ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a four-game series from New York (AL) to start the homestand and the four-game winning streak is the A's second longest of the season (5, April 18-22)...lost six of the previous seven games...are 31-38 (.449), which is the worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in the majors...it is three games better than the A's 69-game mark from last year (28-41)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 14½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 28 days in fifth.

SERIES SWEEPS: The A's four-game sweep of the Yankees was their first series sweep of any length since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City, also a four-game series...it snapped a streak of 26 consecutive series without a sweep...it was their first sweep in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota and their first four-game sweep in Oakland since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 22-13 (.629) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...have the sixth best home record in the majors and the second worst road record (PHI, 9-28/.243)...the home winning percentage is .364 better than the road...the biggest differential in Athletics history is .356 in 1945 (.527 at home, .171 on the road)...are 4-0 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand and have now won six of their last seven home games and 20 of the last 28...leave following the game Thursday for a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...the two longest are 13 (May 11-July 26, 1979) and 11 (June 14-Aug. 14, 1977)...are 7-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 65 errors, which is 13 more than any other team (TB, 52)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...nine of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 61 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51), which are already the A's most before the All-Star Break since 2011 (64)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (8).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.75 ERA (145 in 227.0 ip) and .279 (251-for-901) opponents batting average over the last 26 games...now have a 4.80 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (31) and rank third in wild pitches (37)...the wild pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016, 38 in 1979).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-3 over the last 11 games but they have a 6.60 ERA (43 er in 58.2 ip), .305 (74-for-243) opponents batting average and 14 home runs allowed over that span...are 22-27 with a 4.72 ERA for the season...the losses are tied for second most in the American League...have allowed 49 home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.415)...have used 10 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Texas for second most in the AL (SEA, 12)...it marks the 10th time in the last 11 years the A's have used 10 or more different starting pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .292 (95-for-325) with 47 runs scored over the last nine games (5.2 runs per game)...have the second lowest batting average (.242) and on-base percentage (.310) in the American League, the second most strikeouts (638) and the third fewest runs scored (298)...rank third in extra base hits (233) and tied for fourth in doubles (128)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.228)...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.196) and on-base percentage (.279) in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 98 home runs, which is second most in Athletics history after 69 games...the 2000 club had 105 (had 109 after 70 games...the 1996 club had 99)...60 of the A's 98 home runs have come in

the Coliseum, which is the third most home runs at home in the American League...the A's are one of four teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, COL, MIA)...home runs have accounted for 150 of the A's 298 runs (50.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 28-25 when homering, 3-13 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is tied for third worst in the AL...the pitching staff has surrendered 36 home runs in the last 20 games after allowing just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...Oakland is 23-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 8-29 when they don't.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 9-for-54 (.167) with 26 RBI with the bases loaded...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the RBI are third fewest...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.213) and second lowest slugging percentage (.259).

CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's four wins over the Yankees were by one-run...had lost each of their previous four one-run decisions...are now 8-9 (.471) in one-run games for the season, including 7-2 at home...have two last at bat wins on the homestand and seven for the season...had their fifth walk-off win of the season Thursday, which is tied for third most in the majors (BAL and LAA, 6)...are 3-3 in extra inning games, including 3-1 at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 13-6...through games of last Thursday, the A's were successful in 28.6% (4-of-14) of their challenges, which was tied with Detroit and Miami for the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -71, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 66 different lineups in 69 games...are averaging 3 hours and 18 minutes per game in June and 3:08:19 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have an 8-9 record in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-4 against Houston...lost two of three in Houston April 28-30 after being swept in a rain-shortened two-game series in Oakland April 14-15 (the rainout will be made up as part of a single-admission doubleheader on Sept. 9)...have lost 11 of their last 12 games to the Astros, including each of the last six in Oakland...the six-game home losing streak is the A's longest ever against Houston...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 16-27 against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 48 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 47-40...19 of the 40 losses have been by one run...are 25-18 in Oakland and 22-22 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.630) and OPS (1.027), fourth in on-base percentage (.397) and tied for eighth in home runs (17)...**Khris Davis** hit his 18th home run of the season yesterday, which broke a 2-2 tie...he ranks third in the AL in go-ahead home runs (9) and second in go-ahead RBI (16)...**Ryon Healy** is batting .350 (21-for-60) with 12 runs, six doubles, eight home runs, 18 RBI, a .850 slugging percentage and six multiple hit games over his last 15 games...**Matt Joyce** has seven hits and four walks in his last 12 plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in **2003** Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami last Wednesday...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his Major League debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a pair of solo home runs to Ozuna and Moore in the second...yielded two more runs in the third, highlighted by a Yelich RBI single, and was charged with three runs in the fourth, including a Telis RBI double.

for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...was charged with two runs or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against right-handed hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties...six came with the bases empty...held the opposition to a .154 batting average when leading off an inning...issued just nine walks for a .203 on-base percentage in that situation...had a .225 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts, walked two batters or fewer 23 times and surrendered four hits or fewer 13 times.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors...is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with five saves, four blown saves, a 6.02 ERA (31 er in 46.1 ip) and 10 home runs allowed over the last 14 games...now has a 4.95 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.26).
- Blew three saves during Thursday's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Has allowed just two first batter home runs, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.298) and the fourth most strikeouts (60).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (83), is tied for the second-fewest wins (9) and ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26).
