OAKLAND ATHLETICS (41-50) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (47-42)

SUNDAY, JULY 16, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (7-5, 3.76) VS. RHP TREVOR BAUER (7-7, 5.24) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first two games after the All-Star Break for the second consecutive season and have now won six of the last eight contests...are 14-12 over the last 26 games and 41-50 (.451) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is one game better than the A's 91-game record last year (40-51) and matches the mark from 2015...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by 20 games, which is one game short of the season high of 21...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 51 days in fifth.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their seventh walk-off win of the season last night, which ties them with Washington and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...the walk-off wins match their season total from last year and their five walk-off home runs are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012)...won for the fifth time when trailing after seven innings last night, which is tied for third most in the American League...it was their 10th last at bat win, which is also tied for third in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 21 errors in the last 36 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 79 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (MIL, 71)...have 54 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 45) and 11 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 73 stolen bases, which is tied with the Cubs for the most in the majors...yielded just 75 stolen bases all last year...have the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .189 (79-for-417) over the last 13 games and are hitting .236 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .228)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (878), the second lowest on-base percentage (.309) and the fourth fewest runs scored (392)...rank third in extra base hits (302) and fourth in doubles (163)...have nine stolen bases in 11 games in July after stealing eight bases in 28 games in June...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.188), two hitters (.181) and outfielders (.216)...also have the lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.222) and the second lowest average with the bases loaded (.182).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.78 ERA (42 er in 100.0 ip) in July after the ERA increased each of the first three months (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May and 5.57 in June)...have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (39), rank third in wild pitches (46) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (278).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-4 with a 3.27 ERA (27 er in 74.1 ip) over the last 12 games and 29-37 with a 4.60 ERA (256 er in 500.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the third most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (65)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 131 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 220 and ATL, 181)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have two players with 20 or more home runs (Davis, 25; Alonso, 21)...this marked the sixth time in Athletics history the A's had two players with at least 20 homers before the break (1934, 1986, 1987, 1990, 2014)...the A's are one of two American League teams with two players with 20 home runs (HOU)...home runs have accounted for 197 of the A's 392 runs (50.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (2-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 4-8 over the last 12 home games after going 20-8 over the previous 28...are 26-21 (.553) in Oakland compared to 15-29 (.341) on the road...the road record is second worst in the majors (PHI, 13-35)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-4 over the last 10 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 9-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-1 in road series.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 45 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 8-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-11...through the All-Star Break, the A's were successful in 36.8% (7-of-19) of their challenges, which was third worst in the AL...have used 85 different lineups in 91 games.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 996 career wins and needs four more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...recorded his 500th win as manager of the A's July 6 at Seattle (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season as they were 39-50 (.438)... that was the ninth worst pre-break record in Oakland history...trailed first place Houston by 21 games, which was the second biggest deficit in the American League West at the break in A's history (30½ in 1979)...hitters set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (852) and pitchers set a record for wild pitches (45)...the strikeouts were third most in AL history at the break (TB, 874 in 2017; HOU, 781 in 2013)...tied the Athletics record for fewest triples (8, sixth time, last: 2009)...pitchers had 687 strikeouts, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 728 in 2014, and hit 39 batters, which tied for second most...the A's hit 125 home runs, which were third most in Athletics history and the most since 2000 (131)...allowed 108 home runs, which were fourth most in Athletics history and the most since 1997 (114)...had the third most extra base hits in Athletics history (293) and allowed the third most stolen bases (71)...tied for the third most unearned runs in Oakland history (54).

A's vs. INDIANS: The season series is even at 3-3 entering the final game today...the A's lost three of four in Cleveland but have won the first two games of this series...have not swept a series from the Indians in Oakland since Aug. 17-19, 2012...have won six of the last seven games in Oakland but have lost six of the last seven in Cleveland...have struck out at least 11 times in each of the six games this year (85 strikeouts in 201 plate appearances) and the average of 2.36 plate appearances per strikeout is currently the worst mark in Major League history by a team against one opponent in a season (2.44 by MIL vs. LAD in 2017)...over the previous six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 25-24 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 273-239 against the Indians...that breaks down to 145-104 in Oakland and 128-135 in Cleveland...including 43-66 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 908-1032 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has homered four times in his last eight games and has 21 home runs for the season, all as a first baseman...that matches the most home runs by an A's first baseman over the last 16 years (Moss, 2013)...**Khris Davis** had his second career walk-off home run last night...is tied for the Major League lead in go-ahead home runs (12) and is tied for third in the American League in go-ahead RBI.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a one-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 4-0...Blue improves to 18-3 with the victory and would go on to win both the MVP and the Cy Young Award...in **1991** the A's score three times in the bottom of the 13th inning after Cleveland scores twice in the top of the 13th for a 7-6 win...Mike Gallego has a two-run triple to tie the game and scores the winning run when Terry Steinbach walks with the bases loaded...in **2011** Ryan Sweeney extends his errorless streak to 166 games, setting an Oakland record for consecutive errorless games by an outfielder.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (7-5, 3.76 ERA)

LAST 10 STARTS: Is 6-2 with a 2.95 ERA (21 er in 64.0 ip) over his last 10 starts dating back to May 20...the wins are tied for third most in the American League over that span (Sale, BOS and Vargas, KC with 7 each) and the ERA ranks fourth...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts... has walked 17 batters in 64.0 innings over his last 10 starts (2.39 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.348) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.77), eighth in opponents OPS (.656) and ninth in opponents batting average (.229)...is also third in pickoffs (3) and tied for fourth in most hit batters (6).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .164 (12-for-73) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .246 (67-for-272) against right-handers... the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 80 or more innings...has yielded 21 of his 23 extra base hits to righties and has a .219 opponents slugging percentage against lefties, .382 against righties...his career splits are a .173 (30-for-173) batting average against lefties, .257 (184-for-717) against righties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.80 ERA (20 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 3.72 ERA (19 er in 46.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...is now 8-4 with a 3.31 ERA (48 er in 130.2 ip) in 22 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-10 with a 4.44 ERA (53 er in 107.1 ip) in 19 starts on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA (25 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams compared to 5-0 with a 2.78 ERA (14 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts against everyone else...now has seven-game winning streak against non-AL West teams dating back to last year and has a 2.29 ERA (15 er in 59.0 ip) in nine starts total over that span...his last loss to a non-divisional foe was on Aug. 7, 2016 against Chicago (AL).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .116 (21-for-181) opponents batting average with two strikes, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...the opponents number three hitter is batting .150 (6-for-40), which is second lowest in the AL, the seven hitter is batting .121 (4-for-33), which is third lowest, and the four hitter is batting .195 (8-for-41), which is 10th lowest...opponents are 10-for-29 (.345) with runners in scoring position over his last five starts after hitting .146 over his first 11

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 of his 42 runs in the second inning for an 8.44 ERA (15 er in 16.0 ip) and 10 in the sixth inning for a 6.55 ERA (8 er in 11.0 ip)...has a 2.17 ERA (16 er in 66.1 ip) in all other innings...the 15 runs in the second inning are tied for fifth most in the American League... has a .338 (23-for-68) opponents batting average in the second inning, a .271 (13-for-48) mark in the sixth and a .188 (43-for-229) mark in all other innings.

THIS AND THAT: Has seven wins, which matches his season total from his rookie campaign last year...his 34 walks are three short of his 2016 total of 37...won five consecutive starts from May 20 to June 10 for the longest winning streak of his career...it is also an A's season high...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)... allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, giving him a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so... left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a fourgame streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of

his career...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...tossed a career-high 111 pitches in a 5-3 victory over Toronto on June 5.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle July 7...allowed a RBI single to Cruz in the first inning but the A's scored twice in the third to take a 2-1 lead...he then allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a RBI single by Cruz and a sacrifice fly by Seager for the loss... the A's were shutout on one hit and two walks over the final six innings.

the first 10 batters and had a 1-0 lead when Lindor homered with one out in the fourth to tie the game...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings and the A's scored twice in the fifth for the win...his other start came last year on Aug. 23 in Oakland, a 9-1 win...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with two outs in the fourth and shutout the Indians on two hits and two walks over the first five innings...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Gimenez in the sixth...that was the only run he would allowed in seven innings.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (1-4, 6.23 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...it will be just his second start in a night game...has allowed eight home runs over his first six career starts (2.37 per nine innings) but has walked just five (1.48 per nine innings)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's loss at Seattle a week ago today (4.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Indians in his career...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-13, 4.87 ERA (163 er in 301.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 19-for-31 (61.3%)

- The A's bullpen tossed 3.0 scoreless innings last Saturday, which marked the first time they have not allowed a run since June 24...had a streak of 12 consecutive games with one or more runs from June 25 to July 7 (28 er in 36.1 ip, 6.94 ERA)...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever (July 12-26, 1987; June 19-July 1, 1998; May 7-20, 2005)...the streak in 1987 ended with a Dave Stewart complete game on July 27 and the pen allowed another run on the 28th for a streak of 13 consecutive games in which the pen allowed a run in a game it was used.
- The pen now has a 4.87 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.09).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (102), ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (34), fourth in fewest wins (12) and fourth in fewest walks (108).
