OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-40) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (48-24)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning four in a row and are now 5-5 over the last 10 games...are 31-40 (.437) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it is two games better than the A's 71-game mark from last season (29-42)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 22nd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16½ games...that is ½-game short of the season high of 17 (June 14)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth...swept a four-game series from New York (AL) to start the homestand, snapping a streak of 26 consecutive series without a sweep...it was the A's first sweep since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City and the first in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 22-15 (.595) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...are tied for the eighth best home record in the majors and have the second worst road record (PHI, 9-28/.243)...the home winning percentage is .330 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...are 4-2 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-2)...went 3-3 on the last homestand...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...the two longest are 13 (May 11-July 26, 1979) and 11 (June 14-Aug. 14, 1977)...are 7-2-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 12-21 (.364) against American League West competition compared to 19-19 (.500) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-18)...are batting .223 (240-for-1075) and are averaging 3.61 runs per game (119 r in 33 games) against the West compared to .256 and 4.84 runs per game against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 66 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (MIL, 54)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 39)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 62 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 51)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (8).

OFFENSE: The A's have the lowest batting average in the American League (.241), the second lowest on-base percentage (.309), the second most strikeouts (660) and the third fewest runs scored (303)...the 660 strikeouts are fifth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013; 703 in 2008; 683 in 2012; 668 in 2014)...rank third in the AL in doubles (135) and extra base hits (241)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.226)...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average in the majors (.197) and are tied for the second lowest on-base percentage (.281).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.84 ERA, which is third highest in the American League...lead the league in hit batters (33) and rank third in wild pitches (37)...the wild pitches are tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016, 38 in 1979) and the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-5 with a 6.40 ERA (50 er in 70.1 ip), .299 (87-for-291) opponents batting average and 16 home runs allowed over the last 13 games...have the second most losses in the American League (29) but have the second fewest home runs (51)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.418)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 111 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 202; LAD, 188; ATL, 162)...it is also fourth longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16, 113 from 6/21/12-4/22/13).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 99 home runs, which is tied for ninth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...last hit 100 home runs before the break in 2002 when they had 109...61 of the A's 99 home runs

have come in the Coliseum, which are tied with Houston for the second most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 65)...the A's are one of four teams with three players with 15 or more home runs (CIN, COL, MIA)...home runs have accounted for 151 of the A's 303 runs (49.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 28-26 when homering, 3-14 when they don't...the mark when held to no home runs is tied for third worst in the AL...Oakland is 23-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 8-31 when they don't.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 9-for-54 (.167) with 26 RBI with the bases loaded...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the RBI are second fewest (SD, 23)...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.213) and second lowest slugging percentage (.259).

IN JUNE: Oakland is 8-11 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.95 ERA (111 er in 168.0 ip) this June, which is fourth highest in the American League...the highest June ERA in Oakland history is 5.61 in 1998...rank second in the AL in most strikeouts (167) and most walks (66) and third in most home runs (35)...the home runs are fourth most in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980, 37 in 1998, 36 in 2001)...the offense has struck out an AL leading 184 times...the Athletics record for strikeouts in June is 231 in 2012...have already set franchise record for strikeouts in May (255) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-6...through games of Sunday, the A's were successful in 25.0% (4-of-16) of their challenges, which was the worst mark in the majors...are 8-9 in one-run games, including 7-2 at home...are tied for third in the majors with five walk-off wins (BAL and LAA, 6)...have a run differential of -78, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 68 different lineups in 71 games...are averaging 3 hours and 18 minutes per game in June and 3:08:25 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 17 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-6 against the Astros...are 0-4 in Oakland and 1-2 in Houston...have lost 13 of their last 14 games to the Astros, including each of the last eight in Oakland...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 16-29 (.356) against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 50 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 47-42...are 25-20 in Oakland and 22-22 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.619) and OPS (1.011), fourth in on-base percentage (.392) and tied for eighth in home runs (17)...**Matt Joyce** has a seven-game hitting streak and is 11-for-20 (.550) with five runs, four doubles, a home run and four walks during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-3, 4.01 ERA)

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) and .216 (30-for-139) opponents batting average over his last six starts... the winning streak is a career high, an A's season high and is tied for the third longest active winning streak in the American League...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts... has walked just nine batters in 38.0 innings during the winning streak (2.13 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the American League in most hit batters (5) and tied for 10th in wins (6)...has tossed 67.1 innings and is 3.2 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders in rate categories... based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he ranks third in the American League in opponents batting average (.200), seventh in slugging percentage (.343), ninth in strikeouts per nine innings (9.76) and 10th in on-base percentage (.290).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .109 (5-for-46) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .221 (44-for-199) against right-handers... the mark against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings (Keuchel, .100)...has surrendered just one of his 18 extra base hits to lefties (home run) for a .174 slugging percentage (.382 against righties)...his career splits are a .158 (23-for-146) batting average against lefties, .250 (161-for-644) against righties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 3.97 ERA (15 er in 34.0 ip) in six starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA (15 er in 33.1 ip) in six starts on the road...is now 8-3 with a 3.30 ERA (43 er in 117.1 ip) in 20 career games in the Coliseum compared to 5-9 with a 4.66 ERA (49 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .170 (9-for-53) with runners in scoring position...they are 11-for-135 (.081) with two strikes but they are batting .524 (11-for-21) when putting the first pitch in play...opponents are 9-for-58 (.155) when leading of an inning but he has walked eight and hit three for a .290 on-base percentage...has held the three and four hitter to a combined .119 (7-for-59) batting average...has a .240 (23-for-96) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .174 (26-for-149) after that...has a .174 (28-for-161) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .250 (21-for-84) average with 18 of his 28 opponents RBI with two outs.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA (18 er in 29.1 ip) in six starts against American League West teams compared to 5-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts against everyone else.

THE SECOND INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 33 runs in the second inning for a 9.75 ERA (13 er in 12.0 ip)...the 13 runs are tied for third most in the American League in the second inning...has a 2.77 ERA (17 er in 55.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .346 (18-for-52) with a .382 on-base percentage (3 bb) in the second inning, .161 (31-for-193) with a .267 on-base percentage (23 bb, 5 hbp, 0 sf) in all other innings

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, giving him a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 5-1 with a 3.34 ERA (16 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had

a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was placed on the disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings in a 6-5 loss to Seattle on May 15...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...tossed a career-high 111 pitches in a 5-3 victory over Toronto on June 5.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over New York (AL) on Friday here in Oakland...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the second inning but he allowed a three-run home run to Judge in the third...yielded a RBI single to Williams in the fifth and Carter left of the sixth with a home run...left after six innings trailing 5-4 but Oakland scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth for the win.

MANAEA vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-1 despite a 1.71 ERA (26.1 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 5 er, 13 bb, 26 so, 1 hr) and .143 (13-for-91) opponents batting average in five career starts...is 0-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland, 0-1 with a 0.00 ERA (10.1 ip) in two starts in Houston...had a

no decision in his only start this year, a 10-6 A's loss in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (3-4, 3.56 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA in three starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 6...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA and .242 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...has not allowed a home run over his last nine starts and has a 48.2-inning, 215-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just one home run in 65.2 innings (0.14 per nine innings)...is 3-1 with a 4.37 ERA in five starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 3.14 ERA in seven games on the road...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's win over New York (AL) last Saturday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)... is 1-3 with a 6.05 ERA (19.1 ip, 22 h, 14 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts against Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-2 A's loss at Houston on April 30 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 6 so).

Saves/Opportunities: 15-for-26 (57.7%)

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with five saves, four blown saves, a 6.15 ERA (36er in 52.2 ip) and 13 home runs allowed over the last 16 games... now has a 5.01 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (MIN, 5.21).
- Blew three saves during last Thursday's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Allowed just the fourth first batter home run last night, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...has the third lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.340) and the fourth most strikeouts (60).
