ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped last night and are now 8-8 over the last 16 games...are 31-39 (.443), which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it is two games better than the A's 70-game mark from the previous two seasons (29-41)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 21st consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 15½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 29 days in fifth...swept a four-game series from New York (AL) to start the homestand, snapping a streak of 26 consecutive series without a sweep...it was the A's first sweep since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City and the first in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 22-14 (.611) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...have the eighth best home record in the majors and the second worst road record (PHI, 9-28/.243)...the home winning percentage is .346 better than the road...the biggest differential in Athletics history is .356 in 1945 (.527 at home, .171 on the road)...are 4-1 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-1)...went 3-3 on the last homestand and have now won six of their last eight home games and 20 of the last 29...leave following the game Thursday for a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...the two longest are 13 (May 11-July 26, 1979) and 11 (June 14-Aug. 14, 1977)...are 7-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 65 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (MIL, 53)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 37)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...nine of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 61 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51), which are already the A's most before the All-Star Break since 2011 (64)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (8).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.68 ERA (149 er in 236.0 ip) and .278 (260-for-936) opponents batting average over the last 27 games...have allowed 39 home runs in the last 21 games after surrendering just 46 home runs over the first 49 contests...have the third highest ERA in the American League (4.79)...are tied for the lead in hit batters (31) and rank third in wild pitches (37)...the wild pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016, 38 in 1979).

STARTING PITCHING: The A's have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 110 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 201; LAD, 187; ATL, 161)...it is also fourth longest in Athletics history (third is 113 from June 21, 2012-April 22, 2013)...starters are 3-4 with a 6.20 ERA (45 er in 65.1 ip), .297 (80-for-269) opponents batting average and 15 home runs allowed over the last 12 games...overall, have the second most losses in the American League (28) but are tied for the fewest home runs (50)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.416).

OFFENSE: The A's have the lowest batting average in the American League (.241), the second lowest on-base percentage (.309), the second most strikeouts (651) and the third fewest runs scored (299)...the 651 strikeouts are fifth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013; 703 in 2008; 683 in 2012; 668 in 2014)...are tied for third in the AL in doubles (130) and rank fourth in extra base hits (235)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.229)...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.196) and on-base percentage (.279) in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 98 home runs, which is second most in Athletics history after 70 games (109 in 2000, 99 in 1996)...60 of the A's 98 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which are the third most home runs at home in the American League...the A's are one of four teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, COL, MIA)...home runs have accounted for 150 of the A's 299 runs (50.2%)...the Oakland record for

highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 28-25 when homering, 3-14 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is third worst in the AL...Oakland is 23-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 8-30 when they don't.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 9-for-54 (.167) with 26 RBI with the bases loaded...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the RBI are second fewest...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.213) and second lowest slugging percentage (.259).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of their last three one-run decisions after losing four in a row...are 8-9 (.471) in one-run games for the season, including 7-2 at home...have two last at bat wins on the homestand and seven for the season...had their fifth walk-off win of the season last Thursday, which is tied for third most in the majors (BAL and LAA, 6)...are 3-3 in extra inning games, including 3-1 at home.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 12-20 (.375) against American League West competition compared to 19-19 (.500) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-18)...are batting .222 (231-for-1041) and are averaging 3.59 runs per game (115 r in 32 games) against the West compared to .256 and 4.84 runs per game against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-6...through games of Sunday, the A's were successful in 25.0% (4-of-16) of their challenges, which was the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -74, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 67 different lineups in 70 games...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in June and 3:08:08 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have an 8-10 record in June...went 12-15 in May after going 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-5 against the Astros...are 0-3 in Oakland and 1-2 in Houston...have lost 12 of their last 13 games to the Astros, including each of the last seven in Oakland...the seven-game home losing streak is the A's longest ever against Houston and is tied for the sixth longest Coliseum losing streak against any team...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 16-28 against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 49 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 47-41...19 of the 41 losses have been by one run...are 25-19 in Oakland and 22-22 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.622) and OPS (1.016), fourth in on-base percentage (.395), tied for eighth in home runs (17) and 10th in batting (.301)...**Matt Joyce** has a seven-game hitting streak and is 11-for-20 (.550) with five runs, four doubles, a home run and four walks during the streak...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the AL lead with 23 doubles...the doubles are three short of the Oakland record for doubles before the All-Star Break (26, Joe Rudi in 1974 and Bobby Crosby in 2008).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Roger Cramer ties an American League record by collecting six hits in six at bats in a nine inning game...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches all 11 innings of the A's 3-2 win over Detroit...Joe Rudi has three hits including the game winning homer to lead off the bottom of the 11th...in **1990** Terry Steinbach drives in six runs on a grand slam and a two-run single as the A's defeat the Tigers at Detroit, 12-7...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in a 5-3 win at Pittsburgh, giving him the save in all three games of the three-game series against Pittsburgh.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.44 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-1 with a 5.87 ERA (15 er in 23.0 ip) and .319 (30-for-94) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.30 ERA (11 er in 30.0 ip) and .232 (26-for-112) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.96 ERA (15 er in 22.2 ip) and .301 (28-for-93) opponents average in four starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road.

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed 23 of his 32 runs in the single biggest inning of his nine starts (19 er, 19.00 ERA)...has a 1.44 ERA (7 er in 43.2 ip) in all other innings...last year, he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) in the first and second inning and a 6.23 ERA (24 er in 34.2 ip) from the third inning on...has surrendered all five of his home runs in the third through fifth innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 1-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts at night...has allowed all five of his home runs at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Four of the five home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .189 (14-for-74) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .305 (40-for-131) with all five of his home runs after that...has a .306 (15-for-49) opponents average against batters leading off an inning...opponents are hitting .315 (17-for-54) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .165 (19-for-115) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 15-for-27 (.556) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for sixth among American League pitchers in putouts (8)...has allowed six unearned runs, which is tied for sixth in the AL...is tied for eighth in wild pitches (5)...has walked two batters or fewer in seven of his nine starts...is 4-12 with a 5.78 ERA (92 er in 143.1 ip) over his last 27 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career

REHAB: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota **May 2**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit **May 7** in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead when he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas **May 13**...allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston **May 18** in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami **May 24** in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland **May 30**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time

in his last 23 starts he has allowed seven runs...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brantley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch...had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss to Washington on **June 4** in Oakland...shut out the Nationals on one hit and two walks over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two-run triple to Turner and he scored on a Goodwin sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh to get Gray off the hook...was relieved by Madson to start the eighth and he allowed three runs for the loss...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Tampa Bay in the first game of the **June 10** doubleheader...struck out 10 batters, his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning as Souza had a two-run single following a Gray error...allowed three runs (two earned) in the sixth on a two-run double by Beckham and a Phegley error...left trailing 5-3 but the A's scored single runs in the seventh and ninth innings to send the game into extra innings.

LAST START: He had his third straight no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to New York (AL) last Thursday...shutout the Yankees on four hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a two-run single by Headley and a RBI single by Carter...left after 5.2 innings with the score tied 3-3.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 50 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

LHP Sean Manaea (6-3, 4.01 ERA): Is 5-0 with a 2.84 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his last six starts...the winning streak is a career high and an A's season high...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has allowed a .109 batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .221 against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings...is 3-0 with a 3.97 ERA in six starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA in six starts on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's win over New York (AL) on Friday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 0-1 despite a 1.71 ERA (26.1 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 5 er, 13 bb, 26 so, 1 hr) and .143 opponents batting average in five career starts against Houston...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 10-6 A's loss in Oakland on April 15 (5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with five saves, four blown saves, a 6.10 ERA (33 er in 48.2 ip) and 12 home runs allowed over the last 15 games...now has a 4.98 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.26).
- Blew three saves during Thursday's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Has allowed just three first batter home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (KC, 2)...has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.316) and the fourth most strikeouts (60).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (84), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26) and tied for the second-fewest wins (9).
