# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-59) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (50-52)

SUNDAY, JULY 30, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP JHAREL COTTON (5-8, 5.17) VS. RHP BARTOLO COLÓN (0-1, 7.00) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped their five-game losing streak last night but have lost nine of the last 12 games...are 45-59 (.433) and the 14 games under .500 are one short of the season high of 15 (44-59 on July 28)... have the second worst record in the American League and are tied for the seventh worst record in Oakland history after 104 games (were also 45-59 in 2015)...are 23½ games behind first place Houston in the AL West, which is one short of the season high of 24½ (July 28)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 23½ or more games before the end of July (1979) and just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 65 days in fifth place this year.

**1,000 WINS:** Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win last night to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...he is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1829; Baker, 1827; Scioscia, 1541; Showalter, 1478; Francona, 1438; Hurdle, 1093; Yost, 1060; Maddon, 1036)...Tony La Russa also won his 1000th game on a walk-off (Canseco single on July 14, 1991) and Art Howe won his 900th on a Greg Myers walk-off home run (April 21, 2002).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Rajai Davis hit the A's sixth walk-off home run of the season last night, which ties the Oakland record set in 2004 and matched in 2012...it was the A's eighth walk-off win of the season, which ties Los Angeles (NL) for the most in the majors and is one more than the A's season total from last year...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off losses (6)...won for the sixth time this year last night when trailing after seven innings and the fourth time when trailing after eight innings, both of which are tied for third most in the AL...have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Texas for the most in the AL...are 12-15 (.444) in one-run games and the losses are tied for fourth most in the AL...are 3-5 (.375) in extra inning games and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...

**LOSING MONTHS:** The A's are 10-14 (.417) in the month of July and have clinched a losing record for the ninth consecutive month...that sets an Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record, breaking the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since go-ing 13-12 in April of 2016...are tied with Baltimore and Minnesota for the second worst record in the American League in July (CWS, 4-18).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 87 errors, which have led to a ML leading 61 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 82) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...outfielders have four assists in the last nine games but just 15 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .214 (178-for-833) over the last 26 games and are batting a Major League low .236 for the season...the Oakland record for lowest batting average in a season is .236 in 1982...have the second most strikeouts (975) and second lowest on-base percentage (.311) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (441).

**PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 3.46 ERA (35 er in 91.0 ip) since the All-Star Break...the ERA is second lowest in the American League (NYY, 3.39)...for the season, starters are tied for the second most losses in the AL (42) but are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (75)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.56 ERA (52 er in 131.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the fourth lowest ERA since the break in the AL...for the season, lead the AL lead in wild pitches (57) and rank third in hit batters (40).

**A's IN JULY:** The A's are batting .222 (171-for-772) in July, which is the lowest batting average in the majors, but have walked 101 times, which is second most in the majors (CLE, 102)...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .222 in 2013...have the second most strikeouts in the American League this month (214) and the franchise record for strikeouts in July is 225 set in 2012...have already set franchise records for strikeouts

in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...rank third in the AL in lowest slugging percentage (.382) and fewest doubles (33) and fourth in fewest extra base hits (64)...the pitching staff has two saves, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (ARI, CWS)... the Oakland record for fewest saves in July is 3 (four times, last: 2008)...has a 3.84 ERA (91 er in 213.1 ip) after the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against Minnesota (1-1) and San Francisco (two games)...this homestand starts a stretch of 19 consecutive games in California (14 of 19 in Oakland)... went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won seven of the last 10 home games...are 29-24 (.547) at home compared to 16-35 (.314) on the road...are tied with Cincinnati for the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36/.308)...the home winning percentage is .233 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...are 9-5-2 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have compiled a 20-21 (.488) record during day games compared to 25-38 (.397) at night...are batting .263 (370-for-1406) and are averaging 4.88 runs per game during the day (200 runs), .217 (446-for-2054) and 3.83 runs per games at night (241 runs)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors while the day batting average is seventh best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have scored first in seven of the last nine games but have lost five of those seven games...now have 29 losses in games in which they led at some point, which is second most in the AL (TB, 33)... have a run differential of -88, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-12...home runs have accounted for 213 of the A's 441 runs this year (48.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** After reinstating Cotton from the disabled list today, the A's now have six players on the DL (Graveman, Phegley, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...it is the first time they've had fewer than seven players on the DL since May 23 when they had a season-low five...Graveman, Pinder and Wahl are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 21 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. TWINS:** The A's are 2-3 entering the final meeting today...have lost the season series just once over the last seven years (3-4 in 2015) and are 30-19 (.612) against the Twins over that span...are 1-1 in Oakland this year and 1-2 in Minnesota...have won six of the last seven games and 15 of the last 18 at the Coliseum but have lost four of the last five at Target Field...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 299-300 against Minnesota...that includes 167-129 in Oakland and 132-171 in Minnesota...are 15-16 at Target Field...are 356-369 all-time against the Twins and have a 1003-1005 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only franchise the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Khris Davis* ranks fourth in the American League in home runs (28) and tied for fourth RBI (70)...*Rajai Davis* is tied for the AL lead with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which is tied with Jose Canseco for seventh on the Oakland career stolen base list.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in **2000** Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (5-8, 5.17 ERA)

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today...was placed on the DL July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville and was a combined 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (9.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) and .188 (6-for-32) opponents batting average...originally developed a blister during his start on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and missed a turn in the rotation before making his next start July 3, also against the White Sox.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA (20 er in 38.2 ip) and .239 (34-for-142) opponents batting average in seven starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for second among American League rookies in wins (5) and ranks third in strikeouts (67), innings pitched (76.2) and games started (14)...is tied for the lead among all AL pitchers in balks (2) and is tied for fifth in unearned runs (8)...opponents have been caught stealing five times with him on the mound, which is tied for fifth most in the AL.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA (15 er in 42.2 ip) and .182 (27for-148) opponents batting average in seven starts during the day compared to 1-6 with a 7.68 ERA (29 er in 34.0 ip) and .343 (49-for-143) opponents batting average in seven starts at night...is tied for third in the American League in day wins...has the third highest night ERA in the AL among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at night...the one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-6 with a 6.12 ERA (34 er in 50.0 ip) in 10 career starts at night, 6-2 with a 2.73 ERA (17 er in 56.0 ip) in nine starts during the day.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-4 with a 7.11 ERA (30 er in 38.0 ip) and .291 (44for-151) opponents average in seven starts in Oakland compared to 3-4 with a 3.26 ERA (14 er in 38.2 ip) and .229 (32-for-140) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has the second highest home ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at home (Jimenez, BAL 8.42).

**THE SECOND AND THE FIFTH INNINGS:** Has allowed 15 runs in the second inning (14.0 ip, 9.64 ERA) and 12 in the fifth inning (10 er in 12.2 ip, 7.11 ERA)...has a 3.42 ERA (19 er in 50.0) in all other innings...has surrendered seven of his 13 home runs in the second inning, which is tied for the most in the majors...has a .356 (21-for-59) opponents batting average in the second inning, a .333 (18-for-54) mark in the fifth and a .208 (37-for-178) average in all other innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .324 (24-for-74) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...nine of the 13 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 12 of his 17 career home runs... eight of the home runs have come with two outs...has held the opponents number five hitter to a .184 (7-for-38) average.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed 12 home runs in his last nine starts (49.2 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 32 batters in 76.2 innings this year (3.76 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has received 10 runs of support in his eight losses (40.1 ip, 2.23 RSA) and 19 runs of support in his five wins (30.1 ip, 5.64 RSA).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5. yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...issued a career-high four walks April 17 against Texas...allowed a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings in a 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...also yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9.. that began a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts through June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27 ... walked a career-high tying four batters in consecutive starts on June 1 at Cleveland and June 7 against Toronto...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game win-ning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 3...allowed a RBI single to Anderson in the second inning but the A's came back to score twice in the bottom

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 10-4 win over Las Vegas last Tuesday in Nashville...blanked the 51s on two hits and a walk in 6.0 innings and struck out nine...allowed a single to Neil Walker in the first and walked Kevin Plawecki in the second but they were both erased on double plays...allowed a two-out double to Phillips Evans in the third and then retired each of the final 10 batters he faced.

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs... went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)... then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

**2016 RECAP:** Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts.

#### **TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER RHP Sonny Gray (6-5, 3.43 ERA):** Is 4-2 with a 1.37 ERA and .164 opponents batting average over his last six starts...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first five starts this year and was 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .319 opponents batting average in five starts in between from May 30 to June 20...is 5-2 with a 3.08 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 4.04 ERA in six starts on the road...ranks eighth in the American League in home ERA...is 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in seven starts during the day, 2-5 with a 4.25 ERA in nine starts at night... ranks fourth in the AL in day ERA...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss at Toronto last Tuesday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 9 so)... is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against San Francisco...is 4-6 with a 3.24 ERA in 15 career interleague appearances (14 starts).

#### 13-17, 4.83 ERA (180 er in 335.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-37 (54.1%)

- The A's bullpen has five blown saves in the last 11 games and has a 4.75 ERA (16 er in 30.1 ip) over that span...has issued 18 walks in 30.1 innings and surrendered six home runs.
- Now has 17 blown saves for the season, which is tied for fifth in the American League...the save percentage of 54.1% is fourth lowest.
- Has a 4.83 ERA, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.31).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (120), is second in most stolen bases allowed (36), is third in fewest wins (13) and is tied for fifth in fewest walks (127).

#### **46 RHP SANTIAGO CASILLA**

Last Outing: 7/29 vs. Minnesota (ND, 1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so) Saves/Opportunities: 16-22 Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/1 First Hitters: 8-37, 3 bb

- Made his 600th career appearance on July 8 at Seattle to become one of 11 active pitchers with 600 games pitched.
- Has six saves and four blown saves over his last 17 games and has allowed at least one run in seven of those contests (9 er in 15.1 ip, 5.28 ERA).
- Is third among American League relievers in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for fourth in stolen bases allowed (8), tied for second in blown saves (6) and tied for ninth in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-39 (.179) with runners in scoring position, including 3-for-20 (.150) with RISP and two outs.
