OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-47) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (36-45)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a five-game losing streak, which matches the season high (April 23-28)...the losing streak follows a four-game winning streak, which followed a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak...are 8-9 over the last 17 games and are a season-high 12 games under .500 for the season at 35-47 (.427)...that is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it matches the fourth worst record in Oakland history after 82 games (fifth time, last in 2016)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high 20½ games...the A's largest deficits at the All-Star Break are 30½ in 1979, 19 in 2001 and 15½ in 1986 and 2016.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their home losing streak to seven games yesterday, which is an on-going season-high...it is the second longest home losing streak by an A's team over the last 16 years (8, Sept. 9-24, 2016)...are 0-3 on this six-game homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (three games) after going 4-4 on the last homestand...are 22-20 (.524) at home compared to 13-27 (.325) on the road...the road record is the worst in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...leave following the game Wednesday for a four-game road trip to Seattle that will take the A's into the All-Star Break...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...are 7-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 74 errors, which is the most in the majors ahead of the White Sox (67)...the errors have led to 52 unearned runs, which is also the most ahead of the White Sox (43)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Cubs (68)...are tied for first in the American League in passed balls (10) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (10).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 11 runs in the three-game series against Atlanta to start the homestand (9 er in 30.0 ip, 2.70) but lost all three games...now have a 4.77 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (36) and tied for third in wild pitches (42).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last nine games and are 4-3 with a 2.77 ERA (16 er in 52.0 ip) over that span...are 26-34 with a 4.66 ERA (232 er in 447.2 ip) this year...have the second most losses in the American League but have allowed the fewest home runs (58)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have used 11 different starting pitchers this year, which is tied for second most in the AL (SEA, 13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 32 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any AL team.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored eight runs over the last four games and are batting .156 (21-for-135) over that stretch...rank last in the American League in batting average (.239), have the second most strikeouts (787) and rank third in fewest runs scored (353) and lowest on-base percentage (.310)...are fourth in extra base hits (273) and fourth in doubles (150)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.223) and also have the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.169)...leadoff hitters have the lowest batting average in the majors (.193) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.280).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's begin the final week of play before the All-Star Break tonight...are 35-47 (.427), which is currently the fifth worst mark in Oakland history before the break...have a 4.77 ERA which is eighth highest and the highest since 2000 (4.80)...are batting .239, which is seventh lowest...A's hitters have struck out 787 times, which is an Athletics record for strikeouts before the break (716 in 2013)...have seven triples, which is currently the fewest in Athletics history before the break (8, five times, last: in 2009)...have 42 wild pitches, which is second in Oakland history to the 43 at the break last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...pitchers have hit 36 batters, which is fourth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005)...have hit 116 home runs, which is fifth most (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987, 118 in 1997)...pitchers have struck out 643, which is fifth most (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015, 670 in 2016, 650 in 2013)...have stolen 27 bases, which is fifth fewest (sixth fewest is 30, last in 2006)...have 52 unearned runs, which is tied for fifth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...have allowed

99 home runs, which is tied for fifth most (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 2016, 105 in 1994, 99 in 2001).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's will face a left-handed starting pitcher for just the third time in the last 24 games tonight...are 10-8 in games started by a left-handed pitcher, including 9-3 at home...the 18 games against left-handed starters are tied with Texas for second fewest in the American League (BOS 16)...are 25-39 against right-handers.

ALL-STAR: Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team yesterday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of last Thursday, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was second worst in the majors (MIA, 25%)...have used 78 different lineups in 82 games...27 of the A's last 40 runs have come via the home run (67.5%)...overall, home runs have accounted for 178 of the A's 353 runs (50.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

IN JUNE: The A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which tied for fourth worst in the American League...it marks the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (226) in the month of June...the home runs were second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts were third most (246 in Sept. 2013, 230 in May 2015)...compiled a 5.57 ERA, which was the second highest June ERA in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...had the second highest ERA in the AL in June (5.67), tied for second in saves (8) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.283) and home runs (45)...the offense struck out an AL leading 285 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year...tied for second in the AL in extra base hits (102) and ranked third in doubles (61) and walks (97)...the extra base hits were second most in Oakland history in June (116 in 1996) and the doubles tied for second most (63 in 2004).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Matt Chapman from the disabled list today, the A's have eight players remaining on the DL (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt and Semien are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Chicago June 23-25...it was their first sweep in Chicago since July 8-10, 2005...need one more victory to win their first season series from the White Sox since 2013...are 10-14 against Chicago over the last four years...have lost seven of the last eight games in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 305-286 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-137 in Oakland and 146-149 in Chicago...including 64-61 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 982-1041 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khrist Davis has six home runs in his last 14 games and 23 for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the most home runs by an Athletic before the All-Star Break since Mark McGwire had 31 in 1997...**Jed Lowrie** had his 26th double of the season Friday night, which ties the Oakland record for doubles before the All-Star Break (Joe Rudi in 1974 and Bobby Crosby in 2008).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1983** Carney Lansford hits the 7000th home run in the history of the A's franchise, but the A's lose to Texas 16-4 when the Rangers score 12 times in the top of the 15th inning...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits three home runs but its Mark McGwire's 16th inning solo home run that lifts the A's to a 9-8 victory at Toronto...the following day, McGwire again homers in the 16th inning of the A's 4-2 win at Cleveland...in **1994** Bobby Witt ties Mike Torrez' club record with his third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 10-0 win at Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (5-7, 5.02 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start since June 23 due to a blister...has won consecutive starts for the first time in his career and has a two-game winning streak for the second time (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...is now 2-3 with a 4.28 ERA (16 er in 33.2 ip) and .223 (27-for-121) opponents batting average in six starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has seven losses, which is tied for 10th most in the American League...is also tied for fourth in unearned runs (8)...opponents have been caught stealing five times with him on the mound, which is tied for third most in the AL...ranks second among AL rookies in innings pitched (71.2) and games started (13) and tied for second in wins (5) strikeouts (62).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-3 with a 7.09 ERA (26 er in 33.0 ip) and .285 (37-for-130) opponents average in six starts in Oakland compared to 3-4 with a 3.26 ERA (14 er in 38.2 ip) and .229 (32-for-140) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has the highest home ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at home...last year, he went 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on nine days rest today after leaving his last start early with a blister...is 1-5 with a 6.63 ERA (27 er in 36.2 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-2 with a 3.34 ERA (13 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-5 with a 7.76 ERA (25 er in 29.0 ip) and .344 (42-for-122) opponents batting average in six starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA (15 er in 42.2 ip) and .182 (27-for-148) opponents batting average in seven starts during the day...is tied for third in the American League in day wins and tied for sixth in starts...the one win at night came in his last start on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 6-2 with a 2.73 ERA (17 er in 56.0 ip) in nine starts during the day, 1-5 with a 6.00 ERA (30 er in 45.0 ip) in nine career starts at night.

THE SECOND AND THE FIFTH INNINGS: Has allowed 14 runs in the second inning (13.0 ip, 9.69 ERA) and 12 in the fifth inning (10 er in 11.2 ip, 7.71 ERA)...is tied for third in the American League in runs allowed in the second inning and tied for fifth in runs in the fifth...has a 3.06 ERA (16 er in 47.0) in all other innings...has surrendered seven of his 13 home runs in the second inning, which is the most in the majors...has a .352 (19-for-54) opponents batting average in the second inning, a .340 (17-for-50) mark in the fifth and a .199 (33-for-166) average in all other innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .323 (21-for-65) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...nine of the 13 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 12 of his 17 career home runs...eight of the home runs have come with two outs...has held the opponents number five hitter to a .171 average (6-for-35).

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 12 home runs in his last eight starts (44.2 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 30 batters in 71.2 innings this year (3.77 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has received eight runs of support in his seven losses (35.1 ip, 2.04 RSA) and 19 runs of support in his five wins (30.1 ip, 5.64 RSA).

2017 START-BY-START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **April 5** in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City **April 10**...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on **April 17** in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...retired 12 straight at one point...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle **April 22** in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning and a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston **April 28**...allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota **May 4**...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **May 9** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at New York (AL) **May 27**...tossed a career-high 107 pitches...did not allow a hit over the first five innings...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 8-0 loss at Cleveland **June 1**...issued a career-high tying four walks and allowed five runs, but only one was earned...the A's were shutout on three hits by Kluber and three Indians relievers...had his first no decision of the season in the A's 7-5 loss to Toronto on **June 7** in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks for the second consecutive

start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Miami **June 13**...blanked the Marlins on a hit and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when Ozuna hit a solo home run in the fourth inning to tie the game...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a Gordon RBI single, a Stanton two-run home run and a Realmuto RBI double...snapped his career-high four-game losing streak in the A's 4-3 win over New York (AL) on **June 18** in Oakland...posted a 6.59 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from May 9 to June 13...allowed a lead-off home run to Holliday in the second and a RBI single to Judge in the third, but the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third...surrendered a lead-off home run to Gregorius in fourth...retired each of the final eight batters that he faced.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start June 23 at Chicago (AL) when he combined with Hendriks, Madson, Doolittle and Casilla on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win...tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...left after tossing 66 pitchers with a blister.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13...surrendered two home runs...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win in his last start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win at Sacramento May 21...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214) and tied for 10th in wins (11).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Gossett (1-3, 5.57 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...it will be his second start against the White Sox and his fourth start in a day game...has walked one batter in three of his four starts and none in the other...joins Raul Alcantara (Sept. 5-24, 2016) and Fred Heimach (Oct. 1, 1920-April 17, 1922) as the only Athletics pitchers since 1913 to begin their career with four consecutive games with one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's loss at Houston last Thursday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Chicago (AL), a 10-2 A's win on June 24 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion.

- The A's bullpen posted a 5.66 ERA in June after having a 4.54 ERA over the first two months of the season...the 5.66 June ERA by relievers was the highest among all major league teams...now has a 4.94 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.09) and third highest in the majors.
- Surrendered 20 home runs in June, which was tied for the second most in the majors with Cincinnati (Baltimore, 24)...had allowed just 20 home runs total in April and May.
- Had just seven scoreless outings in June (in 28 games)...allowed three or more runs in a game 10 times.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (94), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34) and is second in fewest wins (9)...winning percentage of .409 is second lowest in the AL.
- Has allowed the fourth fewest walks (100) in the AL.
