OAKLAND ATHLETICS (37-48) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (41-45)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing a season-high six in a row and are now 10-10 over the last 20 games...are 37-48 (.435) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it matches the sixth worst mark in Oakland history after 85 games (were 36-49 after 85 games in each of the previous two seasons)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high 21 games for the third consecutive day.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's begin their final series before the All-Star Break with a record of 37-48...have clinched a losing record at the break for the third consecutive season and the A's .435 winning percentage is currently ninth worst in Oakland history before the break...are 21 games out of first place in the American League West, which is currently the second worst deficit at the break in Oakland history...were 30½ games out in 1979 and 19 in 2001...have a 4.79 ERA which is currently eighth highest in Oakland history before the break and the highest since 2000 (4.80)...are batting .238, which is sixth lowest...A's hitters have struck out 816 times, which is an Athletics record for strikeouts before the break (716 in 2013), and pitchers have struck out 671, which is third most (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015)...have matched the Oakland record for wild pitches at the break with 43 (also 2016)...have eight triples, which is currently tied for the fewest in Athletics history before the break (sixth time, last in 2009)...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most in Oakland history before the break (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...have hit 121 home runs, which is fourth most (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 122 in 1987)...pitchers have hit 37 batters, which is fourth most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005)...have 53 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...have allowed 103 home runs, which is fifth most (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 2016, 105 in 1994)...have 282 extra base hits, which is tied for fifth most (317 in 1996, 294 in 2003, 292 in 2004, 288 in 2000, 282 in 2013).

COUNTDOWN TO 500 AND 1,000: The win by Bob Melvin yesterday was his 499th as manager of the A's...needs one more win to become the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games...Melvin has 992 wins in his career, including 156 in his first two seasons as manager with Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final trip before the All-Star Break tonight with this four-game series against Seattle...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) after going 6-23 over the previous 29 road games...are 13-27 (.325) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) in Oakland...the road record is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1)...are 2-8 over the last 10 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...are 8-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 76 errors, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 68)...the errors have led to 53 unearned runs, which is also the most (CWS, 44)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, 70)...are tied for second in the American League in passed balls (10) and fewest outfield assists (10).

OFFENSE: The A's stole six bases yesterday against Chicago (AL), which matches the second best total by an A's team over the last 28 years and is the most since they had seven on Aug. 6, 2011 at Tampa Bay...prior to yesterday, had not stolen more than two bases in a game this year...are batting .186 (43-for-231) over the last seven games and are hitting .238 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (SD, .229)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (816), rank third in lowest on-base percentage (.310) and fourth in fewest runs scored (369)...are third in extra base hits (282) and fourth in doubles (153)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.223) and the third lowest mark with the bases loaded (.182)...have the lowest batting average in the majors by leadoff hitters (.192) and number two hitters (.185).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.95 ERA (25 er in 57.0 ip) on the last homestand but have a 4.79 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL and are tied for third in the majors in hit batters (37)...rank fourth in the AL in wild pitches (43)...A's starting pitchers

are 5-4 with a 3.57 ERA (27 er in 68.0 ip) over the last 12 games and 27-35 with a 4.72 ERA (243 er in 463.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the AL but have allowed the fewest home runs (61)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Kansas City for second most in the AL to Seattle (13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 32 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any AL team.

ALL-STAR: Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team Sunday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance...head athletic trainer Nick Paparesta will join Alonso in Miami on the AL training staff.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of last Thursday, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was second worst in the majors (MIA, 25%)...have used 81 different lineups in 85 games...home runs have accounted for 185 of the A's 369 runs (50.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 24 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

IN JUNE: The A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which tied for fourth worst in the American League...it marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...A's pitchers set Athletics records for home runs (45) and strikeouts (226) in the month of June...the home runs were second most in any month in Oakland history (48 in Sept. 2015) and the strikeouts were third most (246 in Sept. 2013, 230 in May 2015)...the offense struck out an AL leading 285 times and have set franchise record for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June this year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Jharel Cotton on the disabled list today, which is the 20th time they have used the DL this year...that is fourth most in the American League (TB and TOR 23, TEX 22)...Cotton is the A's seventh starting pitcher to spend time on the DL...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-3...are 1-2 in Seattle and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...have won six of the last nine games against Seattle but are 34-49 (.410) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 11-18/.379)...all-time, the A's are 338-273 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 154-149 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 78-85 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso had his third career two-homer game Tuesday and all three have come this year...had homered just once over his previous 27 games...**Khris Davis** is tied for the Major League with 113 strikeouts, which is one short of the Athletics record for strikeouts before the break (Cust, 114 in 2008)...**Jed Lowrie** has tied the Oakland record for doubles before the break with 26 (Joe Rudi, 1974; Bobby Crosby, 2008).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a double-header to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in **2001** Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

TEAM

10-13, 4.90 ERA (156 er in 286.1 ip)
Saves/Opportunities: 18-for-30 (60.0%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed at least one run in each of the last 10 games dating back to June 25 (21 er in 34.0 ip, 5.56 ERA), which is their longest such streak since May 9-21, 2009 when they had an 11-game streak.
- The pen now has a 4.90 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League.
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (96), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34), tied for second in fewest wins (10) and third in lowest winning percentage (.435).
- Had a 5.66 ERA in June after posting a 4.54 ERA over the first two months of the season...the June ERA was the highest in the majors.
- Surrendered 20 home runs in June, which tied for the second most in the majors...had allowed just 20 home runs total in April and May.

61 RHP JOHN AXFORD

- Has allowed one run in three straight outings (3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA) after tossing three straight scoreless outings from June 20-24.
- Walked four batters Monday, which is a new career high...had walked three batters in a game eight times in his career prior to Monday.
- Has allowed a .214 (10-for-47) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .406 (13-for-32) against left-handers.
- Has not faced the Mariners this year...had a win, loss, save and blown save in seven outings against Seattle last year (6.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 4.05 ERA).
- Was on the 10-day disabled list from April 2 to May 20 with a strained right shoulder.

- Made his major league debut on June 20 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Beltran)...has allowed a first batter home run in two of his six appearances.
- Has allowed runs in back to back outings after tossing two straight scoreless outings from June 24-28.
- Has never faced the Mariners in his career.
- Began his 2017 campaign with two starts, pitched in relief his next eight outings and was 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA over his final four games, all starts...had a .217 opponents batting average with the Sounds, including .197 against left-handers...his complete 2017 minor league stats:

- Blew a save Tuesday after converting his previous four chances...has allowed a run in three of his last six save chances.
- Is tied for second among AL relievers in stolen bases allowed (7), has the third lowest save percentage (77.8%), is tied for third in blown saves (4), tied for fifth in first batter strikeouts (14) and is ninth in saves (14).
- Opponents are 5-for-33 (.152) with runners in scoring position and 1-for-14 (.071) with RISP and two outs.
- Has a 5.84 ERA (8 er in 12.1 ip) and has surrendered all three of his home runs in 13 games on the road...has a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in 19 games in Oakland.
- Has 598 career games pitched.

- Has tossed fewer than one inning in 14 of his last 23 games and 17 of 34 games for the season.

- Opponents are batting .074 (2-for-27) with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the AL among pitcher with 25 or more innings.

- Has not allowed a hit against a first batter faced all season (1 bb, 1 sf)...the 18 at bats without allowing a hit are the most in the majors.
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-19 with 10 strikeouts off him...has not allowed a hit to a lefty since Oct 1, 2016 at Seattle (Aoki).

- Was named to the AL All-Star team Sunday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance.
- Had his third career two-homer game Tuesday against Chicago (AL) and all three have come this year (May 6 vs. DET, May 9 vs. LAA)...had homered just once over his previous 27 games.
- His 19 home runs are a career high...combined for 19 home runs in 343 games over his previous three seasons.
