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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-32) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (28-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games but have lost seven of the last 11...have won the first two games of this series and will be going for their first series sweep of the season...have a streak of 23 consecutive series without a sweep...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City...have not swept a series in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota...are 26-32 (.449), which is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 15½ games...that is one game short of the season high of 16½ (twice, last on June 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 16 days in fifth...are 3-3 in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE LONG BALL...: The A's won for just the second time this year last night when going homerless...are 2-10 with no home runs, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 24-22 when homering...have hit 86 home runs, which ranks third in the AL and is the most in Athletics history after 58 games...had 85 in 2000 (87 after 59 games)...53 of the A's 86 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's lead the majors in home runs at home...home runs have accounted for 22 of the A's 32 runs on the homestand and 134 of their 242 runs for the season (55.4%)...A's pitchers have allowed 62 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...are 20-9 when out-homer the opponent, 6-23 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's struck out 10 times last night, the 29th time in 58 games this year they have fanned 10 or more times...had 33 games with 10 or more strikeouts all last year...have struck out 127 times in the last 12 games (10.6 per game)...have 616 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 616).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-0)...the series loss to Washington was the A's first home series loss since dropping a rain-shortened two-game series with Houston, April 14-15...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 16 of the last 23 home games...are 18-12 (.600) at home compared to 8-20 (.286) on the road...have the worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-21)...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (four games) and Miami (two games) that begins on Friday...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 59 errors, which is 40.4% more than the next closest team (LAD and MIL, 42)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 41 unearned runs (ATL, 36)...have allowed a ML leading 51 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 44)...are tied for second in the American League in passed balls (7).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .220 (78-for-355) over the last 11 games, including .160 (12-for-75) with runners in scoring position...have scored 49 runs in the 11 games, 20 of which came on Saturday and Sunday...for the season, rank last in the American League in batting average (.235) and second to last in runs scored (242) and on-base percentage (.304)...have 192 extra base hits, which is second most behind Houston (205)...rank last in the majors in batting with runners in scoring position (.212) and batting with the based loaded (.179)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.162) and second to last in on-base percentage (.248).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.54 ERA (80 er in 130.0 ip) over the last 15 games...now have a 4.57 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...are tied for the Major League lead in wild pitches (33) and top the AL in hit batters (25)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.400).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-2 with a 3.83 ERA (17 er in 40.0 ip) over the last seven games...however, are 10-19 with a 4.61 ERA (112 er in 218.2 ip) over the last 40 games after going 9-5 with a

3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 19-24 with a 4.37 ERA for the season...the losses are tied for second most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.390) and have the second lowest opponents batting average (.244)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (35).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's improved to 8-7 in games started by left-handed pitchers with the win Monday night, including 8-2 at home...are 18-25 against right-handers...are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher twice in this three-game series against the Blue Jays...faced a right-hander in each of the previous eight games.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 13-11 (.542) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 13-21 (.382) in games decided by three runs or more...have the second worst record in American League in games decided by three runs or more (BAL, 8-13/.381)...are 5-7 (.417) in one-run games, including 4-2 at home...the 12 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL (MIN, 10) and the record is tied for third worst...have a run differential of -57, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-9 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...rank third in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (32) and runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11)...after 50 consecutive games with a different lineup, the A's lineup Sunday was the same as game 54...have used 55 different lineups in 58 games...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the American League...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is third fastest in the AL but second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2017...last swept a series from Toronto July 3-6, 2014, a four-game sweep in Oakland...have not swept a three-game series in Oakland since July 31-Aug. 2, 2000...the two clubs split the six-game season series last year...the A's won two of three in Oakland and lost two of three at Toronto...the A's have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre...the A's have lost the season series just once over the previous six seasons (1-5 in 2015)...are 24-23 against the Blue Jays dating back to the start of the 2011 season...are 217-190 all-time, including 109-96 in Oakland, 108-92 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is tied for fourth in the American League with a career-high 16 home runs...leads AL first baseman in on-base percentage (.390) and slugging percentage (.669), is tied for the lead in home runs (16), ranks second in batting (.299) and third in RBI (34)...**Khris Davis** hit his 17th home run of the season Sunday, which is tied for second in the majors...has 59 home runs over the last two years, which are the most in the majors (Cruz, 57)...**Ryon Healy** is 8-for-14 (.571) with five runs, three doubles, four home runs and 10 RBI over his last four games...has two two-homer games over that stretch, the first of his career...has 13 home runs for the season, which matches his career high from last year...**Trevor Plouffe** is 0 for his last 25, which is the longest hitless streak of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1994** Rickey Henderson steals second base against Milwaukee for the 1100th steal of his career...in **2001** the A's set an Oakland record when they are hit by a pitch five times in a 6-4 loss to Anaheim...Frank Menchino is hit by a pitch twice...in **2008** Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in major league history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (3-6, 5.11 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA (4 er in 11.1 ip) and .162 (6-for-37) opponents batting average in two starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...has walked seven batters in 11.1 innings during his second stint (5.56 per nine innings) after issuing 16 free passes in 38.0 innings during his first stint (3.79 per nine innings).

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has taken the loss in each of his last three starts for the first losing streak of his career...has a 6.06 ERA (11 er in 16.1 ip) in the three starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has six losses, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...is also tied for third in unearned runs (8) and tied for fourth in wild pitches (5)...opponents have been caught stealing four times with him on the mound, which is tied for second most in the AL...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (49.1), strikeouts (44) and games started (9) and tied for second in wins (3).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.37 ERA (8 er in 30.1 ip) and .167 (17-for-102) opponents batting average in five starts during the day compared to 0-4 with an 9.47 ERA (20 er in 19.0 ip) and .369 (31-for-84) opponents average in four starts at night...ranks eighth in the American League in day ERA...is now 5-2 with a 2.06 ERA (10 er in 43.2 ip) in seven career starts during the day compared to 0-4 with a 6.43 ERA (25 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 1-4 with a 6.31 ERA (18 er in 25.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-3 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .206 (21-for-102) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-3 with an 8.27 ERA (19 er in 20.2 ip) and .321 (27-for-84) opponents average in four starts in Oakland...ranks sixth in the American League in road ERA (2.83)...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .213 (10-for-47) batting average to hitters leading off an inning with five walks (.288 on-base percentage)...opponents are batting .212 (24-for-113) with the bases empty, .329 (24-for-73) with runners on base...however, five of his seven home runs allowed have been solo shots as have eight of his 11 career home runs...opponents are 17-for-49 (.347) with runners in scoring position...six of the seven home runs he has allowed have come with two outs...the opponents number five hitter is 2-for-24 (.083).

BY INNING: Has a 7.50 ERA (15 er in 18.0 ip), a .306 (22-for-72) opponents batting average and has yielded six of his seven home runs in the first and second inning...has a 3.73 ERA (13 er in 31.1 ip) and .228 (26-for-114) opponents average from the third inning on...has allowed seven runs in the first inning and nine in the second...last year he did not allow a run in the first inning and yielded just three in the second.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six home runs in his last four starts (22.1 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 23 batters in 49.1 innings this year (4.20 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has received seven runs of support in his six losses (30.1 ip, 2.08 RSA) and 12 runs of support in his three wins (19.0 ip, 5.68 RSA)...has a decision in each of his nine starts.

2017 START-BY-START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **April 5** in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth...combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City **April 10**...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...walked three...allowed just three baserunners to advance into scoring position...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on **April 17** in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI double to Mazarra in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle **April 22** in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third but the A's got that run back in the bottom of the third...

was relieved by Montas to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 4-2...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston **April 28**...allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Gurriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota **May 4**...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a pair of solo home runs in the bottom of the second to Rosario and Santana...also yielded an unearned run in the fourth inning when Rosario scored on a Gimenez single and Jaff Decker error...left after six innings with a 6-3 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **May 9** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the first and the A's scored twice in the bottom of the first to take a 2-1 lead...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Revere and a three-run home run to Escobar in the second...yielded two more runs in the fourth inning on a Pennington RBI single and a Escobar RBI ground out...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at New York (AL) **May 27**...tossed a career-high 107 pitches...did not allow a hit over the first five innings, but surrendered a run in the first when Sanchez walked, went to second on a Holliday hit by pitch, third on a wild pitch and scored on a Castro sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth but he allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the bottom of the sixth for the loss.

LAST START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 8-0 loss at Cleveland last Thursday...issued a career-high tying four walks and allowed five runs, but only one was earned...yielded just one run over the first five innings when Robertson doubled, went to third on a passed ball and scored on a wild pitch...was charged with four unearned runs in the sixth inning due to two Healy errors...the A's were shutout on three hits by Kluber and three Indians relievers.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13...surrendered two home runs...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win in his last start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win at Sacramento May 21...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214) and tied for 10th in wins (11).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (5-5, 3.36 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 7.20 ERA and .359 opponents batting average over his last three starts...the losing streak is the longest of his career...went 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...has allowed 11 unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the majors (Holland, CWS) and tied for the most by an A's pitcher over the last eight years...is 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA in four starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA in seven starts at home...is scheduled to start on six days rest tomorrow...is 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA in three starts on four days rest, 4-2 with a 1.07 ERA in seven starts with five days rest or more...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 13-3 A's loss to Washington last Friday here in Oakland (3.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has made one career appearance against the Rays and it came in relief last year on May 14 at Tampa Bay (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so).
