#### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-51) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (50-44)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost for the first time since the All-Star Break last night after sweeping a three-game series from Cleveland...the three-game winnings streak matched the Athletics record for consecutive wins to start post-break play (1936, 2002, 2010, 2012)...have won seven of the last 10 games, which matches their best 10-game stretch of the season...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 15-13 since then...are 42-51 (.452) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by 20 games, which is one game short of the season high of 21...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 53 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's will face a left-handed starting pitcher for just the fourth time in the last 28 games tonight...are 10-10 in games started by a lefty, including 9-4 at home...the 20 games against left-handed starters are tied with Texas for second fewest in the American League (BOS, 19)... are 32-41 against right-handers.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just two errors in their last 10 games...have 21 errors in the last 38 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 79 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 73)...have 54 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 46) and 11 more than the A's season total from last year (43). have allowed 75 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 76) and matches the A's season total from last year...have the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

OFFENSE: Last night, the A's were held to a season-low two hits for the second time in the last five games, the third time in the last 14 games and the fourth time this year...are batting .190 (91-for-479) over the last 15 games and are hitting .235 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .231)...the Oakland record for lowest batting average in a season is .236 in 1982...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (890), the third lowest on-base percentage (.308) and the fourth fewest runs scored (401)...are tied for third in extra base hits (307) and rank fourth in doubles (166)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.193), two hitters (.180) and outfielders (.219)...also have the lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.222).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.66 ERA (48 er in 118.0 ip) in July, which is fourth lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have a 4.66 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in hit batters (39) and tied for second in wild pitches (48).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 3.26 ERA (32 er in 88.1 ip) over the last 14 games and 30-38 with a 4.56 ERA (261 er in 514.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but have allowed the fewest home runs (67)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 133 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 222 and ATL, 183)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their home winning streak snapped at a season-high tying five games last night...are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (0-1) after going 2-4 on the last homestand against Atlanta (0-3) and Chicago-AL (2-1)...are 27-22 (.551) in Oakland compared to 15-29 (.341) on the road and have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 14-36)...leave following the game tomorrow for a seven-game road trip to New York-NL (three games) and Toronto (four games)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-4 over the last 10 road games after going 6-23 over the previous .. are 9-4-2 in home series compared to 2-11-1 in road series

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their seventh walk-off win of the season Saturday night, which ties them with Washington and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...the walk-off wins match their season total from last year and their five walk-off home runs are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012)...won for the fifth time when trailing after seven innings Saturday, which is tied for third most in the American League.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 997 career wins and needs three more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...recorded his 500th win as manager of the A's July 6 at Seattle (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 7-6 (.583) in the month of July, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...went 12-16 (.429) in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last five games...are 8-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 15-11...through the All-Star Break, the A's were successful in 36.8% (7-of-19) of their challenges, which was third worst in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season as they were 39-50 (.438)... that was the ninth worst pre-break record in Oakland history...trailed first place Houston by 21 games, which was the second biggest deficit in the American League West at the break in A's history (30½ in 1979)...hitters set an Athletics record for strikeouts before the All-Star Break (852) and pitchers set a record for wild pitches (45)...the strikeouts were third most in AL history at the break (TB, 874 in 2017; HOU, 781 in 2013)...tied the Athletics record for fewest triples (8, sixth time, last: 2009).

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three years as they are 1-4 against the Rays with two games remaining...are 0-1 in Oakland and 1-3 in Tampa Bay...are 9-10 over the last three years...all-time, the A's are 102-67 (.607) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team... it is the fifth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100

games...are 56-26 in Oakland and 46-41 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis hit his 26th home run of the season last night, which is tied for third in the American League...now has 68 home runs over the last two years, which are the most in the majors....the next game for *Ryon Healy* will be the 162nd of his career...is a .280 hitter with 39 doubles, 32 home runs and 91 RBI...is the fourth player in Athletics history with 30 or more home runs over the first 162 games of his career (McGwire 51, Canseco 34, Cespedes 32).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1927 Ty Cobb, who spent most of his career with Detroit, collects his 4000th career hit in an A's uniform against the Tigers...he doubles off Sam Gibson in the A's 5-3 loss...in 1983 the A's turn the fifth triple play in Oakland history vs. Detroit when John Wockenfuss hits into a Ricky Peters to Tony Phillps to Bill Almon to Wayne Gross triple play...in 1988 Stan Javier collects five hits in five at bats in the A's 7-2 victory over Cleveland...in 2004 Mark Mulder extends his winning streak to 11 games in the A's 5-3 win over Chicago...the streak, which would end in his next start, is the second longest in Oakland history.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-0, 4.50

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the season and his career...it will be the 65th appearance of his career...his only career decision came in his second career outing on June 24, 2008 with Boston, a win against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

AGE AT FIRST START: His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle July 8...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings and matched his career high with six hits...the A's scored single runs in the second and third innings but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Segura RBI double and a Gamel RBI single...Oakland scored a run in the top of the fifth but he allowed a leadoff home run to Dyson in the bottom of the fifth...left after six innings with the scored tied 3-3.

SMITH vs. TAMPA BAY: Has no decisions and a 15.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, all in relief in 2008 at Tampa Bay...his first outing came on June 30 (0.1 ip, 0 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...allowed a pair of two-run home runs to Justin Ruggiano and Dan Johnson on Sept. 15 (2.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 so)...his last outing came on Sept. 17 (0.2 ip).

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games.. his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers... issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...the Sounds were 6-6 in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA in five games, including four starts, in April...struck out a season-high eight batters and allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.2 innings at Round Rock May 4 but yielded just two runs and was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 5-4 victory...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...tossed the final two innings of the Sounds 13-3 win (2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so)...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha (2.0 ip, 2 so)...moved back into the starting rotation May 28 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day against Colorado Springs...also allowed two home runs, his only game with more than one home run...finished May 1-1 with a 5.68 ERA in five games, including three starts...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at lowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts on the 2nd...then combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts...pitched on June 19 against New Orleans to completed the suspended game of April 30...tossed all six innings on the 19th but allowed one run in the sixth inning in a 1-0 loss...walked a season-high four batters June 27 against Round Rock...finished June with a 2-0 record and a 2.42 ERA in four starts.

2016 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7... had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland... it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)...allowed a .151 (8-for-53) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .188 (6-for-32) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his extra base hits (three doubles, two home runs) to righties for a .321 slugging percentage...both of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .176 average with runners in scoring position, .103 with two outs and .058 with two strikes...now has a .202 (17-for-84) career average with RISP...first batters faced were 0-for-8 but he walked four and surrendered a sacrifice fly for a .308 on-base percentage...allowed 6-of-8 (75.0%) inherited runners to score and has allowed 14-of-32 (43.8%) to score in his career...did not yield a run in four outings on two days rest or fewer (7.0 ip)...compiled a 4.08 ERA in nine appearances on three days rest or more...surrendered six of his nine runs in the seventh inning for a 14.73 ERA...combined for a 0.69 ERA in the eighth and ninth innings...tossed at least one inning in each of his 13 appearances, including two or more six times.

2016 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 22 starts with Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average, sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA...tied for third in the A's farm system in strikeouts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (130.2)...issued a minor league career-high 45 walks...led the Sounds in starts, innings pitched, strikeouts, runs (64) and walks...his opponents batting average included a .223 (49-for-220) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .252 (71-for-282) against righthanders...issued 33 of his 45 walks to lefties...allowed a .226 average with runners in scoring position, including .182 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 1-for-8 (.125) with the bases loaded...compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.88 ERA from the third inning on...did not commit an error in 27 total chances in his 22 starts...the Sounds were 10-12 (.455) in his starting assignments

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Returned to the majors for the first time since 2010 with the A's last year...has made 64 career appearances with Boston (2008), Milwaukee (2009-10) and Oakland (2016-17)...saw his most action with the Brewers in 2009, compiling a 4.11 ERA in 35 relief appearances...was released by the Mariners organization May 19, 2011 and did not pitch professionally again until signing with the Wichita Wingnuts of the independent American Association in 2013...signed a minor league deal with San Diego June 27, 2014...is 58-58 with a 3.86 ERA (467 er in 1089.0 ip) in 316 career minor league appearances, including 164 starts, in a professional career that began with the Red Sox organization in 2002.
