WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of their last six games and five of eight as they continue a six-game, seven-day trip this afternoon with the finale in Oakland.
- RHP Mike Pelfrey, who is 3-2 with a 3.24 ERA (15 ER/41.2 IP) and 33 strikeouts over his last eight starts and 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) over his last three on the road, is scheduled to start for the White Sox.
- The Sox have split the first two games of this series, posting a 7-2 win on Monday before losing, 7-6, yesterday.
- Following today's game and a day off tomorrow, Chicago closes the first half with three games in Colorado (7/7-9).
- The Sox went 4-6 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (0-3), New York-AL (2-2) and Texas (2-1) from 6/23-7/2 and 3-3 on their last trip to Toronto (2-1) and Minnesota (1-2) from 6/16-22.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have won eight of their last 10 games in Oakland after losing the previous seven.
- The Sox have won back-to-back series in Oakland for the first time since 2008-09 and are looking to win three in a row for the first time since 1996-97.
- José Abreu owns a .330 (34-103) average with 11 doubles, six home runs and 25 RBI in his last 24 games ... Abreu has eight homers and 21 RBI in 25 career games against the A's.
- Melky Cabrera is hitting .345 (57-165) with eight home runs and 32 RBI in his last 40 games.
- Mike Pelfrey is 0-5 with a 7.56 ERA (21 ER/25.0 IP) in five career starts vs. Oakland.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- After Melky Cabrera tied the game with a RBI single off Santiago Casilla in the top of the ninth inning, Franklin Barreto hit a game-ending homer off Tommy Kahnle with one out in the bottom of the ninth to lift Oakland to a 7-6 win over the White Sox.
- Cabrera went 2-5 with a home run (No. 10) and three RBI, and José Abreu hit a three-run homer (No. 16) to pace Chicago's 13-hit attack.
- Avisail García returned to the lineup after missing five games with left knee soreness, singling in his first at-bat to end an 0-20 streak ... Adam Engel, Matt Davidson and Omar Narváez added two hits apiece.
- James Shields received a no decision, allowing six runs on six hits (three home runs) over 4.2 IP.

PITO POWER

- José Abreu is attempting to join Al Simmons (11), Albert Pujols (10), Ted Williams (8) and Joe DiMaggio (7) as the only players in major-league history to record 100-plus RBI in each of their first four seasons.
- Abreu is tied for fifth in the American League with 58 RBI, including a league-best 25 since 6/10 (see box at right), and is on pace to finish with a career-high 113.

READINGY FOR RETURNS

- INF Tyler Saladino is 2-5 with a walk through two games of his rehab assignment with Class AAA Charlotte ... Saladino has been on the disabled list since 5/27 with back spasms.
- Leury García, who has been on the disabled list since 6/16 with a sprained finger on his left hand, is rehabbing in Arizona.

ON THE FARM

- Class AAA Charlotte RHP Reynaldo López allowed one run on five hits over 6.0 IP last night in a loss at Durham ... López, the No. 5 prospect in the White Sox system and No. 36 in baseball according to MLB.com, has given up two runs in 12.2 IP with 17 strikeouts over his last two starts.
- Jake Burger, the White Sox first-round pick (No. 11 overall) in the June draft, hit his first professional home run yesterday for the AZL White Sox, a solo shot vs. the AZL Dodgers.

AVI'S AN ALL-STAR

- OF Avisail García has been named to his first American League All-Star Team, selected via the player vote ... he is the first White Sox outfielder named to the All-Star Team since Carlos Quentin in 2011, and the first native of Venezuela since Magglio Ordonez in 2003.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Oakland leads the season series, 4-1 ... the A's swept a three-game series from 6/23-25 (18-5 margin), their first at Guaranteed Rate Field since 7/8-10/05.
- The White Sox are batting .253 (43-170) with a 5.08 ERA (25 ER/44.1 IP) against the A's and have been outscored, 27-18.
- Chicago has won three straight season series against the A's (first time since 1993-95) and eight of the last nine games at the Oakland Coliseum.
- The Sox are 287-306 all-time, going 149-146 at home (61-64 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 138-160 on the road.

SOUTH SIDE HITMEN

- The White Sox are hitting .280/.333/.454 with 61 home runs and 235 runs scored (5.0 R/G) in 47 games since 5/16 ... the .280 average ranks second in the majors behind Houston (.297).
- Over their last eight road games, the Sox are batting .315 (94-298) with 12 home runs, 50 runs scored (6.3) and a .882 OPS, collecting 12-plus hits five times.

FUTURE STARS

- C Zack Collins and RHP Michael Kopech (U.S. Team) and INF Yoán Moncada (World Team) will represent the White Sox in the All-Star Futures Game on 7/9 in Miami.
- Moncada, the No. 1 prospect in baseball, was the Most Valuable Player of the 2016 All-Star Futures Game ... Kopech (No. 11) and Collins (No. 68) are ranked by MLB.com among the Top 100 prospects in baseball.

THE RUNS ARE UNEARNED

- The White Sox have allowed 43 unearned runs in 2017, the second-highest total in the American League behind Oakland (53) ... since 2013, the Sox lead MLB with 308 unearned runs.

WALK THIS WAY

- White Sox pitchers have issued 305 walks this season, the second-highest total in the American League behind Baltimore (315) ... the Sox are on pace for 595 walks, which would be their most in one season since 2000 (614).

SEARCHING FOR QUALITY

- Chicago's starting rotation owns a 5.27 ERA (122 ER/201.2 IP) over the last 41 games, making 10 quality starts.
- The White Sox rank last in the American League with 29 quality starts this season after finishing second in 2016 with 95.

NOT SO RIGHTY TIGHTY

- The White Sox have gone 13-10 vs. left-handed starters this season, compared to 24-36 in games started by right-handers.
- The Sox are hitting a major-league best .292 (216-739) vs. lefties in 2017 and .251 (528-2,103) against right-handers.
- Avisail García (3rd, .423) and José Abreu (5th, .392) rank among the major-league leaders in average vs. left-handers.

POWERFUL PROSPECT PIPELINE

- The White Sox system is rated by MLB.com as No. 3 in MLB and by *Baseball America* as No. 5 ... the Sox seven Top 100 prospects according to MLB.com are tied for the most in baseball.
- Cuban OF Luis Robert (No. 25) became the Sox seventh Top 100 prospect according to MLB.com, joining Yoán Moncada (1), Michael Kopech (11), Lucas Giolito (30), Reynaldo López (38), Carson Fulmer (61) and Zack Collins (70).

ON DECK: COLORADO ROCKIES

- The White Sox conclude the first half this weekend with a three-game series at Colorado ... LHP Derek Holland (5-8, 4.52) is scheduled to start Friday's series opener ... Holland has never faced the Rockies in the regular season.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 7-5, including a 6-3 record at Coors Field ... they are averaging 6.3 runs per game in Colorado, have twice scored 15 runs and hit six home runs on 4/8/14.
- The Rockies won two of three games in the last matchup on 4/7-9/14 at Coors Field.
