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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-41) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (49-24)

THURSDAY, JUNE 22, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning four in a row and are now 31-41 (.431) for the season...that is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...the 10 games under .500 are one short of the season high of 11 (27-38 on June 14)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 23rd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 17½ games...the only other times in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 17½ games before the end of June were in 1979 (23 games on June 30) and 2001 (21 games on June 26)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 31 days in fifth.

FOUR-GAME SERIES: The A's have lost the first three games of this series after sweeping a four-game series from New York (AL) to start the homestand...over the last 106 years, the only time the A's have played back-to-back four-game series and recorded a sweep in one series while getting swept in another was in 1977 when they were swept by Texas (Sept. 23-25) before sweeping Kansas City (Sept. 26-28)...were last swept in a four-game series by New York (AL) last year in Oakland from May 19-22...the sweep of New York (AL) to start this homestand snapped a streak of 26 consecutive series without a sweep...it was the A's first sweep since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City and the first in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of their last three games, which matches the longest home losing streak of the season (April 14-17)...are 22-16 (.579) at home compared to 9-25 (.265) on the road...have the second worst road record (PHI, 9-28/.243)...are 4-3 on this eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-3) after going 3-3 on the last homestand...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 29 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...the two longest are 13 (May 11-July 26, 1979) and 11 (June 14-Aug. 14, 1977)...are 7-3-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 12-22 (.353) against American League West competition compared to 19-19 (.500) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-18)...are batting .221 (244-for-1104) and are averaging 3.53 runs per game (120 r in 34 games) against the West compared to .256 and 4.84 runs per game against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 67 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (MIL, 55)...the errors have led to a ML leading 46 unearned runs (ATL, 39)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 62 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 53)...are tied for third in the AL in passed balls (8).

OFFENSE: The A's have the lowest batting average in the American League (.240), the second lowest on-base percentage (.308), the second most strikeouts (668) and the second fewest runs scored (304)...the 668 strikeouts are tied for fourth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013; 703 in 2008; 683 in 2012; 668 in 2014)...are tied for third in the AL in doubles (136) and extra base hits (242)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.223) and with the bases loaded (.167) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.195) and on-base percentage (.277) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.84 ERA, which is third highest in the American League...lead the league in hit batters (33) and rank third in wild pitches (38)...the wild pitches are tied for second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break to record of 43 in 2016...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-6 with a 6.25 ERA (53 er in 76.1 ip), .297 (94-for-316) opponents batting average and 16 home runs allowed over the last 14 games...have the second most losses in the American League (30) but have allowed the fewest home runs (51)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.416)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 112

consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 203; LAD, 189; ATL, 163)...it is also fourth longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16, 113 from 6/21/12-4/22/13).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 99 home runs, which is tied for ninth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...last hit 100 home runs before the break in 2002 when they had 109...61 of the A's 99 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is tied with Houston for the second most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 67)...home runs have accounted for 151 of the A's 304 runs (49.7%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 28-26 when homering, 3-15 when they don't...Oakland is 23-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 8-32 when they don't.

IN JUNE: Oakland is 8-12 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.90 ERA (116 er in 177.0 ip) this June, which is third highest in the American League...the highest June ERA in Oakland history is 5.61 in 1998...rank second in the AL in most strikeouts (176) and most walks (68) and third in most home runs (36)...the home runs are tied for third most in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980, 37 in 1998)...the offense has struck out an AL leading 192 times...the Athletics record for strikeouts in June is 231 in 2012...have already set franchise record for strikeouts in May (255) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-6...through games of Sunday, the A's were successful in 25.0% (4-of-16) of their challenges, which was the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -82, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 69 different lineups in 72 games...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in June and 3:08:23 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 18 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-7 against the Astros...are 0-5 in Oakland and 1-2 in Houston...have lost 14 of their last 15 games to the Astros, including each of the last nine in Oakland...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 16-30 (.348) against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 51 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 47-43...are 25-21 in Oakland and 22-22 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.620) and OPS (1.014), fourth in on-base percentage (.394) and tied for seventh in home runs (17)...**Ryon Healy** has eight home runs in June, which are his most in a month, tied for the AL lead and the most in June by an Athletic since Ben Grieve also had eight in 2000.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando, Ted Kubiak and Reggie Jackson all hit solo homers in the third inning of the A's 7-3 win against Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...it is the first three-homer inning in Oakland history...in **1979**, twelve days after Jim Essian's inside-the-park Grand Slam, Larry Murray hits an inside-the-park home run in the A's 6-5 win over the Texas Rangers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (3-4, 3.56 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 6...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA and .242 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton May 31 against Lancaster and had a no decision in the Ports 3-2 win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 75 pitches)...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his appearances since then.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run over his last nine starts and has a 48.2-inning, 215-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just one home run in 65.2 innings, an average of 0.14 per nine innings...his innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with one home run or fewer...the lone home run came on April 19 against Texas, a solo shot by Gallo to lead off the fifth inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 4.37 ERA (11 er in 22.2 ip) in five starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 3.14 ERA (15 er in 43.0 ip) in seven games on the road...has not allowed a home run in 43.0 innings on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 8-5 with a 3.32 ERA (43 er in 116.2 ip) in 20 starts in Oakland, 3-9 with a 4.89 ERA (50 er in 92.0 ip) in 17 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.68 ERA (9 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts during the day and 1-3 with a 3.50 ERA (17 er in 43.2 ip) in eight games at night...picked up the win June 6 against Toronto to snap a seven-game losing streak in night games...it was his first win at night since June 15, 2015 at San Diego and his first ever night win in the Coliseum...is now 10-4 with a 2.58 ERA (33 er in 115.1 ip) in 19 career day games, 8-14 with a 4.59 ERA (85 er in 166.2 ip) in 31 night games.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (9 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed his only home run and issued 17 of his 24 walks to left-handed hitters...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed over the last two years have been hit by lefties...opponents are hitting .328 (19-for-58) with runners in scoring position and he has a .322 (58-for-180) opponents batting average with RISP in his three seasons with the A's...has a .200 (12-for-60) batting average against hitters leading off an inning...has a .286 (28-for-98) opponents batting average the first times through the lineup, .253 (23-for-91) the second time and .194 (12-for-62) after that.

SUPPORT: Has received 13 runs of support in his three starts since returning from the DL (16.0 ip, 7.31 RSA) after getting just four runs of support over his previous six starts (31.2 ip, 1.14 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times, and has a season run support average of 3.70 (27 rs in 65.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 18 of his 36 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in three of his starts this year (April 25, May 12 and June 11).

ROAD LOSING STREAK: Has not won a road game over the last two years and is 0-6 with a 5.56 ERA (35 er in 56.2 ip) over his last 11 games (10 starts) on the road...the six-game road losing streak matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last with a longer streak is Ariel Prieto, who had a nine-game road losing streak from April 29, 1997 to Sept. 24, 2000...his last road win came on June 15, 2015 at San Diego.

THIS AND THAT: Has committed two errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers...also ranks sixth in assists (12) and tied for ninth in total chances (17)...is tied for second in the AL in triples allowed (3) and opponents reaching on an error (6)...has tossed more than six innings in just two of his 11 starts this year and 13 of 48 in his career...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen bases attempts off him...are 11-for-12 (91.6%) over the last two years after going 5-for-10 (50.0%) over his first two.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: His first appearance of the season came in relief of starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...moved into the starting rotation April 13 at Kansas City and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...snapped a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to 2016 in a 9-1 win over Texas April 19...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit in a no decision at Los Angeles (AL) April 25, a 2-1 A's loss in 11 innings...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless in-

nings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks May 6 against Detroit...left with a 2-1 lead on May 12 at Texas but Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save...tossed just 2.0 innings May 23 against Miami...was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...went 0-2 with a 6.11 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May...his May ERA was his highest ever in a month (min 5.0 ip)...picked up the win June 6 against Toronto to snap his losing streak at a career-high tying three games (fourth time, last: June 3, 2016-April 13, 2017)...posted a 5.70 ERA and .306 opponents average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 30 to May 23.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win over New York (AL) on Saturday here in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two runs in the second on a Romine RBI single and a Gardner sacrifice fly...those were the only runs he allowed in his five innings of work and Oakland scored once in the bottom of the second and three times in the fourth for the win.

HAHN vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-3 with a 6.05 ERA (19.1 ip, 22 h, 14 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts...that includes 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (6.2 ip) in one start in Oakland and 0-3 with a 9.24 ERA (13 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts in Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-2 A's loss at Houston on April 30...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0...Keuchel shut out the A's on two hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored single runs in the eighth and ninth...went 1-1 with a 8.59 ERA (7.1 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 1 so) in two starts last year.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...his opponents batting average included a mark of .273 against right-handed hitters compared to .361 against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jharel Cotton (4-7, 5.40 ERA): Is 1-3 with a 5.02 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in five starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...is 0-5 with a 9.38 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts at night, 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in seven starts during the day...is 2-4 with a 3.74 ERA and .234 opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 2-3 with a 7.09 ERA and .285 opponents average in six starts in Oakland...has allowed 12 home runs in his last seven starts (39.2 ip)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's win over New York (AL) on Sunday here in Oakland (6.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the White Sox in his career.

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with five saves, four blown saves, a 6.14 ERA (38er in 55.2 ip) and 14 home runs allowed over the last 17 games... now has a 5.02 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League (DET, 5.07; MIN, 5.21).
- Blew three saves during last Thursday's game (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Allowed just the fourth first batter home run on Tuesday, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...has the third lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.335) and the fourth most strikeouts (60).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (84), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26) and tied for the second-fewest wins (9).
