OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-56) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (46-54)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 26, 2017 — ROGERS CENTRE — 7:07 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, four of the last five and six of the last eight games to fall 12 games under .500 at 44-56 (.440)...that is one short of the season low of 13 games under (35-48 on July 3)...have the second worst record in the American League...with the loss last night, Oakland now trails first place Houston by a season-high 23 games in the AL West...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 23 or more games before the end of July (1979) and just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 61 days in fifth place this year...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 17-18 since then.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin recorded his 999th career win Sunday at New York (NL) and needs one more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...there are eight active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1828; Baker, 1825; Scioscia, 1539; Showalter, 1477; Francona, 1434; Hurdle, 1093; Yost, 1058; Maddon, 1033).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors last night and all four Blue Jays runs were unearned...now have a Major League leading 86 errors for the season, which have led to a ML leading 60 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 80) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (13).

OFFENSE: The A's have tallied eight hits in the first two games of this series after collecting at least nine hits in each of the previous four games...are now hitting .210 (147-for-700) over the last 22 games and .236 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (943) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.310) but have the third most extra base hits (324)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.200), two hitters (.191) and outfielders (.225)...are hitting .229 with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the majors to Toronto (.220)...have the third lowest mark in the majors with the bases loaded (.205).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.01 ERA (32 er in 95.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the second lowest post-break ERA in the American League (NYY, 2.76)...for the season, are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (54) and rank second in hit batters (40).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-8 despite a 3.31 ERA (48 er in 130.2 ip) over the last 21 games...are 32-41 with a 4.48 ERA (277 er in 557.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (72)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 140 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 229 and ATL, 191)...it is also third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this seven-game road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-2) and have now lost five of their last six road games...are 16-33 (.327) on the road compared to 28-23 (.549) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...return home following the game tomorrow for a five-game homestand against Minnesota (three games) and San Francisco (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2)...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-12-1 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have compiled a 20-20 (.500) record during day games compared to 24-36 (.400) at night...are batting .264 (361-for-1369) and are averaging 4.90 runs per game during the day (196 runs), .217 (424-for-1958) and 3.85 runs per games at night (231 runs)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have a run differential of -81, which is second worst in the American League to Toronto (-85)...are 32-29 (.525) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 12-27 (.308) in games decided by four runs or more...the mark in games decided by four runs or more is the worst in the majors (SD, 13-28/.317).

A'S IN JULY: Oakland is 9-11 in the month of July...went 12-16 in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...have a 3.60 ERA (71 er in 177.2 ip) this month, which is third lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have issued 51 walks, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...are batting .219 (140-for-639), which is the lowest in the majors...rank third in the AL in stolen bases (15) and are tied for third in walks (80)...the steals are the A's most in one month since April of 2016 when they also had 15.

THIS AND THAT: Home runs have accounted for 208 of the A's 427 runs this year (48.7%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...the A's have used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last 12 games...are 10-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-11...are averaging 3 hours, 7 minutes and 38 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher 23 times, which is third fewest in the American League (BOS and TEX, 22).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have seven players on the disabled list (Cotton, Dull, Graveman, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), but five of those players are currently on rehab assignments (all but Smolinski and Triggs)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day dating back to May 24 and at least five players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 20 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's trail in the season series as they are 2-3 against the Blue Jays...have lost the first two games in Toronto after winning two of three in Oakland...have now lost 10 of the last 11 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 games in the Coliseum...are batting .184 (28-for-152) with 17 runs scored in the five games this year (3.4 runs per game)...the pitching staff has a 2.86 ERA (14 er in 44.0 ip)...need to win each of the remaining two games to avoid losing the season series for the second time in the last three years (1-5 in 2015)...are 6-11 against Toronto over that span...are 217-193 all-time, including 109-97 in Oakland, 108-94 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-62 (.519) in Rogers Centre, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Boston, 127-101, .557).

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Khris Davis ranks third in the American League with 28 home runs... leads the majors in home runs off right-handed pitchers (26) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (14) and home runs on the first pitch (9)...*Rajai Davis* leads the AL with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which ties Jose Canseco for seventh place on the Oakland career stolen base list.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1977 Vida Blue tosses a complete game four hitter in the A's 2-1 win over California...it is the 100th complete game of his career as he becomes the first and only Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...in 1994 Stan Javier ties an Oakland record by collecting three doubles in the A's 6-0 win at California...Steve Ontiveros, Bob Welch and Bill Taylor combine on the three-hit shutout.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-1, 2.88 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...allowed four runs in his last start after allowing just five runs (four earned) over his first three starts (1.83 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 1-for-16 (.063) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-7 with RISP and two outs...has held left-handed hitters to a .192 (10-for-52) batting average but has issued five of his seven walks to lefties...has not allowed a run in the first or second inning...has walked one batter in three of his four starts...allowed one run and walked one batter in each of his first two starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 4-3 A's loss to Atlanta July 1 in Oakland...became the 51st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and it came in the second inning...Flowers reached base on a Barreto error and scored two batters later on a Santana RBI double...retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh inning with the scored tied 1-1.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle on July 6...tossed 7.2 innings, which are the most by an A's pitcher in one of his first two games since Brad Rigby tossed 8.0 innings in his first start on June 28, 1997 against Texas...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a hit in each of the first four innings...did not allow a run as he was aided by three double plays and a pickoff...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win over Cleveland July 15 in Oakland...blanked the Indians on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fourth...the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth but he allowed another run to score on a ground out in the sixth...was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 3-2.

LAST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 7-5 loss at New York (NL) last Friday...retired each of the first eight batters he faced and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a single to the pitcher (Matz) followed by a home run by Conforto...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed two of the Mets three runs in the sixth inning...left with runners on first and second and one out but the bullpen allowed both of those runners to score.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the Pacific Coast League Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

2016 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization and was 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 18 starts when he was traded to the Seattle Mariners organization July 20...was assigned to Double-A Jackson and went 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA in eight games (seven starts) with the Generals...combined for a 9-5 record and a 3.28 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) overall...surrendered just eight home runs in 143.0 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...ranked fourth in the Southern League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.12), tied for fourth in games started, sixth in ERA and innings pitched and tied for eighth in wins...tied for the lead among SL pitchers with 40 total chances...was named to the SL Mid-season All-Star Game after going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...went 5-3 with a 4.18 ERA in 13 games (12 starts) after the break...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (69-for-274) against right-handed pitchers compared to .259 (69-for-266) against left-handers...opponents hit .217 with runners in scoring position...combined for a 3-2 record and a 4.50 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks...was 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA in 12 starts on the road...went 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts as a hitter with Jackson.

CAREER: Was originally selected by the Cubs as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2012 draft but was traded twice in 2016...was sent to the Mariners prior to the trading deadline in the Mike Montgomery deal and was traded to the A's following the season for Danny Valencia...is 34-23 with a 3.21 ERA (177 er in 496.0 ip) in 105 games (99 starts) in six professional seasons...has never posted an ERA above 3.48...has surrendered just 28 home runs in 496.0 innings (0.51 per nine innings)...was named to Midseason All-Star Teams in the Southern League in 2016 and the Midwest League in 2014.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-5, 3.82 ERA): Is 7-2 with a 3.17 ERA over his last 12 starts dating back to May 20...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts...has walked 21 batters in 76.2 innings over his last 12 starts (2.47 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts...ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.373), eighth in opponents batting average (.237) and ninth in opponents OPS (.685)...is 4-0 with a 3.19 ERA in five starts against AL East teams compared to 4-5 with a 4.08 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss at New York (NL) last Saturday (5.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (11.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, one start, against Toronto...including a win in one start this year, a 5-3 A's win in Oakland on June 5 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 7 so).

- The pen now has a 4.77 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.02).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (117), is tied for first in most stolen bases allowed (36), tied for second in fewest wins (12) and fourth in fewest walks (116).
