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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-38) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (38-26)

FRIDAY, JUNE 16, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:35 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won for just the second time in the last eight games last night and are now 6-13 over the last 19 contests...are 28-38 (.424) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is one game better than their 66-game mark from each of the previous two seasons (27-39)...the 10 games under .500 are one short of the season high of 11 (27-38 on June 14)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 17th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16½ games...that is ½-game short of the season high of 17 (June 14)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 25 days in fifth...the A's have played 26 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their fifth walk-off win of the season last night, which is tied with Philadelphia for third most in the majors (BAL and LAA, 6)...the 8-7 win snapped a four-game losing streak in one-run games and was the A's first one-run victory since May 19 (3-2 in 10 innings vs. BOS)...are 5-2 in one-run games at home and 6-9 (.400) overall...have the third worst record in the American League in one-run games...are now 3-3 in extra inning games, including 3-1 at home.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 19-13 (.594) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...have the eighth best home record in the majors and the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 9-28/.243)...are 1-0 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (1-0) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1) and have won 17 of the last 25 home games...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is their longest such streak since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 63 errors, which is 14 more than any other team (TB, 49)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...nine of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...have eight outfield assists, which is tied with Minnesota for the fewest in the AL...have allowed a ML leading 60 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51), which are already the A's most before the All-Star Break since 2011 (64)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (7).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 16 hits last night, which marks the fifth time in the last 23 games they have allowed 15 or more hits in a game...have allowed 10 or more runs six times over that stretch...have a 6.03 ERA (134 in 200.0 ip) and .287 (230-for-801) opponents batting average over that span...now have a 4.86 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (29) and wild pitches (37)...the wild pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016, 38 in 1979).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-3 with a 7.19 ERA (33 er in 41.1 ip), .324 (57-for-176) opponents batting average and 10 home runs allowed over the last eight games...are 20-27 with a 4.69 ERA for the season...rank second in the American League in most losses...have allowed 45 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.413)...the A's have used 10 different starting pitchers, which is second most in the AL (SEA, 12)...it marks the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's had 14 hits last night, which was the third time in the last six games they had at least 14 hits and the fifth time they reached double figures...are batting .299 (69-for-231) with 31 runs scored over that span (5.2 runs per game)...rank second to last in the American League in batting (.241) and on-base percentage (.308), second in most strikeouts (608) and third in fewest runs scored (282)...rank fourth in extra base hits (222) and tied for fourth in doubles (221)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.225)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.176) and second to last in on-base percentage (.255).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just eight home runs in the last nine games but have 94 for the season...that ranks fourth in the American League and is second most in Athletics history after 66 games...the 2000 club had 97 (had 100 after 67 games)...56 of the A's 94 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's rank second in the AL (NYY, 63) and third in the majors (ARI, 58) in home runs at home...are one of three teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, MIA)...home runs have accounted for 145 of the A's 282 runs (51.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 26-25 when homering, 2-13 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is second worst in the majors (DET, 1-16)...the pitching staff has surrendered 32 home runs in the last 17 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...the A's are 22-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 6-29 when they don't.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 3-for-25 (.120) with a home run, three walks and a sacrifice fly with the bases loaded over their last 38 games...are 8-for-50 (.160) with 24 RBI with the bases loaded for the season...have the lowest batting average and on-base percentage (.211) in the majors, the second lowest slugging percentage (.260) and the second fewest RBI.

TIME OF GAME: The time of game in last night's 10-inning game was 4 hours and 29 minutes...it was the third longest game of 10 innings or fewer in Oakland history and was the longest since a 22-9 loss at New York on Aug. 25, 2011, which lasted 4:31...the A's are averaging 3 hours and 34 minutes of baseball per day over the last six days, which includes an off day on Monday...are averaging 3:20 in June and 3:08:19 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08.28 in 2000.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-10 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 11-6...have a run differential of -76, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have used 63 different lineups in 66 games...have a 5-9 record in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. YANKEES: The season series is even at two games each...the A's won the first meeting in Oakland last night after losing two of three in New York at the end of May...went 3-4 against the Yankees last year and lost the season series for the first time since 2011 (3-6)...have lost six of the last eight games but are 23-17 (.575) since the start of the 2012 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 244-278 against the Yankees...that includes 133-127 in Oakland and 111-151 in New York...all-time, the A's are 785-1144 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.645) and OPS (1.043), fourth in on-base percentage (.398), tied for seventh in home runs (17) and eighth in batting average (.306)...**Khris Davis** extended his hitting streak to nine games with his walk-off single last night (13-for-38, .342) and is 16-for-43 (.372) with eight runs and 11 RBI over his last 11 games...**Jed Lowrie** is 9-for-26 (.346) with eight runs scored over his last six games and seven of his nine hits are for extra bases (four doubles, two triples, one home run).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a doubleheader against Chicago...in **1938** Jimmie Foxx sets an American League record by walking six times in a nine-inning game against Boston...in **1971** Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a major league record for consecutive home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record with three doubles at Milwaukee and drives in his 790th career run, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career RBI record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-3, 3.67 ERA)

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 1.97 ERA (7 er in 32.0 ip) and .193 (22-for-114) opponents batting average over his last five starts... the winning streak is a career high, an A's season high and is tied for the fourth longest active winning streak in the American League...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has walked just seven batters in 32.0 innings during the winning streak (1.97 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has tossed 61.1 innings and is 4.2 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he ranks third in the American League in opponents batting average (.186), fourth in slugging percentage (.314), eighth in on-base percentage (.281) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.68) and ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.73)

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .093 (4-for-43) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .209 (37-for-177) against right-handers... the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings...one of the four hits by a lefty was a home run (Gallo on April 9 at Texas)...his career splits are .154 (22-for-143) against lefties. .248 (154-for-622) against righties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 3.21 ERA (10 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA (15 er in 33.1 ip) in six starts on the road...has surrendered four of his five home runs on the road...is now 8-3 with a 3.07 ERA (38 er in 111.1 ip) in 19 career games in the Coliseum compared to 5-9 with a 4.66 ERA (49 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts on the road.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 4-0 with a 2.16 ERA (6 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts against American League East teams compared to 2-3 with a 4.71 ERA (19 er in 36.1 ip) in seven starts against everyone else.

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Allowed six hits in his last start, which were his most since Aug. 17 of last year at Texas when he allowed nine...had a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...now has a streak of 17 games with six hits or fewer and two innings or more, which is second longest in Oakland history (20, Trevor Cahill, May 5-Aug. 14, 2010).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .146 (7-for-48) with runners in scoring position...opponents are 9-for-123 (.073) with two strikes... they are 7-for-52 (.135) when leading of an inning but he has walked eight and hit three for a .286 on-base percentage...has held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .077 (2-for-26) batting average...has a .241 (21-for-87) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .150 (20-for-133) after that...has a .154 (22-for-143) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .247 (19-for-77) average with 15 of his 23 opponents RBI with two outs.

THE SECOND INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 28 runs in the second inning for a 10.64 ERA (13 er in 11.0 ip)...the 13 runs are tied for the most in the American League in the second inning...has a 2.15 ERA (12 er in 50.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .347 (17-for-49) with a .385 on-base percentage (3 bb) in the second inning, .140 (24-for-171) with a .254 on-base percentage (21 bb, 5 hbp, 0 sf) in all other innings

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 5-1 with a 2.68 ERA (11 er in 37.0 ip) in six starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

THIS AND THAT: Has hit five batters, which is tied for fourth most in the American League and is one more than his season total from last year (144.2 innings)...is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) and .213 (10-for-47) opponents batting average in two starts in June...went 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts in May...the three wins in May were his most ever in a month.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at

least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so... left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was placed on the disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings in a 6-5 loss to Seattle on May 15...tossed a career-high 111 pitches in a 5-3 victory over Toronto on June 5.

LAST START: He won his fifth consecutive start in the A's 7-2 win in the second game of the doubleheader last Saturday at Tampa Bay...it was his sixth win of the season, which is tied for ninth in the American League... Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed a run in the bottom of the inning on a Longoria RBI single...the A's increased their lead to 3-1 before he allowed his final run on a Longoria home run in the sixth.

MANAEA vs. NEW YORK: Is 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 0 hr) in two career starts...the win came in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's win on May 26 at New York...pitched 7.0 scoreless in-

nings and yielded just four hits and a walk...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...Tanaka blanked the A's over the first seven innings but Oakland scored twice in the eighth and ninth innings for the win...the loss came last year in Oakland on May 21 in a 5-1 A's loss...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltran RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

RHP Jesse Hahn (2-4, 3.56 ERA): Is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA in two starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 6...however, opponents are 14-for-43 (.326) in those two games...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA and .242 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...has not allowed a home run over his last eight starts and has a 43.2-inning, 193-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just one home run in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.15 per nine innings...is 2-1 with a 4.58 ERA in four starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 3.14 ERA in seven games on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Sunday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (11.2 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 3 hr) in two career starts against New York (AL), both in Oakland.

- The A's bullpen is 1-4 with two saves, four blown saves, a 7.36 ERA (30 er in 36.2 ip) and 10 home runs allowed over the last 11 games...now has a 5.13 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.35).
- Blew three saves during last night's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the third lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.315) and the fourth most strikeouts (55).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (81), has second-fewest wins (8) and ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (25).
