OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-37) VS. MIAMI MARLINS (28-35)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 14, 2017 — MARLINS PARK — 12:10 P.M. EDT RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (ML DEBUT) VS. RHP EDINSON VOLQUEZ (3-7, 3.41) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and 12 of the last 17 to fall a season-high 10 games under .500 at 27-37 (.422)...this marks the third consecutive season the A's have been at least 10 games under .500 after 64 games (27-37 last year, 25-39 in 2015)...have the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 15th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16 games for the second consecutive day...that is ½-game short of the season high of 16½ (four times, last: June 11)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 23 days in fiffth...with the lost last night, the A's extended their streak of consecutive series without a sweep to 26 dating back to last year...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-4 in interleague play (1-2 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. Washington)...in addition to this two-game series, the A's will also travel to New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...will host Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1)...have allowed 48 runs in six interleague games for an 8.15 ERA (48 er in 53.0 ip), which is the highest in the majors

(CLE, 7.08)...the offense ranks third in the majors in slugging percentage (.502)...are 200-170 (.541) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: Jharel Cotton went 0-for-2 with a strikeout last night and A's pitchers are now 0 for their last 26 since Scott Kazmir singled on June 16, 2015 at San Diego...are 1-for-63 over the last four seasons and 7-for-139 (.050) over the last eight...have a .078 (29-for-372) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 176 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .085)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's lost three of four at Tampa Bay to start the road trip and have now lost eight consecutive road series for the first time since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they lost nine in a row...are 9-24 (.273) on the road compared to 18-13 (.581) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-28/.243)...are 1-4 on this six-game road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-1)...went 2-5 on the last road trip and have lost 22 of the last 28 road games...return home following the game today for an eight-game homestand against New York-AL (four games) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1) and have won 16 of the last 24 home games... are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-9-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone errorless in six of their last nine games but have a Major League leading 62 errors for the season...that is 15 more than any other team (BOS, 47)...Daniel Coulombe had an error on Sunday, which was the ninth by an A's pitcher this year...that is the most in the American League and it matches the A's season total from last year...the 62 errors have led to a ML leading 45 unearned runs (ATL, 37)... had 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...have allowed a ML leading 56 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 50)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (7).

OFFENSE: The A's were held to three hits last night after collecting 42 hits over the previous three games...have the lowest batting average (.238) in the American League, the second fewest runs scored (268) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.304)...rank fourth in extra base hits (211)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.224)...leadoff hitters are second to last in the majors in batting average (.179) and on-base percentage (.260) to Kansas City (.174/.204).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 2-for-21 (.095) with a home run, two walks and a sacrifice fly with the bases loaded over their last 36 games...are 7-for-46 (.152) with 20 RBI with the bases load for the season...the batting

average and RBI are the lowest in the majors as is the A's .192 on-base percentage and .267 slugging percentage.

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have gone homerless in back-to-back games for the first time this year...have hit just five home runs in the last seven games but have 91 for the season...that ranks fourth in the American League and is the most in Athletics history after 64 games...the 2000 club had 90 (had 93 after 65 games)...home runs have accounted for 140 of the A's 268 runs (52.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 25-24 when homering, 2-13 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is second worst in the majors (DET, 1-15)...the pitching staff has surrendered 29 home runs in the last 15 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...the A's are 21-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 6-28 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: A's hitters have reached double figures in strikeouts in five of the last seven games and 33 of 64 games this year...had 33 games with 10 or more strikeouts all last year...have 590 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 676).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.79 ERA (117 er in 182.0 ip) over the last 21 games and have a 4.74 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL in hit batters (27) and are tied with Houston for the lead in wild pitches (36).

STARTING PITCHING: Daniel Gossett will become the 10th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year...this marks the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers...A's starting pitchers are 4-6 with a 5.91 ERA (53 er in 80.2 ip) over the last 15 games and have surrendered 16 home runs...however, have allowed just 43 home runs for the season, which is tied with St. Louis for the fewest in the majors...are 20-26 with a 4.58 ERA...the losses are tied for second most in the AL...rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.409).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-10 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have lost each of their last four one-run games and are 5-9 (.357) for the season...that is the second worst record in the AL (TEX, 4-10)...are 1-7 in one-run games on the road...have a run differential of -72, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors... have used 61 different lineups in 64 games...are averaging 3:07 per game, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...rank fifth in the majors in runs scored in the ninth inning (34) and sixth in runs allowed (31)...lead the majors in home runs in the ninth (11).

A's vs. MARLINS: The A's trail in the season series, 1-2...lost the first game in Miami last night after splitting a two-game series in Oakland May 23-24...the A's lead the all-time series 8-7...are 4-4 in Oakland and 4-3 in Miami...including 3-1 at Marlins Park...prior to this year, last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series at Miami, June 27-29.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.649) and OPS (1.052), fourth in on-base percentage (.403), tied for eighth in home runs (16) and ninth in batting average (.310)... **Khris Davis** has a seven-game hitting streak (11-for-29, .379) and is 14-for-34 (.412) with eight runs and nine RBI over his last nine games... **Ryon Healy** is 13-for-39 (.333) with eight runs, four doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI over his last 10 games... **Jed Lowrie** is batting .330 (30-for-91) with 11 doubles, a triple, three home runs and 12 RBI over his last 22 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1964** Jim Gentile drives in four runs, including the game winning home run in the top of the 10^{th} inning in a 6-5 win at Cleveland...in **1969** the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in **1975** Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...the last to win was Jharel Cotton last year on Sept. 7 against Los Angeles (AL)...the last to strike out 10 or more batters was Aaron Harang on May 25, 2002 against Tampa Bay...the last to toss at least seven innings was Rich Harden on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 49 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 15-16 record and a 3.82 ERA.

his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)... tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss... allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings... was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the Sounds 4-2 loss at Omaha on June 5...allowed two runs in the second inning on home runs by Jorge Soler and Bubba Starling...Nashville tied the game with two runs in the sixth but he allowed a Hunter Dozier RBI single in the bottom of the sixth for the loss...surrendered another run in the seventh on a RBI ground out.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7... then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13... was charged with two runs or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against righthanded hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties...six came with the bases empty...held the opposition to a .154 batting average when leading off an inning...issued just nine walks for a .203 on-base percentage in that situation...had a .225 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts, walked two batters or fewer 23 times and surrendered four hits or fewer 13 times.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors....is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.37 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...began the season on the 10-day DL with a strained right shoulder...is 2-0 with a 2.92 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.96 ERA and .301 opponents average in four starts on the road... has allowed four of his five home runs on the road...has held left-handed hitters to a .220 batting average compared to .286 against right-handed hitters...however, has issued nine of his 14 walks to left-handed hitters... has a 1.13 ERA in the first and second inning and a 6.03 ERA from the third inning on...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss at Tampa Bay in 10 innings in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday (6.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 10 so)...is 1-2 with a 4.44 ERA (24.1 ip, 23 h, 13 r, 12 er, 10 bb, 20 so, 1 hr) in four career starts against New York.

- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the third lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.321) and is tied for the fourth most strikeouts (50).
