OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-42) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (32-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first two games of the series for their first road series win since April 10-13 at Kansas City...are now 33-42 (.440) for the season...that is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 26th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 17½ games...the only other times in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 17½ games before the end of June were in 1979 (23 games on June 30) and 2001 (21 games on June 26)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 34 days in fifth.

ELIAS SAYS: Matt Olson (first inning), Jaycob Brugman (second inning), and Franklin Barreto (third inning) all recorded their first career Major League home runs yesterday...**according to Elias, the trio became just the second set of three teammates to hit their first major league home run in the same game...**it was previously done on April 26, 1914, by three players playing for the Kansas City Packers of the Federal League (Duke Kenworthy, Art Kruger and John Potts)...the Federal League played as a third major league during the 1914 and 1915 seasons.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won two straight games on the road for just the second time this season (also April 10-12 at Kansas City)...are 22-17 (.564) at home compared to 11-25 (.306) on the road...are tied for the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 10-29/.256)...went 4-4 on the most recent eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4) after going 3-3 on the last homestand...today marks the third day of a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (2-0) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2) and have lost 23 of the last 31 road games...the win last night ensured the A's first road series win since April 10-13 at Kansas City...had lost nine consecutive series on the road, which tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are now 7-3-2 in home series compared to 2-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 12-23 (.343) against American League West competition compared to 21-19 (.525) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-18, .333)...are batting .224 (256-for-1142) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (129 r in 35 games) against the West compared to .257 (353-for-1375) and 4.93 runs per game (197 runs in 40 games) against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high-tying three errors yesterday (seventh time) and have a Major League leading 71 errors, which is 13 more than any other team (MIL, 58)...the errors have led to a ML leading 49 unearned runs (ATL, 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and seventh fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 62 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 55)...are tied for fourth in the AL in passed balls (8).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second lowest batting average in the American League (.242), the second most strikeouts (700), the third lowest on-base percentage (.312), and the third fewest runs scored (326)...the 700 strikeouts are the third most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013; 703 in 2008)...are second in the AL in extra base hits (256) and third in doubles (144)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.225) and with the bases loaded (.175) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.196) and on-base percentage (.282) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.79 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the league in hit batters (34) and rank third in wild pitches (40)...the wild pitches are the second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break to record of 43 in 2016...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-0 and have not allowed an earned run in 11 innings on the road trip but are 5-7 with a 6.24 ERA (62 er in 89.1 ip), .294 (108-for-367) opponents batting average and 18 home runs allowed over the last 17 games...have the second most losses in the American League (31) but are tied for the fewest home runs (53)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.417)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 115 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in

the majors (TB, 205; LAD, 192; ATL, 166)...it is also the third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 105 home runs, which is the seventh most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...last hit 100 home runs before the break in 2002 when they had 109...61 of the A's 105 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is tied with Houston for the second most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 70)...home runs have accounted for 161 of the A's 326 runs (49.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 30-26 when homering, 3-16 when they don't...Oakland is 25-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 8-33 when they don't.

IN JUNE: Oakland is 10-13 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.60 ERA (127 er in 204.0 ip) this June, which is second highest in the American League...the highest June ERA in Oakland history is 5.61 in 1998...rank tied for third in the AL most walks issued (75) and are fourth in most strikeouts (199)...have allowed the third most home runs (39)...the home runs are the second most in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980)...the offense has struck out an AL-leading 224 times...the Athletics record for strikeouts in June is 231 in 2012...have already set franchise record for strikeouts in May (255) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-8...through games of Thursday, the A's were successful in 25.0% (4-of-16) of their challenges, which was the worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -74, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 72 different lineups in 75 games...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in June and 3:08:39 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Semien began a rehab assignment Friday in Single-A Stockton...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have won each of the first two games of the season series against the White Sox...all seven games in the series are scheduled in a 13-day stretch from June 23-July 5...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and are 9-14 against the White Sox since 2014...their win yesterday ensured their first series win at U.S. Cellular/Guaranteed Rate Field since April 11-13, 2011 (0-4-2 in previous six series)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 304-286 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-137 in Oakland and 145-149 in Chicago...including 63-61 at U.S. Cellular/Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 981-1041 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson (first inning), **Jaycob Brugman** (second inning), and **Franklin Barreto** (third inning) all hit their first career home runs yesterday...according to Elias, that is the second time ever and the first since 1914 that three teammates have hit their first major league home run in the same game...**Yonder Alonso** ranks second in the American League in OPS (.978) and third in slugging percentage (.592)...is sixth in on-base percentage (.385) and tied for ninth in home runs (17)...**Ryon Healy** has eight home runs in June, which are his most in a month, tied for third in the AL, and the most in June by an Athletic since Ben Grieve also had eight in 2000.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1950** Eddie Joost homers in both games of a doubleheader at Chicago and combines to drive in seven runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 300th career home run in the second inning of the A's 10-8 loss to Detroit...he would later add #301 for his 33rd career multi-homer game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-3, 4.84 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-1 with a 5.01 ERA (13 er in 23.1 ip) and .298 (28-for-94) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 2-2 with a 4.72 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first six starts...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 4.11 ERA (16 er in 35.0 ip) and .246 (33-for-134) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.96 ERA (15 er in 22.2 ip) and .301 (28-for-93) opponents average in four starts on the road...has allowed four of his six home runs on the road.

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed 25 of his 37 runs in the single biggest inning of his 10 starts (24 er, 21.60 ERA)...has a 1.32 ERA (7 er in 47.2 ip) in all other innings...last year, he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.15 ERA (7 er in 20.0 ip) in the first and second inning and a 5.73 ERA (24 er in 37.2 ip) from the third inning on...has surrendered five of his six home runs in the third through fifth innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 1-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 6.55 ERA (24 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts at night...has allowed all six of his home runs at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Five of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .235 (19-for-81) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .288 (42-for-146) with five of his six home runs after that...has a .296 (16-for-54) opponents average against batters leading off an inning...opponents are hitting .328 (20-for-61) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .176 (22-for-125) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 17-for-29 (.586) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for sixth among American League pitchers in putouts (8)...has allowed six unearned runs, which is tied for eighth in the AL...is tied for ninth in wild pitches (5)...has walked two batters or fewer in seven of his 10 starts...is 4-13 with a 5.89 ERA (97 er in 148.1 ip) over his last 28 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career

REHAB: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota **May 2**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit **May 7** in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead when he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas **May 13**...allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston **May 18** in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami **May 24** in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland **May 30**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time

in his last 23 starts he has allowed seven runs...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brantley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch...had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss to Washington on **June 4** in Oakland...shut out the Nationals on one hit and two walks over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two-run triple to Turner and he scored on a Goodwin sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh to get Gray off the hook...was relieved by Madson to start the eighth and he allowed three runs for the loss...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Tampa Bay in the first game of the **June 10** doubleheader...struck out 10 batters, his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning as Souza had a two-run single following a Gray error...allowed three runs (two earned) in the sixth on a two-run double by Beckham and a Phegley error...left trailing 5-3 but the A's scored single...received his third straight no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to New York (AL) on **June 15**...shutout the Yankees on four hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a two-run single by Headley and a RBI single by Carter...left after 5.2 innings with the scored tied 3-3.

LAST START: Was tagged with the loss in the A's 8-4 loss to Houston on Tuesday...allowed five runs in the first inning including a leadoff home run to George Springer...left after 5.0 innings with the Astros up 5-3.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 50 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).
