OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-42) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (52-26)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight road games, which is an ongoing season high...had not won more than two road games in a row this year until the current streak...are now 35-42 (.455) for the season...that is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 29th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 16½ games...have been at least 14½ games out of first every day this month...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 37 days in fifth.

ELIAS SAYS: Matt Olson (first inning), Jaycob Brugman (second inning), and Franklin Barreto (third inning) all recorded their first career Major League home runs Saturday...**according to Elias, the trio became just the second set of three teammates to hit their first major league home run in the same game...**it was previously done on April 26, 1914, by three players playing for the Kansas City Packers of the Federal League (Duke Kenworthy, Art Kruger and John Potts)...the Federal League played as a third major league during the 1914 and 1915 seasons.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won four straight games on the road for the first time this season...had won back-to-back road games just once prior to the current streak (April 10 & 12 at Kansas City) and had lost 23 of 29 on the road before the current streak...are 22-17 (.564) at home compared to 13-25 (.342) on the road...have the worst road record in the AL...went 4-4 on the most recent eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4) after going 3-3 on the last homestand...today marks the fifth game of a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-0)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2)...prior to the sweep in Chicago, had lost nine consecutive series on the road, which tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are now 7-3-2 in home series compared to 2-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 13-23 (.361) against American League West competition compared to 22-19 (.537) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 9-19, .321)...are batting .225 (265-for-1178) and are averaging 3.75 runs per game (135 r in 36 games) against the West compared to .258 (365-for-1413) and 4.93 runs per game (202 runs in 41 games) against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high-tying three errors Saturday (seventh time) but have not made an error in their last two games...still have a Major League leading 71 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (MIL/CHW, 59)...the errors have led to a ML leading 50 unearned runs (ATL, 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have eight outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and sixth fewest in the majors...have allowed 62 stolen bases, which is tied for the major league lead (CHC)...are tied for first in the AL in passed balls (10).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second lowest batting average in the American League (.243), the second most strikeouts (719), the third lowest on-base percentage (.313), and the third fewest runs scored (337)...the 719 strikeouts are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013)...are second in the AL in extra base hits (263) and third in doubles (148)...have the third lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.227) and with the bases loaded (.186) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.282) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.75 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the league in hit batters (34) and rank third in wild pitches (40)...the wild pitches are the second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break to record of 43 in 2016...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) during the team's current four-game winning streak...had gone 3-7 with a 7.12 ERA (62 er in 78.1 ip) and 18 home runs allowed in their previous 15 games (June 7-22)...have the second most losses in the American League (31) but have allowed the fewest home runs (54)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.417)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 117

consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 207; LAD, 195; ATL, 168)...it is also the third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 108 home runs, which is tied for the sixth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...last hit 100 home runs before the break in 2002 when they had 109...61 of the A's 108 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is the third most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 72; HOU, 62)...home runs have accounted for 167 of the A's 337 runs (49.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 32-26 when homering, 3-16 when they don't...Oakland is 25-9 when they out-homer the opponent, 10-33 when they don't.

IN JUNE: Oakland is 12-13 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.39 ERA (133 er in 222.0 ip) this June, which is second highest in the American League and would be the second highest in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...have allowed the third most home runs (42)...the home runs are the most allowed in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980)...the offense has struck out 243 times, which is second in the AL (TEX, 251) and a new franchise record for the month of June (231 in 2012)...have already set franchise records for strikeouts in May (255) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-8...through Sunday's games, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was the third worst mark in the majors (Miami, 26.7%; Detroit, 28.6%)...have a run differential of -70, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 74 different lineups in 77 games...are averaging 3:18:00 in June and 3:09:15 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Semien began a rehab assignment Friday in Single-A Stockton...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 2-8 against the Astros this season...are 0-6 in Oakland and 2-2 in Houston...have lost 15 of their last 17 games to the Astros, including each of the last 10 in Oakland...that is the second longest Coliseum losing streak ever against one team (13, Baltimore: July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 17-31 (.354) against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 53 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 48-44...are 25-22 in Oakland and 23-22 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Joyce is ninth in the AL in June on-base percentage (.419)...**Ryon Healy** hit his first career grand slam last night...has nine home runs in June, which are his most in a month, tied for second in the AL, and tied for sixth most in Oakland history in June...also has 25 RBI in June, which is third most in the AL...**A's starting pitchers** are 4-0 with a 0.76 ERA during the team's current four-game winning streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a two-hit shutout and Gus Zernial homers twice and drives in five runs in the A's 12-0 win at New York...in **1994** Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (3-5, 4.6 6 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 6...was 1-4 with a 3.81 ERA and .242 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts, when he was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton May 31 against Lancaster and had a no decision in the Ports 3-2 win (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 75 pitches)...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his appearances since then.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed two home runs in his last start, snapping a 49.2-inning, 224-batters faced homerless streak...has allowed just three home runs in 67.2 innings (0.40 per nine innings)...only one pitcher with at least 60.0 innings pitched has allowed fewer home runs (Alex Wood, two).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 7.30 ERA (20 er in 24.2 ip) in six starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 3.14 ERA (15 er in 43.0 ip) in seven games on the road...has not allowed a home run in 43.0 innings on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 8-6 with a 3.94 ERA (52 er in 118.2 ip) in 21 starts in Oakland, 3-9 with a 4.89 ERA (50 er in 92.0 ip) in 17 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA (18 er in 24.0 ip) in five starts during the day and 1-3 with a 3.50 ERA (17 er in 43.2 ip) in eight games at night...picked up the win June 6 against Toronto to snap a seven-game losing streak in night games...it was his first win at night since June 15, 2015 at San Diego and his first ever night win in the Coliseum...is now 10-5 with a 3.22 ERA (42 er in 117.1 ip) in 20 career day games, 8-14 with a 4.59 ERA (85 er in 166.2 ip) in 31 night games.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.58 ERA (15 er in 37.2 ip) in seven starts on five days rest, 1-3 with a 6.75 ERA (18 er in 24.0 ip) in his other five starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed two of his three home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to left-handed hitters...nine of the 11 home runs he has allowed over the last two years have been hit by lefties...opponents are hitting .355 (22-for-62) with runners in scoring position and he has a .332 (61-for-184) opponents batting average with RISP in his three seasons with the A's...has a .213 (13-for-61) batting average against hitters leading off an inning...has a .294 (30-for-102) opponents batting average the first times through the lineup, .276 (27-for-98) the second time and .194 (12-for-62) after that.

SUPPORT: Has received 13 runs of support in his four starts since returning from the DL (18.0 ip, 6.50 RSA) after getting just four runs of support over his previous six starts (31.2 ip, 1.14 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 12 starts, including no runs five times, and has a season run support average of 3.59 (27 rs in 67.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 19 of his 37 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in three of his starts this year (April 25, May 12 and June 11).

ROAD LOSING STREAK: Has not won a road game over the last two years and is 0-6 with a 5.56 ERA (35 er in 56.2 ip) over his last 11 games (10 starts) on the road...the six-game road losing streak matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last with a longer streak is Ariel Prieto, who had a nine-game road losing streak from April 29, 1997 to Sept. 24, 2000...his last road win came on June 15, 2015 at San Diego.

THIS AND THAT: Has committed two errors, which is tied for the second most among American League pitchers...also tied for sixth in assists (12) and is 13th in total chances (17)...is tied for second in the AL in triples allowed (3) and tied for first in opponents reaching on an error (8)...has tossed more than six innings in just two of his 12 starts this year and 13 of 49 in his career...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen bases attempts off him...are 11-for-12 (91.6%) over the last two years after going 5-for-10 (50.0%) over his first two.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: His first appearance of the season came in relief of starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...moved into the starting rotation April 13 at Kansas City and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...snapped a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to 2016 in a 9-1 win over Texas April 19...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit in a no decision at Los Angeles (AL) April 25, a 2-1 A's loss in 11 innings...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks May 6 against Detroit...left with

a 2-1 lead on May 12 at Texas but Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save...tossed just 2.0 innings May 23 against Miami...was placed on the 10-day DL May 27 retroactive to May 24 with a strained right triceps...went 0-2 with a 6.11 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May...his May ERA was his highest ever in a month (min 5.0 ip)...picked up the win June 6 against Toronto to snap his losing streak at a career-high tying three games (fourth time, last: June 3, 2016-April 13, 2017)...posted a 5.70 ERA and .306 opponents average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 30 to May 23.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-9 loss to Houston on Thursday in Oakland...he allowed 10 runs on six hits in just 2.0 innings of work...after allowing just one home run all season, he gave up two (Marisnick and Gonzalez)...the A's rallied to score nine runs, including six runs in the eighth inning.

HAHN vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-4 with a 9.28 ERA (21.1 ip, 28 h, 24 r, 22 er, 9 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in five career starts...that includes 1-1 with a 9.35 ERA (8.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-3 with a 9.24 ERA (13 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts in Houston...was the losing pitcher in both starts this year, a 12-9 A's loss at home on June 12 and a 7-2 A's loss at Houston on April 30...went 1-1 with a 8.59 ERA (7.1 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 1 so) in two starts last year.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...his opponents batting average included a mark of .273 against right-handed hitters compared to .361 against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jharel Cotton (5-7, 5.02 ERA): Is 2-3 with a 4.28 ERA and .223 opponents batting average in six starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...is 1-5 with a 7.76 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in six starts at night, 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in seven starts during the day...is 3-4 with a 3.26 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts on the road compared to 2-3 with a 7.09 ERA and .285 opponents average in six starts in Oakland...has allowed 12 home runs in his last eight starts (44.2 ip)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's win over Chicago-AL on Friday in Chicago (5.0 ip, 3 h, 0 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has faced the Astros once this year and received the loss.

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with eight saves, four blown saves, a 5.28 ERA (44 er in 75.0 ip) and 17 home runs allowed over the last 22 games... now has a 4.86 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League (MIN, 4.90; DET, 5.16).
- Blew three saves on June 15 (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Matched a season high in innings pitched last Thursday with seven (other: 5/23 vs. Miami)...have thrown four or more innings in 26 of 77 games this season.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (87), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (26) and second-fewest wins (9).
