OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-52) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (51-44)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 19, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the first two games of this series after sweeping a three-game series from Cleveland...the three-game winning streak matched the Athletics record for consecutive wins to start post-break play (1936, 2002, 2010, 2012)...have won seven of the last 11 games...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 15-14 since then...are 42-52 (.447) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 21 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 54 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in their last 11 games...have 22 errors in the last 39 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 80 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 73)...have 55 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, 46) and 12 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, 76) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...have the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

OFFENSE: The A's have six hits in the first two games of this series and are now batting .187 (95-for-509) over the last 16 games...that has dropped the season batting average nine points to .234, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .231)...the Oakland record for lowest batting average in a season is .236 in 1982...struck out 12 times last night, which marks the 49th time this year the A's have fanned 10 or more times in a game...that is second most in Athletics history (59 in 2012)...have 902 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League to Tampa Bay (911) and third most in the majors (MIL, 925)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.308) and the fourth fewest runs scored (404) but are tied for third in extra base hits (308)...have 11 stolen bases in the month of July, which are their most since stealing 12 in May of 2016...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.196), two hitters (.179) and outfielders (.220)...also have the lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.223) and the third lowest mark with the bases loaded (.203).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.61 ERA (51 er in 127.0 ip) in July, which is third lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have a 4.65 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in hit batters (39), tied for second in wild pitches (49) and tied for fourth in fewest walks (286).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings in each of the last three games...that matches the longest stretch of consecutive starts of seven or more innings by A's starting pitchers over the last two years (July 22-24, 2016)...starters are 4-5 with a 3.11 ERA (33 er in 95.1 ip) over the last 15 games and 30-38 with a 4.52 ERA (262 er in 521.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (68)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 134 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 223 and ATL, 184)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (0-2) after going 2-4 on the last homestand...had their season-high tying five-game home winning streak snapped on Monday...are 27-23 (.540) in Oakland compared to 15-29 (.341) on the road and have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 15-36)...leave following the game today for a seven-game road trip to New York-NL (three games) and Toronto (four games) that starts on Friday...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-4 over the last 10 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-11-1 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: Last night, the A's lost for the third time this year when leading after eight innings and the fourth time when leading after seven innings...both marks are tied for third most in the American League...dropped to 10-13 (.435) in one-run games with the loss last night, which is

the third worst record in the AL...had their seventh walk-off win of the season Saturday night, which is tied with Washington and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...the walk-off wins match their season total from last year and their five walk-off home runs are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012)...won for the fifth time when trailing after seven innings Saturday, which is tied for third most in the AL.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 997 career wins and needs three more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...recorded his 500th win as manager of the A's July 6 at Seattle (now has 501)...he is the third manager in Oakland history (La Russa, 798; Howe, 600) and fourth in Athletics history (Mack, 3582) to win 500 games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just four of the last 28 games...are 10-11 in games started by a lefty and the 21 games against left-handed starters are third fewest in the American League (BOS and TEX, 20)...are 32-41 against right-handers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-7 (.500) in the month of July...went 12-16 (.429) in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last six games...are 8-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 16-11...home runs have accounted for 201 of the A's 404 runs (49.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt and Pinder are on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have lost the first two games of this series and have never been swept by the Rays in Oakland (this is the 27th series)...this is just the third time the A's have lost a series in Oakland (18 wins, 6 splits)...have lost the season series for the second time in the last three years as they are 1-5 against the Rays entering the final meeting today...have clinched their worst single season mark against Tampa Bay (previous: 3-6 in 2008)...each of the A's last four losses have been by one run and seven of the last nine games between the two clubs have been decided by one run...are 0-2 in Oakland and 1-3 in Tampa Bay...are 9-11 over the last three years...all-time, the A's are 102-68 (.600) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 56-27 in Oakland and 46-41 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Khris Davis leads the majors in home runs off right-handed pitchers (25) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (13) and home runs on the first pitch (9)...**Rajai Davis** is tied for the Major League lead with seven stolen bases in the month of July...has 133 career steals as an Athletic...that is two behind Jose Canseco, who ranks seventh in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-4, 3.72 ERA)

LAST FOUR STARTS: Is 3-1 with a 1.33 ERA (4 er in 27.0 ip) and .122 (11-for-90) opponents batting average over his last four starts...has allowed four hits or fewer in each of those starts while tossing at least six innings each time...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since Dallas Braden (Aug. 11-28, 2010)...the longest is a five-game streak by Dan Haren from May 14 to June 4, 2007.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.11 ERA (19 er in 55.0 ip), .200 (40-for-200) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed in nine starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (16 er in 29.2 ip), .274 (32-for-117) opponents average and five home runs allowed in five starts on the road...ranks eighth in the American League in home ERA.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.39 ERA (10 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 2-4 with a 4.79 ERA (25 er in 47.0 ip) in eight starts at night...has allowed six of his eight home runs at night...his career numbers are 19-10 with a 2.99 ERA (82 er in 247.0 ip) in 40 starts during the day, 24-25 with a 3.72 ERA (184 er in 445.2 ip) in 72 games at night.

QUALIFICATIONS: Spent the first month of the season on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder and does not have enough innings to qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 80 innings pitched, he ranks seventh in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.286), tied for eighth in slugging percentage (.363) and 10th in batting average (.227).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings for the win in his first start after the All-Star Break last Friday after going 4-4 with a 4.00 ERA in 13 starts before the break...last year, he went 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break, 2-3 with a 7.52 ERA in six starts after the break...his career numbers are 27-18 with a 3.29 ERA in 67 games before the break compared to 16-17 with a 3.71 ERA (112 er in 272.0 ip) in 45 games after the break.

THE SECOND INNING: Has not allowed a run in the second inning and opponents are 4-for-42 (.095)...his 14.0 innings pitched in the second inning are second most in the majors among pitchers with no runs allowed in the second inning (Nova, PIT 19.0).

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed 32 of his 42 runs in the single biggest inning of his 14 starts (28 er in 14.0 ip, 18.00 ERA)...has a 0.89 ERA (7 er in 70.2 ip) in all other innings...last year, he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Six of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...three have been hit by the number one hitter in the order...has yielded a .136 (24-for-176) batting average with two strikes...has held the clean-up hitter to a .175 (7-for-40) batting average, no home runs and two RBI...opponents are 19-for-40 (.475) with two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for fifth among American League pitchers in putouts (11)...has 85 career putouts, which already ranks 10th in Oakland history among pitchers (9th in Matt Keough with 90)...has allowed seven unearned runs, which is tied for seventh in the AL...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 14 starts...is 7-14 with a 5.18 ERA (101 er in 175.1 ip) over his last 32 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...started a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on April 22 and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 7-0 win over San Jose that day (5.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so, 47 pitches)...also made one start with Triple-A Nashville April 27 against New Orleans and earned the win in a 9-2 decision (6.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so, 77 pitches)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in his two starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 13 so) before he was reinstated May 1...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts...allowed a career-high tying three home runs in his first start, a 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...made his 100th career appearance in his next start on May 7 against Detroit in Oakland and had a no decision in the A's 8-6 win...left his start on May 13 at Texas with a 4-2 lead but the bullpen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 win over Boston in Oakland on May 18...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...struck out 11 batters in his next start on May 24 to defeat Miami...it was

his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...then went 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 30 to June 20...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings in a 9-4 loss at Cleveland May 30...struck out 10 batters in a no decision inning at Tampa Bay in the first game of the June 10 doubleheader...it was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...allowed just one run on two hits and a walk in 8.0 innings in a 3-1 loss to Atlanta June 30...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more innings, allow three baserunners or fewer and take the loss (Mulder, July 4, 2003 vs. Anaheim).

LAST START: He combined with Madson, Doolittle and Casilla on a four-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Cleveland last Friday...tossed six of the innings and allowed two of the hits while walking one...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position.

GRAY vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.07 ERA (48.2 ip, 53 h, 29 r, 22 er, 12 bb, 41 so) in eight career starts...has allowed nine career home runs, which are his most against any team...eight have come in his last four starts (24.2 ip)...is 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA (16 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (6 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts at Tampa Bay...had a no decision in his only start this year,

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...now has 50 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Paul Blackburn (1-0, 1.83 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over Cleveland last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Mets in his career...has made one interleague appearance, a start in his Major League debut on July 1 against Atlanta (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 4 so)...has never batted in the majors...was 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in the minors...was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts).

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in four of the last seven games (4 er in 18.2 ip, 1.93 ERA) after allowing at least one run in each of the previous 12 contests...that tied the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever.
- The pen now has a 4.86 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 4.93).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (105), is tied for first in most stolen bases allowed (36), tied for third in fewest wins (12) and fourth in fewest walks (110).
