OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-42) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (32-40)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the first game of the road trip last night, 3-0, for their first shutout victory since April 10 at Kansas City...was just their second shutout of the season...win snapped a four-game losing streak...are now 32-42 (.432) for the season...that is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 25th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 17½ games...the only other times in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 17½ games before the end of June were in 1979 (23 games on June 30) and 2001 (21 games on June 26)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 33 days in fifth.

FOUR-GAME SERIES SWEEPS: On their last homestand, the A's were swept in a four-game series against Houston after sweeping a four-game series from New York (AL) to start the homestand...over the last 106 years, the only time the A's have played back-to-back four-game series and recorded a sweep in one series while getting swept in another was in 1977 when they were swept by Texas (Sept. 23-25) before sweeping Kansas City (Sept. 26-28)...were last swept in a four-game series by New York (AL) last year in Oakland from May 19-22...the sweep of New York (AL) to start this homestand snapped a streak of 26 consecutive series without a sweep...it was the A's first sweep since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City and the first in Oakland since May 30-June 1, 2016 against Minnesota.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's current four-game home losing streak is their longest home losing streak of the season (previous: April 14-17)...are 22-17 (.564) at home compared to 10-25 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 10-28/.263)...went 4-4 on the most recent eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4) after going 3-3 on the last homestand...today marks the second day of a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (1-0) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 30 road games...have lost nine consecutive series on the road, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...the two longest are 13 (May 11-July 26, 1979) and 11 (June 14-Aug. 14, 1977)...are 7-3-2 in home series compared to 1-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 12-23 (.343) against American League West competition compared to 20-19 (.513) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-18, .333)...are batting .224 (256-for-1142) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (129 r in 35 games) against the West compared to .254 (338-for-1332) and 4.79 runs per game (187 runs in 39 games) against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 68 errors, which is 10 more than any other team (MIL, 58)...the errors have led to a ML leading 47 unearned runs (ATL, 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 62 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 54)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (8).

OFFENSE: The A's have the lowest batting average in the American League (.240), the second lowest on-base percentage (.310), the second most strikeouts (688) and the third fewest runs scored (316)...the 688 strikeouts are the third most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013; 703 in 2008)...are third in the AL in doubles (143) and extra base hits (251)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.227) and with the bases loaded (.167) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.195) and on-base percentage (.279) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.86 ERA, which is third highest in the American League...lead the league in hit batters (34) and rank third in wild pitches (39)...the wild pitches are the second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break to record of 43 in 2016...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-7 with a 6.70 ERA (62 er in 83.1 ip), .298 (103-for-346) opponents batting average and 18 home runs allowed over the last 16 games...have the second most losses in the American League (31) but are tied for the second fewest home runs (53)...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.419)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 114 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active

streak in the majors (TB, 204; LAD, 191; ATL, 165)...it is also the third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 101 home runs, which is eighth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...last hit 100 home runs before the break in 2002 when they had 109...61 of the A's 101 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is tied with Houston for the second most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 69)...home runs have accounted for 154 of the A's 316 runs (48.7%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 29-26 when homering, 3-16 when they don't...Oakland is 24-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 8-33 when they don't.

IN JUNE: Oakland is 9-13 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.86 ERA (127 er in 195.0 ip) this June, which is second highest in the American League...the highest June ERA in Oakland history is 5.61 in 1998...rank tied for second in the AL most walks issued (72) and tied for third in most strikeouts (190)...have allowed the third most home runs (39)...the home runs are the second most in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980)...the offense has struck out an AL-leading 212 times...the Athletics record for strikeouts in June is 231 in 2012...have already set franchise record for strikeouts in May (255) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-7...through games of Thursday, the A's were successful in 25.0% (4-of-16) of their challenges, which was the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -82, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 71 different lineups in 74 games...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in June and 3:08:28 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Semien began a rehab assignment last night in Single-A Stockton...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's opened the season series against the White Sox last night with a win...all seven games in the series are scheduled in a 13-day stretch from June 23-July 5...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and are 8-14 against the White Sox since 2014...the A's have not won a series at U.S. Cellular/Guaranteed Rate Field since April 11-13, 2011 (0-4-2 in last six series)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 303-286 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-137 in Oakland and 144-149 in Chicago...including 62-61 at U.S. Cellular/Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 980-1041 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks second in the American League in slugging percentage (.602) and OPS (.988), fifth in on-base percentage (.387) and tied for ninth in home runs (17)...**Ryon Healy** has eight home runs in June, which are his most in a month, tied for second in the AL, and the most in June by an Athletic since Ben Grieve also had eight in 2000...**Matt Joyce** is 18-for-53 (.340) with eight walks (.426 on-base percentage) over his last 16 games after going 6-for-45 (.133) over his previous 16 contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his Major League debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats...in **2012** Derek Norris hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off three-run blast in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (0-2, 7.20 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and made his Major League debut with a start that day at Miami...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...took the loss against the Marlins and in his second start last Monday against Houston...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career...joins Daniel Mengden (June 11-16, 2016) and Brett Anderson (April 10-15, 2009)...Anderson had a no decision in his third game but Mengden fell to 0-3 before picking up the win in his fourth game.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami June 14...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his Major League debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a pair of solo home runs to Ozuna and Moore in the second...yielded two more runs in the third, highlighted by a Yelich RBI single, and was charged with three runs in the fourth, including a Telis RBI double.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on Monday in Oakland...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first four innings but the A's were also held scoreless on two hits...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fifth inning and those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...left trailing 2-1.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25-for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...was charged with two runs or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against right-handed hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties...six came with the bases empty...held the opposition to a .154 batting average when leading off an inning...issued just nine walks for a .203 on-base percentage in that situation...had a .225 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts, walked two batters or fewer 23 times and surrendered four hits or fewer 13 times.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors...is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

RHP Sonny Gray (2-3, 4.84 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is 2-1 with a 4.11 ERA and .246 opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.96 ERA and .301 opponents average in four starts on the road...is 1-3 with a 6.55 ERA in six starts at night, 1-0 with a 2.55 ERA in four starts during the day...is scheduled to start on four days rest...is 1-1 with a 4.82 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA in his other five starts...suffered the loss in his last start, an 8-4 A's defeat against Houston on Tuesday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...he threw a season high 108 pitches, and all five runs came in the first inning...is 1-0 with a 5.29 ERA (17.0 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 10 er, 11 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against Chicago (AL).

- Blew three saves on June 15 (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Matched a season high in innings pitched Thursday with seven (other: 5/23 vs. Miami)...have thrown four or more innings in 26 of 74 games this season.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (85), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26) and tied for the second-fewest wins (9).

- Made his major league debut on Tuesday and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Beltran)...has allowed a first batter home run in each of his appearances.
- Was originally drafted by Florida in 2009 out of the University of California as an infielder and transitioned to pitcher in 2010...signed a minor league contract with the A's Nov. 15, 2016 and is 26-28 with a 3.10 ERA in 283 career appearances (40 starts) in eight seasons as a pitcher...has struck out 515 batters in 508.0 innings and has walked just 85 (1.50 walks per nine innings).
