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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-35) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (33-32)

SUNDAY, JUNE 11, 2017 — TROPICANA FIELD — 1:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's split a doubleheader yesterday and are now 4-4 over the last eight games...however, are 5-10 over the last 15 contests and are 27-35 (.435) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...are eight games under .500 which is one short of the season high of nine established after the first game of the doubleheader (26-35)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 16½ games (twice, last on June 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's collected a season-high 16 hits in both games yesterday and the 32 hits set an Oakland record for most hits in a doubleheader (previous: 29 on July 30, 1983 at California...went 32-for-87 (.368) to boost the season batting average six points to .240...that is the third lowest batting average in the American League...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.306) and are tied for the third fewest runs scored (263)...have collected at least three extra base hits in each of the last nine games (23 doubles, 1 triple, 15 home runs) and have 208 extra base hits for the season, which is third most in the AL...rank last in the majors in batting with the bases loaded (.163) and have the third lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the AL (.223)...leadoff hitters are second to last in the majors in batting average (.178) and on-base percentage (.261) to Kansas City (.172/.203).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 9-22 (.290) on the road compared to 18-13 (.581) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-25/.265)...are 1-2 on this six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (1-2) and Miami (two games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 20 of the last 26 road games...have lost each of the previous seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they also dropped seven in a row...have not lost more than seven straight road series since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they lost nine in a row...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1)...the series loss to Washington was the A's first home series loss since dropping a rain-shortened two-game series with Houston, April 14-15...have won 16 of the last 24 home games...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 91 home runs, which ranks fourth in the American League and is the most in Athletics history after 62 games...the 2000 club had 89 (had 90 after 63 games)...home runs have accounted for 140 of the A's 263 runs (53.2%)...are 25-24 when homering, 2-11 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is tied for second worst in the majors (DET, 1-15)...the pitching staff has surrendered 26 home runs in the last 12 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...has 72 home runs for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have allowed five or more home runs in a game three times this year, which is tied for the most in Athletics history (fifth time, last: 1996)...the A's are 21-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 6-26 when they don't

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's struck out 13 times in the second game of the doubleheader last night and have fanned at least 10 times in 32 of the 62 games this year...had 33 games with 10 or more strikeouts all last year...have 571 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 659)...the pitching staff had a season-high 15 strikeouts in the first game of the doubleheader yesterday.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in their last seven games but have made 61 errors for the season, which is 35.6% more than the next closest team (ATL and MIL, 45)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 44 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...have eight outfield assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League (BOS, 7)...have allowed a ML leading 56 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 48)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (7).

PITCHING: The A's allowed eight runs in the doubleheader after yielding a season-high tying 13 runs Friday night (also June 2 vs. Washington)...now have a 5.69 ERA (105 er in 166.0 ip) over the last 19 games and a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 4.77)...lead the AL in hit batters (27) and wild pitches (36).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 5.73 ERA (45 er in 70.2 ip) over the last 13 games and have surrendered 14 home runs...however, have allowed just 41 home runs for the season, which is the few-

est in the American League and third fewest in the majors (LAD and STL, 40)...are 20-25 with a 4.50 ERA...the losses are third most in the AL...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.248).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 13-13 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 14-22 (.389) in games decided by three runs or more...have the third worst record in the American League in games decided by three runs or more...are 5-8 (.385) in one-run games, including 1-6 on the road...the 13 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL (CWS, 12) and the record is third worst...have a run differential of -64, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-7 on Sunday, which is the worst record in the majors...are 4-10 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have used 59 different lineups in 61 games...the combined time of game for yesterday's doubleheader was 7 hours and 2 minutes, which was the A's longest doubleheader by time since May 26, 2001 at Minnesota (7:48)...are now averaging 3:07 per game, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...rank fourth in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (34) and fifth in runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11).

THE DRAFT: The 2017 First-Year Player Draft begins tomorrow night at 7:00 pm EDT...the A's will have three selections on Day 1...will have the sixth overall pick in the first round (approx. 7:38 pm), the third pick (33rd overall) in Competitive Balance Lottery Round A (approx. 10:04 pm) and their second round pick (approx. 10:31 pm)...this marks the second consecutive A's selected sixth...drafted LHP A.J. Puk from Florida last year...the draft resumes Tuesday at 1:00 pm EDT with rounds 3-10 and concludes Wednesday starting at 12:00 pm EDT with rounds 11-40.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have lost two of the first three meetings of 2017 after winning the season series last year, 5-2...it was their second season series win in the last three years and the fourth in the last six...won three of four in Oakland and two of three at Tampa Bay...were outscored by the Rays 27-24...are 26-19 (.578) against Tampa Bay dating back to 2011...all-time, the A's are 102-65 (.611) against the Rays, which is the best record by any American League team against Tampa Bay...it is the fourth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 56-25 in Oakland and 46-40 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Yonder Alonso went 7-for-10 in the doubleheader yesterday and is the second player in Oakland history to collect seven hits in one day (Josh Reddick, May 7, 2016 vs. Baltimore)...**Khris Davis** is 11-for-25 (.440) with eight runs, three doubles, a home run and eight RBI over his last six games...**Ryon Healy** hit his career high 14th home run of the season last night...**Jed Lowrie** has four two-double games in his last 16 games and has 21 doubles for the season, which are the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1978, at the age of 18 years, 246 days, Mike Morgan becomes the youngest pitcher to start a game for the Oakland A's...he goes the distance, allowing 10 hits against Baltimore, but takes the loss in a 3-0 decision...Morgan's honor is short lived as Tim Conroy, at the age of 18 years, 81 days, gets a start 12 days later...in 1995 Mark McGwire hits three home runs in the A's 8-1 win at Boston after hitting two home runs the day before...his five home runs in consecutive games tied a major league record which he already shared...in 1999 Miguel Tejada hits three home runs in a game against Los Angeles to tie the Athletics record...he is the only Athletics shortstop to hit three home runs in a game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-4, 3.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start since being reinstated from the 10-day disabled list last Tuesday...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton May 31 against Lancaster and had a no decision in the Ports 3-2 win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 75 pitches)...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his last eight appearances.

ROAD LOSING STREAK: Has not won a road game over the last two years and is 0-6 with a 5.57 ERA (32 er in 51.2 ip) over his last 10 games (nine starts) on the road...the six-game road losing streak matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last with a longer streak is Ariel Prieto, who had a nine-game road losing streak from April 29, 1997 to Sept. 24, 2000...his last road win came on June 15, 2015 at San Diego.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 4.58 ERA (9 er in 17.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) in five games on the road...has not allowed a home run in 38.0 innings on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 7-5 with a 3.30 ERA (41 er in 111.2 ip) in 19 starts in Oakland, 3-9 with a 4.86 ERA (47 er in 87.0 ip) in 16 games on the road.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win in his last start to snap his losing streak at a career-high tying three games (fourth time, last: June 3, 2016-April 13, 2017)...posted a 5.70 ERA and .306 opponents average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 30 to May 23...is now 1-3 with a 4.55 ERA (15 er in 29.2 ip) and .308 (37-for-120) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .174 opponents batting average over his first four games (three starts).

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run over his last seven starts and has a 38.2-inning, 170-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just one home run in 55.2 innings, an average of 0.16 per nine innings...his innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with one home run or fewer...the lone home run came on April 19 against Texas, a solo shot by Gallo to lead off the fifth inning.

NIGHT AND DAY: Picked up the win in his last start Tuesday to snap a seven-game losing streak in night games...it was his first win at night since June 15, 2015 at San Diego and his first ever night win in the Coliseum...in his career, he is 9-4 with a 2.39 ERA (28 er in 105.1 ip) in 17 day games, 8-14 with a 4.59 ERA (85 er in 166.2 ip) in 31 night games.

SUPPORT: Received four runs of support in his last start after getting just four runs of support over his previous six starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his nine starts, including no runs four times, and has a season run support average of 2.91 (18 rs in 55.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 18 of his 34 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his six starts this year (April 25 and May 12).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed his only home run and issued 13 of his 19 walks to left-handed hitters...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed over the last two years have been hit by lefties...opponents are 15-for-47 (.319) with runners in scoring position but they are 4-for-17 (.235) with RISP and two outs...has a .320 (54-for-169) average with RISP in his three seasons with the A's...has a .285 (45-for-158) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .148 (8-for-54) after that.

MONTH BY MONTH: Did not allow an earned run and picked up the win in his first start in June...went 0-2 with a 6.11 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May after going 1-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in five games in April...his May ERA was his highest in a month (min 5.0 ip).

THIS AND THAT: Has committed two errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers...also ranks tied for ninth in assists (9)...is tied for first in the AL in triples allowed (3) and tied for fourth in opponents reaching on an error (5)...has tossed more than six innings in just two of his nine starts this year and 13 of 46 in his career...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen bases attempts off him...are 11-for-12 (91.6%) over the last two years after going 5-for-10 (50.0%) over his first two.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Is his first appearance, he relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas **April 7**...entered the game trailing 8-3 and allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 3-1 A's loss at Kansas City **April 13**...left trailing 3-0 and Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on **April 19** in Oak-

land, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on **April 25**...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Houston **April 30**...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win over Detroit **May 6** in Oakland...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas **May 12**...allowed just one run in seven innings and left with a 2-1 lead...Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle **May 17**...allowed a run in the first inning and three more in the fifth inning...the A's were shutout on two hits by Bergman and Pazos...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-9 loss to Miami on **May 23** in Oakland...tossed just 2.0 innings as he left the game early with a strained right triceps.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Toronto last Wednesday in Oakland...surrendered just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work...had a 1-0 lead enter the fourth inning, which started with a Ryon Healy error...allowed a RBI single to Tulowitzki and loaded the bases with one out before Goins grounded into an inning-ending double play...the A's scored once more in the fifth and twice in the sixth for the win.

HAHN vs. TAMPA BAY: Had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 3-2 win on July 24, 2016 in Oakland...shutout the Rays on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had a 2-0 lead entering the eighth...allowed a one-out single to Kiermaier and retired the next batter before he was relieved by Dull...Dull allowed a two-run home run to Forsythe for the blown save but the A's scored once in the bottom of the eighth for the win.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...his opponents batting average included a mark of .273 against right-handed hitters compared to .361 against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville.

RHP Jharel Cotton (3-6, 5.20 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 4.15 ERA in three starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...has allowed a .169 opponents batting average but has walked 11 batters in 17.1 innings (5.71 per nine innings)...is 0-3 with a 6.04 ERA over his last four starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA over his first six starts...the losing streak is the longest of his career...is 2-3 with a 2.83 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 7.76 ERA and .292 opponents average in five starts in Oakland...has allowed six of his nine home runs in Oakland...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's loss to Toronto last Wednesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Marlins or pitched in an interleague game...is a .222 career hitter in the minors with three runs, two triples, six RBI, a walk, 10 strikeouts and a sacrifice hit.

- Tossed 0.2 scoreless innings in his first outing against Tampa Bay this year in Game 1 last night and now has a 1.69 ERA (1 er in 5.1 ip) in five career outings against the Rays.
