OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-44) VS. ATLANTA BRAVES (37-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning four in a row...the four-game winning streak followed a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak...are 8-6 over the last 14 games and 35-44 (.443) for the season...that is the second worst record in the American League and it matches the A's 79-game record from the previous two seasons (lost game 80 in 2015 and 2016)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 31st consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 18½ games...the only other times in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 18½ games before the end of June were in 1979 (23 games on June 30) and 2001 (21 games on June 26)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 39 days in fifth.

IN JUNE: The A's are 12-15 (.444) in June with one game remaining... have clinched a losing record for the eighth consecutive month, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers have set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (222) in the month of June...the home runs are second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts are fourth most (246 in Sept. 2013, 230 in May 2015, 223 in Aug. 2007)... have a 5.67 ERA (150 er in 238.0 ip), which is currently an Oakland record for June (5.61 in 1998)...if it remains above 5.61, it will be the highest by an A's team in June since 1950 (6.21)...are tied for the American League lead in saves this month (8), have the second highest ERA (5.67) and opponents batting average (.288) and rank third in most home runs allowed (45)...the offense has struck out an AL leading 274 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year...is tied for second in the AL in extra base hits this month (100) and ranks third in doubles (60) and walks (93)...the doubles are three short of the Oakland record for June (63 in 2004) and the extra base hits are second most in Oakland history in June (116 in 1996).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-5 in interleague play (1-3 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. Washington), which is tied for the fifth worst mark in the majors... in addition to this three-game series with Atlanta, the A's will also host San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...have allowed 59 runs in seven interleague games for an 8.56 ERA (58 er in 61.0 ip), which is the highest in the majors by nearly two runs (CLE, 6.77)...the offense has scored 43 runs and the average of 6.14 runs per game is second highest in the majors (HOU, 6.80)...are 200-171 (.539) all-time in interleague games, which is seventh best in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four consecutive games without an error after committing a season-high tying three errors last Saturday (seventh time)...still have a Major League leading 71 errors, which is 10 more than any other team (CWS, 61)...the errors have led to a ML leading 50 unearned runs (ARI and ATL, 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have nine outfield assists, which is tied for the fewest in the American League and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...have allowed 66 stolen bases, which leads the Major Leagues (CHC, 65)...are tied for first in the AL in passed balls (10).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.86 ERA, which is second highest in the American League...rank second in hit batters (34) and third in wild pitches (41)...the wild pitches are two short of the Oakland record for wild pitches before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016)...the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers allowed 11 runs in 7.0 innings over the final two games of the road trip (0-2, 14.14 ERA) after yielding just five runs (two earned) in 23.2 innings over the first four games (4-0, 0.76 ERA)...are now 26-33 with a 4.83 ERA (229 er in 426.1 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA and second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (57)...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 119 consecutive games without a complete game is the fourth longest active streak in the majors (TB, 209; LAD, 197; ATL, 170)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second lowest batting average (.242) and second most strikeouts (750) in the American League, rank third in fewest runs scored (346) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.312)...the

750 strikeouts are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013)...rank second in the AL in extra base hits (269) and third in doubles (149)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.226) and with the bases loaded (.177) in the majors...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.198) and on-base percentage (.283) in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's did not homer yesterday after hitting 14 home runs over the first five games of the road trip...have 113 home runs for the season, which is fifth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987, 118 in 1997)...61 of the A's 113 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's rank third in the American League in home runs at home (NYY, 72; HOU, 65)...on the last road trip, 23 of the A's 33 runs came via the home run (69.7%)...overall this season, home runs have accounted for 174 of the A's 346 runs (50.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 32-27 when homering, 3-17 when they don't...Oakland is 25-10 when they out-homer the opponent, 10-34 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Atlanta (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...are 22-17 (.564) at home compared to 13-27 (.325) on the road...the road record is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...went 4-4 on the last homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4) and currently have a four-game home losing streak, which is a season high...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...the sweep of the White Sox snapped a nine series losing streak on the road...that tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since May 16-July 9, 1986 when they also lost nine in a row...won the first game in Houston for a four-game road winning streak...it was the first time the A's won more than two straight road games this year...are 7-3-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 14-8...through games of Sunday, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was the third worst mark in the majors...have a run differential of -78, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have used 75 different lineups in 79 games...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in June and 3:09:27 for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Chapman, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Semien began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton a week ago today...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. BRAVES: The A's are 4-8 all-time against the Braves...that includes 1-2 in Oakland and 3-6 in Atlanta...this is just the second meeting between the two clubs in the Coliseum...lost two of three in Oakland in 2003...last met in 2014 in Atlanta when the A's were swept in a three-game series...now have a four-game losing streak against the Braves and have not defeated Atlanta since May 17, 2008 (5-4).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 21 home runs, which match the most by an Athletic before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Moss, 2014)...**Ryon Healy** has 10 home runs in June, which is tied for second in the American League (Springer, HOU 11)...also ranks fourth in RBI (26) and strikeouts (33)...has the most June home runs by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had 10 in 1997 and the most RBI since Scott Hatteberg had 27 in 2004...**Jed Lowrie** is 11-for-27 (.407) with seven doubles, one home run and eight RBI in seven interleague games...is tied for second in the majors in interleague doubles (Betts, BOS 8).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1995** Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001** Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-3, 4.45 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA (21 er in 35.0 ip) and .293 (41-for-140) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (4 er in 14.0 ip) and .149 (7-for-47) opponents batting average in two interleague starts...is now 4-5 with a 3.44 ERA (33 er in 86.1 ip) in 14 career interleague appearances, including 13 starts.

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed 29 of his 39 runs in the single biggest inning of his 10 starts (25 er in 11.0 ip, 20.45 ERA)...has a 1.17 ERA (7 er in 53.2 ip) in all other innings...last year, he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.27 ERA (8 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 6.55 ERA (24 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts at night...has allowed six of his seven home runs at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Six of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...five have come on the road...three have been hit by the number one hitter in the order...has yielded a .158 (22-for-139) batting average with two strikes...opponents are hitting .313 (20-for-64) with runners in scoring position...opponents are 18-for-32 (.563) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THIS AND THAT: Ranks sixth among American League pitchers in putouts (9)...has allowed seven unearned runs, which is tied for sixth in the AL...is tied for 10th in wild pitches (5)...has walked two batters or fewer in eight of his 11 starts...has not allowed a run in the second inning (11.0 ip) and opponents are 4-for-33 (.121)...is 5-13 with a 5.68 ERA (98 er in 155.1 ip) over his last 29 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career.

REHAB: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota **May 2**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit **May 7** in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead when he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas **May 13**...allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston **May 18** in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami **May 24** in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland **May 30**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time in his last 23 starts he has allowed seven runs...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brant-

ley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch...had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss to Washington on **June 4** in Oakland...shut out the Nationals on one hit and two walks over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two-run triple to Turner and he scored on a Goodwin sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh to get Gray off the hook...was relieved by Madson to start the eighth and he allowed three runs for the loss...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Tampa Bay in the first game of the **June 10** doubleheader...struck out 10 batters, his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning as Souza had a two-run single following a Gray error...allowed three runs (two earned) in the sixth on a two-run double by Beckham and a Phegley error...left trailing 5-3 but the A's scored single runs in the seventh and ninth innings to send the game into extra innings...had his third straight no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to New York (AL) **June 15**...shutout the Yankees on four hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a two-run single by Headley and a RBI single by Carter...left after 5.2 innings with the score tied 3-3...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss to Houston on **June 20**...allowed five runs in the first inning on a lead-off home run to Springer, RBI doubles to McCann and Gurriel, and a two-run single to Bregman...blanked the Astros on two hits and two walks over his final four innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Chicago (AL) last Sunday...allowed a solo home run to Engel in the third and an unearned run in the fourth when Abreu scored on a Phegley passed ball...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work...Oakland was shut out on three hits and two walks over the first six innings before scoring once in the seventh and twice in the eighth and ninth for the win.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 50 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with eight saves, four blown saves, a 536 ERA (50 er in 84.0 ip) and 17 home runs allowed over the last 24 games...now has a 4.89 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.15).
- Blew three saves on June 15 (Madson, Axford, Casilla)...it was the fifth time in the Oakland era that the bullpen has blown three saves in one game...it was the second time they won (May 11, 2010 at Texas).
- Matched a season high in innings pitched on June 22 with seven (other: 5/23 vs. Miami)...have thrown four or more innings in 27 of 78 games this season.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (92), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (30) and second-fewest wins (9).
