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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-34) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (32-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-3 over the last six games but are 4-9 over the last 13 contests...are 26-34 (.433) for the season, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are a season-high tying eight games under .500 for the third time this year (last: 24-32 on June 4)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16 games...that is ½ game short of the season high of 16½ (twice, last on June 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 19 days in fifth... have not swept a series this year and now have a streak of 25 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year (includes this series)...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City.

LET'S PLAY TWO: The A's and Rays will face each other in a doubleheader for the first time today...that will leave Houston as the only American League team Oakland has never faced in a twinbill...it will be the A's first scheduled doubleheader since July 16, 2011 against Los Angeles-AL (L, 2-4; W, 4-3) and their first scheduled DH on the road since May 26, 2001 at Minnesota (W, 5-4; L, 6-7)...the A's split their last doubleheader on May 7, 2014 against Seattle in Oakland (L, 4-6; W, 2-0)...are 0-4-5 over their last nine doubleheaders...have not swept a doubleheader since Aug. 22, 1998 against Detroit.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 8-21 (.276) on the road compared to 18-13 (.581) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-24/.273)...are 0-1 on this six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (0-1) and Miami (two games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 19 of the last 24 road games...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they also dropped seven in a row...have not lost more than seven straight road series since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they lost nine in a row...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1)...the series loss to Washington was the A's first home series loss since dropping a rain-shortened two-game series with Houston, April 14-15...have won 16 of the last 24 home games...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

THE LONG BALL...: The A's allowed five home runs last night after yielding four on Wednesday...this marks just the second time over the last 35 years the A's have allowed four or more home runs in back-to-back games (Aug. 8-10, 2012)...the nine home runs in two games match the most in consecutive games in Oakland history (Aug. 8-10, 2012 and April 11-12, 1985)...have allowed five or more home runs in a game three times this year, which is tied for the most in Athletics history (fifth time, last: 1996)... have surrendered 19 home runs in the last seven games and 25 in the last 11...allowed just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...the A's are 20-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 6-25 when they don't...the A's have hit 88 home runs, which ranks fourth in the AL and matches the 2000 club for the most in Athletics history after 60 games (had 89 after 61 and 62 games in 2000)...home runs have accounted for 136 of the A's 251 runs (54.2%)...are 24-24 when homering, 2-10 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is third worst in the AL

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out at least 10 times in each of the last three games and in 31 of the 60 games this year...had 33 games with 10 or more strikeouts all last year...have struck out 150 times in the last 14 games (10.7 per game)...have 550 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 636).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in their last five games but have made 59 errors for the season, which is 34.1% more than the next closest team (MIL, 44)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 41 unearned runs (ATL, 36)...have eight outfield assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League (BOS, 7)...have allowed a ML leading 55 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 48)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (7).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .216 (92-for-425) over the last 13 games, including .182 (16-for-88) with runners in scoring position...for the season, rank last in the majors in batting with RISP (.214) and last in the American League in batting average (.234)...have the second fewest runs scored in the AL (251) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.302)...have collected at least four extra base hits in each of the last six games (18 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs), which is their longest such streak since

a nine-game streak from June 8-17, 2007...have 201 extra base hits for the season, which is third most in the AL...rank last in the majors in batting with the based loaded (.179)...leadoff hitters are second to last in the majors in batting average (.174) and on-base percentage (.261) to Kansas City (.166/.195).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high tying 13 runs last night (also June 2 vs. Washington)...now have a 6.08 ERA (100 er in 148.0 ip) over the last 17 games and a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and fifth highest in the majors...lead the AL in hit batters (26) and wild pitches (34).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-5 with a 6.40 ERA (41 er in 57.2 ip) over the last 11 games and have surrendered 13 home runs... however, have allowed just 40 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (LAD, STL)...are 19-25 with a 4.57 ERA...the losses are tied for second most in the American League and the ERA is fourth highest...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.400) and have the third lowest opponents batting average (.246).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 13-12 (.520) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 13-22 (.371) in games decided by three runs or more...have the second worst record in the American League in games decided by three runs or more (KC, 12-21/.364)...are 5-7 (.417) in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 12 one-run games are tied with Chicago and Minnesota for the fewest in the AL and the record is tied for third worst...have a run differential of -68, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-9 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have used 57 different lineups in 60 games...rank fourth in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (32) and in runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11)...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is tied for third fastest in the AL but second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night after winning the season series last year, 5-2...it was their second season series win in the last three years and the fourth in the last six...won three of four in Oakland and two of three at Tampa Bay...were outscored by the Rays 27-24... each of the last four A's wins were one-run victories...are 25-18 (.581) against Tampa Bay dating back to 2011...all-time, the A's are

101-64 (.612) against the Rays, which is the best record by any American League team against Tampa Bay...it is the fourth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 56-25 in Oakland and 45-39 at Tropicana Field.

Yonder Alonso leads American League first baseman in on-base percentage (.383) and slugging percentage (.656) and ranks third in batting (.299), home runs (16) and RBI (34)...*Khris Davis* has 59 home runs over the last two years, which are the most in the majors (Cruz, 57)... *Ryon Healy* has four home runs in his last six games and 13 for the season, which matches his career high from last year...*Jed Lowrie* had his fourth two-double game in his last 15 games last night and now has 20 doubles for the season, which are the most in the AL.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park grand slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in **1992** Mark McGwire hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco...in **1997** Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder.

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TODAY'S GAME 1 STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.68 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...began the season on the 10day DL with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)... made two rehab starts before he was reinstated.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 6.35 ERA (16 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts at night...has allowed all five of his home runs at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.92 ERA (8 er

in 24.2 ip) and .202 (18-for-89) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 7.02 ERA (13 er in 16.2 ip) and .284 (19-for-67) opponents average in three starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-0 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 5.32 ERA (14 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) in the first and second inning and a 6.26 ERA (19 er in 27.1 ip) from the third inning on... has surrendered all five of his home runs in the third through fifth innings.

THIS AND THAT: Ranks fifth among American League pitchers in putouts (8)...is 4-12 with a 5.93 ERA (87 er in 132.0 ip) over his last 25 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career...has issued nine of his 13 walks to left-handed hitters...four of the five home runs he has allowed have been solo shots... has a .158 (9-for-57) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .316 (18-for-57) with four of his five home runs the second time through and .238 (10-for-42) with one home run after that...opponents are 11-for-22 (.500) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

REHAB: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit May 7 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Castellanos in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...yielded RBI singles to Cabrera and Martinez and was relieved by Dull who allowed a third run to score on a wild pitch.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas May 13... allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston May 18 in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win.

FIFTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami May 24 in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland May 30...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time in his last 23 starts he has allowed seven runs...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brantley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss to Washington last Sunday in Oakland...shut out the Nationals on one hit and two walks over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two-run triple to Turner and he scored on a Goodwin sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh to get Gray off the hook...was relieved by Madson to start the eighth and he allowed three runs for the loss.

GRAY vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.22 ERA (42.2 ip, 44 h, 24 r, 20 er, 11 bb, 31 so) in seven career starts... has allowed nine career home runs, which are his most against any team...eight have come in his last three starts (18.2 ip)...is 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA (16 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (4 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts at

Tampa Bay...went 0-1 with a 8.44 ERA (10.2 ip, 15 h, 13 r, 10 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 5 hr) in two starts last year...the no decision came in a 7-6 A's win at Tampa Bay May 15...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...had a 1-0 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Guyer in the bottom of the first...Guyer added a three-run home run in the second and a sacrifice fly in the fourth...surrendered a leadoff home run to Longoria in the fifth and left with two outs in the sixth and the A's trailing 6-4...then took the loss in a 7-3 decision on July 21 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven runs...yielded a RBI single to Dickerson in the first and a solo home run to Beckham in the second but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the second to take a 3-2 lead...he surrendered a game-tying home run to Dickerson in the fourth and four more runs in the fifth inning on a Forsythe RBI double, RBI singles by Miller and Longoria and a sacrifice fly by Dickerson.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 49 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

TODAY'S GAME 2 STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (5-3, 3.81 ERA)

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .180 (16-for-89) opponents batting average over his last four starts... the winning streak is a career high and an A's season high...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts... has walked just five batters in 25.0 innings during the winning streak (1.80 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his 10 starts this year...also surrendered five hits or fewer in each of his final six starts last year...has a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more...that is tied for the third longest such streak by

a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter over his last six starts (0-for-20)...for the season, left-handers are hitting .053 (2-for-38) compared to .210 (33-for-157) by right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings... one of the two hits by a lefty was a home run (Gallo on April 9 at Texas)... his career splits are .145 (20-for-138) against lefties. .249 (150-for-602) against righties...held lefties to a .180 batting average last year, which was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .526 OPS against lefties last year, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .143 (6-for-42) with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .192 with RISP, which was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...opponents are 7-for-111 (.063) with two strikes...they are 5-for-46 (.109) when leading of an inning but he has walked seven and hit three for a .268 on-base percentage...has held the opponents three and four hitters to a .082 (4-for-49) batting average...has a .241 (19-for-79) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .138 (16-for-116) after that...has a .135 (17-for-126) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .261 (18-for-69) average with 15 of his 21 opponents RBI with two outs.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 3-0 with a 2.00 ERA (4 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts against American League East teams compared to 2-3 with a 4.71 ERA (19 er in 36.1 ip) in seven starts against everyone else.


