless streak innings streak come to an end at 19 IP... that was the 2nd longest scoreless streak by a RP this season
- ◆ 5/26 vs TEX had a streak of 17.1 straight IP without allowing an XBH snapped after giving up a 2B to Gallo.
