OAKLAND ATHLETICS (40-50) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (47-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won their first game after the All-Star Break for the second consecutive season and have now won five of the last seven contests...are 13-12 over the last 25 games and 40-50 (.444) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is one game better than the A's 90-game record last year (39-51) and matches the mark from 2015...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 21 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 50 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 21 errors in the last 35 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 79 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (MIL, 71)...have 54 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 44) and 11 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 72 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 73)...have the third fewest outfield assists in the American League (11).

PITCHING: The A's tossed their third shutout of the season last night, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...now have a 3.86 ERA (39 er in 91.0 ip) in July after the ERA increased each of the first three months (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May and 5.57 in June)...have a 4.72 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...lead the AL in hit batters (39), are tied for third in most wild pitches (45) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (274).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-4 with a 3.16 ERA (24 er in 68.1 ip) over the last 11 games...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 13 games (15 bb in 75.1 ip, 1.79 per nine innings)...are 29-37 with a 4.60 ERA (253 er in 494.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but have allowed the fewest home runs (64)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have used 12 different starting pitchers, which is third most in the majors behind Cincinnati (13) and Seattle (13)...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used at least 11 starters and Oakland has employed 33 different starting pitchers over that span, which is the most by an AL team and tied with San Diego for third most in the majors (CIN and LAD, 34).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .187 (73-for-387) with 42 runs scored over the last 12 games (3.5 runs per game)...are hitting .236 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .228)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (865), the second lowest on-base percentage (.309) and the fourth fewest runs scored (387)...rank third in extra base hits (298) and fourth in doubles (162)...have nine stolen bases in 10 games in July after stealing eight bases in 28 games in June...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.190), two hitters (.183) and outfielders (.216)...also have the lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.221) and the second lowest average with the bases loaded (.182).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have two players with 20 or more home runs (Davis, 24; Alonso, 21)...this marked the sixth time in Athletics history the A's had two players with at least 20 homers before the break (1934, 1986, 1987, 1990, 2014)...the A's are one of two American League teams with two players with 20 home runs (HOU)...home runs have accounted for 193 of the A's 387 runs (49.9%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (1-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 3-8 over the last 11 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...are 25-21 (.543) in Oakland compared to 15-29 (.341) on the road...the road record is second worst in the majors (PHI, 13-34)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-4 over the last 10 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 8-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-1 in road series.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 10-5 record on Saturday, which is the best record in the American League and third best in the majors (LAD and PIT, 11-3)...it is the only day of the week that the A's have a winning

record...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for third most in the majors (LAA and WAS, 7)...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 7 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 7-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-10...through the All-Star Break, the A's were successful in 36.8% (7-of-19) of their challenges, which was third worst in the AL...have used 85 different lineups in 90 games...went 12-16 (.429) in the month of June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979).

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 995 career wins and needs five more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...recorded his 500th win as manager of the A's July 6 at Seattle (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season as they were 39-50 (.438)...that was the ninth worst pre-break record in Oakland history...trailed first place Houston by 21 games, which was the second biggest deficit in the American League West at the break in A's history (30½ in 1979)...hitters set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (852) and pitchers set a record for wild pitches (45)...the strikeouts were third most in AL history at the break (TB, 874 in 2017; HOU, 781 in 2013)...tied the Athletics record for fewest triples (8, sixth time, last: 2009)...pitchers had 687 strikeouts, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 728 in 2014, and hit 39 batters, which tied for second most...the A's hit 125 home runs, which were third most in Athletics history and the most since 2000 (131)...allowed 108 home runs, which were fourth most in Athletics history and the most since 1997 (114)...had the third most extra base hits in Athletics history (293) and allowed the third most stolen bases (71)...tied for the third most unearned runs in Oakland history (54).

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's trail in the season series as they are 2-3 against the Indians...won the first game in Oakland last night after losing three of four in Cleveland May 29-June 1...have won five of the last six games in Oakland but have lost six of the last seven in Cleveland...over the previous six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 24-24 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 272-239 against the Indians...that breaks down to 144-104 in Oakland and 128-135 in Cleveland...including 43-66 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 907-1032 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso homered for the fourth time in his last seven games last night and now has 21 home runs for the season, all as a first baseman...that matches the most home runs by an A's first baseman over the last 16 years (Moss, 2013)...left-handed hitters are 0-for-23 with 12 strikeouts off **Sean Doolittle**.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons has three home runs and six RBI but the A's lose to Detroit 11-10 in 11 innings...in **1969** Blue Moon Odom homers, drives in four runs and tosses a complete game to improve his record to 13-3 in the A's 6-2 win at Seattle...in **2002** Ted Lilly combines with the A's bullpen on a four-hit shutout in his Oakland debut at Tampa Bay, the A's third shutout in their last four games...in **2014** six A's players appear in the All-Star Game at Minnesota, matching the Athletics record for most players to play in an All-Star Game...the A's also had six players in 1973 and 1975.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-0, 0.66 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...became the 51st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Daniel Gossett, June 14 at Miami) and the seventh over the last two years...the 51 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 15-17 record and a 3.88 ERA.

FIRST TWO STARTS: Has allowed one run and walked one batter in each of his first two starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it...the only one of those eight to do it in his first three games is Cody Anderson for Cleveland in 2015.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 4-3 A's loss to Atlanta July 1 in Oakland...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and it came in the second inning...Flowers reached base on a Barreto error and scored two batters later on a Santana RBI double...retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh inning with the score tied 1-1.

LAST START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle on July 6...tossed 7.2 innings, which are the most by an A's pitcher in one of his first two games since Brad Rigby tossed 8.0 innings in his first start on June 28, 1997 against Texas...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a hit in each of the first four innings...did not allow a run as he was aided by three double plays and a pickoff...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the Pacific Coast League Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on April 15 against Colorado Springs and April 21 at Oklahoma City...picked up his first win April 28 against New Orleans and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment...allowed three runs on four hits and two walks in 4.0 innings...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...had the scoreless streak snapped when he allowed a season-high tying six runs (also May 14 against Albuquerque) on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings on May 29 against Colorado Springs...finished May 2-3 with a 5.12 ERA in six games...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis...walked a season-high four batters June 15 against Iowa...started the second game of a June 20 doubleheader against New Orleans and pitched a season-low 2.0 innings...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June.

2016 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization and was 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 18 starts when he was traded to the Seattle Mariners organization July 20...was assigned to Double-A Jackson and went 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA in eight games (seven starts) with the Generals...combined for a 9-5 record and a 3.28 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) overall...surrendered just eight home runs in 143.0 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...ranked fourth in the Southern League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.12), tied for fourth in games started, sixth in ERA and innings pitched and tied for eighth in wins...tied for the lead among SL pitchers with 40 total chances...was named to the SL Mid-season All-Star Game after going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...went 5-3 with a 4.18 ERA in 13 games (12 starts) after the break...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (69-for-274) against right-handed pitchers compared to .259 (69-for-266) against left-handers...opponents hit .217 with runners in scoring position...combined for a 3-2 record and a 4.50 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks...was 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA in 12 starts on the road...went 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts as a hitter with Jackson.

CAREER: Was originally selected by the Cubs as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2012 draft but was traded twice in 2016...was sent to the Mariners prior to the trading deadline in the Mike Montgomery deal and was traded to the A's following the season for Danny Valencia...is 34-23 with a 3.21 ERA (177 er in 496.0 ip) in 105 games (99 starts) in six professional seasons...has never posted an ERA above 3.48...has surrendered just 28 home runs in 496.0 innings (0.51 per nine innings)...was named to Midseason All-Star Teams in the Southern League in 2016 and the Midwest League in 2014.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (7-5, 3.76 ERA): Is 6-2 with a 2.95 ERA (21 er in 64.0 ip) over his last 10 starts dating back to May 20...the wins are tied for third most in the American League over that span (Sale, BOS and Vargas, KC with 7 each) and the ERA ranks fourth...has allowed a .164 batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .246 against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 80 or more innings...is 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA in nine starts against American League West teams compared to 5-0 with a 2.78 ERA in seven starts against everyone else...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss at Seattle July 7 (7.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Cleveland...including a win in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's victory at Cleveland May 31 (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so).

- The A's bullpen tossed 3.0 scoreless innings last Saturday, which marked the first time they have not allowed a run since June 24...had a streak of 12 consecutive games with one or more runs from June 25 to July 7 (28 er in 36.1 ip, 6.94 ERA)...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever (July 12-26, 1987; June 19-July 1, 1998; May 7-20, 2005)...the streak in 1987 ended with a Dave Stewart complete game on July 27 and the pen allowed another run on the 28th for a streak of 13 consecutive games in which the pen allowed a run in a game it was used.
- The pen now has a 4.92 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.11).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (102), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34), tied for third in fewest wins (11) and fourth in fewest walks (108).

- Made his 600th career appearance last Saturday to become one of 10 active pitchers with 600 games pitched.
- Has five saves and two blown saves over his last 12 games and has allowed one run in five of those contests (4 er in 11.2 ip, 3.09 ERA)
- Is tied for fourth among AL relievers in lowest save percentage (78.9%), tied for third in stolen bases allowed (7), tied for fifth in blown saves (4), tied for sixth in first batter strikeouts (14) and tied for eighth in saves (15).
- Opponents are 5-for-36 (.139) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-17 (.059) with RISP and two outs.
