OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-38) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (38-25)

THURSDAY, JUNE 15, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (2-2, 4.37) VS. LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (4-4, 3.55) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, six of the last seven and 13 of the last 18 games to fall a season-high 11 games under .500 at 27-38 (.415)...that is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the fifth worst mark in Oakland history after 65 games (were 27-38 last year, 26-39 in 2015)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 16th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 17 games...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have been 17 or more games out of first in the West before the end of June (1979, 2001, 2016)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 24 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 18-13 (.581) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-28/.243)...begin an eight-game homestand against New York-AL (four games) and Houston (four games) tonight...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1) and have won 16 of the last 24 home games...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is their longest such streak since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 63 errors, which is 16 more than any other team (BOS and TB, 47)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...nine of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...have eight outfield assists, which is tied with Minnesota for the fewest in the AL...have allowed a ML leading 57 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (7).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 11 runs yesterday at Miami, which was the sixth time in the last 22 games they have allowed 10 or more runs...have a 6.02 ERA (127 er in 190.0 ip) over that span and have a 4.83 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (29) and ranks second in wild pitches (36).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers went 1-3 with a 7.80 ERA (26 er in 30.0 ip), .344 (45-for-131) opponents batting average and eight home runs allowed in six games on the road trip...are now 20-27 with a 4.69 ERA for the season...rank second in the American League in most losses... have allowed 45 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.413)...yesterday, Daniel Gossett became the 10th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year...in the AL, only Seattle has used more starting pitchers (10)...this marks the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers...Gossett allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings for the loss and the runs allowed were the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his Major League debut.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .265 (103-for-389) with 61 runs scored over the last 11 games (5.5 runs per games) but are just 4-7 over that span...have the lowest batting average (.239) in the American League, the second fewest runs scored (274), the second lowest on-base percentage (.306) and the third most strikeouts (597)...rank fourth in extra base hits (216)...have the third lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.224)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.176) and second to last in on-base percentage (.256).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 2-for-22 (.091) with a home run, three walks and a sacrifice fly with the bases loaded over their last 37 games...are 7-for-47 (.149) with 21 RBI with the bases loaded for the season...the batting average and RBI are the lowest in the majors as is the A's .204 on-base percentage and .255 slugging percentage.

THE LONG BALL: Ryon Healy homered yesterday after the A's went homerless in back-to-back games on Sunday and Tuesday for the first time this year...have hit just six home runs in the last eight games but have 92 for the season...that ranks fourth in the American League and is second most in Athletics history after 65 games...the 2000 club had 93 (had 97 after 66 games) ...54 of the A's 92 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's rank third in the AL in home runs at home (NYY, 63; HOU, 55)...

home runs have accounted for 143 of the A's 274 runs (52.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 25-25 when homering, 2-13 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is second worst in the majors (DET, 1-16)...the pitching staff has surrendered 31 home runs in the last 16 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...the A's are 21-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 6-29 when they don't.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's will face a left-handed starting pitcher for just the third time in the last 18 games tonight...are 8-8 in games started by a left-handed pitcher, including 8-3 at home...are 19-30 against right-handers.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have a four-game series with New York followed by a four-game series with Houston...it marks the first time they have played back-to-back four game series since Aug. 7-14, 2014 (vs. MIN and at KC)...it is the first time the A's have played back-to-back four-game series on the same homestand since Sept. 17-24, 2009 (CLE and TEX)...the A's have played 26 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-10 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have lost each of their last four one-run games and are 5-9 (.357) for the season...that is the second worst record in the American League (TEX, 4-10)...are 4-2 in one-run games at home...have a run differential of -77, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have used 62 different lineups in 65 games...are averaging 3:07 per game, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...are average 3:15 in the month of June...have a 4-9 record in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lost two of three in New York at the end of May to open the season series...went 3-4 against the Yankees last year and lost the season series for the first time since 2011 (3-6)...have lost six of the last seven games, including each of the last four in Oakland...however, are 17-12 (.586) since the start of the 2013 season, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span... are 9-6 in New York and 8-6 in Oakland over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 243-278 against the Yankees...that includes 132-127 in Oakland and 111-151 in New York...all-time, the A's are 784-1144 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.635) and OPS (1.033), fourth in on-base percentage (.398), tied for eighth in home runs (16) and ninth in batting average (.303)... *Khris Davis* has an eight-game hitting streak (12-for-33, .364) and is 15for-38 (.395) with eight runs and nine RBI over his last 10 games...*Ryon Healy* has 28 home runs in 136 career games...in Athletics history, the only players with more home runs in the first 136 games of their career are Mark McGwire (42) and Jose Canseco (29)...the trio of Alonso (16), Davis (17) and Healy (15) have combined to hit 48 home runs...the A's are one of three teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, MIA).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win is a Major League record...in **1983** Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in **2002** the A's go errorless for the 12th consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.37 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...began the season on the 10day DL with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)... made two rehab starts before he was reinstated.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.92 ERA (8 er in 24.2 ip) and .202 (18-for-89) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.96 ERA (15 er in 22.2 ip) and .301 (28-for-93) opponents average in four starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .220 (20-for-91) batting average compared to .286 (26-for-91) against right-handed hitters...however, has issued nine of his 14 walks to left-handed hitters...four of the five home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .167 (11-for-66) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .302 (35-for-116) with all five of his home runs after that...has yielded a .140 (14-for-100) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 13-for-24 (.542) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in the first and second inning and a 6.03 ERA (21 er in 31.1 ip) from the third inning on... has surrendered all five of his home runs in the third through fifth innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 1-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 6.35 ERA (16 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts at night...has allowed all five of his home runs at night.

THIS AND THAT: Ranks sixth among American League pitchers in putouts (8)...has allowed six unearned runs, which is tied for sixth in the AL... opponents stolen seven bases with him on the mound, which is tied for 10th most in the AL...has walked two batters or fewer in seven of his eight starts...is 4-12 with a 5.81 ERA (89 er in 138.0 ip) over his last 26 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career

REHAB: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit May 7 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Castellanos in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...yielded RBI singles to Cabrera and Martinez and was relieved by Dull who allowed a third run to score on a wild pitch.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas May 13... allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston May 18 in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win.

FIFTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami May 24 in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of

10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland May 30...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time in his last 23 starts he has allowed seven runs...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brantley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch.

SEVENTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss to Washington on June 4 in Oakland...shut out the Nationals on one hit and two walks over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two-run triple to Turner and he scored on a Goodwin sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh to get Gray off the hook...was relieved by Madson to start the eighth and he allowed three runs for the loss.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Tampa Bay in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday...struck out 10 batters, his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning as Souza had a two-run single following a Gray error...allowed three runs (two earned) in the sixth on a two-run double by Beckham and a Phegley error...left trailing 5-3 but the A's scored single runs in the seventh and ninth innings to send the game into extra innings.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 49 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

LHP Sean Manaea (6-3, 3.67 ERA): Is 5-0 with a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the winning streak is a career high, an A's season high and is tied for the fifth longest active winning streak in the American League...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has allowed a .093 (4-for-43) batting average against left-handed hitters...is 3-0 with a 3.21 ERA in five starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA in six starts on the road...is 4-0 with a 2.16 ERA in four starts against AL East teams...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win at Tampa Bay last Saturday in the second game of the doubleheader (7.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 0 hr) in two career starts against the Yankees...the win came in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's victory at New York on May 26 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 8 so).

- Has converted 12-of-20 (60.0%) save opportunities...has the third few-est save opportunities in the AL, is tied for the third fewest saves and is tied for the fourth lowest save percentage.
- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the third lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.326) and the fourth most strikeouts (51).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (78), is tied for the fewest wins (7) and ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (23)

- Has not allowed a run in six of his last seven appearances (1 er in 7.0 ip, 1.29 ERA) and has converted each of his four save opportunities over that stretch...those are his only four save chances over the A's last 29 games.
- Has a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in 13 games in Oakland where he has converted each of his seven save opportunities...has a 6.75 ERA (7 er in 9.1 ip), is 3-for-5 in save chances and has surrendered both of his home runs in 10 games on the road.
- Opponents are 2-for-19 (.105) with runners in scoring position.
- Is tied for sixth among American League relievers in stolen bases allowed (5).
