### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-36) VS. MIAMI MARLINS (27-35)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost four of the last five games and 11 of the last 16...are a season-high tying nine games under .500 at 27-36 (.429)...that is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 14th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16 games, which is ½-game short of the season high of 16½ (four times, last: June 11)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 22 days in fifth...have not swept a series this year and now have a streak of 25 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 2-3 in interleague play (1-1 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. Washington)...in addition to this two-game series, the A's will also travel to New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...will host Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1)...have allowed 40 runs in five interleague games for an 8.00 ERA (40 er in 45.0 ip), which is the highest in the majors (PHI, 7.74)...the offense leads the majors in slugging percentage (.566), ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.356) and fifth in batting average (.277)...are 200-169 (.542) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers went 0-for-21 with 13 strikeouts and three sacrifice hits last year and are now 0 for their last 24 since Scott Kazmir singled on June 16, 2015 at San Diego...are 1-for-61 over the previous three seasons and 7-for-137 (.051) over the previous seven...have a .078 (29-for-370) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 175 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .085)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's lost three of four at Tampa Bay to start the road trip and have now lost eight consecutive road series for the first time since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they lost nine in a row...are 9-23 (.281) on the road compared to 18-13 (.581) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-27/.250)...are 1-3 on this six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (two games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip and have lost 21 of the last 27 road games...return home following the game tomorrow for an eight-game homestand against New York-AL (four games) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1) and have won 16 of the last 24 home games...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-9-0 in road series.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 62 errors, which is 15 more than any other team (BOS, 47)...Daniel Coulombe had an error on Sunday, which was the ninth by an A's pitcher this year...that is the most in the American League and it matches the A's season total from last year...the 62 errors have led to a ML leading 45 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...have allowed a ML leading 56 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 48)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (7).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .342 (42-for-123) over the last three games, which includes an Oakland record 32 hits in the doubleheader on Saturday at Tampa Bay...that has boosted the season batting average six points to .240, but that is third lowest in the American League...have the second lowest on-base percentage (.306) and the third fewest runs scored (267)...rank fourth in extra base hits (210)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.224)...leadoff hitters are second to last in the majors in batting average (.182) and on-base percentage (.264) to Kansas City (.169/.200).

**BASES LOADED:** The A's are 2-for-20 (.100) with a home run, two walks and a sacrifice fly with the bases loaded over their last 35 games...are 7-for-45 (.156) with 20 RBI with the bases load for the season...the batting average and RBI are the lowest in the majors as is the A's .196 on-base percentage...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.267).

**THE LONG BALL...:** The A's have hit just five home runs in the last six games but have 91 for the season...that ranks fourth in the American League and is the most in Athletics history after 63 games...the 2000 club had 90 (also had 90 after 64 games)...home runs have accounted for 140 of the A's 267 runs (52.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 25-24 when homering, 2-12 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is tied for second worst in the majors (DET, 1-15)...the pitching staff has surrendered 27 home runs in the last 14 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...the A's are 21-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 6-27 when they don't

**...AND THE STRIKEOUT:** A's hitters have reached double figures in strikeouts in five of the last six games and 33 of 63 games this year...had 33 games with 10 or more strikeouts all last year...have 581 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 667).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.64 ERA (109 er in 174.0 ip) over the last 20 games and have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL in hit batters (27) and are tied with Houston for the lead in wild pitches (36).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 5.71 ERA (48 er in 75.2 ip) over the last 14 games and have surrendered 14 home runs... however, have allowed just 41 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (STL, 40)...are 20-25 with a 4.51 ERA...the losses are third most in the AL...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.403) and have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.250)...tomorrow, Daniel Gossett will become the 10th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year...it will be the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 2-6 following an off day, which is the worst record in the American League and tied with Philadelphia for second worst in the majors (STL, 2-10)...are 4-10 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have lost each of their last four one-run games and are 5-9 (.357) for the season...that is the second worst record in the AL (TEX, 4-10)...are 1-7 in one-run games on the road...have a run differential of -65, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors... have used 60 different lineups in 63 games...are averaging 3:07 per game, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...rank fourth in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (34) and fifth in runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

**A's vs. MARLINS:** The season series is even at 1-1 as the two clubs split a two-game series in Oakland May 23-24...the A's lead the all-time series 8-6...are 4-4 in Oakland and 4-2 in Miami...including 3-0 at Marlins Park... prior to this year, last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series at Miami, June 27-29.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yonder Alonso** ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.655) and OPS (1.056), fourth in on-base percentage (.401), tied for eighth in home runs (16), ninth in batting average (.310) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (27)...**Khris Davis** has three straight multiple hit games (7-for-15, .467) and is 13-for-30 (.433) with eight runs and nine RBI over his last eight games...**Ryon Healy** is 13-for-35 (.371) with eight runs, four doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI over his last nine games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw goes 4 for 5 with a home run and three RBI and tosses a complete game five-hitter in the A's 14-1 win over St. Louis in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Jim Nash, Paul Lindblad and Ed Sprague combine to shutout the Cleveland Indians 1-0 in 11 innings...it is the A's third straight shutout...in **1992** Carney Lansford homers off Texas pitcher Bobby Witt for the 2000th hit of his major league career.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (3-6, 5.20 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 0-2 with a 4.15 ERA (8 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...has allowed a .169 (10-for-59) opponents batting average but has walked 11 batters in 17.1 innings (5.71 per nine innings)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...issued 16 free passes in 38.0 innings during his first stint (3.79 per nine innings).

**THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-3 with a 6.04 ERA (15 er in 22.1 ip) over his last four starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA over his first six starts...the losing streak is the longest of his career.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Has six losses, which is tied for sixth most in the American League...also ranks fourth in unearned runs (8) and tied for fifth in wild pitches (5)...opponents have been caught stealing four times with him on the mound, which is tied for second most in the AL...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (55.1), strikeouts (48) and games started (10) and third in wins (3).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-3 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .206 (21-for-102) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 7.76 ERA (23 er in 26.2 ip) and .292 (31-for-106) opponents average in five starts in Oakland...has allowed six of his nine home runs in Oakland...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is scheduled to make his first career interleague appearance.

**WITH THE BAT:** Has never batted as a Major Leaguer...hit .222 (6-for-27) with three runs, two triples, six RBI, a walk, 10 strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in the minors with the Dodgers organization.

**BY INNING:** Has allowed 13 runs in the second inning (10.0 ip, 11.70 ERA), which is tied for the most in the American League (Manaea, OAK and Quintana, CWS)...has six home runs, which is tied for the most in the majors (Anderson, COL)...has an 8.55 ERA (19 er in 20.0 ip), a .309 (25-for-81) opponents batting average and has yielded eight of his nine home runs in the first and second inning...has a 3.31 ERA (13 er in 35.1 ip) and .213 (27-for-127) opponents average from the third inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .210 (26-for-124) with the bases empty, .310 (26-for-84) with runners on base...however, six of his nine home runs allowed have been solo shots as have nine of his 13 career home runs...opponents are 18-for-50 (.360) with runners in scoring position...seven of the nine home runs he has allowed have come with two outs...the opponents number five hitter is 4-for-27 (.148).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-2 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) and .169 (21-for-124) opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 0-4 with an 9.47 ERA (20 er in 19.0 ip) and .369 (31-for-84) opponents average in four starts at night...is now 5-2 with a 2.54 ERA (14 er in 49.2 ip) in eight career starts during the day compared to 0-4 with a 6.43 ERA (25 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts at night.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 1-4 with a 6.25 ERA (22 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed eight home runs in his last five starts (28.1 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 27 batters in 55.1 innings this year (4.39 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has received seven runs of support in his six losses (30.1 ip, 2.08 RSA) and 12 runs of support in his three wins (19.0 ip, 5.68 RSA).

**2017 START-BY-START:** He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **April 5** in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City **April 10**...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on **April 17** in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...retired 12 straight at one point...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle **April 22** in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning and a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston **April 28**...allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Gurriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single...

was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota **May 4**...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a pair of solo home runs in the bottom of the second to Rosario and Santana...also yielded an unearned run in the fourth inning when Rosario scored on a Gimenez single and Jaff Decker error...left after six innings with a 6-3 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **May 9** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the first and the A's scored twice in the bottom of the first to take a 2-1 lead...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Revere and a three-run home run to Escobar in the second...yielded two more runs in the fourth inning on a Pennington RBI single and a Escobar RBI ground out...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at New York (AL) **May 27**...tossed a career-high 107 pitches...did not allow a hit over the first five innings, but surrendered a run in the first when Sanchez walked, went to second on a Holliday hit by pitch, third on a wild pitch and scored on a Castro sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth but he allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the bottom of the sixth for the loss...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 8-0 loss at Cleveland **June 1**...issued a career-high tying four walks and allowed five runs, but only one was earned...yielded just one run over the first five innings when Robertson doubled, went to third on a passed ball and scored on a wild pitch...was charged with four unearned runs in the sixth inning due to two Healy errors...the A's were shutout on three hits by Kluber and three Indians relievers.

**LAST START:** He had his first no decision of the season in the A's 7-5 loss to Toronto last Wednesday in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks for the second consecutive start...he allowed four runs in six innings of work, all in the second inning...Smoak led off the inning with a home run and Pillar added a three-run shot...walked Donaldson following the home run but then retired 13 of the final 15 batters he faced...was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the scored tied 4-4.

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13...surrendered two home runs...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win in his last start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win at Sacramento May 21...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

**2016 RECAP:** Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214) and tied for 10th in wins (11).

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Daniel Gossett (Major League Debut):** Will be selected from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranks sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231)...is tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 Nashville loss at Omaha on June 5 (7.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 so)...pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system last year and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151)...was the A's 2nd round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors.

- The A's bullpen is 0-4 with two saves, a blown save, a 7.03 ERA (19 er in 24.1 ip) and nine home runs allowed over the last eight games...now has a 4.96 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League.
- Has converted 12-of-20 (60.0%) save opportunities...has the third fewest save opportunities in the AL, the fourth fewest saves and is tied for the fourth lowest save percentage
- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the fourth lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.313) and is tied for the fourth most strikeouts (50).
- Have the fewest inherited runners in the AL (72), are tied for the fewest wins and rank second in most stolen bases allowed (22) .
