OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-38) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (38-28)

SUNDAY, JUNE 18, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP JHAREL COTTON (3-7, 5.52) VS. RHP LUIS CESSA (0-0, 5.40) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of the last three games, which is the A's longest winning streak since May 18-20 when they also won three in a row...have won more than three straight just once this year and that was a five-game winning streak from April 18-22...are 4-6 over the last 10 games and 8-13 over the last 21 contests...are 30-38 (.441) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is two games better than the A's 68-game mark from last year (28-40)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 15½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 27 days in fifth.

SERIES SWEEPS: The A's have won each of the first three games of this series...have played 26 consecutive series without a sweep dating back to last year...last swept a series Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City, a fourgame series...have not swept a series in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota...have not swept a four-game series in Oakland since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 21-13 (.618) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...have the sixth best home record in the majors and the second worst road record (PHI, 9-28/.243)...are 3-0 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (3-0) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Washington (1-2) and Toronto (2-1) and have won 19 of the last 27 home games...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...are 7-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 64 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (TB, 52)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...nine of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 60 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51), which are already the A's most before the All-Star Break since 2011 (64)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (8).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.86 ERA (142 in 218.0 ip) and .282 (245-for-869) opponents batting average over the last 25 games...now have a 4.83 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...rank second in the AL in hit batters (29) and third in wild pitches (37)...the wild pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016, 38 in 1979).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-3 with a 6.88 ERA (40 er in 52.1 ip), .311 (68-for-219) opponents batting average and 12 home runs allowed over the last 10 games...are 21-27 with a 4.72 ERA for the season...rank second in the American League in most losses...have allowed 47 home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.413)...have used 10 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Texas for second most in the AL (SEA, 12)...it marks the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's have reached double figures in hits in six of the last eight games and are batting .298 (88-for-295) with 43 runs scored over that span (5.4 runs per game)...have the second lowest batting average (.242) and on-base percentage (.311) in the American League, the second most strikeouts (631) and the third fewest runs scored (294)...rank third in extra base hits (229)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.227)...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.191) and on-base percentage (.273) in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 97 home runs, which ranks fourth in the American League and is second most in Athletics history after 68 games...the 2000 club had 104 (had 105 after 69 games)...59 of the A's 97 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is tied with Milwaukee for the second most home runs at home in the majors (NYY, 63)...the A's are one of three teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, MIA)... home runs have accounted for 148 of the A's 294 runs (50.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3%

in 1996...are 27-25 when homering, 3-13 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is third worst in the AL (DET, 1-16; NYY, 2-12)...the pitching staff has surrendered 34 home runs in the last 19 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...Oakland is 23-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 7-29 when they don't.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 9-for-54 (.167) with 26 RBI with the bases loaded...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the RBI are third fewest...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.213) and second lowest slugging percentage (.259).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of their last two one-run games after losing four in a row...are 7-9 (.438) in one-run games, including 6-2 at home...have two last at bat wins on the homestand and seven for the season...had their fifth walk-off win of the season Thursday, which is tied with Philadelphia for third most in the majors (BAL and LAA, 6)...are 3-3 in extra inning games, including 3-1 at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-8 on Sunday, which is the worst Sunday record in the majors (ATL, 2-8)...are 4-11 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 13-6...through games of Thursday, the A's were successful in 28.6% (4-of-14) of their challenges, which was tied with Detroit and Miami for the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -72, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 65 different lineups in 68 games...are averaging 3 hours and 19 minutes per game in June and 3:08:31 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have a 7-9 record in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's have won the season series for the fourth time in the last five years as they lead 4-2 entering the final meeting today... lost two of three in New York at the end of May but have won the first three games in Oakland...this series is the 28th four-game series between the two clubs since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968...the A's have two sweeps in the previous 27 (July 19-22, 2012 in OAK; July 14-16, 1972 in NY)...Oakland is 20-12 (.625) against New York over the last five years, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 246-278 against the Yankees...that includes 135-127 in Oakland and 111-151 in New York...all-time, the A's are 787-1144 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 29-23 on Father's Day since moving to Oakland in 1968... that includes 17-10 in Oakland and 12-13 on the road...are facing the Yankees for the third time, all in Oakland...won in 2014 but lost in 1974 and 1980...are at home for the seventh consecutive season and are 4-2 over that stretch...**Yonder Alonso** ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.630) and OPS (1.027), third in on-base percentage (.397) and tied for seventh in home runs (17)...**Ryon Healy** had his third career two-homer game yesterday, all of which have come this month...is tied for the Major League lead with eight home runs in June.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1984 Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in 1993 the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9....trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second, the A's score twice in the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good...in 1996 Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's 8-5 win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (3-7, 5.52 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-3 with a 5.24 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 6.59 ERA (20 er in 27.1 ip) over his last five starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA over his first six starts...the losing streak is the longest of his career and it matches the A's season high (Triggs).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has seven losses, which is tied for sixth most in the American League...is also tied for fourth in unearned runs (8) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (5)...opponents have been caught stealing four times with him on the mound, which is tied for third most in the AL...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (60.1) and games started (11), third in strikeouts (53) and tied for third in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 7.76 ERA (23 er in 26.2 ip) and .292 (31-for-106) opponents average in five starts in Oakland...has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched at home...is 2-3 with a 3.74 ERA (14 er in 33.2 ip) and .234 (29-for-124) opponents batting average in six starts on the road...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) and .169 (21-for-124) opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 0-5 with a 9.38 ERA (25 er in 24.0 ip) and .368 (39-for-106) opponents average in five starts at night...is now 5-2 with a 2.54 ERA (14 er in 49.2 ip) in eight career starts during the day compared to 0-5 with a 6.75 ERA (30 er in 40.0 ip) in eight starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 1-5 with a 6.63 ERA (27 er in 36.2 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

THE SECOND AND THE FIFTH INNINGS: Has allowed 13 runs in the second inning (11.0 ip, 10.64 ERA) and 12 in the fifth inning (10 er in 9.2 ip, 9.31 ERA), both of which are tied for second most in the American League...has a 3.17 ERA (14 er in 39.2) in all other innings...has surrendered six of his 15 home runs in the second inning, which is tied for the most in the majors (Anderson, COL)...has a .348 (16-for-46) opponents batting average in the second inning, a .349 (15-for-43) mark in the fifth and a .206 (29-for-141) average in all other innings

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .224 (30-for-134) with the bases empty, .313 (30-for-96) with runners on base...however, seven of his 11 home runs allowed have been solo shots as have 10 of his 15 career home runs...opponents are 20-for-57 (.351) with runners in scoring position...eight of the 11 home runs he has allowed have come with two outs... the opponents number five hitter is 5-for-30 (.167).

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 10 home runs in his last six starts (33.1 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 28 batters in 60.1 innings this year (4.18 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has received eight runs of support in his seven losses (35.1 ip, 2.04 RSA) and 12 runs of support in his three wins (19.0 ip, 5.68 RSA).

2017 START-BY-START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5 in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits... was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on **April 17** in Oakland... allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...retired 12 straight at one point...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle April 22 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning and a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career. was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at New York (AL) *May* 27...tossed a career-high 107 pitches...did not allow a hit over the first five innings, but surrendered a run in the first when Sanchez walked, went to second on a Holliday hit by pitch, third on a wild pitch and scored on a Castro sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth but he allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the bottom of the sixth for the loss...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 8-0 loss at Cleveland June 1 ... issued a career-high tying

four walks and allowed five runs, but only one was earned...yielded just one run over the first five innings when Robertson doubled, went to third on a passed ball and scored on a wild pitch...was charged with four unearned runs in the sixth inning due to two Healy errors...the A's were shutout on three hits by Kluber and three Indians relievers...had his first no decision of the season in the A's 7-5 loss to Toronto on *June 7* in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks for the second consecutive start...allowed four runs in six innings of work, all in the second inning...Smoak led off the inning with a home run and Pillar added a three-run shot...walked Donald-son following the home run but then retired 13 of the final 15 batters he faced...was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the scored tied 4-4.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Miami last Tuesday...blanked the Marlins on a hit and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when Ozuna hit a solo home run in the fourth inning to tie the game...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a Gordon RBI single, a Stanton two-run home run and a Realmuto RBI double.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13...surrendered two home runs...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win in his last start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win at Sacramento May 21...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's \ldots walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeoutto-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers... yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214) and tied for 10th in wins (11).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (0-1, 16.20): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday and was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut that day at Miami (3.1 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...the seven runs were the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system last year and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151)...was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors.

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with four saves, four blown saves, a 6.39 ERA (31 er in 43.2 ip) and 10 home runs allowed over the last 13 games...now has a 5.01 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.25).
- Blew three saves during Thursday's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)... it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at
- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.303) and the fourth most strikeouts (59).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (83), is tied for the secondfewest wins (9) and ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26).

- Has faced the Yankees three times this year (2.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 11.57 ERA).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not pitch before he was placed on the 10-day DL April 5, retroactive to April 2, with a strained right shoulder...did not allow a run in a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville (3.1 ip, 2 h, 4 so) and was reinstated May 21.
