### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-48) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (41-46)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have a three-game winning streak, which follows a season-high six-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak, which followed a four-game losing streak, which followed a four-game winning streak...are 11-10 over the last 21 games and 38-48 (.442) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League... it is one game better than the A's 86-game record last year (37-49) and one game worse than 2015 (39-47)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high 20 games, which is one game short of the season high (21, last on July 5).

**THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's have three games remaining before the All-Star Break and are 38-48...have clinched a losing record at the break for the third consecutive season and the .442 winning percentage is currently ninth worst in Oakland history before the break...are 20 games out of first place in the American League West, which is currently the second worst deficit at the break in Oakland history...were 30½ games out in 1979 and 19 in 2001...have a 4.78 ERA, which is currently eighth highest in Oakland history before the break and the highest since 2000 (4.80)...are batting .239, which is seventh lowest...A's hitters have struck out 826 times, which is sixth most in AL history before the break (HOU, 871 in 2013; TB, 849 in 2017; HOU, 847 in 2014; HOU, 838 in 2015; CWS, 833 in 2014)...A's pitchers have struck out 671, which is third most in Athletics (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015)...have matched the Oakland record for wild pitches at the break with 43 (also 2016)...have eight triples, which is currently tied for the fewest in Athletics history before the break (sixth time, last in 2009)...have hit 123 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history before the break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000)...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...pitchers have hit 38 batters, which is tied for third most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005)...have allowed 105 home runs, which is tied for third most (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 2016, 105 in 1994)...have 53 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...have 287 extra base hits, which is fifth most (317 in 1996, 294 in 2003, 292 in 2004, 288 in 2000).

**500 WINS:** The win by Bob Melvin last night was his 500th as manager of the A's...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games...Melvin has 993 wins in his career, including 156 in his first two seasons as manager with Seattle.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors in their last 11 games but have 76 for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 68)...the errors have led to 53 unearned runs, which is also the most (CWS, 44)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 73)...are tied for second in the American League in passed balls (10) and have the third fewest outfield assists (11).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored seven runs in each of their last three games after tallying 10 runs total in their previous five contests...have eight stolen bases in six games in July after stealing eight bases in 28 games in June...are batting .199 (53-for-266) over the last eight games and are hitting .239 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (826) and rank third in lowest on-base percentage (.311)...are third in extra base hits (287) and fourth in doubles (156)...have the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position in the majors (.225) and the third lowest mark with the bases loaded (.182)...have the lowest batting average in the majors by leadoff hitters (.192) and number two hitters (.186).

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers did not strike out a batter last night for the first time since July 3, 2013 vs. Chicago (NL)...it was the first time they finished with no strikeouts and won since Aug. 24, 2003 at Toronto...the A's lead the American League in hit batters (38), have the fourth highest ERA (4.78) and the fourth most wild pitches (43)...A's starting pitchers are 6-4 with a 3.33 ERA (28 er in 75.2 ip) over the last 13 games and 28-35 with a 4.66 ERA (244 er in 471.1 ip) for the season...are tied for the third most losses in the AL but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (62)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Kansas City for second most in the AL to Seattle (13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least

11 starters and Oakland has employed 32 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any AL team.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this four-game road trip to Seattle... went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) and are now 5-2 over the last seven road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 14-27 (.341) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) in Oakland...the road record is second worst in the American League (BAL, 15-29)...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 2-8 over the last 10 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...begin post All-Star Break play with a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are 8-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's will face a left-handed starting pitcher for just the fourth time in the last 28 games tonight...are 10-9 in games started by a lefty, including 1-5 on the road...the 19 games against left-handed starters are tied with Texas for second fewest in the American League (BOS, 17)...are 28-39 against right-handers.

**ALL-STAR:** Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team last Sunday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance...head athletic trainer Nick Paparesta will join Alonso in Miami on the AL training staff.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 7-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of June 29, the A's were successful in 29.4% (5-of-17) of their challenges, which was second worst in the majors (MIA, 25%)...have used 82 different lineups in 86 games...home runs have accounted for 189 of the A's 376 runs (50.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 14 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...the A's went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's placed Jharel Cotton on the disabled list yesterday, which is the 20th time they have used the DL this year...Cotton is the A's seventh starting pitcher to spend time on the DL...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's lead the season series 5-3...are 2-2 in Seattle and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...have won seven of the last 10 games against Seattle but are 35-49 (.417) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 11-18/.379)...all-time, the A's are 339-273 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 155-149 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 79-85 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yonder Alonso** is batting a Major League leading .688 (22-for-32) when putting the first pitch in play...**Khris Davis** has 115 strikeouts, which are an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (previous: 114 by Cust in 2008)...**Jed Lowrie** had his 27th double of the season last night to set the Athletics record for doubles before the break (previous: 26 by Joe Rudi in 1974 and Bobby Crosby in 2008).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in **1994** the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (7-4, 3.75 ERA)

**LAST NINE STARTS:** Is 6-1 with a 2.84 ERA (18 er in 57.0 ip) over his last nine starts dating back to May 20...the wins are tied for third most in the American League over that span (Sale, BOS and Vargas, KC with 7 each) and the ERA ranks fifth...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts...has walked 16 batters in 57.0 innings over his last eight starts (2.53 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.351) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.83), seventh in opponents batting average (.223) and OPS (.658) and 10th in strikeouts per nine innings (9.38)...is also third in pickoffs (3) and tied for third in most hit batters (6).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Has allowed a .154 (10-for-65) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .240 (61-for-254) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 80 or more innings...has yielded 21 of his 23 extra base hits to righties and has a .215 opponents slugging percentage against lefties, .387 against righties...his career splits are a .170 (28-for-165) batting average against lefties, .255 (178-for-699) against righties.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-4 with a 4.83 ERA (22 er in 41.0 ip) in eight starts against American League West teams compared to 5-0 with a 2.78 ERA (14 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts against everyone else.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .197 (14-for-71) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is seventh lowest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has a .111 (19-for-171) opponents average with two strikes, which is tied for second lowest...the opponents number three hitter is batting .135 (5-for-37), which is the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors (Scherzer, WAS .125)...the four hitter is batting .158 (6-for-38), which is third lowest in the AL, and the seven hitter has a .129 (4-for-31) average, which is also third lowest.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed 15 of his 39 runs in the second inning for a 9.00 ERA (15 er in 15.0 ip) and 10 in the sixth inning for a 7.20 ERA (8 er in 10.0 ip)...has a 1.91 ERA (13 er in 61.1 ip) in all other innings...the 15 runs in the second inning are tied with Cotton for second most in the American League (Hahn, 18)...has a .354 (23-for-65) opponents batting average in the second inning, a .289 (13-for-45) mark in the sixth and a .167 (35-for-209) mark in all other innings.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-1 with a 3.80 ERA (20 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 3.69 ERA (16 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on the road...is now 8-4 with a 3.31 ERA (48 er in 130.2 ip) in 22 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-9 with a 4.49 ERA (50 er in 100.1 ip) in 18 starts on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has seven wins, which matches his season total from his rookie campaign last year...his 33 walks are four short of his 2016 total of 37...won five consecutive starts from May 20 to June 10 for the longest winning streak of his career...it is also an A's season high...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, giving him a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher.

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codir-oli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left

shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...tossed a career-high 111 pitches in a 5-3 victory over Toronto on June 5.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 12-inning loss to Atlanta last Sunday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a leadoff home run by Suzuki and a RBI double by Inciarte...those were the only runs he allowed in 7.1 innings as he blanked the Braves on a hit, a walk and a hit batter over his final 5.1 innings...left with the scored tied 2-2.

**MANAEA vs. SEATTLE:** Is 3-1 with a 4.50 ERA (28.0 ip, 22 h, 14 r, 14 er, 13 bb, 28 so, 3 hr) in five career starts...is 2-0 with a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in Seattle...is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 8 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in the A's 3-1 victory in Oakland on April 21...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth and then scored twice in the sixth for the win...then took the loss in a 6-5 decision at Seattle May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings...issued bases loaded walks to Valencia and Gamel in the first inning and allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the second...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced following the Cruz home run.

**2016 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Chris Smith (2017 debut):** Will be selected from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow and will be making the first start of his Major League career...has made 164 starts as a minor leaguer...at the age of 36 years, 90 days, he will become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...has no decisions and a 2.45 ERA (3.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so) in two career appearances against Seattle, both in relief last year in Oakland...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts, with Nashville...ranks third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 win over Oklahoma City last Sunday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM
