OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-48) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (37-46)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high six-game losing streak yesterday and are now 9-10 over the last 19 games...are 36-48 (.429) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it matches the fifth worst mark in Oakland history after 84 games and is the worst since the A's were also 36-48 last year...are 12 games under .500, which is one short of the season-high of 13 (35-48 on July 3)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high 21 games for the season consecutive day...the A's largest deficits at the All-Star Break are 30½ in 1979, 19 in 2001 and 15½ in 1986 and 2016.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their eight-game home losing streak yesterday, which matched their longest home losing streak over the last 35 years (last: Sept. 9-24, 2016)...it tied for fourth longest in Oakland history...are 1-4 on this six-game homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-1) after going 4-4 on the last homestand...are 23-21 (.523) at home compared to 13-27 (.325) on the road...the road record is the worst in the American League and tied with Cincinnati for second worst in the majors (PHI, 13-33/.283)...leave following the game today for a four-game road trip to Seattle that will take the A's into the All-Star Break...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...are 7-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 76 errors, which is the most in the majors ahead of the White Sox (68)...the errors have led to 53 unearned runs, which is also the most ahead of the White Sox (43)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Cubs (69)...are tied for first in the American League in passed balls (10) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (10).

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs yesterday after tallying 10 runs over their previous five games...are now hitting .170 (34-for-200) with 17 runs scored over the last six games (2.8 runs per game)...are batting .238 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (SD, .227)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (807) and rank third in fewest runs scored (362) and lowest on-base percentage (.310)...are second in extra base hits (279) and fourth in doubles (151)...have the lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.222) and the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.182)...leadoff hitters have the lowest batting average in the majors (.191) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.276).

PITCHING: The A's have a 4.80 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL and are tied for third in the majors in hit batters (37)...rank fourth in the AL in wild pitches (43)...A's starting pitchers are 26-35 with a 4.74 ERA (241 er in 457.2 ip) this year...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but have allowed the fewest home runs (60)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have used 11 different starting pitchers this year, which is tied for second most in the AL (SEA, 13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 32 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any AL team.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's have five games remaining before the All-Star Break...are 36-48 (.429), which is currently the sixth worst mark in Oakland history before the break...have a 4.80 ERA which is seventh highest and the highest since 1998 (4.94)...are batting .238, which is sixth lowest...A's hitters have struck out 807 times, which is an Athletics record for strikeouts before the break (716 in 2013)...have matched the Oakland record for wild pitches at the break with 43 (also 2016)...have eight triples, which is currently tied for the fewest in Athletics history before the break (sixth time, last in 2009)...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most in Oakland history before the break (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...have hit 120 home runs, which is fourth most (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987)...pitchers have hit 37 batters, which is fourth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005), and struck out 659, which is also fourth most (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015, 670 in 2016)...have 53 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...have stolen 27 bases, which is fifth fewest (sixth fewest is 30, last in 2006)...have al-

lowed 101 home runs, which is fifth most (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 2016, 105 in 1994).

ALL-STAR: Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team Sunday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance.

COUNTDOWN TO 500 AND 1,000: The win by Bob Melvin yesterday was his 498th as manager of the A's...needs two more wins to become the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games...Melvin has 991 wins in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their sixth walk-off win of the season yesterday, which is tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 7)...are 6-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of last Thursday, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was second worst in the majors (MIA, 25%)...have used 80 different lineups in 84 games...home runs have accounted for 184 of the A's 362 runs (50.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

IN JUNE: The A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which tied for fourth worst in the American League...it marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (226) in the month of June...the home runs were second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts were third most (246 in Sept. 2013, 230 in May 2015)...compiled a 5.57 ERA, which was the second highest June ERA in Oakland history (5.61 in 1998)...the offense struck out an AL leading 285 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year...had 102 extra base hits, which were second most in Oakland history in June (116 in 1996), and 61 doubles, which tied for second most (63 in 2004).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Semien, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt and Semien are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 19 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have won the season series for the first time since 2013 as they lead 4-1 entering the final game today...have split the first two games in Oakland after sweeping a three-game series in Chicago June 23-25...it was their first sweep in Chicago since July 8-10, 2005...are 11-15 against Chicago over the last four years...have lost eight of the last 10 games in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 306-287 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 160-138 in Oakland and 146-149 in Chicago...including 64-61 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 983-1042 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso had his third career two-homer game yesterday and all three have come this year (May 6 vs. DET, May 9 vs. LAA)...had homered just once over his previous 27 games...**Jed Lowrie** has tied the Oakland record for doubles before the break with 26 (Joe Rudi, 1974; Bobby Crosby, 2008).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1989** Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in **1993** Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hopper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in **1994** Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in **1996** the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-3, 4.09 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-1 with a 1.20 ERA (2 er in 15.0 ip) and .122 (6-for-49) opponents batting average over his last two starts...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first five starts but was 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents average in five starts in between (May 30-June 20)...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.27 ERA (8 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 5.49 ERA (25 er in 41.0 ip) in seven starts at night...has allowed six of his seven home runs at night...his career numbers are 18-10 with a 2.99 ERA (80 er in 241.0 ip) in 39 starts during the day, 23-25 with a 3.77 ERA (184 er in 439.2 ip) in 71 games at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 3.56 ERA (17 er in 43.0 ip), .220 (35-for-159) opponents batting average and two home runs allowed in seven starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip), .274 (32-for-117) opponents average and five home runs allowed in five starts on the road.

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed 30 of his 40 runs in the single biggest inning of his 12 starts (26 er in 12.0 ip, 19.50 ERA)...has a 1.04 ERA (7 er in 60.2 ip) in all other innings...last year, he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.56 ERA (17 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Six of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...five have come on the road...three have been hit by the number one hitter in the order...has yielded a .146 (22-for-151) batting average with two strikes...opponents are hitting .309 (21-for-68) with runners in scoring position...they are 18-for-35 (.514) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for fifth among American League pitchers in putouts (10)...has 84 career putouts, which already ranks 10th in Oakland history among pitchers (9th in Matt Keough with 90)...has allowed seven unearned runs, which is tied for seventh in the AL...has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 12 starts...has not allowed a run in the second inning (12.0 ip) and opponents are 4-for-36 (.111)...is 5-14 with a 5.46 ERA (99 er in 163.1 ip) over his last 30 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career.

REHAB: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota **May 2**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit **May 7** in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead when he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas **May 13**...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston **May 18** in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami **May 24** in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland **May 30**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time in his last 23 starts he allowed seven runs...had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss to Washington on **June 4** in Oakland...shut out the Nationals on one hit and two walks over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh to get Gray off the hook...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Tampa Bay in the first game of the **June 10** doubleheader...struck out 10 batters, his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...had his third straight no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to New York (AL)

June 15...shutout the Yankees on four hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a two-run single by Headley and a RBI single by Carter...left after 5.2 innings with the scored tied 3-3...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss to Houston on **June 20**...allowed five runs in the first inning on a lead-off home run to Springer, RBI doubles to McCann and Gurriel, and a two-run single to Bregman...blanked the Astros on two hits and two walks over his final four innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Chicago (AL) **June 25**...allowed a solo home run to Engel in the third and an unearned run in the fourth when Abreu scored on a Phegley passed ball...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work...Oakland was shut out on three hits and two walks over the first six innings before scoring once in the seventh and twice in the eighth and ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Atlanta last Friday...allowed just one run on two hits and a walk in 8.0 innings...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more innings, allow three baserunners or fewer and take the loss (Mulder, July 4, 2003 vs. Anaheim)...allowed a leadoff double to Camargo in the third, a RBI double to Swanson later in the inning and walked Markakis to start the fourth...retired each of the final 14 batters he faced and left trailing 1-0...Foltnyniewicz no-hit the A's over the first eight innings before Olson homered to start the bottom of the ninth.

GRAY vs. CHICAGO: Is 2-0 with a 4.13 ERA (24.0 ip, 19 h, 13 r, 11 er, 12 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in four career starts...is 1-0 with a 5.29 ERA (10 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in Chicago and 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-3 A's win at Chicago (AL) **June 25**...allowed a solo home run to Engel in the third and an unearned run in the fourth when Abreu scored on a Phegley passed ball...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work...Oakland was shut out on three hits and two walks over the first six innings before scoring once in the seventh and twice in the eighth and ninth for the win.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 50 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).
