OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-49) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (42-46)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night and are now 11-11 over the last 22 games...are 38-49 (.437) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...it is one game better than the A's 87-game record last year (37-50) and one game worse than 2015 (39-48)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 21 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 47 days in fifth.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's have two games remaining before the All-Star Break and are 38-49...have clinched a losing record at the break for the third consecutive season and the .437 winning percentage is currently ninth worst in Oakland history before the break...are 21 games out of first place in the American League West and will have either the second highest or tie for the second highest deficit at the break in Oakland history...were 30½ games out in 1979 and 19 in 2001...have a 4.81 ERA, which is currently seventh highest in Oakland history before the break and the highest since 1998 (4.94)...are batting .238, which is sixth lowest...hitters have set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (836) and pitchers have set a record for wild pitches (44)...the strikeouts are fifth most in AL history before the break (HOU, 871 in 2013; TB, 861 in 2017; HOU, 847 in 2014; HOU, 838 in 2015)...have eight triples, which is currently tied for the fewest in Athletics history before the break (sixth time, last in 2009)...pitchers have struck out 674, which is third most in Athletics history (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015)...have hit 123 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history before the break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000), and have allowed 106, which is also third most (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996)...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...pitchers have hit 38 batters, which is tied for third most (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997, 38 in 2005)...have 53 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...have 288 extra base hits, which is tied for fourth most (317 in 1996, 294 in 2003, 292 in 2004, 288 in 2000).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in their last 12 games but have 76 for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 68)...the errors have led to 53 unearned runs, which is also the most (CWS, 44)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 73)...have the third fewest outfield assists in the American League (11).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .190 (56-for-294) over their last nine games and now have a .238 batting average for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .228)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (836) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.310)...are tied for third in extra base hits (288) and rank fourth in doubles (157)...have eight stolen bases in seven games in July after stealing eight bases in 28 games in June...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.190) and two hitters (.187), the second lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.226) and the third lowest average with the bases loaded (.182).

PITCHING: The A's struck out three batters last night after tallying no strikeouts the night before...the three total strikeouts are the fewest by a Major League team in back-to-back games over the last two years...Oakland leads the American League in hit batters (38), is tied for the third most wild pitches (44) and has the fourth highest ERA (4.81).

STARTING PITCHING: Tonight, Chris Smith will become the 12th different pitcher to start a game for the A's this year...that is third most in the majors behind Cincinnati (13) and Seattle (13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 33 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by any American League team and tied with San Diego for third most in the majors (CIN and LAD, 34)...A's starting pitchers are 6-5 with a 3.38 ERA (31 er in 82.2 ip) over the last 14 games and 28-36 with a 4.65 ERA (247 er in 478.1 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the AL but have the fewest home runs allowed (62)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 10 games (11 bb in 59.0 ip, 1.68 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this four-game road trip to Seattle...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) and are now 5-3 over the last eight road games after going 6-23 over the

previous 29...are 14-28 (.333) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) in Oakland...the road record is tied for the worst in the American League (BAL, 15-30) and tied for third worst in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 2-8 over the last 10 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...begin post All-Star Break play next Friday with a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are 8-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

ALL-STAR: Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team last Sunday as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance...head athletic trainer Nick Paparesta will join Alonso in Miami on the AL training staff.

500 WINS: The win by Bob Melvin Thursday night was his 500th as manager of the A's...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games...Melvin has 993 wins in his career, including 156 in his first two seasons as manager with Seattle.

THIS AND THAT: The time of game last night was 2 hours and 39 minutes, which is the fastest A's game since May 31 (2:30) and just the third under 2:55 dating back to June 1...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 53 seconds per game for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...the A's are 7-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of last Sunday, the A's were successful in 33.3% (6-of-18) of their challenges, which was tied with Detroit for second worst in the AL (TOR, 29.2%)...have used 83 different lineups in 87 games...home runs have accounted for 189 of the A's 378 runs (50.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Jharel Cotton on the disabled list Thursday, which is the 20th time they have used the DL this year...Cotton is the A's seventh starting pitcher to spend time on the DL...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 5-4...are 2-3 in Seattle and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...have won seven of the last 11 games against Seattle but are 35-50 (.412) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 11-18/.379)...all-time, the A's are 339-274 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 155-150 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 79-86 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is batting a Major League leading .697 (23-for-33) when putting the first pitch in play...**Khris Davis** has 115 strikeouts, which are an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (previous: 114 by Cust in 2008) and tied for eighth most in American League history...**Jed Lowrie** had his 27th double of the season Thursday night to set the Athletics record for doubles before the break (previous: 26 by Joe Rudi in 1974 and Bobby Crosby in 2008).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** Danny Murphy goes 6-for-6 with a home run in his A's debut as Philadelphia defeats Boston 22-9...in **1935** Jimmie Foxx homers and drives in three runs in a 4-1 American League victory in the third All-Star game at Cleveland...in **1955** Joe DeMaestri is a perfect 6-for-6 in an 11-8, 11 inning loss to Detroit...in **1993** Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's still lose 11-9 to Boston...in **2013** Grant Balfour records his 41st consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (2017 debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making the first start of his Major League career...has made 164 starts as a minor leaguer...at the age of 36 years, 90 days, he will become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he will become just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Has made 63 relief appearances in four seasons with Boston (2008), Milwaukee (2009-10) and Oakland (2016)...made his Major League debut with Boston in 2008 and picked up the only decision of his career in his second career appearance, a win on June 24, 2008 against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has made 61 relief appearances since then without a decision.

SMITH vs. SEATTLE: Has no decisions and a 2.45 ERA (3.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so) in two career appearances, both in relief last year in Oakland...tossed a scoreless ninth inning Aug. 14 (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so)...also pitched Sept. 10 (2.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so) when he inherited a bases loaded situation in the seventh inning and allowed three runs to score plus one of his own (Cruz sacrifice fly).

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranks third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...the Triple-A All-Star Game is scheduled for Wednesday, July 12 at Tacoma...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games...his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers...issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...the Sounds were 6-6 in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA in five games, including four starts, in April...struck out a season-high eight batters and allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.2 innings at Round Rock May 4 but yielded just two runs and was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 5-4 victory...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...tossed the final two innings of the Sounds 13-3 win (2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so)...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha (2.0 ip, 2 so)...moved back into the starting rotation May 28 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day against Colorado Springs...also allowed two home runs, his only game with more than one home run...finished May 1-1 with a 5.68 ERA in five games, including three starts...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts on the 2nd...then combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts...pitched on June 19 against New Orleans to complete the suspended game of April 30...tossed all six innings on the 19th but allowed one run in the sixth inning in a 1-0 loss...walked a season-high four batters June 27 against Round Rock...finished June with a 2-0 record and a 2.42 ERA in four starts.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in Nashville's 5-4 win over Oklahoma City last Sunday...allowed a Willie Calhoun RBI double in the first inning but the Sounds came back with two in the bottom of the

first and one more in the second...surrendered a leadoff home run to Scott Van Slyke in the sixth inning...was relieved by Josh Smith to start the seventh with Nashville leading 4-2 but he allowed two runs for the blown save.

2016 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7...had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland...it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)...allowed a .151 (8-for-53) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .188 (6-for-32) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his extra base hits (three doubles, two home runs) to righties for a .321 slugging percentage...both of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .176 average with runners in scoring position, .103 with two outs and .058 with two strikes...now has a .192 (15-for-78) career average with RISP...first batters faced were 0-for-8 but he walked four and surrendered a sacrifice fly for a .308 on-base percentage...allowed 6-of-8 (75.0%) inherited runners to score and has allowed 14-of-32 (43.8%) to score in his career...did not yield a run in four outings on two days rest or fewer (7.0 ip)...compiled a 4.08 ERA in nine appearances on three days rest or more...surrendered six of his nine runs in the seventh inning for a 14.73 ERA...combined for a 0.69 ERA in the eighth and ninth innings...tossed at least one inning in each of his 13 appearances, including two or more six times.

2016 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 22 starts with Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average, sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA...tied for third in the A's farm system in strikeouts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (130.2)...issued a minor league career-high 45 walks...led the Sounds in starts, innings pitched, strikeouts, runs (64) and walks...his opponents batting average included a .223 (49-for-220) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .252 (71-for-282) against right-handers...issued 33 of his 45 walks to lefties...allowed a .226 average with runners in scoring position, including .182 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 1-for-8 (.125) with the bases loaded...compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.88 ERA from the third inning on...did not commit an error in 27 total chances in his 22 starts...the Sounds were 10-12 (.455) in his starting assignments.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Returned to the majors for the first time since 2010 with the A's last year...is now 1-0 with a 4.58 ERA in 63 career relief appearances with Boston (2008), Milwaukee (2009-10) and Oakland (2016)...saw his most action with the Brewers in 2009, compiling a 4.11 ERA in 35 relief appearances...was released by the Mariners organization May 19, 2011 and did not pitch professionally again until signing with the Wichita Wingnuts of the independent American Association in 2013...signed a minor league deal with San Diego June 27, 2014...is 58-58 with a 3.86 ERA (467 er in 1089.0 ip) in 316 career minor league appearances, including 164 starts, in a professional career that began with the Red Sox organization in 2002.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (1-3, 6.23 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...it will be his fifth start in a day game...has walked one batter in three of his four starts and none in the other two...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...is the 11th Major League pitcher to do it over that span...has allowed seven home runs in 26.0 innings with Oakland after surrendering four in 60.2 innings with Nashville...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's win over Chicago (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 so)...has never faced the Mariners in his career...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion.

- The A's bullpen has allowed at least one run in each of the last 12 games dating back to June 25 (28 er in 36.1 ip, 6.94 ERA)...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever (July 12-26, 1987; June 19-July 1, 1998; May 7-20, 2005)...the streak in 1987 ended with a Dave Stewart complete game on July 27 and the pen allowed another run on the 28th for a streak of 13 consecutive games in which the pen allowed a run in a game it was used...the last scoreless outing by the pen was on June 24 at Chicago-AL (3.0 ip).
- The pen now has a 5.08 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the majors (WAS, 5.11).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (98), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34), tied for second in fewest wins (10) and fourth in fewest walks (107) and lowest winning percentage (.435).

- Has allowed one run in three straight games (3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA) after tossing three straight scoreless outings from June 20-24.
- Walked four batters Monday, which is a new career high...had walked three batters in a game eight times in his career prior to Monday.
- Has allowed a .214 (10-for-47) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .406 (13-for-32) against left-handers.
- Has not faced the Mariners this year...had a win, loss, save and blown save in seven outings against Seattle last year (6.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 4.05 ERA).
