OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-59) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (50-51)

SATURDAY, JULY 29, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last five games, which matches the A's second longest losing streak of the season (6, June 28-July 3)... have now lost nine of the last 11 games to fall a season-high 15 games under .500 at 44-59 (.427)...that is the second worst record in the American League and it matches the fifth worst record after 103 games in Oakland history...it matches the worst over the last 20 years...the 2009 club was also 44-59 (lost game 104)...are a season-high 24½ games behind first place Houston in the AL West...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 24½ or more games before the end of July (1979) and just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 64 days in fifth place this year.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin recorded his 999th career win last Sunday at New York (NL) and needs one more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...there are eight active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1829; Baker, 1827; Scioscia, 1540; Showalter, 1477; Francona, 1437; Hurdle, 1093; Yost, 1060; Mad-don, 1035).

LOSING MONTHS: The A's are 9-14 (.391) in the month of July and have clinched a losing record for the ninth consecutive month...that sets an Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record, breaking the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...are tied with Baltimore for the second worst record in the American League in July (CWS, 4-17).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 87 errors, which have led to a ML leading 61 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 82) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...outfielders have four assists in the last eight games but just 15 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League (14).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .209 (167-for-800) over the last 25 games and are batting a Major League low .235 for the season (SD, .236)...the Oakland record for lowest batting average in a season is .236 in 1982...have the second most strikeouts (971) and second lowest on-base percentage (.310) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (436).

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 3.24 ERA (31 er in 86.0 ip) since the All-Star Break...the ERA is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...for the season, starters are tied for the second most losses in the AL (42) but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (74)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.53 ERA (48 er in 122.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the fourth lowest ERA since the break in the AL...for the season, lead the AL in wild pitches (56) and are tied for second in hit batters (40).

A's IN JULY: The A's are batting .217 (160-for-739) in July, which is the lowest batting average in the majors, but have walked 97 times, which is the most in the majors...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .222 in 2013 and the last AL team to hit under .218 in July is Toronto in 1997 (.212)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League this month (210) and the franchise record for strikeouts in July is 225 set in 2012...have already set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...the pitching staff ranks fourth in the AL with a 3.83 ERA (87 er in 204.1 ip)...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...are tied for the fewest saves in the AL this month and the Oakland record for fewest saves in July is 3 (four times, last: 2008).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this five-game homestand against Minnesota (0-1) and San Francisco (two games)...this homestand starts a stretch of 19 consecutive games in California (14 of 19 in Oakland)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won six of the last nine home games...are 28-24 (.538) at home

compared to 16-35 (.314) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36/.308)...the home winning percentage is .224 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher today for the second consecutive game and fifth time in the last 11 games...entering today, have faced 24 left-handers for the season, which is third fewest in the American League (TEX, 22; BOS, 23).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied for the American League lead in walk-off wins (7) but rank third in walk-off losses (6)...the seven walk-off wins match the A's season total from last year...have five walk-off home runs, which are one short of the Oakland record of six (2004 and 2012)...are 3-5 (.375) in extra inning games and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...are 11-15 (.423) in one-run games and the 15 losses are tied for third most in the AL...have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Texas for the most in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have an 11-6 record on Saturday, which is the best record in the American League and third best in the majors (LAD, 13-3; PIT, 11-5)...it is the only day of the week that the A's have a winning record...have scored first in six of the last eight games but have lost five of those six games...now have 29 losses in games in which they led at some point, which is second most in the AL (TB, 32)...have a run differential of -89, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...are 11-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-11.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have seven players on the disabled list (Cotton, Graveman, Phegley, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), but four of those players are currently on rehab assignments (all but Phegley, Smolinski and Triggs)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day dating back to May 24 and at least five players on the DL all year...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 21 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. TWINS: The A's are 1-3 against the Twins and with one more loss, will lose the season series for just the second time in the last seven years (3-4 in 2015)...lost the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three at Minnesota May 2-4...have lost four of the last five games at Target Field but have won five of the last six and 14 of the last 17 at the Coliseum...have won four of the previous five season series are 25-15 (.625) against Minnesota dating back to the start of the 2012 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-300 against Minnesota...that includes 166-129 in Oakland and 132-171 in Minnesota...are 15-16 at Target Field...are 355-369 all-time against the Twins and have a 1002-1005 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only franchise the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Khris Davis ranks fourth in the American League in home runs (28) and RBI (70)...*Rajai Davis* leads the AL with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which is tied with Jose Canseco for seventh on the Oakland career stolen base list.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1969 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to hit 40 home runs when he hits a solo shot in the first inning of the A's 6-5 win against the New York Yankees...a young rookie named Vida Blue recorded his first major league win in that game...in 1989 Rickey Henderson steals five bases but the A's lose 14-6 to Seattle...in 1992 Dennis Eckersley saves his 33rd consecutive game to set what was then a Major League record with 36 consecutive saves dating back to 1991...he would save 36 straight to start the season for a total of 40 consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-1, 3.32 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and start of the season...it is also the fourth start of his career but it will be his 67th appearance...his only career win came in his second career outing over nine years ago on June 24, 2008 with Boston against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

AGE AT FIRST START: His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle July 8...matched his career high by allowing six hits...the A's scored single runs in the second and third innings but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Segura RBI double and a Gamel RBI single...Oakland scored a run in the top of the fifth but he allowed a leadoff home run to Dyson in the bottom of the fifth...left after six innings with the scored tied 3-3.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs (one earned)...the A's scored two runs in the first inning but he allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second and a Souza lead off home run in the third...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and left with a 3-2 lead...Casilla allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto last Monday...allowed a career-high tying six hits...Oakland scored a run in the first inning but he gave that run back in the bottom of the first on a solo home run by Martin...allowed two more runs in the fourth inning on RBI singles by Carrera and Goins...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-2.

SMITH vs. MINNESOTA: Has not allowed a run in two career appearances (3.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 2 so)...both appearances came in relief in 2009 at Milwaukee...pitched the final inning of the Brewers 7-3 loss on June 23 (1 h, 1 bb)...tossed the final two innings of a 6-4 loss on June 25 (1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games...his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers...issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...the Sounds were 6-6 in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA in five games, including four starts, in April...struck out a season-high eight batters and allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.2 innings at Round Rock May 4 but yielded just two runs and was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 5-4 victory...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...tossed the final two innings of the Sounds 13-3 win (2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so)...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha (2.0 ip, 2 so)...moved back into the starting rotation May 28 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day against Colorado Springs...also allowed two home runs, his only game with more than one home run...finished May 1-1

with a 5.68 ERA in five games, including three starts...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts on the 2nd...then combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts...pitched on June 19 against New Orleans to completed the suspended game of April 30...tossed all six innings on the 19th but allowed one run in the sixth inning in a 1-0 loss...walked a season-high four batters June 27 against Round Rock...finished June with a 2-0 record and a 2.42 ERA in four starts.

2016 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7...had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland...it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)...allowed a .151 (8-for-53) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .188 (6-for-32) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his extra base hits (three doubles, two home runs) to righties for a .321 slugging percentage...both of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .176 average with runners in scoring position, .103 with two outs and .058 with two strikes...now has a .200 (19-for-95) career average with RISP...first batters faced were 0-for-8 but he walked four and surrendered a sacrifice fly for a .308 on-base percentage...allowed 6-of-8 (75.0%) inherited runners to score and has allowed 14-of-32 (43.8%) to score in his career...did not yield a run in four outings on two days rest or fewer (7.0 ip)...compiled a 4.08 ERA in nine appearances on three days rest or more...surrendered six of his nine runs in the seventh inning for a 14.73 ERA...combined for a 0.69 ERA in the eighth and ninth innings...tossed at least one inning in each of his 13 appearances, including two or more six times.

2016 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 22 starts with Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average, sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA...tied for third in the A's farm system in strikeouts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (130.2)...issued a minor league career-high 45 walks...led the Sounds in starts, innings pitched, strikeouts, runs (64) and walks...his opponents batting average included a .223 (49-for-220) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .252 (71-for-282) against right-handers...issued 33 of his 45 walks to lefties...allowed a .226 average with runners in scoring position, including .182 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 1-for-8 (.125) with the bases loaded...compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first and second inning...had a 4.88 ERA from the third inning on.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Returned to the majors for the first time since 2010 with the A's last year...has made 66 career appearances with Boston (2008), Milwaukee (2009-10) and Oakland (2016-17)...saw his most action with the Brewers in 2009, compiling a 4.11 ERA in 35 relief appearances...was released by the Mariners organization May 19, 2011 and did not pitch professionally again until signing with the Wichita Wingnuts of the independent American Association in 2013...signed a minor league deal with San Diego June 27, 2014...is 58-58 with a 3.86 ERA (467 er in 1089.0 ip) in 316 career minor league appearances, including 164 starts, in a professional career that began with the Red Sox organization in 2002.

RHP Sonny Gray (6-5, 3.43 ERA):	Is 4-2 with a 1.37 ERA and .164 opponents batting average over his last six starts...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts this year and was 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents batting average in five starts in between from May 30 to June 20...is 5-2 with a 3.08 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 4.04 ERA in six starts on the road...ranks eighth in the American League in home ERA...is 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in seven starts during the day, 2-5 with a 4.25 ERA in nine starts at night...ranks fourth in the AL in day ERA...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss at Toronto last Tuesday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 9 so)...is 2-3 with a 5.14 ERA (28.0 ip, 27 h, 16 r, 16 er, 14 bb, 23 so, 6 hr) in five career starts against Minnesota...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 9-1 A's loss in Minnesota on May 2 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

- Made his 600th career appearance on July 8 at Seattle to become one of 11 active pitchers with 600 games pitched.
- Has six saves and four blown saves over his last 16 games and has allowed at least one run in seven of those contests (9 er in 14.1 ip, 5.65 ERA).
- Is third among American League relievers in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for third in stolen bases allowed (8), tied for first in blown saves (6) and tied for ninth in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-38 (.184) with runners in scoring position, including 3-for-19 (.158) with RISP and two outs.
- Has a 6.60 ERA (11 er in 15.0 ip) and has surrendered all five of his home runs in 17 games on the road...has a 3.32 ERA (8 er in 21.2 ip) in 22 games in Oakland.
