OAKLAND ATHLETICS (39-49) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (42-47)

SUNDAY, JULY 9, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 1:10 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (1-3, 6.23) VS. RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (3-3, 5.04) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games and are now 12-11 over the last 23 contests...are 39-49 (.443) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is one game better than the A's 88-game record last year (38-50) and matches the mark from 2015... have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by 20 games, which is one game short of the season high...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 48 days in fifth.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's enter the final game before the All-Star Break with a 39-49 record...have clinched a losing record at the break for the third consecutive season...a win today would give the A's their 11th worst record at the break in Oakland history and a loss would make it ninth worst...were 38-51 at the break last year...are 20 games out of first place in the American League West and will either have the second highest or tie for the second highest deficit at the break in Oakland history...were 301/2 games out in 1979 and 19 in 2001...hitters have set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (842) and pitchers have set a record for wild pitches (45)...the strikeouts are fourth most in AL history before the break (HOU, 871 in 2013; TB, 868 in 2017; HOU, 847 in 2014)...have eight triples, which is currently tied for the fewest in Athletics history (sixth time, last in 2009)...pitchers have struck out 681, which is second most in Athletics history (728 in 2014), and have hit 39 batters, which is tied for second most in Athletics history (42 in 2004, 39 in 1997)...have hit 125 home runs and allowed 107, both of which are currently third most in Oakland history (hit 137 in 1996 and 131 in 2000; allowed 114 in 1997 and 111 in 1996). have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is third most in Oakland history (77 in 1976, 76 in 1997)...have 292 extra base hits, which is tied for third most (317 in 1996, 294 in 2003, 292 in 2004)...have 53 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most (70 in 1979, 58 in 1999, 54 in 2000, 53 in 1973)...are batting .238, which is sixth lowest...have a 4.79 ERA, which is currently eighth highest and the highest since 2000 (4.80).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 77 errors, which is the most in the majors (MIL, 69)...10 of the errors have been by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAD, MIL) and is one more than A's season total for pitchers from last year...have 53 unearned runs, which is also the most in the majors (CWS, 44)...had just 43 unearned runs all last year...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 73)...have the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .197 (65-for-330) over their last 10 games and now have a .238 batting average for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .227)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (842) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.311)... ranks third in extra base hits (292) and fourth in doubles (159)...have nine stolen bases in eight games in July after stealing eight bases in 28 games in June...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.188) and two hitters (.187), the lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.224) and the third lowest average with the bases loaded (.182).

HOME RUNS: Yonder Alonso hit his 20th home run of the season last night, giving the A's two players with 20 or more home runs (Khris Davis, 24)...this is the sixth time in Athletics history the A's have two players with at least 20 homers before the break (1934, 1986, 1987, 1990, 2014)... Ryon Healy has 19 home runs and the A's have never had three players with 20 home runs before the break...the A's are the first American League team with two players with 20 home runs...home runs have accounted for 191 of the A's 382 runs (50.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League in hit batters (39), are tied for the third most wild pitches (45) and have the fourth highest ERA (4.79)...A's starting pitchers are 6-5 with a 3.45 ERA (34 er in 88.2 ip) over the last 15 games and 28-36 with a 4.65 ERA (250 er in 484.1 ip) for the season...are tied for the third most losses in the AL but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (63)...are one of four American League teams without a complete game...starters have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 11 games (12 bb in 65.0 ip, 1.66 per nine innings)...the A's have used 12 different starting pitchers, which is third most in the majors behind Cincinnati (13) and Seattle (13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 33 different.

ent starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by an AL team and tied with San Diego for third most in the majors (CIN and LAD, 34) $\,$

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this four-game road trip to Seattle...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Chicago-AL (3-0) and Houston (1-2) and are now 6-3 over the last nine road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 15-28 (.349) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) in Oakland...the road record is tied with Detroit for second worst in the American League (BAL, 16-30)...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 2-8 over the last 10 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...begin post All-Star Break play next Friday with a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are 8-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-0 in road series.

ALL-STAR: Yonder Alonso was named to the American League All-Star team a week ago today as a reserve...he was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot and will be making his first All-Star Game appearance...head athletic trainer Nick Paparesta will join Alonso in Miami on the AL training staff.

500 WINS: The win by Bob Melvin Thursday night was his 500th as manager of the A's (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games...Melvin has 994 wins in his career, including 156 in his first two seasons as manager with Seattle.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 42 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 7-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of last Sunday, the A's were successful in 33.3% (6-of-18) of their challenges, which was tied for second worst in the AL (TOR, 29.2%)...have used 84 different lineups in 88 games...went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record (...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Jharel Cotton on the disabled list Thursday, which is the 20th time they have used the DL this year...Cotton is the A's seventh starting pitcher to spend time on the DL...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year... currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series, 6-4...are 3-3 in Seattle and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...have won eight of the last 12 games against Seattle but are 36-50 (.419) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 11-18/.379)...all-time, the A's are 340-274 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 156-150 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-86 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has hit all 20 of his home runs as a first baseman... is just the second Athletic over the last 16 years to hit 20 home runs as a first baseman (Brandon Moss, 21 in 2013)...*Khris Davis* has 116 strikeouts, which are an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break and eighth most in American League history...*Jed Lowrie* had his 27th double of the season Thursday night to set the Athletics record for doubles before the break.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971**, after 19 scoreless innings, Angel Mangual delivers a RBI single in the bottom of the 20th inning as the A's defeat the Angels 1-0...Vida Blue strikes out a club record (extra innings) 17 batters in 11 innings of work, Rollie Fingers adds seven in seven innings of relief and the A's pitching staff finishes with a club record 26 strikeouts in the five hour and five minute game that finishes at 1:08 a.m.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (1-3, 6.23 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...it will be his fifth start in a day game.

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter in three of his four starts and none in the other two...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...is the 11th Major League pitcher to do it over that span (last: Joe Musgrove, Aug. 2-23, 2016 with Houston)...no one has ever done it in their first six games...has walked three batters in 26.0 innings (1.04 walks per nine innings).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed two home runs in his last start and now has seven home runs over his first five career starts (26.0 ip, 2.42 per nine innings)...the home runs are fifth most in Oakland history by a player over the first five games of his career...five of the seven home runs have come with runners on base.

THIS AND THAT: Has a .114 (5-for-44) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .412 (28-for-68) after that...has not allowed a run in the first inning...has allowed six of his seven home runs and issued all three of his walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are 12-for-28 (.429) with a walk when leading off an inning.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut... they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a pair of solo home runs to Ozuna and Moore in the second...yielded two more runs in the third, highlighted by a Yelich RBI single, and was charged with three runs in the fourth, including a Telis RBI double.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on June 19 in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)... shutout the Astros on two hits over the first four innings but the A's were also held scoreless on two hits...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fifth inning and those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...left trailing 2-1.

THIRD START: He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on June 24...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead before Sanchez reached on a Barreto error and scored on a Cabrera RBI single...allowed another unearned run in the fourth inning on an Anderson sacrifice fly and was relieved by Coulombe to start the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston June 29...retired each of the first 10 batters before Reddick doubled with one out in the fourth and scored on a Correa two-run home run...also allowed a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth inning.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland...retired eight of the first nine batters he faced before Engel singled with two outs in the third inning and scored on a tworun home run by Cabrera...the A's scored two in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Abreu in the fifth...was relieved by Coulombe after allowing a leadoff single to Davidson in the sixth and left with a 6-5 lead...Casilla allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25-for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)... tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss... allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings... was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7... then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13... was charged with two runs or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against righthanded hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties...six came with the bases empty...held the opposition to a .154 batting average when leading off an inning...issued just nine walks for a .203 on-base percentage in that situation...had a .225 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts, walked two batters or fewer 23 times and surrendered four hits or fewer 13 times.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors....is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

11-13, 5.03 ERA (163 er in 291.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 19-for-31 (61.3%)

- The A's bullpen tossed 3.0 scoreless innings last night, which marks the first time they have not allowed a run since June 24...had a streak of 12 consecutive games with one or more runs from June 25 to July 7 (28 er in 36.1 ip, 6.94 ERA)...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever (July 12-26, 1987; June 19-July 1, 1998; May 7-20, 2005)...the streak in 1987 ended with a Dave Stewart complete game on July 27 and the pen allowed another run on the 28th for a streak of 13 consecutive games in which the pen allowed a run in a game it was used.
- The pen now has a 5.03 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.10).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (98), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34), tied for third in fewest wins (11) and fourth in fewest walks (107).

- Has allowed one run in three straight games (3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA) after tossing three straight scoreless outings from June 20-24
- Walked four batters Monday, which is a new career high...had walked three batters in a game eight times in his career prior to Monday. Has allowed a .214 (10-for-47) batting average against right-handed hit-
- ters compared to .406 (13-for-32) against left-handers.
- Has not faced the Mariners this year...had a win, loss, save and blown save in seven outings against Seattle last year (6.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 4.05 ERA).
- Was on the 10-day disabled list from April 2 to May 20 with a strained right shoulder.

- Has five saves and two blown saves over his last 11 games and has allowed one run in five of those contests (4 er in 10.2 ip, 3.38 ERA)
- Is tied for third among AL relievers in lowest save percentage (78.9%) and stolen bases allowed (7), is tied for fifth in blown saves (4), tied for sixth in first batter strikeouts (14) and tied for eighth in saves (15).
- Opponents are 5-for-35 (.143) with runners in scoring position, including
- 1-for-16 (.063) with RISP and two outs.
