OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-59) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (40-66)

MONDAY, JULY 31, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (1-1, 2.25) VS. RHP MATT CAIN (3-9, 5.45) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have back-to-back walk-off wins after losing five straight...have lost nine of the last 13 games and are 46-59 (.438) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 22½ games...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 22½ or more games before the end of July (1979) and just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 66 days in fifth place this year.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won back-toback games on walk-off home runs for the second time this year...the other time was May 7-8, which was part of a three-game streak of walk-off wins...now have a Major League leading seven walk-off home runs for the season, which sets an Athletics franchise record (previous: 6, 2004 and 2012)...have nine walk-off wins overall, which ties Los Angeles (NL) for the most in the majors and is two more than the A's season total from last year...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off losses (6)... overcame a season-high five run deficit to win yesterday after coming back from three runs the day before...it's the first time the A's have overcome deficits of three or more runs in back-to-back games and win both game since June 6-7, 2013 at Chicago (AL)...have won back-to-back games when trailing after seven innings and have seven such wins for the season, which is tied for second most in the majors (KC, 8)...are tied for fifth in the majors with four wins when trailing after eight innings but have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied is tied for third most... improved to 4-5 in extra innings games and 13-15 in one-run games with the win yesterday... are tied for third in the AL in extra inning losses and tied for fourth in one-run losses.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-10 (.231) in interleague play, which is the worst mark in the majors (CWS, 4-11)...it is currently the worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13, .278 in 2009)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record against the National League for the second consecutive season and seventh time in 21 seasons...following these four games with the Giants, the A's will conclude interleague play at Philadelphia, Sept. 15-17...have a 6.25 ERA (81 er in 116.2 ip), which is the highest in the majors (BAL, 5.90)...it is currently the highest in Oakland history (5.77 in 1998)...are 201-176 (.533) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

LOSING MONTHS: The A's are 11-14 in the month of July and have clinched a losing record for the ninth consecutive month...that sets an Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record, breaking the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

A's IN JULY: The A's are 11-14 (.440) in July, which is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League this month...are batting .226 (185-for-819), which is the lowest batting average in the majors, but have walked 103 times, which is second most in the majors (CLE, 104)...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .222 in 2013...have 224 strikeouts, which is fourth most in the AL and one short of the Athletics record for strikeouts in the month of July (225 in 2012)...have already set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...rank third in the AL in lowest slugging percentage (.391) and fourth in fewest runs scored (100)...the pitching staff has two saves, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (ARI, CWS)...the Oakland record for fewest saves in July is 3 (four times, last: 2008)...rank fourth in the AL with a 3.83 ERA (96 er in 225.1 ip)...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 87 errors, which have led to a ML leading 61 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 79 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 82) and four more than the A's season total from last year (75)...outfielders have four assists in the last 10 games but just 15 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .261 (97-for-371) over the last 11 games but are batting .237 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (SD, .236)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts (985) and second lowest on-base percentage (.311) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (447)...have the third most extra base hits (342) and fourth most doubles (188).

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in two of the last three games (13 er in 12.1 ip, 9.49 ERA) but are 4-5 with a 3.80 ERA (40 er in 94.2 ip) since the All-Star Break...for the season, starters are tied for the second most losses in the American League (42) but have the third fewest home runs allowed (77)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.58 ERA (57 er in 143.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...for the season, lead the AL lead in wild pitches (58) and are tied for third in hit batters (40).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this five-game homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (two games)...this homestand starts a stretch of 19 consecutive games in California (14 of 19 in Oakland)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won eight of the last 11 home games...are 30-24 (.556) at home compared to 16-35 (.314) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36/.308)...the home winning percentage is .242 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...begin a five-game road trip to San Francisco (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) on Wednesday... went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...are 10-5-2 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

THIS AND THAT: Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win Saturday night to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...he is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins...the A's have scored first in seven of the last 10 games but have lost five of those seven games...now have 29 losses in games in which they led at some point, which is second most in the AL (TB, 33)...have a run differential of -87, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-12.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the DL (Fowler, Graveman, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl) after having at least seven players on the DL every day from May 24 to July 29...Graveman and Wahl are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl)...have had at least five players on the DL all year.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's won the season series last year 3-1...split two games in Oakland and swept a two-game series in San Francisco...have won 13 of the last 18 games in Oakland but have lost 16 of the last 21 in San Francisco...in the previous 20 years of interleague play, the A's have won seven season series, split nine and lost four...are 57-53 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 33-22 in Oakland and 24-31 in San Francisco...are 20-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has hit all 22 of his home runs as a first baseman, which are the most by an A's first baseman since Jason Giambi hit 32 of his 38 home runs in 2001 as a first baseman...Rajai Davis is tied for the AL lead with nine stolen bases in the month of July...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which is tied with Jose Canseco for seventh on the Oakland career stolen base list.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** Vida Blue tosses a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat Texas 2-0 in 1:52...Joe Rudi drives in both of the A's runs with sacrifice flies as the A's are also limited to two hits...in **1973** Ken Holtzman pitches all 11 innings of the A's 4-3 win over Minnesota...Ray Fosse drives in the winning run with a sacrifice fly.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-1, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...it will be his fifth start at night and his third start in interleague play...has allowed one run or fewer in three of his five starts and walked one batter three times.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (11.1 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two interleague starts compared to 1-0 with a 1.74 ERA in three starts against the American League.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed a hit with runners in scoring position in his first career start but opponents are 0 for their last 16 with RISP against him... they are 1-for-19 for the season, including 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs... left-handed hitters are 1-for-21 off him over his last two starts and they are batting .167 (10-for-60) for the season...however, has issued seven of his 10 walks to lefties...has not allowed a run in the first inning and has not allowed an earned run in the second inning...allowed one run and walked one batter in each of his first two starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 4-3 A's loss to Atlanta July 1 in Oakland...became the 51st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and it came in the second inning...Flowers reached base on a Barreto error and scored two batters later on a Santana RBI double...retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh inning with the scored tied 1-1.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle on July 6...tossed 7.2 innings, which are the most by an A's pitcher in one of his first two games since Brad Rigby tossed 8.0 innings in his first start on June 28, 1997 against Texas...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a hit in each of the first four innings...did not allow a run as he was aided by three double plays and a pickoff...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win over Cleveland July 15 in Oakland...blanked the Indians on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fourth...the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth but he allowed another run to score on a ground out in the sixth...was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 3-2.

FOURTH START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 7-5 loss at New York (NL) July 21...retired each of the first eight batters he faced and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a single to the pitcher (Matz) followed by a home run by Conforto...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed two of the Mets three runs in the sixth inning...left with runners on first and second and one out but the bullpen allowed both of those runners to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Toronto last Wednesday...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer while tossing seven or more scoreless innings in one of the first five games of his career (Doug Johns, Aug. 25, 1995)...just two base runners advanced into scoring position...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss.

against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on April 15 against Colorado Springs and April 21 at Oklahoma City...picked up his first win April 28 against New Orleans and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment... allowed three runs on four hits and two walks in 4.0 innings...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h. 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...had the scoreless streak snapped when he allowed a season-high tying six runs (also May 14 against Albuquerque) on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings on May 29 against Colorado springs...finished May 2-3 with a $5.12\ \text{ERA}$ in six games...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis... walked a season-high four batters June 15 against lowa...started the second game of a June 20 doubleheader against New Orleans and pitched a season-low 2.0 innings...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five

2016 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization and was 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 18 starts when he was traded to the Seattle Mariners organization July 20...was assigned to Double-A Jackson and went 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA in eight games (seven starts) with the Generals...combined for a 9-5 record and a 3.28 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) overall...surrendered just eight home runs in 143.0 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...ranked fourth in the Southern League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.12), tied for fourth in games started, sixth in ERA and innings pitched and tied for eighth in wins...tied for the lead among SL pitchers with 40 total chances...was named to the SL Midseason All-Star Game after going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...went 5-3 with a 4.18 ERA in 13 games (12 starts) after the break...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (69-for-274) against right-handed pitchers compared to .259 (69-for-266) against left-handers...opponents hit .217 with runners in scoring position... combined for a 3-2 record and a 4.50 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks...was 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA in 12 starts on the road...went 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts as a hitter with Jackson.

CAREER: Was originally selected by the Cubs as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2012 draft but was traded twice in 2016...was sent to the Mariners prior to the trading deadline in the Mike Montgomery deal and was traded to the A's following the season for Danny Valencia... is 34-23 with a 3.21 ERA (177 er in 496.0 ip) in 105 games (99 starts) in six professional seasons...has never posted an ERA above 3.48...has surrendered just 28 home runs in 496.0 innings (0.51 per nine innings)...was named to Midseason All-Star Teams in the Southern League in 2016 and the Midwest League in 2014.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-5, 3.82 ERA): Is 7-2 with a 3.23 ERA over his last 13 starts dating back to May 20...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts...has walked 21 batters in 83.2 innings over his last 13 starts (2.26 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts...is 6-0 with a 3.18 ERA in 10 starts against interdivision opponents compared to 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA in nine starts against American League West teams...is 4-1 with a 3.64 ERA in nine starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 3.99 ERA in 10 starts on the road... had a no decision in his last start, an 8-4 A's loss at Toronto in 10 innings last Thursday (7.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against San Francisco, a start last year in Oakland on June 29 in a 7-1 A's win (5.2 ip, 6 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA in two interleague starts this year.

- Now has 17 blown saves for the season, which is tied for fifth in the American League...the save percentage of 54.1% is fourth lowest.
- Has a 4.71 ERA, which is third highest in the AL (MIN, 4.79 & DET, 5.31).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (123), is tied for first in most stolen bases allowed (38), is tied for third in fewest wins (14) and is sixth in fewest walks (130).

- Is third among American League relievers in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for fourth in stolen bases allowed (8), tied for second in blown saves (6) and tied for ninth in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-39 (.179) with runners in scoring position, including 3-for-20 (.150) with RISP and two outs.
- Has a 6.60 ERA (11 er in 15.0 ip) and has surrendered all five of his home runs in 17 games on the road...has a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in 24 games in Oakland.
