OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-58) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (49-51)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a four-game series at Toronto, marking the second time they have been swept in a four-game series this year (June 19-22 vs. Houston)...it marks the first time the A's have been swept in a four-game series twice in one season since 1997 when it happened three times...have now lost eight of the last 10 games to fall a season-high 14 games under .500 at 44-58 (.431)...that is the second worst record in the American League and the worst mark by an A's team after 102 games since the 2009 club was also 44-58 (lost game 103)...are a season-high 23½ games behind first place Houston in the AL West...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 23½ or more games before the end of July (1979) and just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 63 days in fifth place this year.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin recorded his 999th career win last Sunday at New York (NL) and needs one more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...there are eight active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1829; Baker, 1827; Scioscia, 1539; Showalter, 1477; Francona, 1436; Hurdle, 1093; Yost, 1059; Maddon, 1035).

LOSING MONTHS: The A's are 9-13 (.409) in the month of July with four games remaining...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the ninth consecutive month...that would set an Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record, breaking the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it would be the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...are tied for the third worst record in the American League in July.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 85 errors, which have led to a ML leading 60 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 80) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (14).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .160 (20-for-125) with nine runs scored in the four-game series at Toronto and now have a .207 (159-for-767) batting average over the last 24 games...are hitting a Major League low .235 for the season (SD, .236)...the Oakland record for lowest batting average in a season is .236 in 1982...have the second most strikeouts (961) and second lowest on-base percentage (.310) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (433)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 2.95 ERA (27 er in 82.1 ip) since the All-Star Break...the ERA is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors behind the Nationals (2.50) and Cubs (2.51)...for the season, starters are tied for the second most losses in the AL (41) but have surrendered the third fewest home runs (74).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.41 ERA (43 er in 113.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the fourth lowest ERA since the break in the AL...for the season, are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (54) and tied for second in hit batters (40).

A's IN JULY: The A's are batting .215 (152-for-706) in July, which is the lowest batting average in the majors, but have walked 93 times, which is the most in the majors...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .222 in 2013 and the last AL team to hit under .218 in July is Toronto in 1997 (.212)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League this month (200) and the franchise record for strikeouts in July is 225 set in 2012...have already set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...rank second in the AL in fewest doubles (26) and lowest slugging percentage (.373), third in fewest extra base hits (55) and tied for third in most stolen bases (15)...the pitching staff ranks fourth in the AL with a 3.78 ERA (82 er in 195.1 ip)...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...are tied for the fewest saves in the AL this month (2) and have the third fewest walks (59) and strikeouts (157)...the Oakland record for fewest saves in July is 3 (four times, last: 2008).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a five-game homestand against Minnesota (three games) and San Francisco (two games) tonight...it starts

a stretch of 19 consecutive games in California (14 of 19 in Oakland)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won six of their last eight home games...are 28-23 (.549) at home compared to 16-35 (.314) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36/.308)...the home winning percentage is .235 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the first two games of this series...have faced lefties in three of the previous nine games but just 23 times for the season, which is third fewest in the American League (BOS and TEX, 22).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost back-to-back games when leading after eight innings and have five such losses for the season, which is tied with Texas for the most in the American League...have back-to-back walk-off losses for the first time since Aug. 14-15, 2015 and have six walk-off losses for the season, which is third most in the AL...fell to 3-5 in extra inning games with the loss yesterday and the five losses are tied for second most in the AL...are 11-15 (.423) in one-run games and the 15 losses are tied for second most in the AL...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (LAD, 8)...the walk-off wins match the A's season total from last year and the five walk-off home runs are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored first in six of the seven games on the last road trip but lost five of those six games...now have 29 losses in games in which they led at some point, which is second most in the American League (TB, 32)...have a run differential of -86, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...home runs have accounted for 210 of the A's 433 runs this year (48.5%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 11-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-11.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have seven players on the disabled list (Cotton, Graveman, Phegley, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), but four of those players are currently on rehab assignments (all but Phegley, Smolinski and Triggs)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day dating back to May 24 and at least five players on the DL all year...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 21 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. TWINS: The A's trail in the season series as they lost two of three at Minnesota May 2-4...have lost four of the last five games at Target Field but have won five straight and 14 of the last 16 at the Coliseum...have won four of the previous five season series are 25-14 (.641) against Minnesota dating back to the start of the 2012 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-299 against Minnesota...that includes 166-128 in Oakland and 132-171 in Minnesota...are 15-16 at Target Field...are 355-368 all-time against the Twins and have a 1002-1004 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only franchise the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is tied for third in the American League in home runs (28) and ranks fourth in RBI (69)...the home runs are the second best mark of his career and the RBI are tied for second best...had 42 home runs and 102 RBI last year...**Rajai Davis** leads the AL with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which is tied with Jose Canseco for seventh on the Oakland career stolen base list.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1989**, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle...in **2002** Miguel Tejada has six RBI, David Justice hits his 300th career home run and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2...in **2009** Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston...it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (2-5, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and his career...is 2-5 over his first eight starts and is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history with five or more losses over his first eight career games...only Mike Morgan, with eight, has more.

THE LONG BALL: Has surrendered at least one home run in seven of his first eight starts and has allowed 11 home runs in 43.1 innings (2.28 per nine innings)...the home runs are tied for third most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first eight career games...only Dillon Overton and Raul Alcantara, with 12 each, have more...the most by a pitcher over his first nine games is 13 by Dan Straily...nine of the home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters twice this year, one batter four times and no batters twice...has eight walks in 43.1 innings (1.66 walks per nine innings)...is the only A's pitcher since at least 1913 with two walks or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more in each of their first eight career games...issued one free pass or fewer in each of his first five starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning...has a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) and .143 (8-for-56) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 7.57 ERA (23 er in 27.1 ip) and .339 (42-for-124) opponents average after that.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .130 (9-for-69) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .369 (41-for-111) after that...opponents are 18-for-45 (.400) with three walks when leading off an inning.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami **June 14**...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on **June 19** in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first four innings but the A's were also held scoreless on two hits...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fifth inning and those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...left trailing 2-1...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on **June 24**...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead before Sanchez reached on a Barreto error and scored on a Cabrera RBI single...allowed another unearned run in the fourth inning on an Anderson sacrifice fly and was relieved by Coulombe to start the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **June 29**...retired each of the first 10 batters before Reddick doubled with one out in the fourth and scored on a Correa two-run home run...also allowed a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on **July 4**...retired eight of the first nine batters he faced before Engel singled with two outs in the third inning and scored on a two-run home run by Cabrera...the A's scored two in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Abreu in the fifth...was relieved by Coulombe after allowing a leadoff single to Davidson in the sixth and left with a 6-5 lead...Casilla allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle in the final game before the All-Star Break on **July 9**...retired six of the first seven batters before allowing Dyson to score on a Segura grounded into double play in the third...also allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the fourth...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay **July 17** in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Souza in the second and another run in the third when Smith scored on a fielders choice...the A's scored once in the fourth to make the score 2-1 but he allowed a solo home run to Longoria in the fifth and left after seven innings trailing 3-1.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at New York (NL) last Sunday...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Conforto in the third inning...the A's added a run in the fourth to re-take the lead but he allowed the tying run to score in the sixth inning on a Reyes RBI ground out...Oakland then scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25-for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 against right-handed hitters and .224 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Smith (0-1, 3.32 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and start of the season...it is also the fourth start of his career but it will be his 67th appearance...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss at Toronto on Monday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has not allowed a run in two career appearances against Minnesota (3.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 2 so)...both outings came in relief in 2009 at Milwaukee...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts, with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games.
