OAKLAND ATHLETICS (39-50) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (47-40)

FRIDAY, JULY 14, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (4-4, 4.00) VS. RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (10-3, 3.44) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won four of their final six games before the All-Star Break and are now 12-12 over the last 24 contests...are 39-50 (.438) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...it is one game better than the A's 89-game record last year (38-51) and matches the mark from 2015...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 21 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 49 days in fifth.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season as they were 39-50 (.438)... that was the ninth worst pre-break record in Oakland history and was one game better than last year (38-51)...trailed first place Houston by 21 games, which was the second biggest deficit in the American League West at the break in A's history (30½ in 1979)...hitters set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (852) and pitchers set a record for wild pitches (45)...the strikeouts were third most in AL history at the break (TB, 874 in 2017; HOU, 781 in 2013)...tied the Athletics record for fewest triples (8, sixth time, last: 2009)...pitchers had 687 strikeouts, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 728 in 2014, and hit 39 batters, which tied for second most...the A's hit 125 home runs, which were third most in Athletics history and the most since 2000 (131)...allowed 108 home runs, which were fourth most in Athletics history and the most since 1997 (114)... had the third most extra base hits in Athletics history (293) and allowed the third most stolen bases (71)...tied for the third most unearned runs in Oakland history (54)...hit .236, which was sixth lowest...compiled a 4.78 ERA, which was eighth highest and the highest since 2000 (4.80).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 20 errors in their last 34 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 78 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS and MIL, 69)...10 of the errors have been by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAD, MIL) and is one more than A's season total for pitchers from last year... have 54 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 44) and 11 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 71 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 73)...have the third fewest outfield assists in the American League (11).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout on two hits in the final game before the All-Star Break last Sunday in Seattle...it marked the fifth time Oakland has been shutout this year and the third time they were held to two hits...are batting .187 (67-for-358) with 37 runs scored over the last 11 games (3.4 runs per game)...the team batting average has dropped seven points over that stretch to .236, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .227)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (852) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.310) but are tied for third in extra base hits (293) and fourth in doubles (160)...have nine stolen bases in nine games in July after stealing eight bases in 28 games in June...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.189), two hitters (.185) and outfielders (.215)...also have the lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.223) and the third lowest average with the bases loaded (.182).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have two players with 20 or more home runs (Davis, 24; Alonso, 20)...this marks the sixth time in Athletics history the A's had two players with at least 20 homers before the break (1934, 1986, 1987, 1990, 2014)...the A's are one of two American League teams with two players with 20 home runs (HOU)...home runs have accounted for 191 of the A's 382 runs (50.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 4.14 ERA in April, a 4.70 ERA in May and a 5.57 ERA in June...currently have a 4.39 ERA (40 er in 82.0 ip) in July... have a 4.79 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL in hit batters (39), are tied for third in most wild pitches (45) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (273).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-4 with a 3.47 ERA (24 er in 62.1 ip) over the last 10 games...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 12 games (14 bb in 69.1 ip, 1.82 per nine innings)...are 28-37 with a 4.66 ERA (253 er in 488.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (64)...are one of four AL teams without a complete

game...have used 12 different starting pitchers, which is third most in the majors behind Cincinnati (13) and Seattle (13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 33 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by an AL team and tied with San Diego for third most in the majors (CIN and LAD, 34).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin post All-Star Break play with a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 2-8 over the last 10 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...are 24-21 (.533) in Oakland compared to 15-29 (.341) on the road...the road record is second worst in the majors (PHI, 13-33)... went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-4 over the last 10 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 8-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-1 in road series.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 994 career wins and needs six more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...recorded his 500th win as manager of the A's July 6 at Seattle (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have six walk-off wins, which is tied for third most in the majors (LAA and WAS, 7)...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 22 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 7-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through games of July 2, the A's were successful in 33.3% (6-of-18) of their challenges, which was tied for second worst in the American League (TOR, 29.2%)...have used 84 different lineups in 89 games...went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's trail in the season series as they are 1-3 against the Indians after losing three of four in Cleveland May 29-June 1...have won four of the last five games in Oakland but have lost six of the last seven in Cleveland...over the previous six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 23-24 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 271-239 against the Indians...that breaks down to 143-104 in Oakland and 128-135 in Cleveland...including 43-66 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 906-1032 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso had the sixth multiple-hit game by an Athletic in the All-Star Game (Foxx, 1934 and 35; Jackson, 1972; Campaneris, 1975; Henderson, 1982) and the fourth stolen base (Washington, 1975; Henderson, 1982; Canseco, 1990)...left-handed hitters are 0-for-23 with 12 strikeouts off **Sean Doolittle**.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1987 Oakland hosts its only All-Star game, a game the National League wins 2-0 on Tim Raines' two-run triple off A's reliever Jay Howell in the top of the 13th inning...A's rookie Mark McGwire is 0 for 3 in his first All-Star game...in 1991 the A's defeat the Baltimore Orioles 3-2 in 11 innings as Tony La Russa becomes the 40th manager in Major League history win 1000 games...Baltimore scores a run in the top of the 11th but the A's win in the bottom of the inning on Jose Canseco's two-run single.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-4, 4.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-1 with a 1.71 ERA (4 er in 21.0 ip) and .130 (9-for-69) opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first five starts but was 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents average in five starts in between (May 30-June 20)...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 3.49 ERA (19

er in 49.0 ip), .212 (38-for-179) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed in eight starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip), .274 (32-for-117) opponents average and five home runs allowed in five starts on the road...ranks 10th in the American League in home ERA.

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed 32 of his 42 runs in the single biggest inning of his 13 starts (28 er in 13.0 ip, 19.38 ERA)...has a 0.96 ERA (7 er in 65.2 ip) in all other innings...last year, he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

THE SECOND INNING: Has not allowed a run in the second inning and opponents are 4-for-39 (.103)...his 13.0 innings pitched in the second inning are third most among American League pitchers with no runs allowed in the second inning

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.39 ERA (10 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 5.49 ERA (25 er in 41.0 ip) in seven starts at night...has allowed six of his eight home runs at night...his career numbers are 19-10 with a 2.99 ERA (82 er in 247.0 ip) in 40 starts during the day, 23-25 with a 3.77 ERA (184 er in 439.2 ip) in 71 games at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on eight days rest today...is 3-2 with a 3.49 ERA (19 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 4-4 with a 4.00 ERA in 13 starts before the All-Star Break...last year, he went 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break, 2-3 with a 7.52 ERA in six starts after the break... his career numbers are 27-18 with a 3.29 ERA in 67 games before the break compared to 15-17 with a 3.79 ERA (112 er in 266.0 ip) in 44 games

OPPONENTS BATTING: Six of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...three have been hit by the number one hitter in the order...has yielded a .142 (23-for-162) batting average with two strikes... has held the clean-up hitter to a .189 (7-for-37) batting average, no home runs and two RBI...opponents are 18-for-37 (.486) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for fifth among American League pitchers in putouts (10)...has 84 career putouts, which already ranks 10th in Oakland history among pitchers (9th in Matt Keough with 90)...has allowed seven unearned runs, which is tied for seventh in the AL...has walked two batters or fewer in 10 of his 13 starts...is 6-14 with a 5.37 ERA (101 er in 169.1 ip) over his last 30 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career.

2017 HIGHLIGHT: Began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...started a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so) before he was reinstated May 1...made his first start the next day at Minnesota and allowed a career-high tying three home runs in a 9-1 loss...made his 100th career appearance in his next start on May 7 against Detroit in Oakland and had a no decision in the A's 8-6 win...left his start on May 13 at Texas with a 4-2 lead but the bullpen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss.....was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 win over Boston in Oakland on May 18...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...struck out 11 batters in his next start on May 24 to defeat Miami...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts... allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings in a 9-4 loss at Cleveland May 30...struck out 10 batters in a no decision inning at Tampa Bay in the first game of the June 10 doubleheader...it was his second game of 10

or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...allowed just one run on two hits and a walk in 8.0 innings in a 3-1 loss to Atlanta June 30... is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more innings allow three baserunners or fewer and take the loss (Mulder, July 4, 2003 vs. Anaheim).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win over Chicago (AL) on July 5 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on four hits over the first four innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Davidson in the fifth...those were the only runs he would allow in 6.0 innings and he retired six of the final seven batters that he faced.

ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 9-4 A's loss at Cleveland on May 30...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brantley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 21/2 runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 50 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).
