TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 15, 1930: In a 17-10 Yankees win over the Indians at League Park, Lou Gehrig goes 3-for-5 with 2HR and 7RBI. In the Yankees' next game, a 17-2 win over Cleveland, Gehrig goes 4-for-6 with 4RBI, 3R and 1HR.

June 15, 1923: Lou Gehrig makes his Major League debut at 19 years old during a 10-0 win over the St. Louis Browns, entering the game as a defensive replacement at first base.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 16, 2007: The Yankees record only one assist during an 11-8 win vs. the Mets at Yankee Stadium, a 4-3 rout (Robinson Cano to Miguel Cairo) in the top of the third inning.

June 16, 1996: Mel Allen, the "Voice of the Yankees," dies at the age of 83.

June 16, 1977: Ron Guidry allows just 3H and 2BB in tossing the first of 26 career shutouts with a 7-0 blanking of Kansas City at the original Yankee Stadium. The game lasts just 2:02.

SATURDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 17, 1978: Ron Guidry strikes out 18 California Angels in a four-hit, 4-0 shutout, setting a single-game club record that still stands. His 18 strikeouts also set a single-game AL record for left-handed pitchers, since broken by Randy Johnson (19K).

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their West Coast road trip tonight with the first of 4G at Oakland (through Sunday)...are 1-2 after losing 2-of-3 in Anaheim...went 5-1 on their recent six-game homestand vs. Boston (2-1) and Baltimore (3-0)...following an off day on Monday, return to Yankee Stadium for 3G vs. Los Angeles-AL (6/20-22) and 3G vs. Texas (6/23-25).

- ▶ Have lost two straight since a six-game winning streak (6/7-12).
- ▶ At 38-25 (.603), own the Majors' fifth-best record (see chart).
- ▶ Are in first place in the AL East, 2.0G ahead of second-place Boston.
- ▶ Have had sole possession of first place for 25 straight days (since the end of play on 5/21), the team's second-longest such streak since the start of 2013 (40d from 7/3-8/11/15)... have been in first for 33 of the last 34 days (since 5/14)...have had at least a share of first for 44 of the last 49 days (since 4/28).
- ▶ Are 13G above .500...are 0-2 since they were a season-high 15G over at the end of play on 6/12 (38-23).
- ▶ The 38-25 record is tied for their second-best 63G start in the last 13 seasons since 2005 (40-23 in 2010, 38-25 in 2012)...with a win tonight, would match their second-best 64-game start in that span (41-23 in 2010, 39-25 in 2012).
- ▶ Their +114 run differential leads the Majors (next-best: Houston, +102)... have not finished a season with a run differential above +100 since 2012 (+136)...have outscored opponents, 97-39, in 12 June games (+58).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees dropped the rubber game of a three-game series in Anaheim, 7-5, on Wednesday...**RHP Michael Pineda** (6.0IP, 10H, 5ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1WP) started and took a no-decision...**C Gary Sánchez** (3-for-4, 2R) hit a three-run HR in the first and tied a season high in hits (third time)...**CF Aaron Hicks** (2-for-5, 1 double) extended his career-high on-base streak to 21G...**SS Didi Gregorius** (1-for-4) collected an infield single in the fourth to extend his career-long hitting streak to 16G...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-5, 1R) and **3B Chase Headley** (2-for-4, 1RBI) both had multiple hits...**RHP Ronald Herrera** (2.0IP, 2H, 2ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP) made his Major League debut, taking the loss in relief.

- ▶ The Yankees scored 4R in the top of the first inning...was their first loss in a game in which they scored at least 4R in the first since 9/29/15 vs. Boston.
- ▶ Fell to 28-5 this season when scoring at least 5R.
- ▶ All 18 players in the starting lineup hit safely in the game.

SÁNCHEZ PLAYER: **C Gary Sánchez** went 3-for-4 with his 11th HR of the season on Wednesday...in 7G since being moved to the No. 6 spot in the lineup, is batting .414/.469/1.000 (12-for-29) with 11R, 2 doubles, 5HR, 16RBI and 3BB...has at least 3RBI in four of those seven games; leads the AL in games with at least 3RBI while batting sixth...the Yankees are 6-2 in that span (did not play on 6/12).

- ▶ Has hit 31HR in 92 career games, the fourth player in Major League history to hit at least 31HR in his first 92G, joining Mark McGwire (33), José Abreu (31) and Rudy York (31).
- ▶ Is batting .319/.373/.809 (15-for-47) with 14R, 2 doubles, 7HR and 19RBI in June...leads the Majors in home runs this month and is tied for the MLB lead in RBI (with Seattle's Mike Zunino).
- ▶ His 11HR this season are tied for second-most among MLB catchers (Kansas City's Salvador Perez-13, San Diego's Austin Hedges-11)...each of his last 6HR have come with runners on base (3 two-run, 3 three-run).
- ▶ According to MLB Statcast, each of his 11HR has traveled at least 409 feet.

SS Didi Gregorius collected an infield single in the fourth inning on Wed. at Los Angeles-AL to extend his career-long hitting streak to 16 games...is the longest streak by a Yankee in 2017, and the second-longest over the last five seasons since 2013 (Jacoby Ellsbury, 17G, 5/26-6/13/14)...is the longest active hitting streak in the Majors, tied for the fourth-longest in the Majors in 2017...is batting .373 (25-for-67) with 9R, 5 doubles, 3HR and 7RBI during the streak.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors with 105HR...have hit 18HR in their last 7G...have homered in a season-high nine straight games.

- ▶ Their 105HR are the most the team has hit in the first 62 games of any season.
- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 21HR with multiple runners on base (19 three-run, 2 grand slams)... hit just 18 such HRs in all of 2016...nine of the team's last 11HR have come with at least one runner on base...51.0% of the team's runs in 2017 have scored on HRs (186-of-365).
- ▶ Lead the Majors with 5.79 runs per game (365R/63G)... is the club's third-highest run total through 63G since 1952: 1998 (394R) and 2006 (366R).
- ▶ In 13G this month, are hitting .308/.379/.561 with 97R, 30 doubles, 2 triples and 29HR...have tallied at least 11H in seven of their last 8G (.339, 101-for-298).

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge is batting .388/.494/.791 (26-for-67) with 22R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 19RBI and 14BB during his career-long 17-game on-base streak...is one of four Yankees with an active on-base streak of at least 16G (Gardner-22, Hicks-21, Gregorius-16).

- ▶ Had his eight-game walk streak snapped on Wednesday (was the longest by a Yankee since Curtis Granderson, 8G, from 5/19-27/12)...has walked in 13-of-15 and 17-of-22...leads the AL in walks (40).
- ▶ Leads the Majors with 22HR...has hit 4HR in his last 5G...has matched the Yankees' 2016 home run leader (Carlos Beltrán-22HR in 99G).
- ▶ Was one of five players in Yankees history to hit at least 22HR through 61 team games: Babe Ruth (5x: 1921, '26-28, '30), Mickey Mantle (1956), Roger Maris (1961), Alex Rodriguez (2007).
- ▶ With 22HR, has matched the single-season high by an AL rookie over the last three seasons (Houston's Carlos Correa-22HR in 2015)...is the highest home run total by a Yankee rookie in the last 79 years and the third-highest in Yankees history: 29-Joe DiMaggio (1936), 25-Joe Gordon (1938).

JUDGE'S FOOTNOTES
Judge's 22HR this season have traveled a total of 9,046 feet (per MLB Statcast), longer than the span of the Golden Gate Bridge (8,981 feet).

SAFE BET: RHP Dellin Betances has not allowed an earned run in 20 consecutive relief appearances since 4/9, the longest streak in Majors this season...is the second-longest streak of his career (27G from 9/23/14-6/2/15).

- ▶ Leads MLB relievers with a 0.45 ERA (20.0IP, 1ER) and ranks second with a 17.10 K/9.0IP ratio (38K/20.0IP).
- ▶ Has tossed just 20.0IP this season, his lowest total through 63 team games in the last four seasons (30.2IP in 2016, 33.1IP in '15, 37.1IP in '14).

HEAD OF THE CLASS: 3B Chase Headley was 2-for-4 with 1RBI on Wednesday and is 5-for-8 in his last 2G...has consecutive multi-hit games for the first time since 4/10-12 (2G).

- ▶ Is batting .400/.484/.600 (10-for-25) with 6R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 4RBI and 5BB in his last seven games.
- ▶ Made his Major League debut 10 years ago today, with San Diego on 6/15/07 against the Cubs at Wrigley Field (went 0-for-3 in a start at 3B).

YOUTH IS SERVED: RHP Ronald Herrera was recalled from Double-A Trenton and made his Major League debut on Wed. at Los Angeles-AL (L, 2.0IP, 2H, 2ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP).

- ▶ Is the first Yankee to be promoted to the Major League active roster from Double-A or lower since OF Taylor Dugas was signed and selected from Trenton on 7/1/15.
- ▶ Made his debut at 22 years, 42 days old (born on 5/3/95)...is the first player in Yankees history born in 1995 or later...is the Yankees' youngest player to appear in a game since Luis Severino finished the 2015 season at 21 years, 225 days old.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (4-4, 3.55 ERA)

LHP Jordan Montgomery will make his 12th Major League start tonight at Oakland...the 24-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...is coming off the longest start of his career on Friday vs. Baltimore (7.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR), in which he also set a career high in strikeouts...is 2-1 with a 1.50 ERA (24.0IP, 6R/4ER) in his last four starts...has the lowest HR/9.0IP ratio among Yankees starting pitchers at 0.85 (6HR/63.1IP)...the Yankees are 5-6 in his 11 starts...has held opponents to a .182 BA (10-for-55) with RISP...earned his first Major League win on 4/17 vs. Chicago-AL (6.0IP, 3ER)...made his Major League debut on 4/12 vs. Tampa Bay (ND, 4.2IP, 5H, 3R/2ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...was signed to a Major League contract and selected to the Yankees' 25-man roster on 4/12...split the 2016 season between Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB, going 14-5 with a 2.13 ERA (139.1IP, 33ER) in 25 starts...entering the season, was ranked the No. 13 prospect in the Yankees organization by MLB Pipeline.com...never allowed more than 4R in any of his 61 career minor league games (57 starts)...was selected by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST START: Won his second consecutive start on Friday vs. Baltimore, completing 7.0IP for the first time in his career (7.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR)...set a career high in strikeouts...had 3K in the first, his second career inning with 3K (also the fourth inn. on 5/18 at Kansas City)...had 1-2-3 innings in four of his last five frames...permitted both runs on a two-run HR by Jonathan Schoop in the second inning.

- ✦ Retired 4-of-9 batters (4-for-8 with 1BB) the first time through the lineup...the second and third times through the lineup, retired 17-of-18 batters (1-for-17 with one sac bunt).

GUMBY NATION: Leads Major League rookies with 61K...ranks fifth in innings pitched (first among AL rookie hurlers).

- ✦ His 61K are fifth-most by a Yankees pitcher through 11 Major League games: 88–Masahiro Tanaka, 72–Orlando Hernandez, 69–Al Leiter, 64–Dave Righetti.

2017: Opponents are batting .230 (55-for-239) against Montgomery, 10th-lowest opp. BA in the AL...has allowed 5H-or-fewer in six of his last eight starts (.203, 36-for-177 in that span)...has allowed more than 3R just twice in 11 starts...has completed at least 6.0IP in 7-of-11 turns...according to Brooks Baseball, opponents are batting a combined .179 (25-for-140) with 47K against his three offspeed pitches (changeup/slider/curveball).

- ✦ Has faced only 35 left-handed batters this season, limiting them to a .161 (5-for-31) BA...has faced strictly RHB in three of his 11 starts.
- ✦ Opponents are hitting .182 (10-for-55) with RISP, tied for ninth-lowest in the Majors (min. 50AB)...is the lowest mark among rookie pitchers.
- ✦ Is only the second Yankee since 1913 to toss at least 6.0IP and allow 3H-or-fewer in three of his first 10 career games (also Sam Militello-3G).
- ✦ Was the second pitcher in Yankees history to log a start with at least 6.0IP and two base runners or fewer within his first eight career games (5/23 vs. Kansas City), joining Jorge De Paula on 9/26/03-G2 vs. Baltimore.

VS. OAKLAND: Makes his first career start vs. Oakland and his second career start vs. an AL West opponent...took a loss on 5/12 vs. Houston, setting then-career highs in strikeouts and hits and permitting 4ER in 6.0IP (8H, 1BB, 7K, 1HR).

ROAD TRIPPIN': Is 2-3 with a 3.21 ERA (28.0IP, 10ER) in five road starts...has allowed more than 2ER just once.

TALL TALE: At 6'6", is one of five Yankees (four pitchers, incl. three starting pitchers) measuring 6'6" or taller, to play for the team this season...the others: RHP Dellin Betances (6'8"), OF Aaron Judge (6'7"), RHP Michael Pineda (6'7") and LHP CC Sabathia (6'6").

WINNER, WINNER!: Earned his first career win in the Yankees' 7-4 win on 4/17 vs. Chicago-AL (6.0IP, 7H, 3ER, 2BB, 4K, 1HR)...took a shutout into the seventh inning before allowing a three-run HR to Yolmer Sánchez...became the third Yankees pitcher since 2014 to earn his first career win within his first two Major League games, joining Shane Greene (second career game – 7/7/14 at Cleveland) and Masahiro Tanaka (Major League debut – 4/4/14 at Toronto).

- ✦ Was the second Yankees pitcher since 2008 to start Yankees victories in each of his first two Major League games (RHP Chase Whitley started Yankees victories in each of his first three Major League games, all in 2014)...was just the fifth Yankees left-hander since 1913 to accomplish the feat, joining Ray Fontenot (1983), Bill Miller (1952), Art Schallock (1951) and Russ Van Atta (1933).
