OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-43) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (53-26)

THURSDAY, JUNE 29, 2017 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (1-2, 4.50) VS. RHP BRAD PEACOCK (4-1, 2.82) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost 11-8 last night, snapping a season-high four-game road winning streak...had not won more than two road games in a row this year prior...are now 35-43 (.449) for the season...that is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 30th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 17¹/₂ games ...have been at least 14¹/₂ games out of first every day this month...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 38 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have are 4-1 on this road trip after dropping 23 of their previous 29 road games...a win today would give them their second straight road series win...have not won two road series in a row since last September (Sept., 12-15 at KC; Sept. 16-18 at TEX)...are 22-17 (.564) at home compared to 13-26 (.333) on the road...have the worst road record in the AL...went 4-4 on the most recent eight-game homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4) after going 3-3 on the last homestand...today marks the final game of a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-1)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (1-3) and Miami (0-2)...prior to the sweep in Chicago, had lost nine consecutive series on the road, which tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...are now 7-3-2 in home series compared to 2-10-0 in road series.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 13-24 (.351) against American League West competition compared to 22-19 (.537) against all other teams...have the second worst intra-division record in the AL (KC, 10-19, .345)...are batting .225 (273-for-1214) and are averaging 3.86 runs per game (143 r in 37 games) against the West compared to .258 (365-for-1413) and 4.93 runs per game (202 runs in 41 games) against everyone else.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high-tying three errors Saturday (seventh time) but have not made an error in their last three games...still have a Major League leading 71 errors, which is 11 more than any other team (CHW, 60)...the errors have led to a ML leading 50 unearned runs (ATL, 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have nine outfield assists, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...have allowed 66 stolen bases, which lead the major leagues (CHC, 63)...are tied for first in the AL in passed balls (10).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second lowest batting average in the American League (.243), the second most strikeouts (736), the third lowest on-base percentage (.312), and are tied for the third fewest runs scored (345)...the 736 strikeouts are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013)...are second in the AL in extra base hits (268) and third in doubles (148)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.229) and third lowest with the bases loaded (.186) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.281) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.84 ERA, which is third highest in the American League...second in the league in hit batters (34) and rank third in wild pitches (41)...the wild pitches are the second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break to record of 43 in 2016...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Hahn allowed six earned runs in two innings pitched last night...prior to that, A's starting pitchers were 4-0 with a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) over the first four games of the road trip...had gone 3-7 with a 7.12 ERA (62 er in 78.1 ip) and 18 home runs allowed in their previous 15 games (June 7-22)...have the second most losses in the American League (32) but have allowed the fewest home runs (55)...have the fifth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.422)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 118 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 208; LAD, 196; ATL, 169)...it is also the third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit five home runs and lost last night, falling to 36-5 in games in which they hit five or more home runs since 1968... have hit 14 home runs in the first five games of the road trip after hitting just two home runs in their previous five games...have hit 113 home runs total, which is fifth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break and

their most since 2000 when they had 131...61 of the A's 113 home runs have come in the Coliseum, which is the third most home runs at home in the American League (NYY, 72; HOU, 63)...on the current road trip, 23 of the A's 32 runs have come via the home run (71.9%)...overall this season, home runs have accounted for 174 of the A's 345 runs (50.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 32-27 when homering, 3-16 when they don't...Oakland is 25-10 when they out-homer the opponent, 10-33 when they don't.

IN JUNE: Oakland is 12-14 in June after going 12-15 in May and 11-14 in April...May marked the A's seventh consecutive month with a losing record, which is Oakland's longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had a streak of seven...the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record is eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979 (consecutive months notes exclude October)...A's pitchers have compiled a 5.63 ERA (144 er in 230.0 ip) this June, which is second highest in the American League and would be the highest in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)... have allowed the third most home runs (43)...the home runs are the most allowed in Oakland history in June (41 in 1980)...the offense has struck out 260 times, which is tied for the most in the AL with Texas and is a new franchise record for the month of June (251) and April (221) this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-8...through Sunday's games, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was the third worst mark in the majors (Miami, 26.7%; Detroit, 28.6%)...have a run differential of -73, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 74 different lineups in 78 games...are averaging 3:18:21 in June and 3:09:28 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Semien began a rehab assignment Friday in Single-A Stockton...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 2-9 against the Astros this season...are 0-6 in Oakland and 2-3 in Houston...have lost 16 of their last 18 games to the Astros, including each of the last 10 in Oakland...that is the second longest Coliseum losing streak ever against one team (13, Baltimore: July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...are 17-32 (.347) against Houston over the last three years...have 15 blown saves in their last 54 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 48-45... are 25-22 in Oakland and 23-23 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's hit five home runs and lost last night...since moving to Oakland in 1968, it was just the fifth time hitting at least five home runs and losing (36-5)...*Ryon Healy* has homered in back to back games and has 10 home runs in June, which are his most in a month, tied for second in the AL, and tied for fourth most in Oakland history in June...is the first Athletics player to hit 10 home runs in June since Mark McGwire in 1997...also has 26 RBI in June, which is third most in the AL...*Khris Davis* hit two home runs last night, his third multi-homer game this season and 14th of his career...two of his three multi-homer games this season have come at Houston (also April 28)...since the 2015 All-Star break, he has 84 home runs, four more than any other player in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** Bill Lamar extends his hitting streak to an Athletics franchise record 29 consecutive games...in **1990** Dave Stewart pitches the fifth no-hitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...after walking the first two hitters he faced, Stewart retired 25 in a row before a two-out walk in the ninth...in **1996** the A's hit three home runs at California, giving Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, which ties the American League record...in **2003** Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and ties an Oakland record with five hits in a 5-2 win at San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (1-2, 4.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and made his Major League debut with a start that day at Miami...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...picked up his first major league win on Saturday at Chicago (AL)...took the loss in each of his first two starts against Miami and Houston, respectively...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career...joins Daniel Mengden (June 11-16, 2016) and Brett Anderson (April 10-15, 2009).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami June 14...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his Major League debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a pair of solo home runs to Ozuna and Moore in the second...yielded two more runs in the third, highlighted by a Yelich RBI single, and was charged with three runs in the fourth, including a Telis RBI double.

LAST START: He picked up his first win in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago (AL)...allowed two runs to score over six innings of work...both were unearned on errors by Barreto and Rosales...exited the game with the A's leading 8-2.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five ... ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)... tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss... allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings... was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7... then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13... was charged with two runs or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against righthanded hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties...six came with the bases empty...held the opposition to a .154 batting average when leading off an inning...issued just nine walks for a .203 on-base percentage in that situation...had a .225 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts, walked two batters or fewer 23 times and surrendered four hits or fewer 13 times.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors...is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-3, 4.45 ERA): Is 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .293 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is 2-1 with a 4.11 ERA and .246 opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA and .274 opponents average in five starts on the road...is 1-3 with a 6.55 ERA in six starts at night, 2-0 with a 2.27 ERA in five starts during the day...is scheduled to start on five days rest... is 1-1 with a 4.56 ERA in four starts on five days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.39 ERA in his other seven starts...earned the win in his last start, a 5-3 A's win against Chicago (AL) last Sunday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 1 hr)...lost his only career start against the Braves on Aug. 16, 2014...is 4-5 with a 3.44 ERA in 14 career interleague games (86.1 ip, 72 h, 36 r, 33 er, 19 bb, 78 so, 4 hr).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

9-11, 4.92 ERA (144 er in 263.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 18-for-29 (62.1%)

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with eight saves, four blown saves, a 5.44 ERA (49 er in 81.0 ip) and 17 home runs allowed over the last 23 games... now has a 4.92 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.16).
- Blew three saves on June 15 (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Matched a season high in innings pitched last Thursday with seven (other: 5/23 vs. Miami)...have thrown four or more innings in 27 of 78 games this season.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (92), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (30) and second-fewest wins (9).

61 RHP JOHN AXFORD

Last Outing: 6/28 at Houston (ND, 1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-1 Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1

First Hitters: 3-15, 2 bb

Has a 1.42 ERA (1 er in 6.1 ip) on one day rest and an 7.94 ERA (10 er in 11.1 ip) in all other games.

- Has allowed a .205 (9-for-44) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .448 (13-for-29) against left-handers.
- Is 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and is 8-for-10 in save chances in 28 games against Houston
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not pitch before he was placed on the 10-day DL April 5, retroactive to April 2, with a strained right shoulder...did not allow a run in a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville (3.1 ip, 2 h, 4 so) and was reinstated May 21.

Last Year: Went 6-4 with three saves and a 3.97 ERA in 68 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...had a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 games and a 2.19 ERA over his first 24 but logged a 9.42 ERA in 18 games in between.

- Made his major league debut on Tuesday and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Beltran)...has allowed a first batter home run in two of his four appearances...right-handers are batting .083 (1-for-12) with four strikeouts, while lefties are 3-for-9 (.333).
- Has not allowed a run in back-to-back outings (2.1ip) after allowing three runs in his first two appearances (3 er in 4.0 ip).
- Has a 0-0 mark with a 5.06 ERA (3 er in 5.1 ip) in three games vs. Houston this season.
- Was originally drafted by Florida in 2009 out of the University of California as an infielder and transitioned to pitcher in 2010...signed a minor league contract with the A's Nov. 15, 2016 and is 26-28 with a 3.10 ERA in 283 career appearances (40 starts) in eight seasons as a pitcher. has struck out 515 batters in 508.0 innings and has walked just 85 (1.50 walks per nine innings).
