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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-33) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (31-31)

FRIDAY, JUNE 9, 2017 — TROPICANA FIELD — 7:10 P.M. EDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (5-5, 3.36) VS. RHP ALEX COBB (4-5, 4.52) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KFOX 98.5 FM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-2 over the last five games but are 4-8 over the last 12 contests...are 26-33 (.441) for the season, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...it is one game better than last year (25-34) and three games better than 2015 (23-36)...are seven games under .500, which is one short of the season high of eight (twice, last: 24-32 on June 4)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16 games...that is 1/2 game short of the season high of 161/2 (twice, last on June 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 18 days in fifth...have not swept a series this year and now have a streak of 24 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year... last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City...are 3-4 in June... went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April... May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 8-20 (.286) on the road compared to 18-13 (.581) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-23/.281)...begin a six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (four games) and Miami (two games) tonight...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games... have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they also dropped seven in a row...have not lost more than seven straight road series since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they lost nine in a row...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1)...the series loss to Washington was the A's first home series loss since dropping a rain-shortened two-game series with Houston, April 14-15...have won 16 of the last 24 home games...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 87 home runs, which ranks fourth in the American League and matches the 2000 club for the most in Athletics history after 59 games (had 88 after 60 games in 2000)...home runs have accounted for 135 of the A's 247 runs (54.7%)...are 24-23 when homering, 2-10 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is third worst in the AL...A's pitchers allowed four home runs Wednesday...have surrendered 14 home runs in the last six games and 20 in the last 10... however, have yielded just 66 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (KC, 65)...the A's are 20-9 when out-homering the opponent, 6-24 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's struck out 13 times Wednesday, the 30th time in 59 games this year they have fanned 10 or more times...had 33 games with 10 or more strikeouts all last year...have struck out 140 times in the last 13 games (10.8 per game)...have 540 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 630).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in their last four games but have made 59 errors for the season, which is 37.2% more than the next closest teams (BOS and MIL, 43)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 41 unearned runs (ATL, 36)...have seven outfield assists, which is tied with Boston for the fewest in the American League... have allowed a ML leading 51 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 46)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (7).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (86-for-392) over the last 12 games, including .171 (14-for-82) with runners in scoring position...for the season, rank last in the majors in batting with RISP (.213) and last in the American League in batting average (.235)...have the second fewest runs scored in the AL (247) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.302)...have collected at least four extra base hits in each of the last five games (15 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs) and have 197 for the season, which is tied with Tampa Bay for second most in the AL (HOU, 212)...are tied for fourth in doubles (105)...rank last in the majors in batting with the based loaded (.179)...leadoff hitters are second to last in the majors in batting average (.176) and on-base percentage (.258) to Kansas City (.169/.198).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.59 ERA (87 er in 140.0 ip) over the last 16 games...now have a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...lead the AL in hit batters (26) and are tied for the lead in wild pitches (33)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.402).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-19 with a 4.65 ERA (116 er in 222.2 ip) over the last 41 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 19-24 with a 4.40 ERA for the season...the losses are third most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.391) and have the third lowest opponents batting average (.243)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (37).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 13-12 (.520) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 13-21 (.382) in games decided by three runs or more...have the second worst record in the American League in games decided by three runs or more (KC, 12-20/.375)...are 5-7 (.417) in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 12 one-run games are tied with Chicago and Minnesota for the fewest in the AL and the record is tied for third worst...have a run differential of -59, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-5 following an off day, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 3-9 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have used 56 different lineups in 59 games...rank fourth in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (32) and tied for third in runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11)...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is third fastest in the AL but second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

LET'S PLAY TWO: The A's and Rays will face each other in a double-header for the first time tomorrow...the only other American League team Oakland has never faced in a twinbill is Houston...it will be the A's first scheduled doubleheader since July 16, 2011 against Los Angeles-AL (L, 2-4; W, 4-3) and their first scheduled DH on the road since May 26, 2001 at Minnesota (W, 5-4; L, 6-7)...the A's split their last doubleheader on May 7, 2014 against Seattle in Oakland (L, 4-6; W, 2-0)...are 0-4-5 over their last nine doubleheaders...have not swept a doubleheader since Aug. 22, 1998 against Detroit.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's won the season series last year, 5-2...it was their second season series win in the last three years and the fourth in the last six...won three of four in Oakland and two of three at Tampa Bay... were outscored by the Rays 27-24...each of the last four A's wins were one-run victories...are 25-17 (.595) against Tampa Bay dating back to 2011...all-time, the A's are 101-63 (.616) against the Rays, which is the

best record by any American League team against Tampa Bay...it is the third best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 56-25 in Oakland and 45-38 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is tied for fourth in the American League with a careerhigh 16 home runs...leads AL first baseman in on-base percentage (.390) and slugging percentage (.669), is tied for second in home runs (16) and ranks third in batting (.299) and RBI (34)...**Khris Davis** hit his 17th home run of the season Sunday, which is tied for second in the majors...has 59 home runs over the last two years, which are the most in the majors (Cruz, 57)...**Ryon Healy** has four home runs in his last five games and 13 for the season, which matches his career high from last year...is the fourth player in Oakland history to hit 10 home runs in each of his first two Major League seasons.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in **1991** Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

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TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (5-5, 3.36 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 7.20 ERA (12 er in 15.0 ip) and .359 (23-for-64) opponents batting average over his last three starts... the losing streak is the longest of his career...has allowed six runs in each of the three starts...his streak of three consecutive starts with six or more runs matches the longest by an Athletic over the last eight years (Gray, May 3-15, 2016)...went 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has allowed 11 unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the majors (Holland, CWS) and tied for the most by an A's pitcher over the last eight years...the last A's pitcher to allow more than 11 unearned runs in a season is Vin Mazzaro in 2010 (12)...opponents have reached on an error six times, which is tied for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Gsellman, NYM 7).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA (21 er in 36.2 ip) in seven starts at home...last year, he was 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road and 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA (18 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 4-2 with a 1.07 ERA (5 er in 42.0 ip) in seven starts with five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .194 (19-for-98) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (40-for-138) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...also ranks seventh with a .167 (5-for-30) average against the clean-up hitter...opponents are hitting .197 (13-for-66) with two outs but he has surrendered four of his six home runs in that situation.

ON THE BASES: Opponents have stolen 11 bases with him on the mound, which is second most in the majors (Glasnow, PIT 12)...that is already the most steals against an A's pitcher over the last three years...opponents have been caught stealing with him on the mound four times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (21.0 ip) after surrendering just one long ball over his first seven starts (40.2 ip)...has yielded two grand slams, which is tied for the most in the majors (Chacin, SD).

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 14.73 ERA (6 er in 3.2 ip) and .450 (9-for-20) opponents batting average in one start in June...went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of May after going 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts in April...tied for fifth in the American League in May losses (3)...his four wins in April match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)... his April ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015).

EARNED RUNS: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no earned runs four times...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his team-leading 12th start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his 11 starts and walked one batter or fewer six times...has walked one batter or fewer 13 of his 17 career starts...has issued six of his 17 walks in the first inning...has 16 runs of support in his last eight starts after receiving 16 runs of support in his first three...is tied for fifth in the AL in hit batters (4) and ranks seventh in fewest pitches per game (90.5)...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...won each of his first three starts this year to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts since Tommy Milone in 2013.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) *April* 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned... won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City *April* 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on *April* 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits

over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...surrendered five runs in the third inning, including a Motter grand slam...picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston April 29...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings... was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Detroit on May 5 in Oakland. was charged with two unearned runs in the third inning and allowed a base loaded three-run triple to Adduci in the sixth...picked up his fifth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Los Angeles (AL) *May 10* in Oakland... walked the first three batters he faced to match his career high in walks... tossed a career-high 105 pitches...had his first no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on May 16...allowed a two-out solo home run to Cruz in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-3 loss to Boston May 21 in Oakland...matched his career highs in runs (6) and walks (3)...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 9-5 loss at New York (AL) May 28... matched his career high by allowing six runs but only one was earned. the five unearned runs match the most by an A's pitcher over the last eight seasons (last: Milone on June 30, 2012 vs. Texas)...surrendered four unearned runs in the third as a Joyce error preceded a Judge grand slam.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss to Washington a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a career high nine hits and matched his career highs in runs (6) and home runs (2)...allowed solo home runs in the second and third innings to Taylor and Murphy...the A's scored two in the bottom of the third to tie the game but he allowed four runs in the fourth inning for the loss...Wieters had a RBI double and Turner and Murphy had RBI singles before the bullpen allowed an inherited runner to score.

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's... the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23... compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...his opponents batting average included a .235 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

Game 1: RHP Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.68 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...had a no decision in his last start, an 11-10 A's loss to Washington on Sunday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 2-2 with a 4.22 ERA (42.2 ip, 44 h, 24 r, 20 er, 11 bb, 31 so) in seven career starts against Tampa Bay... including 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA in three starts at Tropicana Field.

Game 2: LHP Sean Manaea (5-3, 3.81 ERA): Is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA and .180 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the winning streak is a career high...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over Toronto last Monday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 7 so)... had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Rays, a start in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win in Oakland last year on July 22 (8.0 ip, 5 h, 7 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-9, 4.95 ERA (107 er in 194.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 12-for-19 (63.1%)

- The bullpen has compiled a 6.62 ERA (39 er in 53.0 ip) over the last 16 games and now has a 4.95 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.24).
- Has converted each of its four save opportunities over the last 20 games after tallying four blown saves over a five-game stretch from May 12-16...have 12 saves for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL... have 19 save opportunities, which is third fewest.
- Has allowed just one first batter home run, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.274).
