LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros took Game #1 of the current series in OAK last night, 4-1...RHP Brad Peacock (4-1) earned the win (5.2 IP, 1 ER, 2 BB, 8 SO)...a 2-run HR by Jake Marisnick (#9) snapped a 0-0 tie in the 5th...George Springer (#20) and Derek Fisher (#2) also added homers...RHP Ken Giles retired the side in order in the 9th to earn his 17th save.

PEACOCKKKK: RHP Brad Peacock has been punching out batters at a remarkable rate in 2017...his 8 K's in last night's win increased his season total to 66 in just 44.2 IP...in his previous start on 6/13 vs. TEX, he tallied 10 K's in just 4.2 IP, becoming the 1st pitcher in club history to record 10 K's in an outing less than 5.0 IP...his 13.30 SO/9IP ratio is tops in the Majors among hurlers with at least 40 IP this season.
