### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-46) VS. ATLANTA BRAVES (39-41)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak, which followed a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak...are 8-8 over the last 16 games...are 35-46 (.432) overall and are a season-high tying 11 games under .500 for the third time this year (last: 31-42 on June 22)...have the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...have matched the A's worst record after 81 games over the last 20 years (2009, 2016)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 33rd consecutive day (May 30-present) and trail first place Houston by a season-high 19½ games...the A's largest deficits at the All-Star Break are 30½ in 1979, 19 in 2001 and 15½ in 1986 and 2016...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 41 days in fifth.

**THE HALFWAY MARK:** Yesterday was the A's 81st game, which is the halfway mark of the season...Oakland is pace to finish the season 70-92, which is one game better than last year (69-93) but would be the A's third straight 90-loss season...the offense is on pace to set an Athletics record for most strikeouts (1540, current is 1387 in 2012)...are on pace for 230 home runs, which would be fourth most in Oakland history and the most since 2000 (239), and 14 triples, which would be second fewest in a non-strike season (13 in 1998)...the pitching staff is on pace to set Athletics records for strikeouts (1264, current is 1244 in 2014) and wild pitches (82, current is 72 in 1979) and Oakland records for hit batters (70, current is 68 in 2004) and fewest intentional walks (12, current is 17 in 1981)...currently do not have a complete game and the Athletics record for fewest in a season is 1 in 2012...are on pace to allow 194 home runs, which would be third most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...have a 4.80 ERA, which is currently seventh highest and the highest since 1998 (4.81)...the defense is on pace to commit 146 errors, which would be the most since 1984 (146)...are on pace for 104 unearned runs, which would be the most since 1979 (106).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 2-7 in interleague play (0-2 vs. Atlanta, 1-3 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. Washington), which is the third worst mark in the majors...in addition to this three-game series with Atlanta, the A's will also host San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...have allowed 66 runs in nine interleague games for a 7.18 ERA (63 er in 79.0 ip), which is the highest in the majors (CLE, 6.77)...are 200-173 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's extended their home losing streak to six games yesterday, which is an on-going season-high...it matches the second longest home losing streak by an A's team over the last 16 years (8, Sept. 9-24, 2016)...are 0-2 on this six-game homestand against Atlanta (0-2) and Chicago-AL (three games) after going 4-4 on the last homestand against New York-AL (4-0) and Houston (0-4)...are 22-19 (.537) at home compared to 13-27 (.325) on the road...the road record is the worst in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...are 7-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors yesterday to snap a five-game errorless streak...have 73 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 63)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 52 unearned runs (ARI, ATL and CWS 41)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 70 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, 68) and tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...have nine outfield assists, which is tied for the fewest in the American League and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...are tied for first in the AL in passed balls (10).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.80 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (35) and rank fourth in wild pitches (41)...the wild pitches are two short of the Oakland record for wild pitches before the All-Star Break (43 in 2016) and the hit batters are tied for fourth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005, 35 in 2006).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Yesterday, Paul Blackburn became the 11th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year...that is second most in the American League (SEA, 13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 32 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any AL team...A's starting pitchers are now 26-34 with a 4.70 ERA (230 er in 440.1 ip) this year...have the second most losses in the American League and the fourth highest ERA but have allowed the fewest home runs (57).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have the second lowest batting average (.240) and second most strikeouts (770) in the American League and rank third in fewest runs scored (350) and lowest on-base percentage (.310)...the 770 strikeouts are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (716 in 2013)...rank third in the AL in extra base hits (272) and fourth in doubles (150)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.225) and also have the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.175)...leadoff hitters have the lowest batting average in the majors (.196) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.282).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have 115 home runs, which is fifth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987, 118 in 1997)...63 of the A's 115 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's rank third in the American League in home runs at home (NY, 72; HOU, 68)...26 of the A's last 37 runs have come via the home run (70.2%)...overall, home runs have accounted for 177 of the A's 350 runs (50.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 32-29 when homering, 3-17 when they don't...Oakland is 25-12 when they out-homer the opponent, 10-34 when they don't.

**IN JUNE:** The A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which tied for fourth worst in the American League...it marks the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (226) in the month of June...the home runs were second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts were third most (246 in Sept. 2013, 230 in May 2015)...compiled a 5.57 ERA, which was the second highest June ERA in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...had the second highest ERA in the AL in June (5.67), tied for second in saves (8) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.283) and home runs (45)...the offense struck out an AL leading 285 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year...tied for second in the AL in extra base hits (102) and ranked third in doubles (61) and walks (97)...the extra base hits were second most in Oakland history in June (116 in 1996) and the doubles tied for second most (63 in 2004).

**A's vs. BRAVES:** The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2017 and are now 4-10 all-time against the Braves...that is the A's worst record against any team (4-8 vs. Cubs)...are 1-4 in Oakland and 3-6 in Atlanta...this is just the second meeting between the two clubs in the Coliseum...lost two of three in Oakland in 2003...last met in 2014 in Atlanta when the A's were swept in a three-game series...now have a six-game losing streak against the Braves and have not defeated Atlanta since May 17, 2008 (5-4).

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** hit his 22nd home run of the season yesterday, which are the most home runs by an Athletic before the All-Star Break since Jason Giambi had 22 in 2000...**Ryon Healy** is batting .405 (15-for-37) with four home runs and 11 RBI in nine interleague games...**Jed Lowrie** had his 26th double of the season Friday night, which ties the Oakland record for doubles before the All-Star Break (Joe Rudi in 1974 and Bobby Crosby in 2008).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Reggie Jackson hits three home runs in the A's 5-0 win against Seattle...the three-homer game is the first in Oakland history and it gives Reggie 33 round trippers in the A's first 72 games...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 303<sup>rd</sup> career home run to break Jimmie Foxx's all-time Athletics record of 302...also, Jason Giambi is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 11-6 victory at Seattle...he has three singles and a pair of doubles.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (7-4, 3.87 ERA)

**LAST EIGHT STARTS:** Is 6-1 with a 2.90 ERA (16 er in 49.2 ip) over his last eight starts dating back to May 20...the wins are third most in the American League over that span (Sale, BOS and Vargas, KC with 7 each) and the ERA ranks seventh...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts...has walked 14 batters in 49.2 innings over his last eight starts (2.54 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Has seven wins, which matches his season total from his rookie campaign last year and is tied for ninth in the American League...is also tied for sixth in most hit batters (5)...has tossed 79.0 innings and is 2.0 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders in rate categories...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he ranks sixth in the American League in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.80), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.347) and 10th in opponents batting average (.221) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.57)

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Has allowed a .127 (7-for-55) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .243 (58-for-239) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings (Keuchel, .100)...has surrendered just one of his 21 extra base hits to lefties (home run) for a .182 slugging percentage (.385 against righties)...his career splits are a .161 (25-for-155) batting average against lefties, .256 (175-for-684) against righties.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-1 with a 4.05 ERA (18 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 3.69 ERA (16 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on the road...is now 8-4 with a 3.36 ERA (46 er in 123.1 ip) in 21 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-9 with a 4.49 ERA (50 er in 100.1 ip) in 18 starts on the road.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...went 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA (18.2 ip, 18 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 14 so) in three interleague starts last year.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .182 (12-for-66) with runners in scoring position...they are 18-for-160 (.113) with two strikes but are batting .444 (12-for-27) when putting the first pitch in play...opponents are 13-for-67 (.194) when leading of an inning but he has walked 11 and hit three for a .333 on-base percentage...has held the three and four hitter to a combined .145 (10-for-69) batting average.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed 13 of his 37 runs in the second inning for an 8.36 ERA (13 er in 14.0 ip) and 10 in the sixth inning for an 8.00 ERA (8 er in 9.0 ip)...the 10 runs in the sixth inning and 13 runs in the second are both tied for fourth most in the American League...has a 2.09 ERA (13 er in 56.0 ip) in all other innings...has a .333 (20-for-60) opponents average in the second inning, a .310 (13-for-42) mark in the sixth and a .167 (32-for-192) mark in all other innings.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-4 with a 4.83 ERA (22 er in 41.0 ip) in eight starts against American League West teams compared to 5-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts against everyone else.

**FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Won five consecutive starts from May 20 to June 10 for the longest winning streak of his career...it is also an A's season high...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings).

**FIVE HITS OR FEWER:** Allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, giving him a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Is 6-2 with a 3.29 ERA (20 er in 54.2 ip) in nine starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6

so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was placed on the disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings in a 6-5 loss to Seattle on May 15...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...tossed a career-high 111 pitches in a 5-3 victory over Toronto on June 5.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 victory at Houston last Tuesday...allowed nine hits and walked three batters in 5.2 innings but allowed just one run...had a 1-0 lead when Springer scored on a Gattis grounded into double play in the fifth inning...Ryon Healy hit a grand slam in the sixth for the win.

**2016 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

**RHP Jharel Cotton (5-7, 5.02 ERA):** Has won consecutive starts for the first time in his career and has a two-game winning streak for the second time...is 2-3 with a 4.28 ERA and .223 opponents batting average in six starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...has not pitched since June 23 at Chicago (AL) when he left the game after 5.0 scoreless innings with a blister...picked up the win in the A's 3-0 victory (3 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...that was his only career outing against the White Sox...is 2-3 with a 7.09 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 3-4 with a 3.26 ERA in seven starts on the road...has the highest home ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at home

- The A's bullpen posted a 5.66 ERA in June after having a 4.54 ERA over the first two months of the season...the 5.66 June ERA by relievers was the highest among all major league teams...now has a 4.95 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.06) and third highest in the majors.
- Surrendered 20 home runs in June, which was tied for the second most in the majors with Cincinnati (Baltimore, 24)...had allowed just 20 home runs total in April and May.
- Had just seven scoreless outings in June (in 28 games)...allowed three or more runs in a game 10 times.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (93), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34) and is second in fewest wins (9)...winning percentage of .429 is second lowest in the AL.
- Has allowed the fourth fewest walks (99) in the AL.
