OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-50) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (49-44)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won each of their three games since the All-Star Break to tie the Athletics record for consecutive wins to start post-break play (1936, 2002, 2010, 2012)...have won seven of the last nine games, which is their best nine-game stretch of the season...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14, and are 15-12 since then...are 42-50 (.457) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by 20 games, which is one game short of the season high of 21...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 52 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won each of their last five home games, which matches their longest home winning streak of the season (April 18-22)...have won more than five straight home games just once over the last three years (6, May 28-June 13, 2016)...are 3-0 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (three games) after going 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1)...are 27-21 (.563) in Oakland compared to 15-29 (.341) on the road...the home winning percentage is .222 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 14-35)...leave following the game Wednesday for a seven-game road trip to New York-NL (three games) and Toronto (four games)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-4 over the last 10 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 9-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-1 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 21 errors in the last 37 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 79 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 73)...have 54 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 46) and 11 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 75 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, 73) and matches the A's season total from last year...have the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .198 (89-for-449) over the last 14 games and are hitting .236 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .228)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (884), the third lowest on-base percentage (.310) and the fourth fewest runs scored (399)...rank third in extra base hits (305) and fourth in doubles (165)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among lead-off hitters (.194), two hitters (.182) and outfielders (.220)...have the second lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.223).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.72 ERA (45 er in 109.0 ip) in July, which is tied for third lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have a 4.68 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (39), tied for third in wild pitches (46) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (281).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.21 ERA (29 er in 81.1 ip) over the last 13 games and 30-37 with a 4.57 ERA (258 er in 507.2 ip) for the season...have the fourth most losses in the American League but have allowed the fewest home runs (65)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 132 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 221 and ATL, 182)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have two players with 20 or more home runs (Davis, 25; Alonso, 21)...this marked the sixth time in Athletics history the A's had two players with at least 20 homers before the break (1934, 1986, 1987, 1990, 2014)...home runs have accounted for 198 of the A's 399 runs (49.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their seventh walk-off win of the season Saturday night, which ties them with Washington and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...the walk-off wins match their season total from last year and their five walk-off home runs are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012)...won for the

fifth time when trailing after seven innings Saturday, which is tied for third most in the American League...it was their 10th last at bat win, which is tied for fourth in the AL.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 997 career wins and needs three more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...recorded his 500th win as manager of the A's July 6 at Seattle (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-5 (.583) in the month of July, which is the third best record in the American League...went 12-16 (.429) in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...are 8-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-11...through the All-Star Break, the A's were successful in 36.8% (7-of-19) of their challenges, which was third worst in the AL...have used 86 different lineups in 92 games...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 44 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season as they were 39-50 (.438)...that was the ninth worst pre-break record in Oakland history...trailed first place Houston by 21 games, which was the second biggest deficit in the American League West at the break in A's history (30½ in 1979)...hitters set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (852) and pitchers set a record for wild pitches (45)...the strikeouts were third most in AL history at the break (TB, 874 in 2017; HOU, 781 in 2013)...tied the Athletics record for fewest triples (8, sixth time, last: 2009)...pitchers had 687 strikeouts, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 728 in 2014, and hit 39 batters, which tied for second most...the A's hit 125 home runs, which were third most in Athletics history and the most since 2000 (131)...had the third most extra base hits in Athletics history (293) and allowed the third most stolen bases (71).

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lost three of four at Tampa Bay in June to open the season series...won the season last year but lost it in 2015...are 9-9 against the Rays over the last three years...all-time, the A's are 102-66 (.607) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...it is the fourth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 56-25 in Oakland and 46-41 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has homered four times in his last nine games and has 21 home runs for the season, all as a first baseman...that matches the most home runs by an A's first baseman over the last 16 years (Moss, 2013)...**Ryon Healy** is a .282 hitter with 39 doubles, 32 home runs and 91 RBI in 160 career games...is the fourth player in Athletics history with 30 or more home runs over the first 162 games of his career (McGwire 51, Canseco 34, Cespedes 32).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson, Jimmie Foxx and Pinky Higgins hit consecutive home runs in the fourth inning but the A's lose to St. Louis, 7-4...in **1969** Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-2 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he would duplicate the feat later in the season on September 30, also against Seattle...in **1974** Sal Bando singles in the A's 2-0 win at Baltimore for the 1000th hit of his major league career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (1-4, 6.23 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...it will be just his second start in a night game.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed eight home runs over his first six career starts (30.1 ip, 2.37 per nine innings)...the home runs are fifth most in Oakland history by a player over the first six games of his career...six of the eight home runs have come with runners on base.

DON'T WALK: Walked a career-high two batters in his last start after issuing one free pass or fewer in each of his first five starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...is one of four A's pitchers with two walks or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more in each of his first six games (Godfrey, Griffin, Cotton)...has walked five batters in 30.1 innings (1.48 walks per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Has four losses over the first six games of his career, which are tied for second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first six career games (Mike Morgan had 6)...has a .118 (6-for-51) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .410 (32-for-78) after that...has not allowed a run in the first inning...has allowed seven of his eight home runs to right-handed hitters...opponents are 14-for-32 (.438) with two walks when leading off an inning.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a pair of solo home runs to Ozuna and Moore in the second...yielded two more runs in the third, highlighted by a Yelich RBI single, and was charged with three runs in the fourth, including a Telis RBI double.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on June 19 in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first four innings but the A's were also held scoreless on two hits...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fifth inning and those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...left trailing 2-1.

THIRD START: He recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on June 24...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead before Sanchez reached on a Barreto error and scored on a Cabrera RBI single...allowed another unearned run in the fourth inning on an Anderson sacrifice fly and was relieved by Coulombe to start the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston June 29...retired each of the first 10 batters before Reddick doubled with one out in the fourth and scored on a Correa two-run home run...also allowed a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth inning.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 4...retired eight of the first nine batters he faced before Engel singled with two outs in the third inning and scored on a two-run home run by Cabrera...the A's scored two in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Abreu in the fifth...was relieved by Coulombe after allowing a leadoff single to Davidson in the sixth and left with a 6-5 lead...Casilla allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle in the final game before the All-Star Break on July 9...retired six of the first seven batters before allowing Dyson to score on a Segura grounded into double play in the third...also allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the fourth...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25-for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 (76-for-347) against right-handed hitters and .224 (49-for-219) against left-handers.

CAREER: Was the A's second round pick in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and is the first Oakland pick from that draft to reach the majors...is 19-22 with a 3.55 ERA (151 er in 383.0 ip) in 77 games, including 66 starts, in four seasons in the A's organization...led the A's farm system with 151 strikeouts in 2016...earned California League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 16 to 22, 2016...tied for the Midwest League lead in complete games (2) and losses (13) in 2015...was rated as the A's No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Smith (0-0, 4.50 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the season and his career...his first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over the Mariners (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 r, 1 bb, 4 so)...has no decisions and a 15.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances against the Rays, all in relief in 2008 at Tampa Bay...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team.

- Missed a total of 74 games while he was on the disabled list after playing in all but 10 games over the previous two seasons combined.
- Was placed on the 10-day DL April 16 retroactive to April 15 with a right wrist contusion...it was his first career stint on the DL...was diagnosed with a fractured scaphoid bone and had surgery to insert a screw into the bone April 18...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 20.
- Hit a combined .323 (10-for-31) with six runs, three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, a walk and three strikeouts on an eight-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (June 23-29) and Triple-A Nashville (July 1-4)...started five games at shortstop and three at designated hitter.

Last Year: Played in all but three games and batted .238 with 27 HR and 75 RBI in 159 games...is the fifth shortstop in Athletics history to hit 20 home runs...the home runs tied for first in the majors and tied for fourth in Athletics history by a shortstop.
