### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-55) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (45-54)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost five of the last seven games after winning three straight to start post All-Star Break play...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 17-17 since then...are 44-55 (.444) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 22 games (also July 22)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 60 days in fifth.

**COUNTDOWN TO 1,000:** Bob Melvin recorded his 999th career win Sunday at New York (NL) and needs one more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...there are eight active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1827; Baker, 1825; Scioscia, 1539; Showalter, 1477; Francona, 1433; Hurdle, 1093; Yost, 1057; Maddon, 1032).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 26 errors in the last 44 games after making 58 in their first 55 contests...have 84 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (MIL, 77)...have 56 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (CWS and SD, 49) and 13 more than the A's season total from last year (43)...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 79) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (12).

**OFFENSE:** The A's were held to two hits last night for the second time in the last seven games and the fourth time in the last 20 games...it was the fifth time this year Oakland has been held to two or fewer hits, which ties the Cubs for the most such games in the majors...are now hitting .211 (141-for-669) over the last 21 games and .236 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have struck out 10 or more times in a game 50 times this year, which is second most in Oakland history (59 in 2012)...have 937 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the AL to Tampa Bay (960)...have the third lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.310) but rank third in extra base hits (321)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.197), two hitters (.190) and outfielders (.223)...are hitting .230 with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the majors to Toronto (.219)...have the third lowest mark in the majors with the bases loaded (.205).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.29 ERA (32 er in 87.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have a 4.63 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the American League...rank second in the AL in wild pitches (52) and hit batters (39).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 6-7 with a 3.46 ERA (48 er in 124.2 ip) over the last 20 games but are 32-40 with a 4.52 ERA (277 er in 551.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (72)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 139 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 228 and ATL, 190)...it is also third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-3 on this seven-game road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-1)...went 2-2 on the last road trip to Seattle and are 7-7 over the last 14 road games after going 6-23 over the previous 29...are 16-32 (.333) on the road compared to 28-23 (.549) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36)...return home following the game Thursday for a five-game homestand against Minnesota (three games) and San Francisco (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2)...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-12-1 in road series.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have compiled a 20-20 (.500) record during day games compared to 24-35 (.407) at night...are batting .264 (361-for-1369) and are averaging 4.90 runs per game during the day (196 runs), .217 (418-for-1927) and 3.90 runs per games at night (230 runs)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's have a run differential of -78, which is second worst in the American League to Toronto (-88)...each of the A's four games on the road trip and seven of their last nine have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 32-28 (.533) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 12-27 (.308) in games decided by four runs or more...the mark in games decided by four runs or more is the worst in the majors (SD, 13-28/.317).

**A'S IN JULY:** The A's are 9-10 in the month of July...went 12-16 in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...have a 3.77 ERA (71 er in 169.2 ip) this month after the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have issued 47 walks, which is second fewest in the American League (LAA, 44)...are batting .220 (134-for-608), which is the lowest in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in walks (78) and rank third in stolen bases (15)...the steals are the A's most in one month since April of 2016 when they also had 15.

**THIS AND THAT:** Home runs have accounted for 208 of the A's 426 runs this year (48.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...the A's have used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last 11 games...are 9-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 18-11...are averaging 3 hours, 7 minutes and 46 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher 23 times, which is third fewest in the American League (BOS and TEX, 22).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), but six of those players are currently on rehab assignments (all but Smolinski and Triggs)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day dating back to May 24 and at least five players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 20 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Bassitt, Smolinski and Triggs).

**A's vs. BLUE JAYS:** The season series is even at two games each...the A's lost the first game in Toronto last night after winning two of three in Oakland, June 5-7...have now lost nine of the last 10 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 games in the Coliseum...have lost the season series just once over the previous six seasons (1-5 in 2015) but are 24-25 against the Blue Jays over that span...are 217-192 all-time, including 109-97 in Oakland, 108-93 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-61 (.523) in Rogers Centre, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Boston, 127-101, .557).

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is the first A's rookie to homer in three straight games since Josh Donaldson (Aug. 29-31, 2012)...the Oakland record for consecutive games with a home run by a rookie is four by Dan Johnson (Aug. 3-6, 2005)...**Khris Davis** ranks third in the American League with 28 home runs...leads the majors in home runs off right-handed pitchers (26) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (14) and home runs on the first pitch (9)...**Rajai Davis** leads the AL with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which ties Jose Canseco for seventh place on the Oakland career stolen base list.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in **1936** Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM

12-15, 4.80 ERA (171 er in 320.2 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-35 (57.1%)

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in six of the last 12 games (9 er in 32.0 ip, 2.53 ERA) after allowing at least one run in each of the previous 12 contests...that tied the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever.
- The pen now has a 4.80 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.04).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (117), is tied for first in most stolen bases allowed (36), tied for third in fewest wins (12) and fourth in fewest walks (114).

## 61 RHP JOHN AXFORD

**Last Outing:** 7/24 at Toronto (ND, 0.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 6/1  
**First Hitters:** 5-17, 5 bb

- Last night was first appearance this season in which he did not record an out.
- Walked four batters on July 3, which is a new career high...had walked three batters in a game eight times in his career prior to that game.
- Has allowed a .250 (13-for-52) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .400 (14-for-35) against left-handers.
- Has faced the Blue Jays three times this season (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 4.50 ERA).
- Was on the 10-day disabled list from April 2 to May 20 with a strained right shoulder.

*Last Year: Went 6-4 with three saves and a 3.97 ERA in 68 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...had a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 games and a 2.19 ERA over his final 24 but logged a 9.42 ERA in 18 games in between.*

## 46 RHP SANTIAGO CASILLA

**Saves/Opportunities:** 16-21  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 2/1  
**First Hitters:** 8-36, 2 bb

- Made his 600th career appearance on July 8 at Seattle to become one of 11 active pitchers with 600 games pitched.
- Has six saves and three blown saves over his last 15 games and has allowed at least one run in six of those contests (6 er in 14.1 ip, 3.77 ERA).
- Is third among American League relievers in lowest save percentage (76.2%), tied for third in stolen bases allowed (8), tied for third in blown saves (5) and tied for ninth in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-38 (.184) with runners in scoring position, including 3-for-19 (.158) with RISP and two outs.
- Has a 4.80 ERA (8 er in 15.0 ip) and has surrendered all three of his home runs in 16 games on the road...has a 3.48 ERA (8 er in 20.2 ip) in 21 games in Oakland.
- Has faced the Blue Jays twice this season (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so, 0.00 ERA).

*Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.*

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville on July 16 and made his 2017 debut.
- Has allowed homer in back-to-back relief appearances (2 er in 1.2 ip).
- Was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring after signing a minor league deal Dec. 9, 2016.
- Made his Major League debut with Chicago (AL) in 2013 and also pitched for Colorado in 2015...is 2-2 with a 5.31 ERA in 17 career relief appearances.
- Has never faced the Blue Jays.
- Did not allow an earned run over his final 10 games with Nashville and walked just one batter in 11.0 innings over that span...allowed a .176 opponents batting average, including .167 against right-handers...his complete 2017 minor league stats:

- Has tossed fewer than one inning in 23 of his 42 games.
- Faced the Blue Jays once earlier this season (0.2 ip, 1 bb, 2 so, 0.00 ERA).

- Is 23-for-119 (.193) with 20 walks over his last 36 games...is batting .203 (13-for-64) in the month of July, which is his lowest batting average of any month this season.
- Has not homered in nine straight games, but has 21 home runs for the season...that is tied for ninth in the American League and is an on-going career high...combined for 19 home runs in 343 games over his previous three seasons.
- Has hit all 21 of his home runs as a first baseman, which matches the most home runs by an A's first baseman over the last 16 years (Moss, 2013)...the last with more than 21 is Jason Giambi, who hit 32 of his 38 home runs in 2001 as a first baseman.
- Has hit 14 of his 21 home runs at the Coliseum and ranks third in the AL in home runs at home.
- Ranks 10th in the AL in slugging (.535) and eighth in OPS (.898).
- Is 23-for-34 (.676) with five doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the batting average is the best in the majors and his 1.176 slugging percentage ranks fourth.
- Is 5-for-38 (.132) with runners in scoring position over his last 52 games after going 13-for-28 (.464) over his first 35 contests.
- Went 2-for-2 with a stolen base in the All-Star Game at Miami...was the leading vote getter at first base on the player ballot...it was his first All-Star Game.

**Last Year:** Batted .253 with 34 doubles, seven home runs and 56 RBI in 156 games in his first season with Oakland...had career highs in games and runs scored (52)...ranked second among AL first baseman with a .997 fielding percentage.

## 38 JAYCOB BRUGMAN

- Is 12-for-32 (.375) over his last 11 games after going 7-for-45 (.156) over his previous 15 contests.
- Is hitting .271 (26-for-96) against right-handed pitchers, .143 (2-for-14) against left-handers.
- Is batting .196 (10-for-51) at night, .305 (18-for-59) during the day.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville June 9 and has started 32 of the A's 38 games since then (29 in center field, three in left field)...hit .288 with a home run and eight RBI in 33 games with the Sounds.

**Last Year:** Began the season at Double-A Midland and was moved up to Triple-A Nashville May 21...combined for a .285 batting average, 12 home runs and 87 RBI in 132 games overall...ranked second in the A's farm system in hits (155).

## 26 MATT CHAPMAN

**Current Streak:** 3 games (4 for 9)  
**Toronto Series:** 1-3, r, hr, rbi, so  
**Road Trip:** 4-14, 3 r, 2b, 3 hr, 4 rbi, 3 so, sf

- 11 of his 15 hits this season have gone for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, five homers).
- With a homer on Monday, he has homered in three straight games, joining Ryon Healy (5/4-7) as the only other A's player to do so this season.
- Is batting .302 (13-for-43) with nobody on, and .071 (2-for-28) with runners on base...all five of his homers this season are solo roundtrippers.
- Is 10-for-33 (.303) with eight runs, three doubles, a triple, five home runs and six RBI in 10 games since the All-Star Break after going 2-for-24 (.083) with 13 strikeouts over his previous seven games after being reinstated from the DL July 3.
- Made an error in back-to-back games Friday and Saturday, and has recorded one error in three of the last six games after not committing an error in his first 15 games.
- Has started each of the A's 21 games at third base while on the active roster since he was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 15...was on the 10-day disabled list from June 19 to July 2 with left knee cellulitis
- Hit his first Major League home run off Kluber in the third inning July 15 and added his second in the eighth...the two-homer game came in the 13th game of his career...the only player in Oakland history with a two homer game that early in his career is Mitchell Page, who did it in his sixth game on April 13, 1977.
- Was tied for third in the Pacific Coast League in home runs (16) and ranked fifth in slugging (.589) at the time of his June 15 promotion...the home runs were tied for fifth in all of the minor leagues...appeared in 49 games, all at third base...his complete 2017 minor league stats:
