TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 18, 2005: Derek Jeter hits his first (and only) career grand slam off the Cubs' Joe Borowski and adds a solo homer in an 8-1 Yankees victory. Jeter had hit 156 career homers prior to the slam, the most by any active player and any Yankee before hitting a grand slam.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 19, 2015: Alex Rodriguez hits a solo homer in the first inning off Detroit's Justin Verlander at Yankee Stadium to become the 29th player in Major League history to collect 3,000 hits. Rodriguez joins Derek Jeter and Wade Boggs as the only three players to hit a home run for the 3,000th hit.

June 19, 1903: Hall of Famer Lou Gehrig is born in New York City. The "Iron Horse" played in an amazing 2,130 consecutive games between 1925 and 1939 and established an AL record by driving in at least 100 runs for 13 straight seasons (1926-38).

TUESDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 20, 1983: Bobby Murcer retires. He played the majority of his 17-year Major League career with the Yankees, finishing with 1,862 hits, 252 home runs, 972 runs and 1,043 RBI in 1,908 games.

June 20, 1963: The Mets defeat the Yankees at Yankee Stadium, 6-2, in the first-ever Mayor's Trophy game.

June 20, 1934: The Yankees sweep the Indians, 3-2 and 3-0, at Yankee Stadium. Lou Gehrig wins Game 1 with a ninth-inning, "walk-off" home run after a Frank Crosetti solo homer tied it in the eighth. Red Ruffing limits the Indians to one hit in Game 2.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 1-5 on their West Coast road trip, which finishes today with the finale of a four-game series at Oakland (0-3)...lost 2-of-3 in Anaheim...following an off day on Monday, return to Yankee Stadium for 3G vs. Los Angeles-AL (Tue.-Thurs.) and 3G vs. Texas (Fri.-Sun.).

- At 38-28 (.576), own the AL's second-best record (see chart).
- Are in first place in the AL East, 1.0G ahead of second-place Boston...have had a lead this small just twice in the last 26 days (at the end of play Friday and on 6/6).
- Have had sole possession of first place for 28 straight days (since the end of play on 5/21), the team's second-longest such streak since the start of 2013 (40d from 7/3-8/11/15)...have been alone in first for 36 of the last 37 days (since 5/14)...have had at least a share of first for 47 of the last 52 days (since 4/28).
- Are 10G above .500...are 0-5 since they were a season-high 15G over at the end of play on 6/12 (38-23).
- Their +109 run differential leads the Majors (next-best: Houston, +107)...have not finished a season with a run differential above +100 since 2012 (+136)...have outscored opponents, 112-59 (+53) but are just 8-8 in 16 June games.
- Have lost a season-high five straight games, on the heels of their six-game winning streak (6/7-12)...is the longest current losing streak in the AL and tied for second-longest in the Majors (Cincinnati-8, San Francisco-5)...is just their second five-game skid in 204G since 5/4/16...last lost at least six straight games from 4/26-5/3/16 (0-6).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters had their 11-game home run streak snapped on Saturday...still **lead the Majors with 108HR**...have hit just 6HR in 6G on this road trip (hit 18HR in 6G on the previous homestand).

- Their 108HR are the most by a Yankees team through the first 66G of a season...are tied for the fourth-highest 66-game total in Major League history: Seattle-1999 (127HR), St. Louis-2000 (113HR), Seattle-1996 (110HR), Cleveland-2000 (108HR).
- Lead the Majors with 380 runs and 5.76 runs per game...is the club's third-highest run total through 66G since 1951 (1998-408R, 2006-386R).
- In 16G this month, are hitting .302/.372/.532 with 112R, 34 doubles, 3 triples and 32HR...have tallied at least 10H in nine of their last 11G (.322, 132-for-410).

#ALLSTARLIN: 2B Starlin Castro went 1-for-4 in his first career game as designated hitter on Saturday...is the only Yankee to appear in all 66 games this season.

- Leads the AL with 29 multi-hit games, second in MLB to Colorado's Charlie Blackmon (32)...has seven multi-hit efforts in his last 11G.
- Is tied for the AL hits lead (88), tied for second-most in the Majors (Charlie Blackmon-94)...is third in BA (.328).
- Is batting .315 (46-for-146) on the road (hit .230 in 2016).

SS Didi Gregorius had his career-long 17-game hitting streak snapped with an 0-for-4 Saturday...was the longest streak by a Yankee in 2017, and tied for the longest over the last five seasons since 2013 (Jacoby Ellsbury, also 17G, 5/26-6/13/14)...was tied for the second-longest hitting streak in the Majors in 2017...hit .361/.378/.556 (26-for-72) with 10R, 5 doubles, 3HR and 7RBI during the streak (5/28-6/15).

BROOM-STUCK: The Yankees are the only AL team and one of three Major League teams that has not been swept in a series this season (Arizona, Los Angeles-NL)...entering this series, have been swept just once in their last 40 series (since 8/1/16)...have won at least one game in each of their last 25 series (since going 0-4 from 9/15-18/16 at Boston).

- This is the deepest into a season the Yankees have made it without being swept (min. 2G) since 1980, when they did not suffer their first sweep until 8/8-10/80 vs. Baltimore (107th-109th games).

SEVENTH HAVEN: RHP Luis Cessa will make his first start of the season today...is the seventh Yankees pitcher to start a game this season...the 66G is the deepest into a season that the club has used just six starters since 2011, when seventh starter (Brian Gordon) also made his first start in Game No. 67...the last longer run to begin a season with six starters was in 2010, when seventh starter Dustin Moseley first took the ball in Game No. 101.

FRIENDLY CONFINES AWAIT: After Monday's off day, the Yankees return to Yankee Stadium on Tuesday, where they have the best home record in the AL at 22-9 (.710)...have won five consecutive home games (since 6/7), the AL's longest active home winning streak and tied for longest in the Majors (also Colorado, Miami).

- Have drawn at least 40,000 fans in eight consecutive home games (going 7-1 since 5/27), their longest such streak since 7/22-8/9/15 (also 8G)...are averaging 44,394 fans per game during this stretch...are 10-3 at home this season when drawing at least 40,000.

MARGINAL LOSSES: Seven of the Yankees' eight losses this month have been by 1R (5x) or 2R (2x)...also lost Saturday by 3R...for the season, 14 of their 28 losses are by 2R-or-fewer.

- Their average margin of victory across 38 wins this season is 4.71, compared to their average margin of defeat in 28 losses of 2.50.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost their fifth straight game on Saturday, 5-2, at Oakland...RHP Masahiro Tanaka (4.0IP, 8H, 5ER, 1BB, 10K, 3HR, 1WP) took the loss, while notching his ninth career double-digit-strikeout game (second this season, both vs. Oakland)...the Yankees scored both runs in the second on an RBI single by C Austin Romine (1-for-4) and sac fly by LF Brett Gardner (0-for-2, 1BB)...RHP Domingo Germán struck out six in 4.0 scoreless innings (4H, 3BB) of relief in his second career appearance.

SIX OF ONE, HALF-DOZEN OF THE OTHER: RHP Masahiro Tanaka (10K in 4.0IP) and RHP Domingo Germán (6K in 4.0IP) on Saturday became the fourth pair of Yankees teammates ever to each tally at least 6K in a nine-inning game...the others: Rick Rhoden (7K)/Tim Lincecum (6K) on 8/23/87 at Oakland; Doc Medich (6K)/Lindy McDaniel (6K) on 4/23/73 at Milwaukee; and Stan Williams (6K)/Steve Hamilton (6K) on 7/17/64 vs. Cleveland.

- Are the first Yankees teammates to both notch at least 6K in less than 9.0IP, just the fifth Major League duo in the last 100 years to do so, the first since Philadelphia's Jeff Juden and Russ Springer (6K each) on 8/30/95 at San Francisco.

ALL STRUCK OUT: RHP Masahiro Tanaka tallied 10K and allowed 3HR in just 4.0IP on Saturday...is the first pitcher in Yankees history to record 10K without completing 5.0IP...is the seventh pitcher in Major League history to last 4.0IP-or-less in a game with double-digit strikeouts...only Cleveland's Danny Salazar recorded fewer outs (10K in 3.2IP on 4/10/14 at Chicago-AL).

- Is the first pitcher in Major League history to strike out 10 batters and allow 3HR in a start of 4.0IP-or-less.

GERMÁN ENGINEERING: In his second Major League game on Saturday, RHP Domingo Germán tossed 4.0 scoreless innings (4H, 3BB, 6K) in relief...over the last 30 seasons (since 1988), is just the third Yankees reliever to record at least 6K in a scoreless appearance of at least 4.0IP (also David Phelps-6K in 4.0IP on 4/13/13 vs. Baltimore and Kei Igawa-6K in 6.0IP on 4/28/07 vs. Boston).

- Is the first reliever in Yankees history to strike out six batters and not allow a run in either his first or second Major League game...two starters also did it in their second career outing: Phil Hughes (6K in 6.1IP on 5/1/07 at Texas) and Bill Burbach (7K in 9.0IP shutout 4/20/69-G2 vs. Detroit).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS CESSA (0-0, 5.40 ERA)

RHP Luis Cessa will make his second Major League appearance and first start of the season today at Oakland...the 25-year-old was recalled on Wednesday from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, where he has a 3-6 record and a 4.15 ERA (65.0IP, 66H, 37R/30ER, 22BB, 47K, 7HR) in 11 games (10 starts) in 2017...will be the seventh different pitcher to start for the Yankees this season...has made one relief appearance for the Yankees in 2017 on 5/1 vs. Toronto (3.1IP, 2ER)...made the Yankees' Opening Day roster in 2016 and was 4-4 with a 4.35 ERA (70.1IP, 34ER) in 17 games (nine starts)...was acquired by the Yankees from Detroit along with RHP Chad Green in exchange for LHP Justin Wilson on 12/9/15...was acquired by Detroit from the Mets along with RHP Michael Fulmer in exchange for OF Yoenis Céspedes on 7/31/15...began his professional career as an infielder in 2009 before being converted to a pitcher during the 2011 season.

IN THE BIGS: Is in his second stint with the Yankees in 2017 (also 5/1)...made one relief appearance for the Yankees this season, allowing 2ER in 3.1IP (4H, 1BB, 1K, 1HR) in a 7-1 loss on 5/1 vs. Toronto.

WITH SCRANTON/WB: In 11 games (10 starts) with the RailRiders this season, is 3-6 with a 4.15 ERA (65.0IP, 66H, 37R/30ER, 22BB, 47K, 7HR)...is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (20.0IP, 13H, 5ER, 3BB, 17K, 2HR) in his last three starts...last pitched in a start on 6/9 at Lehigh Valley (W, 6.0IP, 5H, 1ER, 2BB, 6K).

VS. OAKLAND: Has never pitched against the A's...is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (9.0IP, 1ER) in two career appearances (one start) vs. AL West opponents.

EL LANZADOR: The Córdoba-born Cessa is the fourth Mexico-born pitcher to start a game in Yankees history...leads Mexico-born Yankees in starts and ranks second in innings pitched to Alfredo Aceves (145.1IP)...Esteban Loaiza (6GS), Alfredo Aceves (5GS) and Alfonso Pulido (3GS) have also made starts in pinstripes.

2016: Saw his first Major League action with the Yankees, going 4-4 with a 4.35 ERA (70.1IP, 64H, 36R/34ER, 14BB, 46K, 16HR, 3HP, 2WP) in 17 games (nine starts) over four stints with the Yankees (4/4-15, 5/17-6/7, 6/26-7/5, 8/11-10/2)...made his first career Opening Day roster.

- ✦ Also went 6-3 with one complete game and a 3.03 ERA (77.1IP, 66H, 33R/26ER, 23BB, 69K, 8HR) in 15 games (14 starts) with the RailRiders.

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER VS. LOS ANGELES-AL: RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (7-3, 3.71 ERA)

RHP Michael Pineda will make his 14th start of the season in Tuesday's series opener vs. Los Angeles-AL...the 28-year-old is pitching on extended five days' rest...will face the Angels for the second straight start, having tied season highs with 10H and 5ER in 6.0IP (1BB, 2K, 1HR) in a no-decision on Thursday...needs 1K to reach 500K as a Yankee...the Yankees are 9-4 in his 13 starts...is tied for fifth in the AL in wins, surpassing his 2016 total (6-12 in 32 starts)...has a 1.96 ERA at home this season (6.25 on the road)...tied a career best with five consecutive quality starts from 5/5-28 (also first five career starts - 4/5-28/11 with Seattle)...permitted 3ER-or-fewer in nine straight starts from 4/10-5/28, matching the longest single-season streak of his career (also 4/5-9/5/14); went 6-1 with a 2.89 ERA (56.0IP, 18ER) during the streak...was one of three pitchers in Yankees history to record at least 6K in his first seven starts of a season (also Mike Mussina in 2003, Bob Turley in 1955)...made his fifth Opening Day roster (also 2011, '14-16) and fourth with the Yankees...spent his first six professional seasons in the Mariners organization (2006-11)...made his MLB debut in 2011, earning an All-Star selection and finishing fifth in AL "Rookie of the Year" voting...was acquired by the Yankees along with RHP Vicente Campos in exchange for C/DH Jesús Montero and RHP Hector Noési on 1/23/12 but did not appear in a game for the Yankees until 2014 due to injury.

#28 JOE GIRARDI—MANAGER

- The 2017 season marks his 10th as manager of the New York Yankees (since 2008)...is one of six managers in franchise history to lead the team for at least part of 10 different seasons (also Joe McCarthy-16, Joe Torre-12, Casey Stengel-12, Miller Huggins-12 and Ralph Houk-11)...owns the sixth-most managerial wins in Yankees history, trailing only McCarthy (1,460), Torre (1,173), Stengel (1,149), Huggins (1,067) Ralph Houk (944).
- Is the only current manager to lead his team to winning records in each of the last eight seasons (2008-16)—credit: *Elias*.
- From 2014-16, the Yankees had a Major League-best 73.6% success rate on replay challenges (87 challenges, 64 overturned).
- Has been ejected twice this season (5/3 win vs. Toronto and 5/20 loss at Tampa Bay)...has 37 career ejections (34 as a manager, 32 as Yankees manager).
