OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-38) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (38-27)

SATURDAY, JUNE 17, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the third time over the last 24 games...have not won more than two straight since a three-game winning streak from May 18-20...are 3-6 over the last nine games and 7-13 over the last 20 contests...are 29-38 (.433) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is one game better than their 67-game mark from each of the previous two seasons (28-39)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 18th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 15½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 26 days in fifth...the A's have played 26 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 20-13 (.606) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...are tied for the sixth best home record in the majors and have the second worst road record (PHI, 9-28/.243)...are 2-0 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (2-0) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1) and have won 18 of the last 26 home games...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is their longest such streak since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are 6-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of the first two games of this series by one run to snap a four-game losing streak in one-run games...are now 7-9 (.438) in one-run games, including 6-2 at home...have won each of the last two games in their final at bat and have seven last at bat wins for the season...had their fifth walk-off win of the season Thursday, which is tied with Philadelphia for third most in the majors (BAL and LAA, 6)...are 3-3 in extra inning games, including 3-1 at home.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone errorless in eight of the last 12 games (five errors total) but have committed a Major League leading 63 errors, which is 13 more than any other team (TB, 50)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...nine of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...have eight outfield assists, which is tied with Minnesota for the fewest in the AL...have allowed a ML leading 60 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51), which are already the A's most before the All-Star Break since 2011 (64)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (8).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed at least 10 hits in each of the last five games and 13 of the last 24...have allowed 10 or more runs six times over that stretch...have a 6.03 ERA (140 in 209.0 ip) and .287 (240-for-837) opponents batting average over that span...now have a 4.88 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...rank second in the AL in hit batters (29) and third in wild pitches (37)...the wild pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016, 38 in 1979).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-3 with a 7.22 ERA (38 er in 47.1 ip), .323 (65-for-201) opponents batting average and 12 home runs allowed over the last nine games...are 20-27 with a 4.74 ERA for the season...rank second in the American League in most losses...have allowed 47 home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.416)...have used 10 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Texas for second most in the AL (SEA, 12)...it marks the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .293 (76-for-259) with 38 runs scored over the last seven games (5.4 runs per game)...have the second lowest batting average (.241) and second most strikeouts (615) in the American League and rank third in lowest on-base percentage (.309) and fewest runs scored (289)...rank fourth in extra base hits (224) and tied for fourth in doubles (123)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.229) in the AL...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.182) and second to last in on-base percentage (.261).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just eight home runs in the last 10 games but have 94 for the season...that ranks fourth in the American League and is second most in Athletics history after 66 games...the 2000 club had 100 (had 104 after 68 games)...56 of the A's 94 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is tied with Houston for the second most home runs at home in the AL (NYY, 63)...the A's are one of three teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, MIA)...home runs have accounted for 145 of the A's 289 runs (50.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 26-25 when homering, 3-13 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is third worst in the AL (DET, 1-16; NYY, 2-11)...the pitching staff has surrendered 34 home runs in the last 18 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...Oakland is 22-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 7-29 when they don't.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 9-for-51 (.176) with 26 RBI with the bases loaded...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the RBI are third fewest...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.224) and slugging percentage (.275).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-11 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 13-6...through games of Thursday, the A's were successful in 28.6% (4-of-14) of their challenges, which was tied with Detroit and Miami for the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -75, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 64 different lineups in 67 games...are averaging 3 hours and 20 minutes per game in June and 3:08:23 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have a 6-9 record in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have won the first two games of this series after losing two of three in New York at the end of May...with a victory today or tomorrow, will win the season series from the Yankees for the fourth time in the last five years...are 19-12 (.613) against New York over the last five years, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 245-278 against the Yankees...that includes 134-127 in Oakland and 111-151 in New York...all-time, the A's are 786-1144 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.638) and OPS (1.038), third in on-base percentage (.400), tied for seventh in home runs (17) and ninth in batting average (.303)...
Khrist Davis has reached base safely in each of his last 13 games and is 17-for-51 (.333) with six walks (1 sf, .397 on-base percentage), 10 runs scored and 11 RBI over that span...
Ryon Healy is 18-for-52 (.346) with 10 runs, six doubles, six home runs and 16 RBI over his last 13 games...
Jed Lowrie is 9-for-30 (.300) with eight runs scored over his last seven games and seven of his nine hits are for extra bases (four doubles, two triples, one home run)

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1967** the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in **1988** Stan Javier's RBI single in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the three game series with the Rangers...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-4, 3.56 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 6...however, opponents are 14-for-43 (.326) in those two games...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA and .242 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton May 31 against Lancaster and had a no decision in the Ports 3-2 win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 75 pitches)...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his appearances since then.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run over his last eight starts and has a 43.2-inning, 193-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just one home run in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.15 per nine innings...his innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with one home run or fewer...the lone home run came on April 19 against Texas, a solo shot by Gallo to lead off the fifth inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 4.58 ERA (9 er in 17.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 3.14 ERA (15 er in 43.0 ip) in seven games on the road...has not allowed a home run in 43.0 innings on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 7-5 with a 3.30 ERA (41 er in 111.2 ip) in 19 starts in Oakland, 3-9 with a 4.89 ERA (50 er in 92.0 ip) in 17 games on the road.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in June...went 0-2 with a 6.11 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May after going 1-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in five games in April...his May ERA was his highest ever in a month (min 5.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed his only home run and issued 15 of his 21 walks to left-handed hitters...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed over the last two years have been hit by lefties...opponents are hitting .340 (18-for-53) with runners in scoring position and he has a .326 (57-for-175) opponents batting average with RISP in his three seasons with the A's...has a .276 (48-for-174) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .203 (12-for-59) after that.

SUPPORT: Has received eight runs of support in his two starts since returning from the DL after getting just four runs of support over his previous six starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 10 starts, including no runs four times, and has a season run support average of 3.26 (22 rs in 60.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 18 of his 35 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in three of his starts this year (April 25, May 12 and June 11).

ROAD LOSING STREAK: Has not won a road game over the last two years and is 0-6 with a 5.56 ERA (35 er in 56.2 ip) over his last 11 games (10 starts) on the road...the six-game road losing streak matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last with a longer streak is Ariel Prieto, who had a nine-game road losing streak from April 29, 1997 to Sept. 24, 2000...his last road win came on June 15, 2015 at San Diego.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win June 6 to snap his losing streak at a career-high tying three games (fourth time, last: June 3, 2016-April 13, 2017)...posted a 5.70 ERA and .306 opponents average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 30 to May 23...is now 1-3 with a 4.67 ERA (18 er in 34.2 ip) and .312 (44-for-141) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .174 opponents batting average over his first four games (three starts).

NIGHT AND DAY: Picked up the win June 6 to snap a seven-game losing streak in night games...it was his first win at night since June 15, 2015 at San Diego and his first ever night win in the Coliseum...in his career, he is 9-4 with a 2.53 ERA (31 er in 110.1 ip) in 18 day games, 8-14 with a 4.59 ERA (85 er in 166.2 ip) in 31 night games.

THIS AND THAT: Has committed two errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers...also ranks tied for sixth in assists (11)...is tied for second in the AL in triples allowed (3) and tied for fourth in opponents reaching on an error (5)...has tossed more than six innings in just two of his 10 starts this year and 13 of 47 in his career...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen bases attempts off him...are 11-for-12 (91.6%) over the last two years after going 5-for-10 (50.0%) over his first two.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: His first appearance of the season came in relief of starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...moved into the starting rotation April 13

at Kansas City and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...snapped a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to 2016 in a 9-1 win over Texas April 19...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit in a no decision at Los Angeles (AL) April 25, a 2-1 A's loss in 11 innings...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks May 6 against Detroit...left with a 2-1 lead on May 12 at Texas but Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save...tossed just 2.0 innings May 23 against Miami...was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Tampa Bay last Sunday...blanked the Rays on two hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead with he allowed three runs in the bottom of the fifth...Smith and Dickerson had RBI doubles and Longoria tied the game with a RBI single...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 4-3 lead and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the bottom of the sixth...Hendriks allowed a leadoff home run to Rasmus for the blown save and Coulombe allowed an unearned run in the seventh for the loss.

HAHN vs. NEW YORK: Is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (11.2 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 3 hr) in two career starts, both in Oakland...made one start last year and took the loss in a 5-4 decision in Oakland on May 22...had a 1-0 lead

when he allowed solo home runs to McCann in the second and Ellsbury in the third...the A's came back to take a 3-2 lead and he was relieved by Axford with runners on first and second and two outs in the sixth...Axford allowed both of the inherited runners to score for the blown save...the other loss came in a 5-3 decision in Oakland on May 30, 2015...allowed a McCann RBI single in the first and had a 3-1 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Headley RBI single...then surrendered a two-run home run to Beltran in the sixth for the loss.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...his opponents batting average included a mark of .273 against right-handed hitters compared to .361 against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (3-7, 5.52 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 5.24 ERA in four starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...has a career-high four-game losing streak overall...his seven losses are sixth most in the American League...is also tied for fourth in unearned runs (8) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (5)...is 1-3 with a 7.76 ERA and .292 opponents average in five starts in Oakland...has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's loss at Miami last Tuesday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against the Yankees, a 3-2 loss in New York earlier this year on May 27 (5.2 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with three saves, four blown saves, a 7.03 ERA (31 er in 39.2 ip) and 10 home runs allowed over the last 12 games... now has a 5.10 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.25).
- Blew three saves during Thursday's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)... it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.309) and the fourth most strikeouts (57).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (83), has second-fewest wins (9) and ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26).

- Allowed a game-tying home run on Thursday in his first save opportunity of the season.
- Has allowed a .194 (6-for-31) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .500 (10-for-20) against left-handers.
- Has faced the Yankees three times this year (2.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 11.57 ERA).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not pitch before he was placed on the 10-day DL April 5, retroactive to April 2, with a strained right shoulder...did not allow a run in a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville (3.1 ip, 2 h, 4 so) and was reinstated May 21.
