OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-45) VS. ATLANTA BRAVES (38-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning four in a row...the four-game winning streak followed a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak...are 8-7 over the last 15 games and 35-45 (.438) for the season...that is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it matches the A's 80-game record from the previous two seasons...the 10 games under .500 are one short of the season high of 11 (twice, last: 31-42 on June 22)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 32nd consecutive day (May 30-present) and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 18½ games...the only other times in Oakland history the A's trailed by at least 18½ games before the end of June were in 1979 (23 games on June 30) and 2001 (21 games on June 26).

CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITHOUT BEING NO-HIT: Matt Olson homered in the ninth inning last night to break up the no-hitter and extend the A's streak of consecutive games without being no-hit to 4,139...that is the longest active streak in the majors and it is fourth longest in American League history...Oakland has not been no-hit since July 13, 1991 when Bob Milacki, Mike Flanagan, Mark Williamson and Gregg Olson combined to no-hit the A's for Baltimore.

THE HALFWAY MARK: Today is the A's 81st game, which is the halfway mark of the season...Oakland is pace to finish the season 71-91, which is two games better than last year (69-93) but would be the A's third straight 90-loss season...the offense is on pace to set an Athletics record for most strikeouts (1541, current is 1387 in 2012)...are on pace for 231 home runs, which would be fourth most in Oakland history and the most since 2000 (239), and 14 triples, which would be second fewest in a non-strike season (13 in 1998)...the pitching staff is on pace to set Athletics records for strikeouts (1268, current is 1244 in 2014) and wild pitches (83, current is 72 in 1979) and Oakland records for hit batters (69, current is 68 in 2004) and fewest intentional walks (12, current is 17 in 1981)...currently do not have a complete game and the Athletics record for fewest in a season is 1 in 2012...are on pace to allow 196 home runs, which would be third most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...have a 4.83 ERA, which is currently fifth highest and the highest since 1997 (5.48)...the defense is on pace to commit 144 errors, which would be the most since 1984 (146)...are on pace for 101 unearned runs, which would be the most since 1979 (106).

IN JUNE: The A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which tied for fourth worst in the American League...it marks the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (226) in the month of June...the home runs were second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts were third most (246 in Sept. 2013, 230 in May 2015)...compiled a 5.57 ERA, which was the second highest June ERA in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...had the second highest ERA in the AL in June (5.67), tied for second in saves (8) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.283) and home runs (45)...the offense struck out an AL leading 285 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year...tied for second in the AL in extra base hits (102) and ranked third in doubles (61) and walks (97)...the extra base hits were second most in Oakland history in June (116 in 1996) and the doubles tied for second most (63 in 2004).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-6 in interleague play (0-1 vs. Atlanta, 1-3 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. Washington), which is the third worst mark in the majors...in addition to this three-game series with Atlanta, the A's will also host San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...have allowed 62 runs in eight interleague games for a 7.84 ERA (61 er in 70.0 ip), which is the highest in the majors by more than a run (CLE, 6.77)...the offense has scored 44 runs and the average of 5.50 runs per game is eighth highest in the majors...are 200-172 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is seventh best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The loss last night extended the A's home losing streak to five games, which is an on-going season-high...are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Atlanta (0-1) and Chicago-AL (three games) after going 4-4 on the last homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4)...are 22-18 (.550) at home compared to 13-27 (.325) on the road...the road record is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...

went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...are 7-3-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone five consecutive games without an error after committing a season-high tying three errors a week ago today (seventh time)...still have a Major League leading 71 errors (CWS, 62)...the errors have led to a ML leading 50 unearned runs (ARI, ATL and CWS 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have nine outfield assists, which is tied for the fewest in the American League and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...have allowed 67 stolen bases, which is tied with the Cubs for the most in the majors...are tied for first in the AL in passed balls (10).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.83 ERA, which is second highest in the American League...rank second in hit batters (34) and fourth in wild pitches (41)...the wild pitches are two short of the Oakland record for wild pitches before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016) and the hit batters are fifth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006)...A's starting pitchers are 26-34 with a 4.77 ERA (230 er in 434.1 ip)...have the second most losses in the American League and the third highest ERA but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (57).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second lowest batting average (.240) and second most strikeouts (761) in the American League and rank third in fewest runs scored (347) and lowest on-base percentage (.310)...the 761 strikeouts are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013)...rank second in the AL in extra base hits (271) and fourth in doubles (150)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.224) and the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.177)...leadoff hitters have the second lowest batting average (.196) and on-base percentage (.283) in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have 114 home runs, which is fifth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987, 118 in 1997)...62 of the A's 114 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's rank third in the American League in home runs at home (NYY, 72; HOU, 65)...24 of the A's last 34 runs have come via the home run (70.6%)...overall, home runs have accounted for 175 of the A's 347 runs (50.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 32-28 when homering, 3-17 when they don't...Oakland is 25-11 when they out-homer the opponent, 10-34 when they don't.

A's vs. BRAVES: The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night and are now 4-9 all-time against the Braves...that includes 1-3 in Oakland and 3-6 in Atlanta...this is just the second meeting between the two clubs in the Coliseum...lost two of three in Oakland in 2003...last met in 2014 in Atlanta when the A's were swept in a three-game series...now have a five-game losing streak against the Braves and have not defeated Atlanta since May 17, 2008 (5-4).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 21 home runs, which match the most by an Athletic before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Moss, 2014)...**Ryon Healy** hit 10 home runs in June, which tied for second in the American League...also ranked fourth in RBI (26) and strikeouts (35)...had the most June home runs by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had 10 in 1997 and the most RBI since Scott Hatteberg had 27 in 2004...**Jed Lowrie** had his 26th double of the season last night, ties the Oakland record for doubles before the All-Star Break (Joe Rudi in 1974 and Bobby Crosby in 2008).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** Rube Waddell becomes the first major league pitcher to strikeout the side on nine pitches...he turns the trick in the third inning of the A's 2-0 win over Baltimore, his first victory as an Athletic...in **1979** the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas...Jim Essian has five hits and Rickey Henderson, Mike Heath and Mike Edwards add four each...Texas starter Jon Matlack allows 12 hits in 5 1/3 and losing pitcher Doc Medich allows 12 hits in 8 1/3 innings of relief...in **2007** Dan Haren extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 11-5 win at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 51st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Daniel Gossett, June 14 at Miami) and the seventh over the last two years...the last to win was Jharel Cotton last year on Sept. 7 against Los Angeles (AL)...the last to strike out 10 or more batters was Aaron Harang on May 25, 2002 against Tampa Bay...the last to toss at least seven innings was Rich Harden on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 50 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 15-17 record and a 3.96 ERA.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranks second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231)...is 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment...allowed three runs on four hits and two walks in 4.0 innings...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...had the scoreless streak snapped when he allowed a season-high tying six runs (also May 14 against Albuquerque) on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings on May 29 against Colorado springs...finished May 2-3 with a 5.12 ERA in six games...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis...walked a season-high four batters June 15 against Iowa...started the second game of a June 20 doubleheader against New Orleans and pitched a season-low 2.0 innings...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 5-3 win over Round Rock on Monday in Nashville...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Will Middlebrooks in the second inning...Nashville built a 5-1 lead and he was relieved by Tucker Healy with a runner on first and one out in the sixth...Healy allowed the run to score plus one of his own.

2016 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization and was 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 18 starts when he was traded to the Seattle Mariners organization July 20...was assigned to Double-A Jackson and went 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA in eight games (seven starts) with the Generals...combined for a 9-5 record and a 3.28 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) overall...surrendered just eight home runs in 143.0 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...ranked fourth in the Southern League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.12), tied for fourth in games started, sixth in ERA and innings pitched and tied for eighth in wins...tied for the lead among SL pitchers with 40 total chances...was named to the SL Mid-season All-Star Game after going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...went 5-3 with a 4.18 ERA in 13 games (12 starts) after the break...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (69-for-274) against right-handed pitchers compared to .259 (69-for-266) against left-handers...opponents hit .217 with runners in scoring position...combined for a 3-2 record and a 4.50 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks...was 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA in 12 starts on the road...went 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts as a hitter with Jackson.

CAREER: Was originally selected by the Cubs as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2012 draft but was traded twice in 2016...was sent to the Mariners prior to the trading deadline in the Mike Montgomery deal and was traded to the A's following the season for Danny Valencia...is 34-23 with a 3.21 ERA (177 er in 496.0 ip) in 105 games (99 starts) in six professional seasons...has never posted an ERA above 3.48...has surrendered just 28 home runs in 496.0 innings (0.51 per nine innings)...was named to Midseason All-Star Teams in the Southern League in 2016 and the Midwest League in 2014.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (7-4, 3.87 ERA): Is 6-1 with a 2.90 ERA over his last eight starts dating back to May 20...the wins are second most in the American League over that span (Vargas, KC 7) and the ERA is seventh lowest...has seven wins overall, which matches his season total from his rookie campaign last year and is tied for ninth in the AL...has allowed a .127 batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .243 against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings (Keuchel, .100)...his career splits are .161 against lefties, .256 against righties...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-4 A's win at Houston on Monday (5.2 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Braves in his career...is 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA in three career interleague starts, all last year.

- The A's bullpen posted a 5.66 ERA in June after having a 4.54 ERA over the first two months of the season...the 5.66 June ERA by relievers was the highest among all major league teams...now has a 4.89 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.15) and third highest in the majors.
- Surrendered 20 home runs in June, which was tied for the second most in the majors with Cincinnati (Baltimore, 24)...had allowed just 20 home runs total in April and May.
- Had just seven scoreless outings in June (in 28 games)...allowed three or more runs in a game 10 times.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (92), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (31) and is second in fewest wins (9)...winning percentage of .450 is third lowest in the AL.
- Has allowed the fourth fewest walks (99) in the AL.
- Has allowed 14 sacrifice flies, which is tied for the most in the majors.
