OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-54) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (44-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last six games after winning three straight to start post All-Star Break play...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 17-16 since then...are 44-54 (.449) for the season, which is tied with Toronto for the second worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by 21 games, which is one game short of the season high of 22 (July 22)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 59 days in fifth.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin recorded his 999th career win yesterday at New York (NL) and needs one more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...there are eight active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1827; Baker, 1825; Scioscia, 1539; Showalter, 1476; Francona, 1432; Hurdle, 1092; Yost, 1056; Maddon, 1032).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 26 errors in the last 43 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 84 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (MIL, 77)...have 56 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS and SD, 49) and 13 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 79) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (12).

OFFENSE: The A's collected 33 hits in the three-game series at New York (NL) to start the road trip, which are their most hits in a three-game series this year...hit .324 (33-for-102) after batting .196 over the previous 17 games...are now batting .238 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have struck out 10 or more times in a game 50 times this year, which is second most in Oakland history (59 in 2012)...have 928 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the AL to Tampa Bay (950)...have the fourth lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.312) but are tied for third in extra base hits (320)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.198), two hitters (.192) and outfielders (.225)...are hitting .230 with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the majors to Toronto (.220)...have the third lowest mark in the majors with the bases loaded (.205).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.16 ERA (28 er in 79.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the fourth lowest post-break ERA in the American League...have a 4.63 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in wild pitches (51) and hit batters (39) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (293).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-6 with a 3.41 ERA (45 er in 118.2 ip) over the last 19 games but are 31-39 with a 4.52 ERA (274 er in 545.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (71)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 138 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 227 and ATL, 189)...it is third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this seven-game road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (four games)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 7-6 over the last 13 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 16-31 (.340) on the road compared to 28-23 (.549) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36)...return home following the game Thursday for a five-game homestand against Minnesota (three games) and San Francisco (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2)...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-12-1 in road series.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third time in their last six games tonight...however, have faced a left-handed starter just 22 times this year entering tonight, which is third fewest in the American League (BOS and TEX, 21)...are 10-12 (.455) in games started by a lefty compared to 34-42 (.447) against right-

handers...have the worst batting average in the AL against left-handed pitchers (.229).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have a run differential of -76, which is second worst in the American League to Toronto (-90)...four of the A's last six games have been decided by one run and six of the last eight have been decided by two runs or fewer...the A's are 32-27 (.542) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 12-27 (.308) in games decided by four runs or more...the mark in games decided by four runs or more is the worst in the majors (SD, 13-28/.317).

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 9-9 in the month of July...went 12-16 in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...have a 3.73 ERA (67 er in 161.2 ip) this month, which is third lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have issued 41 walks, which is second fewest in the majors (LAD, 33)...are batting .227 (132-for-581), which is third lowest in the AL...lead the league in walks (75) and rank third in stolen bases (15)...the steals are the A's most in one month since April of 2016 when they also had 15.

THIS AND THAT: The A's hit three solo home runs in a 3-2 win yesterday at New York (NL)...home runs have accounted for 207 of the A's 424 runs this year (48.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last 10 games...are 9-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 18-11...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 5 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years Oakland has used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have eight players on the DL (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl) but six of those players are on rehab assignments (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Wahl)...Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs are on the 60-day DL...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to May 24...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three in Oakland, June 5-7...the two clubs split the six-game season series last year...the A's won two of three in Oakland and lost two of three at Toronto...have won nine of the last 13 games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre...have lost the season series just once over the previous six seasons (1-5 in 2015) but are 24-24 against the Blue Jays over that span...are 217-191 all-time, including 109-97 in Oakland, 108-92 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-60 (.528) in Rogers Centre, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Boston, 127-101, .557).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is tied for second in the American League and tied for fourth in the majors with 28 home runs...leads the majors in home runs off right-handed pitchers (26) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (14) and home runs on the first pitch (9)...**Rajai Davis** leads the AL with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which ties Jose Canseco for seventh place on the Oakland career stolen base list.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in **1999** Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-0, 2.77 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his third appearance and start of the season...it is the third start of his career but it will be his 66th appearance...his only career decision came in his second career outing on June 24, 2008 with Boston, a win against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

AGE AT FIRST START: His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle July 8...matched his career high by allowing six hits...the A's scored single runs in the second and third innings but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Segura RBI double and a Gamel RBI single...Oakland scored a run in the top of the fifth but he allowed a leadoff home run to Dyson in the bottom of the fifth...left after six innings with the scored tied 3-3.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs (one earned)...the A's scored two runs in the first inning but he allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second and a Souza lead off home run in the third...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and left with a 3-2 lead...Casilla allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

SMITH vs. TORONTO: Is scheduled to face the Blue Jays tonight for the first time in nearly nine years...his only career outing against Toronto came in relief on Aug. 23, 2008 at Rogers Centre while pitching for Boston (2.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 so, 2 hr)...relieved Jon Lester with one out in the third inning and Toronto leading 6-0...allowed an inherited runner to score...also yielded two runs in the fourth inning and two more in the fifth on solo home runs by Scutaro and Wells.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games...his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers...issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...the Sounds were 6-6 in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA in five games, including four starts, in April...struck out a season-high eight batters and allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.2 innings at Round Rock May 4 but yielded just two runs and was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 5-4 victory...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...tossed the final two innings of the Sounds 13-3 win (2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so)...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha (2.0 ip, 2 so)...moved back into the starting rotation May 28 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day against Colorado Springs...also allowed two home runs, his only game with more than one home run...finished May 1-1 with a 5.68 ERA in five games, including three starts...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning score-

less streak from June 2-13...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts on the 2nd...then combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts...pitched on June 19 against New Orleans to completed the suspended game of April 30...tossed all six innings on the 19th but allowed one run in the sixth inning in a 1-0 loss...walked a season-high four batters June 27 against Round Rock...finished June with a 2-0 record and a 2.42 ERA in four starts.

2016 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7...had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland...it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)...allowed a .151 (8-for-53) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .188 (6-for-32) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his extra base hits (three doubles, two home runs) to righties for a .321 slugging percentage...both of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .176 average with runners in scoring position, .103 with two outs and .058 with two strikes...now has a .198 (17-for-86) career average with RISP...first batters faced were 0-for-8 but he walked four and surrendered a sacrifice fly for a .308 on-base percentage...allowed 6-of-8 (75.0%) inherited runners to score and has allowed 14-of-32 (43.8%) to score in his career...did not yield a run in four outings on two days rest or fewer (7.0 ip)...compiled a 4.08 ERA in nine appearances on three days rest or more...surrendered six of his nine runs in the seventh inning for a 14.73 ERA...combined for a 0.69 ERA in the eighth and ninth innings...tossed at least one inning in each of his 13 appearances, including two or more six times.

2016 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 22 starts with Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average, sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA...tied for third in the A's farm system in strikeouts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (130.2)...issued a minor league career-high 45 walks...led the Sounds in starts, innings pitched, strikeouts, runs (64) and walks...his opponents batting average included a .223 (49-for-220) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .252 (71-for-282) against right-handers...issued 33 of his 45 walks to lefties...allowed a .226 average with runners in scoring position, including .182 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 1-for-8 (.125) with the bases loaded...compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.88 ERA from the third inning on...did not commit an error in 27 total chances in his 22 starts...the Sounds were 10-12 (.455) in his starting assignments

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Returned to the majors for the first time since 2010 with the A's last year...has made 65 career appearances with Boston (2008), Milwaukee (2009-10) and Oakland (2016-17)...saw his most action with the Brewers in 2009, compiling a 4.11 ERA in 35 relief appearances...was released by the Mariners organization May 19, 2011 and did not pitch professionally again until signing with the Wichita Wingnuts of the independent American Association in 2013...signed a minor league deal with San Diego June 27, 2014...is 58-58 with a 3.86 ERA (467 er in 1089.0 ip) in 316 career minor league appearances, including 164 starts, in a professional career that began with the Red Sox organization in 2002.

RHP Sonny Gray (6-4, 3.66 ERA): Is 4-1 with a 1.62 ERA and .155 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is 5-2 with a 3.08 ERA, .208 opponents batting average and three home runs allowed in 10 starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA, .274 opponents average and five home runs allowed in five starts on the road...is 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in seven starts during the day compared to 2-4 with a 4.79 ERA in eight starts at night...is 4-2 with a 3.42 ERA in nine starts on four days rest, 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA in his other six starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win over Tampa Bay last Wednesday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 3-1 with a 3.00 ERA (33.0 ip, 29 h, 13 r, 11 er, 15 bb, 22 so, 4 hr) in five career starts against Toronto...last faced the Blue Jays on July 16, 2016 in Oakland when he picked up the win in the A's 5-4 victory (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 2 so).
