### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-48) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (37-45)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a season-high six consecutive games...the losing streak follows a four-game winning streak, which followed a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak...are 8-10 over the last 18 games and are a season-high 13 games under .500 for the season at 35-48 (.422)...that is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it matches the fourth worst record in Oakland history after 83 games and is the worst since 2009 (35-48, lost game 84)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high 21 games...the A's largest deficits at the All-Star Break are 30½ in 1979, 19 in 2001 and 151/2 in 1986 and 2016.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's have lost each of their last eight home games, which matches their longest home losing streak over the last 35 years (last: Sept. 9-24, 2016)...it is tied for fourth longest in Oakland history...the last time the A's lost more than eight straight home games was June 4-20, 1982 when they dropped nine in a row...are 0-4 on this six-game homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (0-1) after going 4-4 on the last homestand...are 22-21 (.512) at home compared to 13-27 (.325) on the road...the road record is the worst in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...leave following the game tomorrow for a four-game road trip to Seattle that will take the A's into the All-Star Break...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...are 7-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors in the last three games and have 76 for the season, which is the most in the majors ahead of the White Sox (68)...the errors have led to 53 unearned runs, which is also the most ahead of the White Sox (43)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Cubs (68)...are tied for first in the American League in passed balls (10) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (10).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.46 ERA (15 er in 39.0 ip) on the homestand... that has lowered the season ERA to 4.78, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in hit batters (37)...rank fourth in the AL in wild pitches (43).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last 10 games and are 4-4 with a 3.16 ERA (20 er in 57.0 ip) over that span...are 26-35 with a 4.69 ERA (236 er in 452.2 ip) this year...have the second most losses in the American League and the fourth highest ERA but have allowed the fewest home runs (58)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have used 11 different starting pitchers this year, which is tied for second most in the AL (SEA, 13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 32 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any AL team.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 10 runs over the last five games and are batting .155 (26-for-168) over that stretch...are batting .238 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (800) and rank third in fewest runs scored (355) and lowest on-base percentage (.310)... are fourth in extra base hits (274) and fourth in doubles (151)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.223) and also have the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.182)...leadoff hitters have the lowest batting average in the majors (.190) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.276).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's have six games remaining before the All-Star Break...are 35-48 (.422), which is currently the fourth worst mark in Oakland history before the break and the worst since 1997 (37-52, .416)... have a 4.78 ERA which is eighth highest and the highest since 2000 (4.80)...are batting .238, which is sixth lowest...A's hitters have struck out 800 times, which is an Athletics record for strikeouts before the break (716 in 2013)...have matched the Oakland record for wild pitches at the break with 43 (also 2016)...have seven triples, which is currently the fewest in Athletics history before the break (8, five times, last: in 2009)...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most in Oakland history before the break (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...pitchers have hit 37 batters, which is fourth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005), and struck out 652, which is also fourth most (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015, 670 in 2016)...have 53 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...have hit 116 home runs, which is fifth most (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987, 118 in 1997)...have stolen 27 bases, which is fifth fewest (sixth fewest is 30, last in 2006)...have allowed 99 home runs, which is tied for fifth most (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 2016, 105 in 1994, 99 in 2001)

ALL-STAR: Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team Sunday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 6-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of last Thursday, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was second worst in the majors (MIA, 25%)...have used 79 different lineups in 83 games... home runs have accounted for 178 of the A's 355 runs (50.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

IN JUNE: The A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which tied for fourth worst in the American League ... it marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (226) in the month of June...the home runs were second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts were third most (246 in Sept. 2013. 230 in May 2015)...compiled a 5.57 ERA, which was the second highest June ERA in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...had the second highest ERA in the AL in June (5.67)...the offense struck out an AL leading 285 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year...tied for second in the AL in extra base hits (102) and ranked third in doubles (61)...the extra base hits were second most in Oakland history in June (116 in 1996) and the doubles tied for second most (63 in 2004).

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lead the season series 3-1...lost the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a three-game series in Chicago June 23-25...it was their first sweep in Chicago since July 8-10, 2005... need one more victory to win their first season series from the White Sox since 2013...are 10-15 against Chicago over the last four years...have lost eight of the last nine games in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 305-287 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-138 in Oakland and 146-149 in Chicago...including 64-61 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 982-1042 against Chicago.

### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

The A's have a five-game winning streak on the fourth of July and are 28-19 on the fourth since moving to Oakland in 1968...are 15-7 in the Coliseum and 13-12 on the road...have faced the White Sox twice, both times in Chicago...won 2-0 in 1980 and 7-1 in 2008...the Athletics are 78-82 all-time on July 4, including 8-6 against the White Sox...*Khris Davis* has six home runs in his last 15 games and 23 for the season, which are the most by an Athletic before the All-Star Break since Mark McGwire had 31 in 1997... Jed Lowrie has tied the Oakland record for doubles before the break with 26 (Joe Rudi, 1974; Bobby Crosby, 2008).

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1905 Rube Waddell defeats Boston's Cy Young in a 20-inning marathon in the afternoon game of a doubleheader, 4-2...A's catcher Ossee Schreckengost works all 29 innings of the doubleheader to set a major league record...in 1974 California's Winston Llenas hits a pinch hit home run off Vida Blue in the sixth inning to end Oakland's club record streak of 136 2/3 innings without allowing a home run...in 1988 Mark McGwire homers in the 16th inning for the second consecutive day as the A's defeat the Cleveland Indians 4-2...McGwire has a solo shot in the 16th inning the day before at Toronto as the A's have a two-day span where they play 32 innings and 9 hours and 54 minutes of baseball in two cities

### **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (1-3, 5.57 ERA)**

**FOR STARTERS:** Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...it will be his second start against the White Sox and his fourth start in a day game.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked one batter in three of his four starts and none in the other...joins Raul Alcantara (Sept. 5-24, 2016) and Fred Heimach (Oct. 1, 1920-April 17, 1922) as the only Athletics pitchers since 1913 to begin their career with four consecutive games with one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...has walked three batters in 21.0 innings (1.29 walks per nine innings).

**THIS AND THAT:** Has not allowed a run in the first inning...has a .114 (4-for-35) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .377 (20-for-53) after that...opponents are 6-for-44 (.136) with three home runs with two strikes...has allowed all five of his home runs and issued all three of his walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are 9-for-22 (.409) with a walk when leading off an inning.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut... they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a pair of solo home runs to Ozuna and Moore in the second...yielded two more runs in the third, highlighted by a Yelich RBI single, and was charged with three runs in the fourth, including a Telis RBI double.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on June 19 in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)... shutout the Astros on two hits over the first four innings but the A's were also held scoreless on two hits...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fifth inning and those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...left trailing 2-1.

**THIRD START:** He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on June 24...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead before Sanchez reached on a Barreto error and scored on a Cabrera RBI single....allowed another unearned run in the fourth inning on an Anderson sacrifice fly and was relieved by Coulombe to start the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston last Thursday...retired each of the first 10 batters before Reddick doubled with one out in the fourth and scored on a Correa two-run home run...also allowed a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth inning.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25-for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against

left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)... tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss... allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings... was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7... then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13... was charged with two runs or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against righthanded hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties...six came with the bases empty...held the opposition to a .154 batting average when leading off an inning...issued just nine walks for a .203 on-base percentage in that situation...had a .225 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts, walked two batters or fewer 23 times and surrendered four hits or fewer 13 times.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors....is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by Baseball America following the 2016 season.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-3, 4.09 ERA): Is 1-1 with a 1.20 ERA and .122 opponents batting average over his last two starts...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first five starts but was 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents average in five starts in between (May 30-June 20)...is 2-0 with a 2.27 ERA in five starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 5.49 ERA in seven starts at night...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss to Atlanta last Friday here in Oakland (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more innings, allow three baserunners or fewer and take the loss (Mulder, July 4, 2003 vs. Anaheim)...is 2-0 with a 4.13 ERA (24.0 ip, 19 h, 13 r, 11 er, 12 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in four career starts against Chicago... including a win in his only start this year on June 25 at Chicago, a 5-3 A's win (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so).

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

9-13, 4.93 ERA (153 er in 279.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 18-for-29 (62.1%)

- The A's bullpen posted a 5.66 ERA in June after having a 4.54 ERA over the first two months of the season...the 5.66 June ERA by relievers was the highest among all major league teams...now has a 4.93 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.09) and fourth highest in the majors.
- Surrendered 20 home runs in June, which was tied for the second most in the majors with Cincinnati (Baltimore, 24)...had allowed just 20 home runs total in April and May.
- Has just two scoreless outings in its last 14 games, uncluding the current streak of allowing at least one run in eight straight contests
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (94), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34) and is second in fewest wins (9)...winning percentage of .409 is second lowest in the AL (DET, .407)

- Has allowed one run in three straight outings (3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA) after tossing three straight scoreless outings from June 20-24.
- Walked four batters last night, which is a new career high...had walked three batters in a game eight times in his career prior to yesterday.
- Has allowed a .214 (10-for-47) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .406 (13-for-32) against left-handers.
- Has faced the White Sox twice this season (1 er in 2.0 ip)...has a 4.76 ERA (6 er in 11.1 ip) in 12 career appearances against the White Sox.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not pitch before he was placed on the 10-day DL April 5, retroactive to April 2, with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated May 21.

Last Year: Went 6-4 with three saves and a 3.97 ERA in 68 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...had a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 games and a 2.19 ERA over his final 24 but logged a 9.42 ERA in 18 games in between.
