ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of five games since winning three straight games after the All-Star break...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 16-16 since then...are 43-54 (.443) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high 22 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 58 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in their last four games after making only two errors over their previous 10 games (July 4-17)...have 84 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (CWS/MIL, 75)...have 56 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS, SD: 49) and 13 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is the second most in the majors (CHC, 79) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (12).

OFFENSE: The A's have recorded three straight 10+ hit games for the second time this season (also June 10-11 at Tampa Bay)...are hitting .237 as a team, which is the third lowest batting average in the majors (SD, .235; TEX, .236)...the Oakland record for lowest batting average in a season is .236 in 1982...have 10+ strikeouts in 50 games...that is second most in Athletics history (59 in 2012)...have 924 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League to Tampa Bay (937) and third most in the majors (MIL, 972)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.200), two hitters (.188) and outfielders (.224)...also have the second lowest mark with runners in scoring position (.230) and the third lowest mark with the bases loaded (.205).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.83 ERA (65 er in 152.2 ip) in July, which is fourth lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have a 4.65 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in hit batters (39) and wild pitches (50), and are fourth in fewest walks (291).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers had allowed three earned runs or fewer in 11 straight games before back-to-back four-run starts Friday and Saturday (Blackburn and Manaea)...starters are 5-4 with a 3.43 ERA (31 er in 81.1 ip) over the last 13 games and 31-39 with a 4.54 ERA (272 er in 539.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (70)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 137 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 226 and ATL, 188)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on their current seven-game road trip to New York-NL (0-2) and Toronto (four games)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 6-6 over the last 12 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...went 4-2 on their most recent six-game homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) after going 2-4 on the last homestand...had their season-high tying five-game home winning streak snapped on Monday...are 28-23 (.549) in Oakland compared to 15-31 (.326) on the road and have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36, .308)...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-12-1 in road series (includes current series loss to Mets).

CLOSE CALLS AND BLOWOUTS: A's are 10-14 (.417) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the AL...have seven walk-off wins and five walk-off home runs...the home runs are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012)...have the worst record in the majors in games decided by more than three runs (12-27, .308).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just five of the last 31 games...are 10-12 in games started by a lefty and the 22 games against left-handed starters are the third the fewest in the American League (BOS, TEX: 11)...have the worst batting average in the AL against left-handed pitchers (.228)...are 33-42 against right-handed starters.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin has 998 career wins and needs two more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...just eight active managers have at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1827; Baker, 1824; Scioscia, 1538; Showalter, 1475; Francona, 1431; Hurdle, 1092; Yost, 1055; Maddon, 1031).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-9 (.471) in the month of July...went 12-16 (.429) in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last nine games...are 9-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 18-11...home runs have accounted for 205 of the A's 421 runs (48.7%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-10 (.167) in interleague play (0-3 vs. Atlanta, 1-3 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. Washington, 0-2 vs. New York), which is the worst mark in the majors (CLE, 4-13, .235)...in addition to today's series finale against New York, the A's will also play host to San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...have allowed 83 runs in 12 interleague games for a 6.60 ERA (79 er in 107.2 ip), which is the highest in the majors (CWS, 6.31)...are 200-176 (.532) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-68 (.029) over the last four seasons and 8-for-144 (.056) over the last eight...have a .080 (30-for-377) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 11 walks and 178 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt, Cotton, Graveman and Pinder are on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. METS: The A's have lost the first two games of this year's three-game season series against the Mets...are now 1-3-1 all-time in season series against the Mets...prior to this series, the two teams last played in 2014, splitting a four-game season series...all-time, the A's are 5-10 vs. the Mets...have lost 10 of the last 13 games dating back to 2005 since winning the first two games between the teams on June 14-15, 2005...the A's are 2-8 in New York and 3-2 at home.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is tied for fourth in the majors with 27 home runs...tied for the major league lead in homers off right-handed pitchers (25) and home runs on the first pitch (9)...**Rajai Davis** is tied for the Major League lead with eight stolen bases in the month of July...has 134 career steals as an Athletic, one behind Jose Canseco, who ranks seventh in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1964** Bert Campaneris homers twice in his major league debut as the A's defeat Minnesota, 4-3...the first home run comes on the first pitch he sees from Jim Kaat...in **1976** Vida Blue tosses a six-hit shutout and strikes out 13 in the A's 2-0 win over Kansas City to record his 100th career victory...he would go on to win 124 games in an Oakland uniform, second only to Catfish Hunter's 131...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits his eighth career grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Chicago...it was his fifth homer in three days.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (1-5, 5.79 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...it will be his sixth start in a day game...has five losses over the first seven games of his career...is the second pitcher in Oakland history with at least five losses over his first seven career games...the other is Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first nine career games.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed two home runs in his last start and has surrendered at least one home run in six of his first seven starts...has allowed 10 home runs in 37.1 innings, an average of 2.41 per nine innings...the 10 home runs are tied for fourth most in Athletics history by a pitcher over his first seven career games (Overton 12, Alcantara 11, Straily 11)...nine of the home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters once this year, one batter four times and no batters twice...has six walks in 37.1 innings (1.45 walks per nine innings)...issued one free pass or fewer in each of his first five starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...is one of three A's pitchers since 1913 with two walks or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more in each of his first seven games (Graham Godfrey and A.J. Griffin)...neither Godfrey or Griffin extended their streak to eight.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has pitched once in interleague play and it was a start in his Major League debut at Miami on June 14...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-6 loss (3.1 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hr).

WITH THE BAT: Batted for the first time as a professional June 14 at Miami and, after laying down a sacrifice bunt in his first plate appearance, had an infield single off Edinson Volquez in the fourth inning for his first Major League hit.

BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning...has a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) and .143 (7-for-49) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, an 8.10 ERA (21 er in 23.1 ip) and .355 (38-for-107) opponents average after that.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .133 (8-for-60) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .385 (37-for-96) after that...opponents are 16-for-39 (.410) with two walks when leading off an inning.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami **June 14**...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on **June 19** in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first four innings but the A's were also held scoreless on two hits...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fifth inning and those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...left trailing 2-1...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on **June 24**...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead before Sanchez reached on a Barreto error and scored on a Cabrera RBI single...allowed another unearned run in the fourth inning on an Anderson sacrifice fly and was relieved by Coulombe to start the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **June 29**...retired each of the first 10 batters before Reddick doubled with one out in the fourth and scored on a Correa two-run home run...also allowed a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on **July 4**...retired eight of the first nine batters he faced before Engel singled with two outs in the third inning and scored on a two-run home run by Cabrera...the A's scored two in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Abreu in the fifth...was relieved by Coulombe after allowing a leadoff single to Davidson in the sixth and left with a 6-5 lead...Casilla allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle in the final game before the All-Star Break on **July 9**...retired six of the first seven batters before allowing Dyson to score on a Segura grounded into double play in the third...also allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the fourth...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay last Monday in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Souza in the second and another run in the third when Smith scored on a fielders choice...the A's scored once in the fourth to make the score 2-1 but he allowed a

solo home run to Longoria in the fifth and left after seven innings trailing 3-1.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25-for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 against right-handed hitters and .224 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Smith (0-0, 2.77 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and career...his first 63 career games were out of the bullpen...his first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over the Mariners (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 h, 3 r, 1 bb, 4 so)...tossed a career high 7.0 innings and allowed one earned run in his last outing, July 18 vs. Tampa Bay (ND)...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team.

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in five of the last 10 games (8 er in 27.0 ip, 2.67 ERA) after allowing at least one run in each of the previous 12 contests...that tied the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever.
- The pen now has a 4.85 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.02).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (114), is tied for first in most stolen bases allowed (36), tied for third in fewest wins (12) and fourth in fewest walks (111).
