OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-42) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (52-25)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won all three games at Chicago (AL) this past weekend for their first three-game road winning streak of the season...was their first road series win since April 10-13 at Kansas City and first road sweep since Sept. 12-15, 2016, also at Kansas City...are now 34-42 (.447) for the season...that is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 28th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 17½ games ...the only other times in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 17½ games before the end of June were in 1979 (23 games on June 30) and 2001 (21 games on June 26)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 36 days in fifth.

ELIAS SAYS: Matt Olson (first inning), Jaycob Brugman (second inning), and Franklin Barreto (third inning) all recorded their first career Major League home runs Saturday...**according to Elias, the trio became just the second set of three teammates to hit their first major league home run in the same game**...it was previously done on April 26, 1914, by three players playing for the Kansas City Packers of the Federal League (Duke Kenworthy, Art Kruger and John Potts)...the Federal League played as a third major league during the 1914 and 1915 seasons.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won three straight games on the road for the first time this season...had won back-to-back road games just once prior to the current streak (April 10 & 12 at Kansas City) and had lost 23 of 29 on the road before the weekend sweep...are 22-17 (.564) at home compared to 12-25 (.324) on the road...have the worst road record in the AL and the fifth worst road record in the majors (PHI, 10-31/.244)...went 4-4 on the most recent eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4) after going 3-3 on the last homestand...today marks the fourth game of a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2)...prior to the sweep in Chicago, had lost nine consecutive series on the road, which tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are now 7-3-2 in home series compared to 2-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 12-23 (.343) against American League West competition compared to 22-19 (.537) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-18, .333)...are batting .224 (256-for-1142) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (129 r in 35 games) against the West compared to .258 (365-for-1413) and 4.93 runs per game (202 runs in 41 games) against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high-tying three errors Saturday (seventh time) and have a Major League leading 71 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (MIL, 59)...the errors have led to a ML leading 50 unearned runs (ATL, 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and sixth fewest in the majors...have allowed a ML leading 62 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 55)...are tied for first in the AL in passed balls (10).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second lowest batting average in the American League (.243), the second most strikeouts (709), the third lowest on-base percentage (.313), and the third fewest runs scored (331)...the 709 strikeouts are the second most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013)...are second in the AL in extra base hits (259) and third in doubles (145)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.225) and with the bases loaded (.175) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.284) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.76 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the league in hit batters (34) and rank third in wild pitches (40)...the wild pitches are the second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break to record of 43 in 2016...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers went 3-0 with a 0.50 ERA (1 er in 18 ip) in the sweep at Chicago (AL)...had gone 3-7 with a 7.12 ERA (62 er in 78.1 ip) and 18 home runs allowed in their previous 15 games (June 7-22)...have the second most losses in the American League (31) but have allowed the fewest home runs (54)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.416)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug.

19 of last year and their streak of 116 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 206; LAD, 194; ATL, 167)...it is also the third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 107 home runs, which is the seventh most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...last hit 100 home runs before the break in 2002 when they had 109...61 of the A's 107 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is tied with Houston for the second most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 72)...home runs have accounted for 163 of the A's 331 runs (49.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 31-26 when homering, 3-16 when they don't...Oakland is 25-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 9-33 when they don't.

IN JUNE: Oakland is 11-13 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.45 ERA (129 er in 213.0 ip) this June, which is second highest in the American League and would be the second highest in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...have allowed the third most home runs (41)...the home runs are tied for the most in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980)...the offense has struck out an AL-leading 233 times, which is a new franchise record for the month of June (231 in 2012)...have already set franchise records for strikeouts in May (255) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-8...through Sunday's games, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was the third worst mark in the majors (Miami, 26.7%; Detroit, 28.6%)...have a run differential of -72, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 73 different lineups in 76 games...are averaging 3:17:30 in June and 3:08:58 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Semien began a rehab assignment Friday in Single-A Stockton...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-8 against the Astros this season...are 0-6 in Oakland and 1-2 in Houston...have lost 15 of their last 16 games to the Astros, including each of the last 10 in Oakland...this is the second longest Coliseum losing streak ever against one team (13, Baltimore: July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 16-31 (.340) against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 52 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 47-44...are 25-22 in Oakland and 22-22 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's offense has set a **new franchise record** for strikeouts in a month in all three months this year (April, 221; May, 255; June, 231)...**Matt Joyce** is seventh in the AL in June on-base percentage (.432)...**Ryon Healy** has eight home runs in June, which are his most in a month, tied for fifth in the AL, and the most in June by an Athletic since Ben Grieve also had eight in 2000...**Franklin Barreto** has recorded a multi-hit game in both games since being recalled on Saturday (4-for-10, 3 r, hr, 2 rbi).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland...McGwire has four hits and drives in five runs...in **1996** the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in **2002** Miguel Tejada plays in his 348th consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played...Tejada's streak reached 594 before signing with Baltimore as a free agent.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-4, 4.05 ERA)

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Suffered a loss on Wednesday snapping a five-game winning streak...the winning streak was a career high, an A's season high and was tied for the third longest active winning streak in the American League...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has walked just 11 batters in 44.0 innings during his last seven games (2.25 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the American League in most hit batters (5) and tied for 13th in wins (6)...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks sixth in the American League in opponents batting average (.207), fifth in slugging percentage (.337), and eighth in strikeouts per nine innings (9.94).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .135 (7-for-52) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .225 (49-for-218) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 70 or more innings (Keuchel, .100)...has surrendered just one of his 29 extra base hits to lefties (home run) for a .192 slugging percentage (.372 against righties)...his career splits are a .164 (25-for-152) batting average against lefties, .250 (166-for-663) against righties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 4.05 ERA (18 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA (15 er in 33.1 ip) in six starts on the road...is now 8-4 with a 3.36 ERA (46 er in 123.1 ip) in 21 career games in the Coliseum compared to 5-9 with a 4.66 ERA (49 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .200 (12-for-60) with runners in scoring position...they are 16-for-151 (.106) with two strikes but they are batting .458 (11-for-24) when putting the first pitch in play...opponents are 10-for-62 (.161) when leading of an inning but he has walked 10 and hit three for a .307 on-base percentage...has held the three and four hitter to a combined .138 (9-for-65) batting average...has a .231 (24-for-104) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .193 (32-for-166) after that...has a .185 (33-for-178) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .250 (23-for-92) average with 19 of his 31 opponents RBI with two outs.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-4 with a 5.35 ERA (21 er in 35.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West teams compared to 5-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts against everyone else.

THE SECOND INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 33 runs in the second inning for a 9.00 ERA (13 er in 13.0 ip)...has a 2.98 ERA (20 er in 60.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .327 (18-for-55) with a .362 on-base percentage (3 bb) in the second inning, .191 (41-for-215) with a .290 on-base percentage (25 bb, 5 hbp, 0 sf) in all other innings

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, giving him a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 5-2 with a 3.49 ERA (19 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was placed on the disabled list April 30 retroactive to

April 27 with a strained left shoulder...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings in a 6-5 loss to Seattle on May 15...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...tossed a career-high 111 pitches in a 5-3 victory over Toronto on June 5.

LAST START: Tagged with the loss in the A's 5-1 loss to Houston on Wednesday in Oakland...allowed all three runs in the third inning after the first three batters all singled...left after six innings trailing 3-0...The A's scored a run in the seventh inning but the Astros added a run in the eighth and a run in the ninth for a 5-1 win.

MANAEA vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-2 despite a 2.23 ERA (32.1 ip, 20 h, 11 r, 8 er, 15 bb, 34 so, 1 hr) and .172 (20-for-116) opponents batting average in six career starts...is 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland, 0-1 with a 0.00 ERA (10.1 ip) in two starts in Houston...received the loss in his last start against Houston, which was also his last outing...had a no decision in a 10-6 A's loss in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

RHP Jesse Hahn (3-5, 4.66 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA in four starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 6...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA and .242 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...allowed two home runs in his last start, snapping a 49.2-inning, 224-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just three home runs in 67.2 innings (0.40 per nine innings)...is 3-2 with a 7.30 ERA in six starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 3.14 ERA in seven games on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 12-9 A's loss to Houston last Thursday in Oakland (2.0 ip, 6 h, 10 r, 9 er, 3 bb, 1 hb, 2 hr)...is 1-4 with a 9.28 ERA (21.1 ip, 28 h, 24 r, 22 er, 9 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in five career starts against Houston...was the losing pitcher in both starts this year, a 12-9 A's loss in Oakland on June 22 and a 7-2 A's loss at Houston on April 30.

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with seven saves, four blown saves, a 5.15 ERA (41 er in 71.2 ip) and 16 home runs allowed over the last 21 games... now has a 4.81 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League (MIN, 4.94; DET, 5.20).
- Blew three saves on June 15 (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Matched a season high in innings pitched Thursday with seven (other: 5/23 vs. Miami)...have thrown four or more innings in 26 of 76 games this season.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (85), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26) and second-fewest wins (9).
